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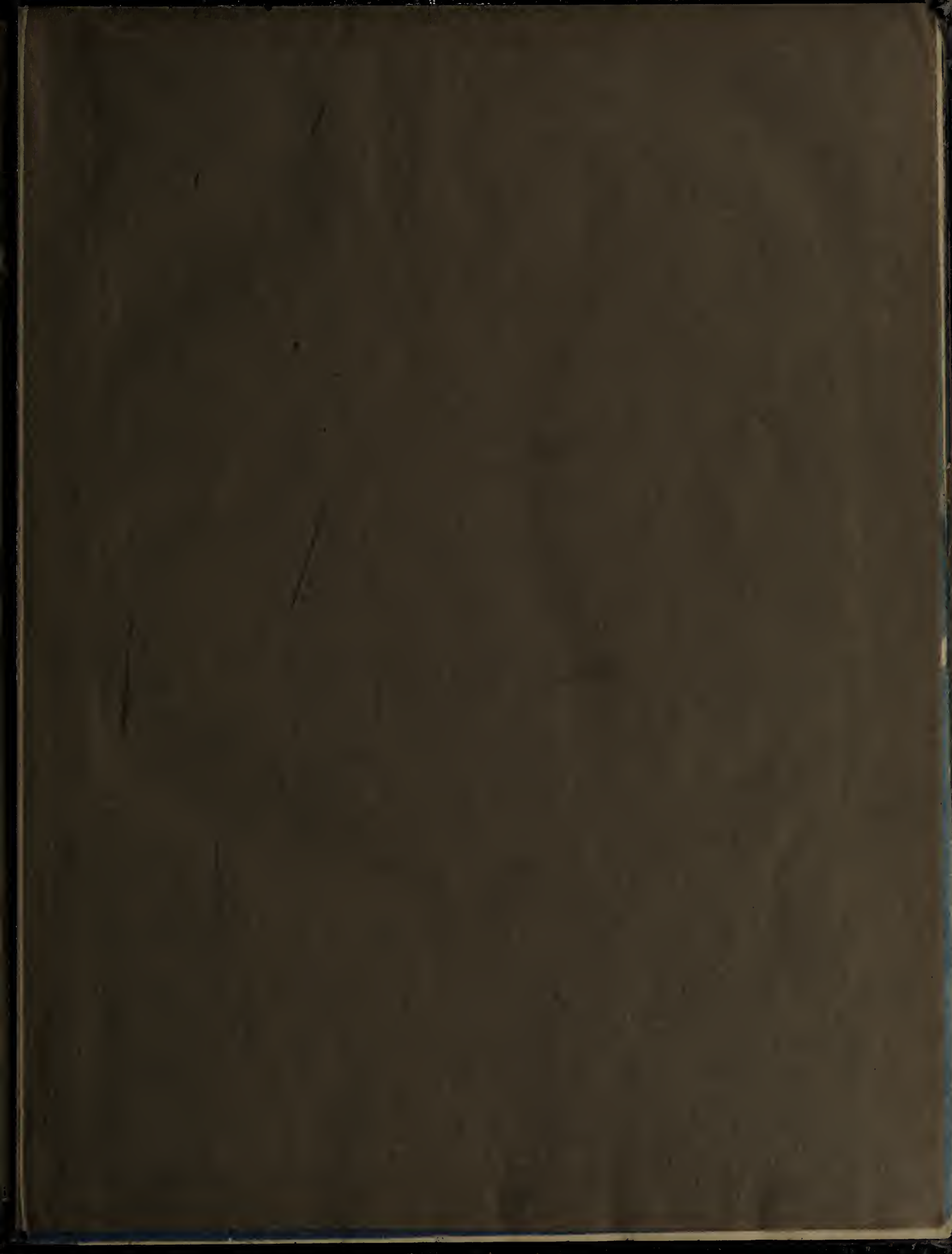

Gentlemen,-

I hand you herewith blueprinted booklet on the ancestors and descendants of Albert Coe and Deborah Prentice, which represents a considerable amount of work and contains a good deal of data that is not easily obtainable.

In indexing this, I would suggest first, that you mention the index of 278 names, which makes the data much more accessible for the worker with limited time, second, that you index under the names Roberts and Emmons, as well as Coe and Prentice, as none of the Roberts data given is in print, and this data connects up these Roberts families with some of the well known old Connecticut families of other names.

Some of the Emmons data is in print, but some, I believe, incorrectly, and my collaborator, George Dimmock, Ph.D. has traced out some obscure points and proved them from the probate records.

There is some question about whether it would be worth while to index under Smith, although it took us about a year before we could identify the Rev. Newton Smith, who was buried at Wyoming, N.Y., with the son of William Smith and Margery Kellogg, who was born in New London, barely escaped the Wyoming (Pa.) Massacre, and lived in Wyoming Pa. nearly all his life.

Regarding the name Call, this appears thirteen times in the index, and there are several additional Call ancestors given in the appendix, but as most of this data is covered by the vital statistics of New York State, it may not be worth indexing.

I hope to be able to add more data to this work, particularly on the Sornberger line, but this has proved very difficult, and I have thought it best to get what data I have into shape so that it would be accessible and safe, rather than to wait more or less indefinitely, till I could get more complete data. I might ~~have~~ add that I have secured a considerable amount of this data in your reference room, when stopping in Boston on business trips, and that I wish to express my appreciation for the courtesies that have been extended to me.

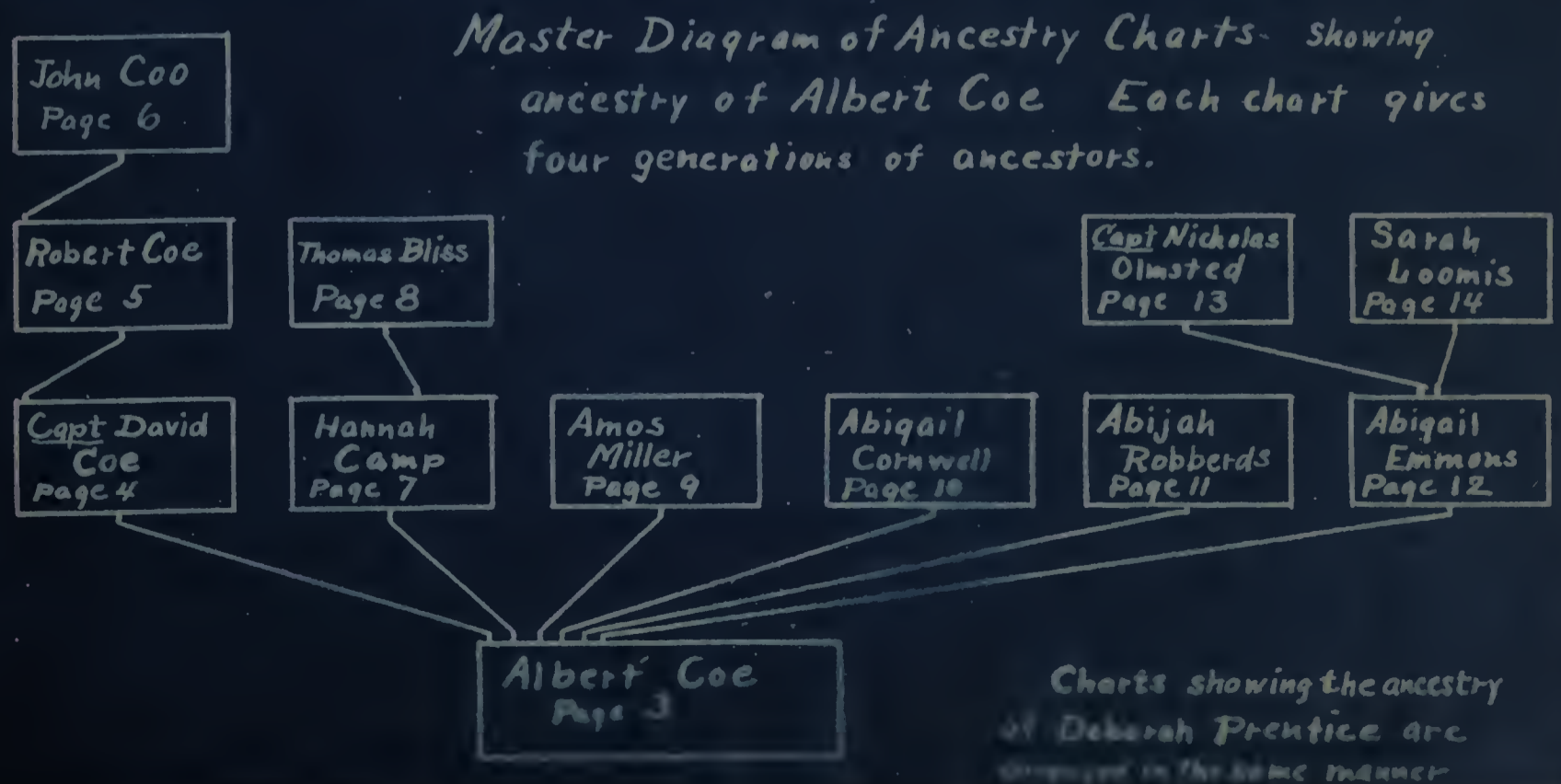

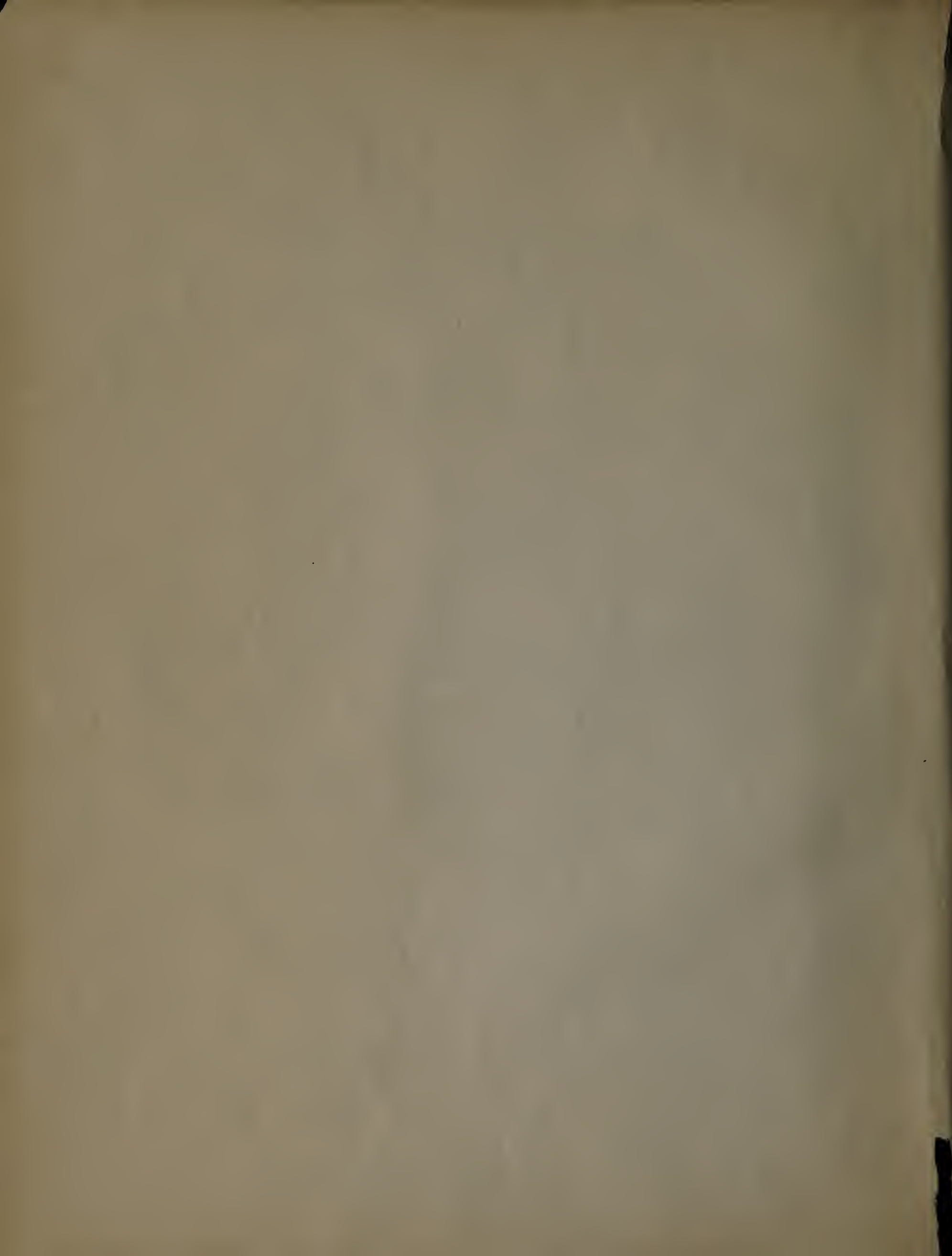
### Arrangement of Ancestry Charts.

In arranging the ancestry charts, each male line is followed as far as we have record, when we take up the earliest intermarried line on which we have further data, and follow this as far back as possible. This seems a logical arrangement, and in a work of limited scope like this, does not lead to the confusion which might result in a more extensive work. (See Diagram below)

### Numbering of Descendants

The numbers on the list of descendants indicate the lines of descent from Albert Coe and from his immigrant ancestor, Robert Coe. Each letter or numeral digit indicates one generation, numerals indicating males and letters females. Thus the last three digits of the number for Charles Warren Bryant (131a3) indicate that he is of the third generation from Albert Coe, that his descent is through Albert Coe's first son and through that son's first daughter; Also that he is second son of that daughter.







## ALBERT COE

Albert Coe, son of Ezra Coe and Elizabeth Sornberger Coe, was born Feb. 17, 1837, on the Homestead Farm in the town of Pavilion, N.Y., (not far from Linwood) which his father cleared from "the forest primeval". His education was received in the district school and in the hard work and hard knocks usually encountered in pioneer life.

On Dec. 31, 1850, he married Deborah Prentice. The story is told that when he first saw her at the District School he exclaimed "That's my wife!" This he indignantly denied and insisted that all he had said was "That's the girl for me!" He remained a devoted lover during their long lives. Once, during the weary days of the last winter of his life he said to her "You won't be long, will you Mother?"

After his marriage he went to Michigan, planning to live there, but had an attack of fever, probably malarial, and decided the climate unsuitable. In 1873 he moved to LeRoy, having sold the Homestead Farm where he and his five children were born. In 1875 he bought the farm 2 1/4 miles East of LeRoy, where he lived for more than thirty years, until his death in 1907. This move was partly to obtain better educational facilities for his children, the two older having already attended the LeRoy Academy. He often spoke of desiring a better education and a better chance for his children than he had himself.

He was one of the most liberal supporters of the LeRoy Methodist Church. One pastor, Dr. Dryer, repeatedly declared that his pledge "built" (made possible) the "new" church, built about 1886. He was of a kindly social nature, and his home was the scene of frequent social gatherings of the older as well as the young people of the community and church. Many pastors and their families made it almost a second home.

After a winter of ill-health, his death occurred Apr. 26, 1907 at his home East of LeRoy. "He was held in high esteem in the community".

## Deborah Prentice Coe

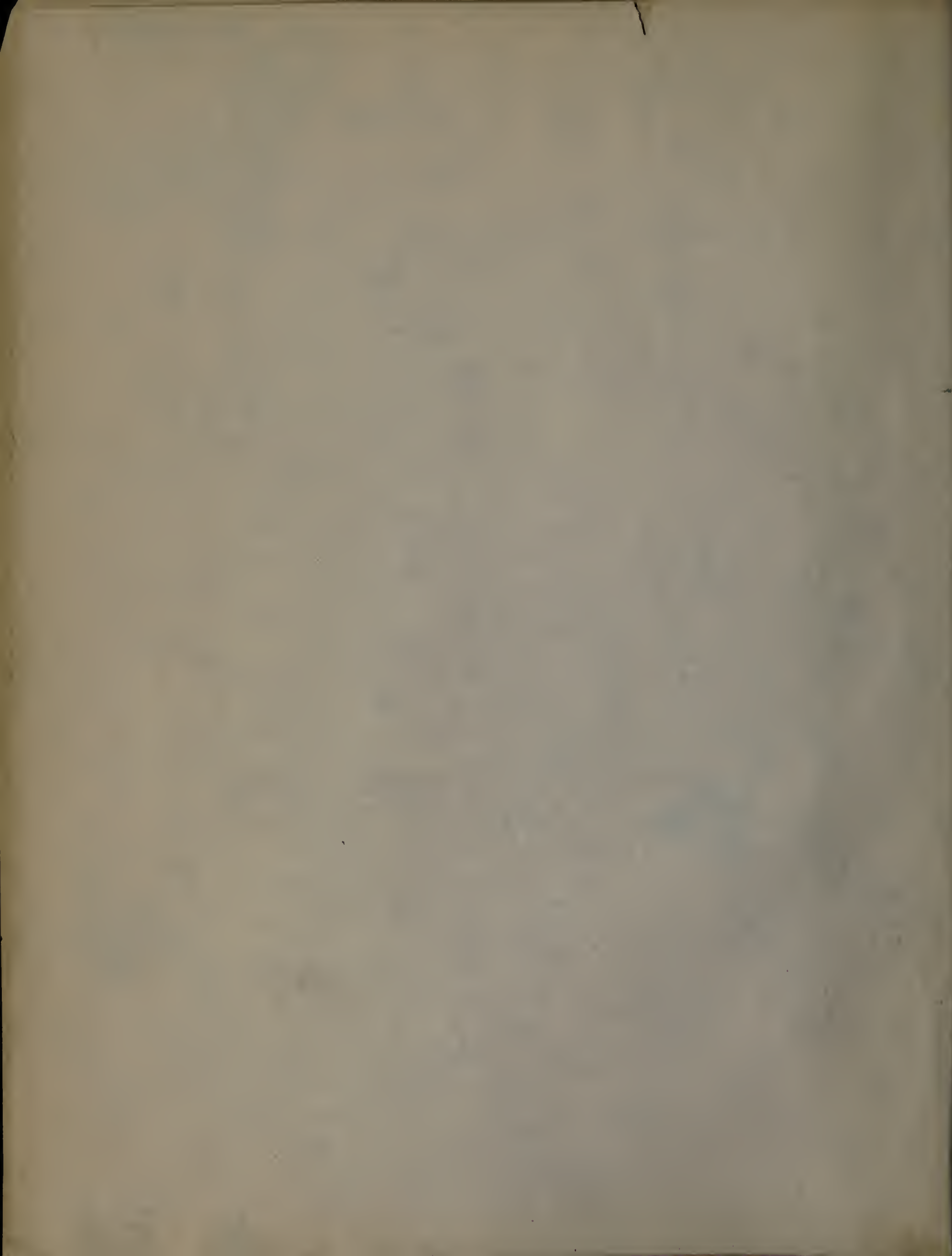
Deborah Prentice was born in Franklinsville, Pa., Apr. 4, 1833. Her Mother died when she was only 13, the oldest child, and the family was "broken up". She lived for a time with a family named Mills, in the Town of Pavilion, N.Y., but early married Albert Coe, Dec. 31, 1850. She had five children, all of whom were married and survive her. She was fine-looking, with an excellent, quick mind and was a most devout Christian.

The great blessings of her life and character chiefly benefited her children, but were a benediction to others with whom she came in contact. She taught the same Bible Class at LeRoy M.E. Church, for more than thirty five years. Her death occurred very suddenly, Nov. 6th, 1910. There were those who said they knew of no one better prepared to go.



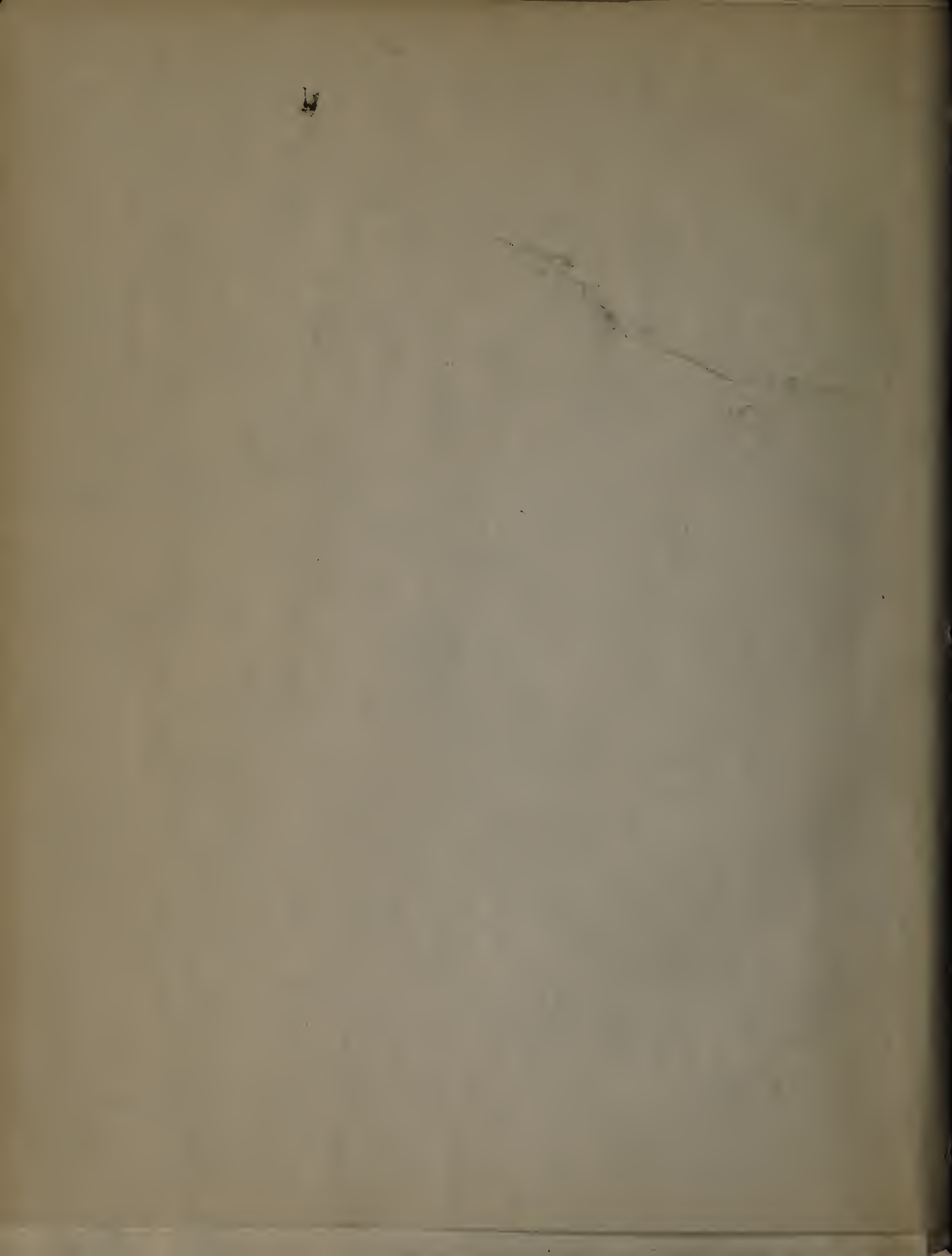
