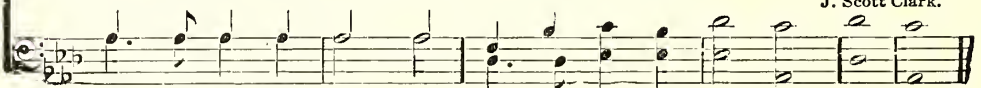

HONORARY DEGREES

Doctor of Laws—Henry Barrett Chamberlin

A devoted alumnus of the Law School, who as a journalist of highest rank and most varied achievements both in war and in peace, as an officer of the National Guard of Illinois, as an active worker in many public causes for the good of City and State, and now as operating director of the Chicago Crime Commission, has given an enviable example of that high public service which the educated citizen can render to the community.

Doctor of Literature—Charles Henry Dennis

Editor Emeritus of the Chicago Daily News, whose fifty years in American journalism are noteworthy as an example of the leadership that arises from service and the power that is based on public responsibility. Master of Arts—Jacob Louis Jacobs

A fearless public servant, whose achievements in practical governmental administration have won widespread recognition.

Master of Arts—Florence Marguerite Patterson
