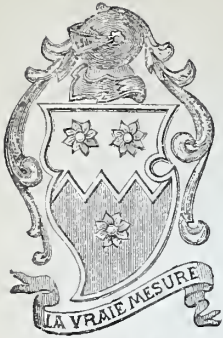



THE CLARKE PRIZE.

MR. THOMAS B. CLARKE, of New York, has generously provided a prize of Three Hundred Dollars, to be awarded yearly to the best **American Figure Composition**,—painted in the UNITED STATES, and shown at the Annual Exhibition. This prize will be offered at the same time and place, and awarded in the same general manner as the other prizes herein named, except that in *this* prize there is no limitation of age. Academicians are not eligible to compete.

THE HALLGARTEN PRIZES.

The late MR. JULIUS HALLGARTEN, by a Deed of Trust to the Academy, endowed Prizes of Three Hundred, Two Hundred and One Hundred Dollars, to be awarded to the painters of the three best pictures in oil colors at each Annual Exhibition of the Academy, as follows :

All works will be considered to be in competition which have been painted in the United States by American citizens under thirty-five years of age, and which have not before been publicly exhibited in the City or vicinity of New York. No competitor may take two prizes, or a prize of the same class a second time.

The awards will be made by a vote by ballot of all the Exhibitors of the season, at a meeting held for the purpose during the third or fourth week of the Exhibitions. Each artist will be entitled to one vote at each ballot, specifying his choice for each one of the three prizes, and each prize will be awarded to the painting receiving the highest number of votes for that prize, but no work will be entitled to the prize unless at least fifty of the Exhibitors vote at the ballot, and the work receive one-third of all the votes cast.

Any prize not awarded upon or before the third ballot, will not be awarded at the time, but will be reserved for and added to the prize or prizes of the following year.

Artists, to whom prizes may be awarded, will receive therewith a certificate, stating the prize won, the name of the work, and the year of the Exhibition.

THE NORMAN W. DODGE PRIZE,

FOR WOMEN EXHIBITORS.

MR. NORMAN W. DODGE, of New York, has instituted a prize of Three Hundred Dollars, to be awarded at the Annual Exhibitions, to the best picture painted in the United States by a woman. All the women exhibitors, without limitation of age or of nationality, will be eligible to compete for this prize. It will be awarded at the same time and in the same manner as the other prizes. It cannot be taken a second time by the same exhibitor, or by any exhibitor who may have taken any other prize at the same exhibition.

MEETING OF EXHIBITORS TO AWARD THE PRIZES, April 18th, 1888.

A meeting of the Exhibitors at the Sixty-third Annual Exhibition to award the Clarke, Hallgarten and Dodge prizes will be held in the Lecture Room of the Academy, at two o'clock in the afternoon of WEDNESDAY, April 18th. All the Artist Exhibitors are especially requested to attend this meeting.

THE FOUNDERS
OF THE
NATIONAL ACADEMY OF DESIGN.

On the 8th of November, 1825, a number of young Artists and Students established the New York Drawing Association, and soon after, on the 16th of January, 1826, they resolved themselves into a new organization, to be known as the National Academy of the Arts of Design. They, thereupon, chose from their number fifteen artists, who were directed to choose fifteen others—the thirty thus selected to constitute the New Society.

Of this body of Founders of the National Academy of Design, whose names are here recorded, Mr. Thos. S. Cummings, N.A., who was for many years the Treasurer, and at one time the Vice-President of the Academy, is now the only survivor.

EXTRACTS FROM THE CHARTER

OF THE

National Academy of Design,

AS AMENDED AND MADE PERPETUAL

BY THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, CHAPTER 292, PASSED APRIL 24TH, 1873.

From Section 2 of the Amendments :

The said Society, in addition to its present corporate powers, may take, receive and hold real and personal property to any amount, by grant, gift, devise or bequest, for the proper uses and purposes of said Society; and may so take and receive the same absolutely or conditionally or in trust, and for any estate or term, or to be held perpetually; and any person or persons may endow said corporation by grant, devise or bequest made to any trustee or trustees, the principal to be held, managed and preserved as a perpetual fund and the income to be applied to such uses of said Society as the donor or donors may prescribe.

(FORM OF LEGACY TO THE SOCIETY.)

*I hereby give, devise and bequeath to the Society called
the National Academy of Design, chartered by the State

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF DESIGN.

DEPARTMENT OF SCHOOLS.

In the list of students of the National Academy for the past sixty years may be found the names of nearly all the most eminent artists of America.

The schools, directed by the Academicians and instructed by professors of high position and wide experience, with spacious and elegant class rooms, and with every facility for study, offer to art students the best and fullest opportunities for that thorough and varied discipline and training which will most certainly ensure the development and fruition of their genius.

The schools are in session day and evening, from the first Monday in October to the middle of May.

The Antique Rooms, equipped with a very large and varied collection of casts, are open to all students daily from 8 A. M. to 9½ P. M. under the direction of L. E. Wilmarth, N.A., and Edgar M. Ward, N.A., who have also charge of the LIFE Classes, which are in daily session—in the morning and night for men and in the afternoon for women.

The PAINTING School, which now occupies a large and well-lighted hall, is open daily under the instruction of Edgar M. Ward, N.A.

The MODELING CLASS, which will be open daily, with all needed appliances, has been placed under the direction of Mr. F. Edwin Elwell.

The SKETCH Class, for the study of the draped living model, is open to all the students from 4 to 5 P. M. daily.

In the COMPOSITION Class, which is designed to develop the inventive and imaginative faculties, original sketches of prescribed subjects are made. The class is directed by Prof. Wilmarth.

The COSTUME Class, open to all students, meets every Saturday morning.

A course of LECTURES on PERSPECTIVE is given during each annual session, by Frederick Dielman, N.A., and also a course of lectures on ART ANATOMY, by J. Wells Champney, A.N.A.

Other Special Lectures are given from time to time.



THE FOUNDERS
OF THE
NATIONAL ACADEMY OF DESIGN.

On the 8th of November, 1825, a number of young Artists and Students established the New York Drawing Association, and soon after, on the 16th of January, 1826, they resolved themselves into a new organization, to be known as the National Academy of the Arts of Design. They, thereupon, chose from their number fifteen artists, who were directed to choose fifteen others—the thirty thus selected to constitute the New Society.

Of this body of Founders of the National Academy of Design, whose names are here recorded, Mr. Thos. S. Cummings, N.A., who was for many years the Treasurer, and at one time the Vice-President of the Academy, is now the only survivor.

EXTRACTS FROM THE CHARTER
OF THE
National Academy of Design,
AS AMENDED AND MADE PERPETUAL

BY THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, CHAPTER 292, PASSED APRIL 24TH, 1873.

From Section 2 of the Amendments:

The said Society, in addition to its present corporate powers, may take, receive and hold real and personal property to any amount, by grant, gift, devise or bequest, for the proper uses and purposes of said Society; and may so take and receive the same absolutely or conditionally or in trust, and for any estate or term, or to be held perpetually; and any person or persons may endow said corporation by grant, devise or bequest made to any trustee or trustees, the principal to be held, managed and preserved as a perpetual fund and the income to be applied to such uses of said Society as the donor or donors may prescribe.

(FORM OF LEGACY TO THE SOCIETY.)

The schools, directed by the Academicians and instructed by professors of high position and wide experience, with spacious and elegant class rooms, and with every facility for study, offer to art students the best and fullest opportunities for that thorough and varied discipline and training which will most certainly ensure the development and fruition of their genius.

The schools are in session day and evening, from the first Monday in October to the middle of May.

The Antique Rooms, equipped with a very large and varied collection of casts, are open to all students daily from 8 A. M. to 9½ P. M. under the direction of L. E. Wilmarth, N.A., and Edgar M. Ward, N.A., who have also charge of the LIFE Classes, which are in daily session—in the morning and night for men and in the afternoon for women.

The PAINTING School, which now occupies a large and well-lighted hall, is open daily under the instruction of Edgar M. Ward, N.A.

The MODELING Class, which will be open daily, with all needed appliances, has been placed under the direction of Mr. Olin L. Warner.
