

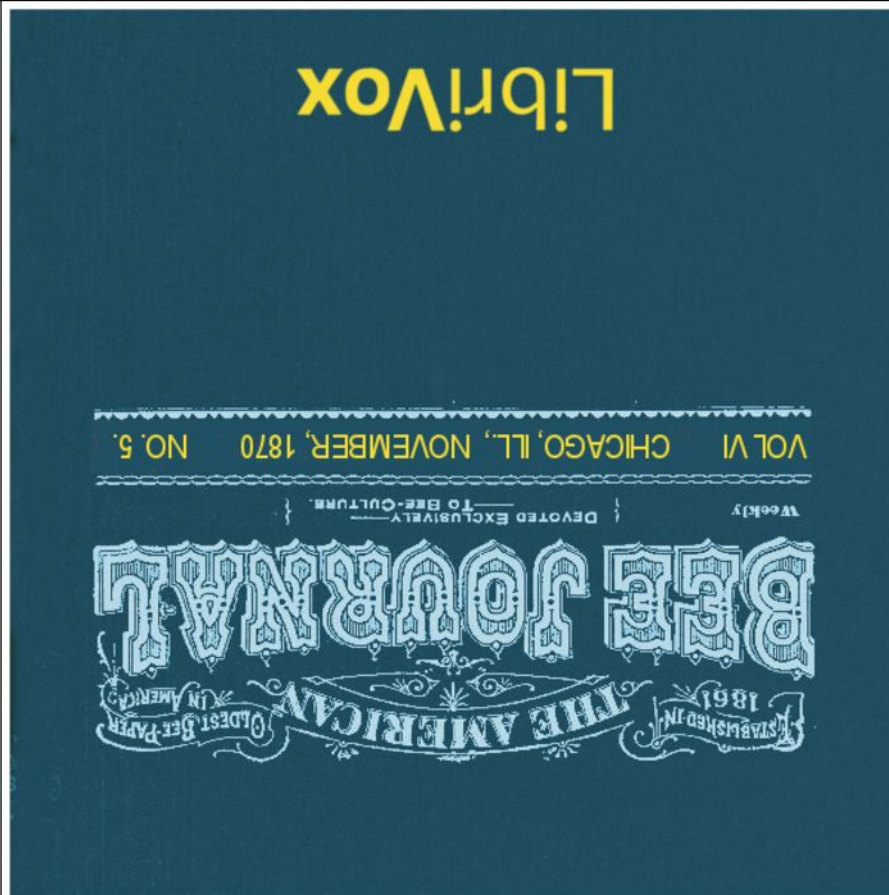
**The American Bee Journal. Vol. VI, No. 5, November 1870**
