

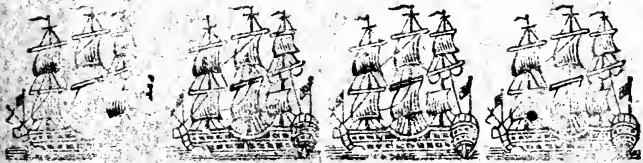

Solar and Lunar Eclipses in the Year 1815.

1. An eclipse of the Sun, on the 10th of the first month (January,) at 56 min after 8 in the morning, invisible here, on account of the moon's south latitude. The Sun will be centrally eclipsed on the meridian in latitude 63 deg. 45 min. south and longitude 48 deg. 42 min. east from Philadelphia.

2. Of the Moon on the 21st of the sixth month, (June) at 59 min. after noon; of course invisible.

3. of the Sun, on the sixth of the seventh month, (July) in the afternoon partly visible.

Digits eclipsed 3 1-2 on the North Limb.

It will be total and central on the meridian in latitude 88 deg. 3 min. north, and longitude 99 deg. 11 min. west from Philadelphia.

4. Of the Moon, on the sixteenth of the twelfth month (December) in the morning, partly visible.

Beginning at Philadelphia, at 6 10

Beginning of total darkness 7 9

The Moon will set about 7 22

Totally eclipsed from the south side of the earth's shadow.

9. Of the Sun on the 30th of the 12th month (December) at 50 minutes after 9 in the morning; invisible on account of the Moon's south latitude.

NOTES TO THE READER.

1. The time of High Water at Philadelphia, is so computed as to serve for either morning or evening, sufficiently near for common use; the morning flood being about 12 minutes earlier than the time given in the tide column, and that of the afternoon as much later.

2. The rising, setting or southing of a Star, may be carried several days backward by adding, or forward by subtracting 4 minutes per day; for instance, on the 18th of the first month (January) Sirius is south at 36 minutes after 10; adding 8 minutes for 2 days sooner, we have 10h. 44m. for the southing on the 16th; and deducting twelve minutes for 3 later leaves ten h. 24m. for that of the 25st of the same month.
