NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean line, and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

Copies of the Annual Report, descriptive printed matter, and souvenir post-cards will be sent upon request.

Season of 1908.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES.

The season of 1908 began on Wednesday, July 1, and closed on Tuesday, September 15. There were more patients on the first day than there had ever been on the first day of any previous season. This could be accounted for partly owing to the extremely hot weather and probably to some extent to the fact that, as the Floating Hospital becomes more widely known and appreciated, its field of usefulness broadens, and a greater number of parents of sick infants anxiously await the opening day of the season. All the beds in the six permanent wards were soon in use, and a seventh ward, containing eighteen beds, was opened for the first time, making the total number of permanent patients 130. New beds were added on the upper deck, increasing the number of day patients to 125. The Hospital, therefore, not only did the largest service it has ever done, but had to deal with an unusual number of very severe cases.

The newly-installed refrigerating and cooling plant was ready for service and proved of inestimable value, especially during the hottest days and while the boat was at the pier at night. The results of this system of supplying the wards with air, artificially cooled and dried, are being carefully studied and compared with the results attained by treatment in the open air, where heat and moisture have to be contended with. There are certain conditions under which the artificial system seems indispensable. As this is the only hospital of its kind in existence, it presents new problems to be solved, which are of vital importance in the study of saving infant life during the months of highest mortality. To those who are interested to read them the reports of the medical side of the work and the business administration will give a comprehensive idea of what the Hospital accomplishes.

The Trustees regret that Miss Alice P. Goodwin is to be no longer Superintendent of Nurses, and wish to express their grateful appreciation of her faithful and efficient services and of the high standard which she has set in this department. Our appreciation is also due to Miss Carolyn A. Brown, who has served the Hospital efficiently for seven years as Night Superintendent of Nurses.

The Hospital will begin its sixteenth season on Wednesday, June 30.

The Trustees gratefully acknowledge the many gifts and contributions which have been received during the year, and earnestly hope that this generous support may be continued. They also wish to thank the press for its invaluable service.

STATEMENT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE VISITING STAFF.

There is little to be added this year to what was said last year as to the importance and usefulness of the work of this Hospital. More babies were taken care of than ever before and the efficiency of this care was probably greater than ever before. It is hardly possible for any one not familiar with hospitals for infants to realize the immense amount of work and the infinite attention to detail which is required to take care of and prepare the food for 130 sick babies day and night and 125 or more others during the day. It is certainly equal to that required for three times that number of adults.

The educational value of the work to mothers, nurses, house-officers, students, and visiting staff, and through them to hundreds or even thousands of others, can hardly be overestimated. How wide this area of influence is can best be appreciated by noting the residences of the nurses and house staff.

Last year the failure to take advantage of the opportunities for scientific research afforded by the Hospital was spoken of with regret. This year, through the munificence of two gentlemen interested in the advancement of medical knowledge, original investigations will be begun as to the causation, recognition, and treatment of the diarrhœal diseases of infancy. With this work going on, the Hospital will at last be fulfilling all the functions of the modern hospital, which include not only the care of the sick and the training of nurses and physicians, but also the study of disease and original investigations into its causation and treatment.

REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

The Boston Floating Hospital has passed its most active and successful season. The early hot weather of June so increased the infant morbidity that the Hospital opened with a larger number of permanent patients than ever before. The demand for permanent treatment was maintained throughout the season, so that the Hospital was at its full capacity from the 1st of July until the close of the season. Ward A with eighteen beds was opened the middle of July, thus increasing the number of permanent beds to 130. 491 patients were treated in the permanent wards.

On the upper deck 941 patients were treated who made 5,437 trips, or an average of 72 patients each trip. A large majority of these patients would have been treated in the permanent wards under ordinary conditions, but the demand was so great that only the most urgent cases were admitted to the wards.

The permission for well children to accompany the mothers of sick infants was this year restricted to the smallest possible number, to the evident advantage of the work. Several major surgical operations were performed during the season. For the future it seems advisable, on account of the lack of proper facilities on the Hospital, to restrict this work to emergency cases. It is understood that in the near future it will be possible to have in charge of the clinical laboratory a competent Pathologist and Bacteriologist, trained for research work, as was recommended by the Visiting Staff last year. Opportunities such as few institutions possess for work of this nature will now be improved, leading to a better and more complete knowledge and treatment of the cases with which we have to deal.

The mortality rate was high (183), as was to be expected, on account of the severity of cases admitted and the progress of the diseases before the patients were brought to the Hospital.

The work of the Food Laboratory was conducted in a most capable and efficient manner. More feedings were prepared than ever before,—over 92,000, an average of 1,200 per day.

Considerable attention has been paid this season to instruction of mothers in the preparation of infants' food. On the discharge of an infant a formula for home modification has been given the mother, with careful directions how to prepare the food. A nurse who has finished her work in the Food Laboratory and who has shown aptitude for the work has been detailed to

demonstrate the preparation of the formula step by step until the process is well understood. Much intelligence among the mothers has been developed by this instruction. They appreciate it greatly, and it has been of great value.

Our thanks are again due to Tufts Medical School, Boston City Hospital, the Emergency Hospital, the Massachusetts Homœpathic Hospital, the Children's Hospital, and the New England Hospital for Women and Children for professional courtesies, as for several seasons past; to the American Oxygen Association, Messrs. H. K. Mulford & Co., the Pureoxia Company for supplies furnished the Hospital; and to Mr. Frederick L. Briggs, undertaker, for assistance.

I desire to thank the Trustees for their cordial support during the season, and acknowledge the ready and hearty co-operation of the Hospital Staff in all its departments.

STATEMENT OF THE MANAGER.

Those who have had faith in any kind of philanthropic work which started from small beginnings will appreciate thoroughly the satisfaction felt by the friends of the Boston Floating Hospital, who have observed the evolution of this institution to a point where it has taken its place among Boston's established philanthropies.

Those who view the physical property represented by our ship and its equipment and learn of the systematic effort made by each official serving under the management of the Trustees will see that the evolutionary stage has been passed. People who always supported and believed in the work, together with many new friends, recognize the present success in conserving to the utmost the labor of its employees and the use of its valuable supplies. We think that no exception can be taken to the methods controlling the administration of the work during the season when the institution stands in the breach and meets the emergencies thrown suddenly upon it by conditions created by the excessive heat in our city.

During July, August, and September between four and five times as many children under five years of age die as in any other three months of the year. Hence the great need of the service and instruction afforded by our Hospital. There have been difficulties in co-ordinating three distinct branches of administration so that the best results may be obtained. In most hospitals there is, of course, the distinctly hospital as well as the business administration, but in our unique hospital there must be met all the problems connected with conducting these functions on board a ship, where in many instances the authority of the ship's officers and men must of necessity be supreme, and where hospital and business matters properly yield to the conditions called forth by the handling of a vessel making its trips daily within given hours. and then resting quietly at the dock through the night. It is my belief that the successful working out of these problems is more dependent upon the personnel and tact of the different responsible heads of work in this institution than in any other of which I know, and much of the success of last season's standards can be attributed to the admirable manner in which the different officials who worked on board the ship co-operated with one another in meeting the demands of an unusually busy season of important

and handling of supplies. This system is still maintained with great care, and more and more now are we devoting ourselves to the best direction of the rank and file of our employees, that we may get from them the service necessary for the up-keep of the ship and its equipment, and so avoid expenses which would prove heavier if we turned our work over to firms representing the different lines of labor and maintenance work.

Our Captain, George F. Simpson, is now serving us faithfully in his third year, having begun with us as mate. His faithful care of our valuable property during the winter, and his industry during his hours of duty, have saved us much money, and the recent government inspection of our boat and equipment shows that it has undergone as small a loss by depreciation as is possible.

For Chief Engineer we have Harry D. Oakes, who came to us from the Eastern Steamship Company, and whose careful supervision of our machinery and alertness in checking the different forms of waste so easily possible in his department have been of great value.

Our Steward, William M. McIver, who began in 1906 as chef on the old boat, most ably organizes the "ship housekeeping." He, in common with other responsible employees, indorses the idea that supplies are the equivalent of money, and that waste of these is as wrongful as carelessness in handling cash; and so it may be said that our officials conform readily to the lines of conduct in administration which are directed by the Trustees from the hospital office.

Since the Hospital was started, Mr. Lewis A. Freeman has been connected with the work, and now efficiently keeps the books and cares for many of the details of our office at 54 Devonshire Street. I want to record my hearty appreciation of his courtesy and diligent faithfulness.

It is to be regretted that we have lost the services of Miss Alice P. Goodwin as Superintendent of Nurses. The appreciation of the Trustees is recorded in the Chairman's statement. It is my great pleasure to say that she was of inestimable value to the institution in directing her department where it bore immediately on the question of supplies, and she showed great capability in her constant attention to details, resulting in a substantial saving to the institution. She has certainly set a high standard for the future.

When I originally undertook the work intrusted to me, there was no thought that I should be called upon to deliver lectures or talks regarding the work of the Hospital, but demands from various sources for descriptive talks have led me to attempt to tell of our unique work, and from such contact as I have had with audiences it is my belief that people are eager to learn how the money is used for the specific purposes for which it is given. Having always



been averse to dwelling on pathetic, heart-rending scenes and incidents necessarily connected with our work as a means of interesting people to give, I have believed that their own intelligence would tell them that such things must be where we care for so many critically sick children, and that it is best to spend my allotted time in telling them of our organization and letting them hear of the manner in which the funds given to the Trustees are applied to the work in hand.

The interest in the important work of our Food Laboratory, where are prepared the foods for the patients, is so general that I have asked Dr. H. C. Marble, who has done so much for the success of our Hospital, to make a statement covering the work of his department, and it appears herewith.

STATEMENT OF THE CHIEF OF THE FOOD LABORATORY.

From the view-point of the Food Laboratory the season of 1908 was most successful.

There was installed in the laboratory a card index system which showed exactly the daily amount of material received, the mixtures prepared, the number of feedings sent to the wards, the record of the bacteriological examinations and chemical analyses, and, lastly, the instruction given the nurses; in fact, an accurate index of the work of the Laboratory. By this system it was possible to figure more accurately the amount of milk and cream and other supplies necessary for each twenty-four hours.

The milk came from The Warelands, a farm in Norfolk, Mass.

The bacteriological tests of the milk ranged from 300 to 10,000 bacteria per cubic centimetre. (In the city of Boston milk up to 500,000 bacteria per cubic centimetre is salable.)

The chemical tests were all most satisfactory.

During the season every nurse on the Hospital received practical instruction in the preparation of infant foods, and particularly in home modification according to a physician's prescription.

Those nurses duly qualified were given an opportunity under direction of the laboratory staff to prepare and demonstrate to mothers, whose children were well enough to be discharged, the correct methods of preparing the feedings for infants. A carefully prepared set of directions was given each mother. This method seemed very helpful, and it is along these lines that much more work will be done in the future.

Our laboratory was visited by superintendents, doctors, and nurses from other institutions in quest of new methods of preparation and feeding. We were glad to be of assistance to them to aid them in caring for the children under their care.

I wish to state my appreciation of the laboratory assistants, Dr. Hunt, Dr. White, and Mr. Owen, whose hearty co-operation helped make the work in the Food Laboratory successful.

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

Season of 1909.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES.

The season of 1909, which began on Wednesday morning, June 30, and closed on Wednesday, September 15, was eminently successful. While, owing to a fairly cool summer, the total number of patients was not quite so large as the year before, yet all the beds in the seven permanent wards were soon in demand, and were used almost constantly through the season. The number of day patients varies somewhat with the weather. Mothers are less inclined to bring their children on very cool days, while on hot and sultry days the day patients' deck is usually taxed to its utmost.

One of the most difficult problems with which the Hospital has had to contend is the treatment and distribution of air in the permanent wards. This has been to a considerable extent pioneer work, as this Hospital is the first of its kind, and the conditions on the water are so different from those on land. It was supposed that the best conditions could be attained by closing the windows and causing the free circulation through the wards of air which had been artificially cooled and relieved of moisture. Experience, however, has proved to us that by combining the natural air with the treated air we are able to get the most satisfactory results. This is especially true in oppressive weather. When it is less oppressive the process is modified, when the weather is cool and clear, it is best to rely entirely upon the supply of natural air. It is therefore desirable to have the window openings as large as possible. This has necessitated putting in new windows of a different kind.

The Boston Floating Hospital is the largest infants' hospital in the United States, and one of the most important. The large number and variety of cases which are treated offer the widest opportunity for original research work in infants' diseases. The Hospital has a well-equipped clinical laboratory where valuable work was done during the past season, for which a special fund was raised. This work is to be continued during the

present season with a view to studying the causes of dysentery among young children. Beyond performing the primary duty of saving the lives of infants intrusted to it, the Hospital is aiming to contribute perhaps even a greater service along the lines of permanent progress.

A new system was started in 1909, of having the discharged patients visited in their homes. This was successfully done by nurses under the supervision of the Instructive District Nursing Association. Reports of the home conditions were submitted daily to the Resident Physician and the Superintendent of Nurses. This "follow-up" work has proved to be of value.

The Trustees deeply regret the resignations of Dr. John Lovett Morse, who served on the Visiting Staff for six years, from 1904 to 1909, and Dr. Charles W. Townsend, who served for three years, from 1907 to 1909. A debt of sincere gratitude is due to them for their faithful and efficient services.

The Hospital began its seventeenth season on Wednesday, June 29, 1910, under very favorable conditions. The work is now so well established and organized that it is unnecessary to dwell upon details in this brief preliminary report, excepting to point out new features.

Upon the unanimous recommendation of the Visiting Staff provision has been made for a daily supply during the season of four quarts of human milk. During critical periods in certain severe cases it has been demonstrated beyond doubt that the use of breast milk is essential. Statistics show that the mortality has been lowered in hospitals where it is used.



REPORT OF THE MANAGER.

To the Board of Trustees:

With both Hospital officials and those versed in general business methods it has often been a matter of comment that the management of The Boston Floating Hospital must, of necessity, proceed without the aid that usually can be gained by learning from the experience of similar institutions, for it is true that the Floating Hospital is unique, that there is no other institution like it, that the ordinary conduct of the average hospital must, in our case, yield to conditions created by the necessity of shipboard life, while the management and operation of the Hospital, as a vessel, must also, of necessity, adapt itself to conditions entirely different from any other ship afloat. At the same time, however, we must conform inexorably to the rules and conditions laid down by the United States Inspectors of Steamboats in all that is required for safety and discipline.

With these points in mind a business man, or one acquainted with hospital life, organization, and discipline among employees, will instantly see that a spirit of co-operation and adaptability to new conditions is an absolute prerequisite in every person intrusted with any degree of responsibility in connection with our institution. I have had this idea firmly on my mind during the past four seasons, and while I realize that perfection has not yet been attained, it is my belief that the coming season will show that we have made a great advance toward the standard to which we have aspired and for the attainment of which I have every reason to thank the Trustees for their attitude of confidence, which I gratefully acknowledge.

I am pleased to report that time and again visitors who come to us with friendly criticism frequently commend the excellent spirit shown by physicians, nurses, and all classes of employees. Our business methods are also given the confidence and approval of the community, but I can state with assurance that they have not crowded out the sentiment of good will and sympathetic service along the lines for which we are organized.

Captain George F. Simpson has finished his third year in command of the ship, having begun in 1907 as mate. I wish to testify to the excellent spirit he has displayed in his work, and to the industry and care he has shown during the winter months, when his personal labor did so much to save us expense. The usual annual government inspection of the ship reflected credit on him. Our chief engineer is to be Jesse B. Upton, who served during 1909 as our assistant engineer, and his faithfulness entitled him to this promotion.

William M. McIver, who began in 1906 as chef on the old boat, will serve his fifth season as steward, and credit is due him for the able manner in which he acts, not only as a steward of the ship, but as a steward of the Hospital.

Dr. Henry C. Marble served his third year as chief of our Food Laboratory, and has recently been appointed as Resident Physician for the season 1910, and it has been my belief that his thorough experience with the every-day life and procedure in our Hospital will serve us in good stead.

Dr. Robert B. Hunt, who was formerly assistant in the Food Laboratory, will have charge the coming season.

Miss Sarah A. Egan, who graduated in our post-graduate course in 1906, and served as head-nurse on the Day Patients' deck in 1907 and 1908, has been appointed Superintendent of Nurses for the season of 1910, and Miss Hilda O. Lawson, a graduate of this Hospital in 1904, will serve her second season as Night Superintendent of Nurses.

In analyzing the work of the Hospital for the season of 1909, it may be well to bear in mind at the outset that our institution is the only one in the city which can provide care for any considerable number of sick babies during the summer months. Our work is essentially emergency work, and this fact is borne into one's mind by the fact that in all the large cities statistics show that the deaths among children under five years of age are between four and five times as great during the months of July, August, and September than in any other three months in the year, thus furnishing ample reason for the supporters of our work to feel fully justified in the expenditure of funds for an institution which is peculiarly adapted to meet this emergency work in behalf of the child life of the city If the imagination may be given a little play, let any one acquainted with the average hospital on the hot, dusty, dirty street corner think what it would mean to have the building bodily removed, with all its equipment and conveniences, to a point in Boston Harbor where may be obtained the freshest, coolest breeze, being able to avoid the hot off-shore breeze so often prevailing at a beach, and then will be seen the justification for the expense incurred in the maintenance of our plant during the heated term.

Every possible means is used to apprise the public of the advantages

offered by treatment in our Hospital, and we are bending our efforts to induce parents and physicians to send children to us before it is too late to make our help effective. Practically 25 per cent. of the deaths on board our ship were moribund cases when admitted.

It would be mere repetition for me to refer specifically to each department of work on the boat, as I have done in previous reports, but I can only commend most heartily the efficiency and success of all of our responsible heads of departments.

I must refer to the high standard of work in our Food Laboratory, a department which may be considered the most important in its connection with the welfare of our patients. Reference must be made to the instruction to mothers, which was well carried out, and produced results which justified still further extension in 1910.

The nurses, also, profited by the systematic teaching given them during the term which they spent in practical work under Dr. Marble. Some idea may be given of the enormous volume of work throughout our institution by stating that our minimum feedings were about 600 a day, and our maximum 1,587 a day, with a total for the season of over 97,000 bottles of specially prepared feedings.

The Boston Floating Hospital is known throughout the country as offering a post-graduate course of unique attractiveness to graduate nurses, who, perhaps, may not have had the advantages of institutions dealing with infants' and small children's diseases. We believe that that the further plans which are being considered will make the course which we offer much more attractive to nurses.

In closing, I wish particularly to state my appreciation of my very pleasant relations with representatives of all the different newspapers, without whose aid we could not have gained the hearty support of the public, who learn first hand by the papers of our needs, and of the conduct of the work which justifies the support so generously given by the community.

Following will be found the usual statistics and financial statements showing the work of the year, all of which may be commended to those who desire exact and careful information.



NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.



THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL.

SEASON OF 1910.

INTRODUCTION.

It gives me great pleasure to present this report to the public, having been connected with The Boston Floating Hospital for fifteen of the sixteen years of its existence.

The demand which brought us into existence was the necessity for the relief of the children of the poor in the intense heat of summer. Our first arrangements were but little different from those for the ordinary day excursions. We started by hiring a barge for one day each week, increasing this service as the contributions warranted. Four years later we bought this barge and refitted it for hospital use. Meanwhile our organization had grown from volunteer service to a paid corps of nurses and an organized medical staff. The next important steps were twenty-four hour treatment, the insistence that our nurses should be graduates of some training school, and the establishment of a post-graduate course of instruction with diplomas.

The splendid bequest of Mrs. Potter made a new boat possible in 1906, with accommodations for 125 permanent and 125 day patients, in place of the total of about 100 which could be cared for comfortably on the old boat. With the new boat and its more nearly adequate facilities the administration has improved, better medical records have been devised, and are not only in such shape that they may be easily consulted by physicians throughout the year, but have served in several instances as models for other institutions; and our methods have been carried by our certificated doctors and nurses to distant parts of the world. We annually have nurses from points as far distant as St. Louis, Minneapolis, Montreal, and New Orleans; and they have gone out from us to such varied services as positions in New Zealand, The American Hospital at Rome, families among the nobility of England, as well as into innumerable families in our own country.

The medical treatment has progressed with the advance in other lines. This year we instituted the use of breast milk, which we shall continue in

a larger way next year. The bacteriological work which we have conducted for some years was increased by the employment of Dr. Arthur I. Kendall, through the courtesy of the Harvard Medical School. In 1911 we shall extend the work by giving Dr. Kendall two assistants. Our Medical Staff felt so certain of the results to be obtained that they personally raised most of the funds for this work outside our regular contributions, and the results have justified their faith and the generosity of the special contributors.

The season of 1911 will open with better co-ordination of the work in financial, relief, medical, and scientific lines. As Trustees, we endeavor that each dollar expended shall accomplish all that is possible for it to do, and that the progressive standard shall be maintained and our work enlarged as fast as our public provides the funds. The reports and statistics following will be of interest, and are commended to the friends of the work.

REPORT OF THE MANAGER.

Every charitable organization dependent upon the contributions of the public must make report through a financial statement of its receipts and expenditures, but underlying all this there should be given to the public, if possible, some conception of the spirit in which the work is carried on. This report has distinct parts: one concerns the manner in which its benefits are carried to those for whom the work is organized and conducted; the other concerns most vitally a true accounting and letting in of the light on the methods employed in bringing out the results on which the money is spent.

It is on the writer's mind that those who intrust their money to this Hospital to be spent should feel a thorough reliance on those who, in the literal spirit of Trustees, conserve the funds to the greatest possible extent which business-like methods will permit.

The writer, in his effort to carry out the policy of the Trustees, has had the great advantage of the skilled service of the auditing department of the Stone & Webster Management Association, and each year shows a decided improvement in accounting methods and in the handling of supplies along the lines of the best practice in public service corporations. We cordially invite business men and others to inspect the methods of the purchase of supplies, their handling and issue, both in the wards of the Hospital and in the other parts of our ship.

We pay fair wages and properly feed employees who must be thorough and diligent, each in his or her own part, in carrying out the spirit of the system. This, in the long run, merits the hearty approval and indorsement of practical people who wish that the money given to a charity shall accomplish the end they have in mind when the gift is made.

Our institution is young as compared with other of Boston's well-known charities. Our endowment brings us at present an income of only about 2 per cent. of our annual expense. Through the anxious years when the founders of this Hospital were proving the value of their experiment, it was natural that practical people should hesitate to make payment of any large endowment sums until the permanency and fixed value of the work should be assured. Now that we possess property assuring permanency, with a reputation built up not alone along lines of professional and scien-

tific usefulness, but also along business lines, it should appeal to those who are selecting objects for their favor in the bestowal of funds for permanent endowment.

Those concerned in the administrative functions of the Hospital should certainly conduct themselves in a true spirit of open-minded co-operation. In no hospital in the world is that more necessary than in an institution which includes within its scope the detail of the every-day life of the efficient nurse, doctor, and general employee on board a ship. I can commend most emphatically this spirit among those who filled the principal administrative positions on the ship during the season, most of whom have served us through two or more seasons and proved their value.

I can safely say that the last season marked the greatest advance in the co-operation of the medical and administrative departments thus far made. For this we are most deeply indebted to the unvarying courtesy, patience, and appreciation of the Visiting Staff, the Resident Physician, and the House Officers.

All honor is due the efficient corps of nurses who upheld the best traditions of the work in the care of the sick children in our charge. These were organized under Miss Sarah A. Egan as Superintendent of Nurses and Miss Hilda O. Lawson as Night Superintendent.

It is thought that the intelligent people of Boston have an accurate idea of the peculiar position of this Hospital in the community. It stands unique in that it is entirely an emergency hospital, meeting the untoward conditions to which the children of the poor are subjected during the hot weather.

During the past three years we have grown to believe that we should not be too dependent on agents of other organizations for information about our patients and the families from which they come. Careful observation in 1908 laid the ground-work for the beginning in 1909 of what we call "on shore" duty. In that year we were assisted by another organization which assigned three nurses to our "on shore" work. The reports of these nurses were of such help to our doctors in the treatment of their patients that for the season of 1910 we employed Miss Helen B. Fenton, formerly connected with the Massachusetts General Hospital, who did faithful and efficient work, assisting particularly in the cases of day patients by seeing to it that their food and treatment, when they returned home for the night, did not destroy all the gain they had made during the day.

This work as carried on has not entailed elaborate or expensive reports, the value of which would be greater in hospitals in operation throughout the year than in our three months' emergency work. We expect to continue this work as our conditions call for it.

And so, at the risk of seeming to lack sentiment and of displaying too much cold-blooded business method, we have gone on perfecting and improving the work of our institution along well-defined lines consistent with the faithful expenditure of the funds which have been intrusted to us. Until this Hospital has cleared all its debt, has established itself on an even more definite working basis than at present, and has behind it sufficient endowment to provide for at least half the income for its annual current expenses, it will be well for the Hospital, even at the risk of criticism, to adhere to its special line of work, receiving patients from all other institutions and thus far co-operating with and helping them in what they may be trying to do.

We desire to thank most heartily the large number of business concerns who have made gifts and concessions to our work during the past year.

In closing my report for the season, I wish to express to the friends of the institution how much we have been indebted to the newspapers of Boston and other places for their hearty support of our work and the great help they have given us in making known our necessities as well as our successes. In connection with my duties as manager I come in close contact with the reporters of the various newspapers, as well as with many special magazine writers, and I cannot let the opportunity pass without stating my sincere appreciation of the pleasant friendships I have made through understanding the cordial good-heartedness that these workers for the public weal have shown in their untiring loyalty in personally doing all in their power to help our work.

REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

The season of 1910 has been one of advanced effort and marked success along medical lines. The desire of the Visiting Staff for the solution of problems, new and old, furnished the keynote of the season's work, and this desire was met with a spirit of unusual enthusiasm and willingness for hard, concerted endeavor on the part of the house staff.

The *personnel* of the Hospital Staff was all that could be desired. Their hearty co-operation and consistent help in carrying out the orders of the Visiting Staff merit and have my sincere appreciation.

A new position has been added, that of Junior Externe, and with his help the work on the Day Patients' deck was far superior to that of any previous year. This position should be continued, in order that the standard may be maintained.

The co-operation of the Milk and Baby Hygiene in opening the Sun Court Street Station so that mothers could obtain milk for their babies at 4.30 P.M. for the night, did much to supplement this phase of the work, and it was a matter of gratification to us that we could reciprocate by giving special training and instruction to one of the nurses of their organization, who later took charge of a milk station.

The research work which was begun in the summer of 1909 was greatly extended this season under Dr. Arthur I. Kendall as Bacteriologist, who gave to it the benefits of his extended knowledge, gained by years of careful laboratory work. Reports on some of the results of this work have been published in the Boston *Medical and Surgical Journal*, and also as a monograph by our Visiting Staff. The House Staff is indebted to Dr. Kendall for his great helpfulness in their work, and I want to express my personal thanks for the opportunity he afforded staff and nurses for the observation of research work.

The use of breast milk was inaugurated this season. About four quarts were procured daily, and many feeble infants owe their lives directly to its use. I believe this work to be absolutely necessary for the reduction of the death-rate, and Mrs. Henderson, the nurse who had charge of the collection of the milk, deserves high praise for a successful accomplishment that in other institutions has been deemed impossible.

A "follow up" system has been instituted, with Miss Fenton in charge. The work has been unique as related to our Hospital, and has been of great assistance to the Medical Staff. Miss Fenton set a high standard, and if the work is enlarged and extended, as I trust it may be, substantial results will be obtained.

The system of charts and records has been completely reorganized, and we now have a more useful and comprehensive set of records than ever before.

The ventilation system has been the subject of continued study, with the view of giving to the babies the best possible atmospheric conditions. The boat has gone out into mid-stream every hot night, thus spending at least eighteen hours away from the dock. In this way better ventilation and, from a medical viewpoint, far better treatment have been available. I feel that this should be an established custom.

A consideration of these facts will explain to some extent the reduction of the mortality from 37 per cent. in 1909 to 27 per cent. in 1910,—a record which places the Hospital in the forefront of institutions for the treatment and cure of the diseases of childhood.

I desire to express my hearty and deep appreciation of the helpful cooperation of the Manager, the Superintendent of Nurses, the heads of the different departments on the boat and their respective forces, in the work which I have endeavored to do during the past year. Without this cooperation the work of the Hospital would have been successful, but the work of the Resident Physician would have been less satisfactory and far less pleasant.

The Staff is much indebted to Dr. Rosenau, of the Harvard Medical School, for the use of the Laboratory and for many courtesies extended in connection with the research work; to the New England Hospital for Women and Children, Massachusetts General, Boston City and Massachusetts Homœopathic Hospitals for ambulances on the closing day of the season.

Throughout the season I have been sustained and encouraged by the active sympathy of the members of the Visiting Staff, and I cannot adequately express to them and to the Trustees my gratitude for being permitted a share in the work of what I believe to have been the most successful season of The Boston Floating Hospital.

Following will be found statistics giving the detail of operations for the year, a study of which is commended to those interested.

STATEMENT OF THE VISITING STAFF.



NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.



THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL.

SEASON OF 1911.

INTRODUCTION.

In presenting to the supporters of The Boston Floating Hospital their report of its eighteenth year of operation, the Trustees have a satisfaction which will be shared by these friends in the evidences of the steady growth and progress set forth in the detailed reports of its various departments which follow.

The number of patients treated, while below the record number of 1910, is still above the average of the past six years. The methods of treatment and care have kept pace with the best practice in the best hospitals, and in many respects have been found worthy of adoption by these. The progress in bacteriological and scientific work has been marked not only by immediate results of value to the medical profession, but has indicated the exceptional opportunity of this Hospital for the study of childhood diseases which is being accepted with enthusiasm by the various medical staffs.

Only those in close touch with the work may note the adoption and effect of changes and innovations from one year to another. A comparison of periods of years shows a steady progress, in which of course some of the steps are more prominent, though perhaps no more important than others. From a quest for health to be found in the breezes of the harbor for a few children to a hospital caring for thousands suffering from every disease peculiar to childhood as well as many of those common to mankind; from a hired barge to a hospital equipped to care for more children than any other in the country; from a few volunteer care-takers locally interested to a corps of graduate nurses of country-wide selection, including often superintendents of other hospitals; from graduate nurses giving of their training to graduate nurses sent to all parts of our country with an experience not offered elsewhere; from the purchase of an anchor that the boat may be kept in mid-stream through the night in the endeavor to save two lives to twenty-four-hour service throughout the summer and a night anchorage,—these are some of the progressive steps taken.

been in response to a legitimate demand, and the meeting of the demand has opened a new possibility. And so has come the development of our On Shore work, which during its third year has occupied the time of two visitors. Plans have already been made for the extension of this work in 1912, whereby its benefits may be carried to those who may not come in direct contact with the work on the boat.

The character of the work and its growth justify the Trustees in asking a larger share of popular support for the work of 1912. Reference to the report of the Treasurer will show a deficit in the current expense account of 1911 which must be met from the income of 1912, which income, it is hoped, will also be adequate for our current needs.

In 1906 the hospital boat was built and put in service, replacing the barge "Clifford" at a cost of \$174,000, to meet which, in addition to gifts, \$74,000 5 per cent. bonds were issued. \$52,000 of these bonds have been retired without appeal to our contributors of the past six years. These bonds mature in April, 1913, and contributions to this amount are asked for in addition to those for current needs.

To those who have made possible the splendid results outlined in this report and have helped the Trustees in the steady growth in usefulness of the institution intrusted to them we have given as best we could of our abilities in the use of our income for the logical demands made upon us. We look forward to larger accomplishments in which the public is asked to share by contributions adequate to accomplish the work for which The Boston Floating Hospital is organized.

REPORT OF THE VISITING STAFF

It is with pleasure that the Staff reports for the season of 1911 the steady progress of the medical and bacteriological work committed to their care.

In the summer of 1910, on the recommendation of the Staff, Dr. Arthur I. Kendall was appointed bacteriologist, the work of this department having grown to an extent and importance which rendered its prosecution under the methods of previous years impracticable and to a degree unsatisfactory.

In order that the results of the work might be available for record and reference, the hospital forms were revised and simplified, so that better and more accurate data were obtained with less clerical work on the part of the House Physician. The Staff and its assistants were enthusiastic in the closer study of the causes of the diseases treated during the summer, and at the close of the season we were able to publish in pamphlet form a series of papers which served to give the Hospital a higher medical status than it had previously occupied.

So promising and encouraging was the work of 1910 that the Trustees granted to Dr. Kendall two assistants of special abilities, making possible still closer study along bacterial, chemical, and clinical lines. A great amount of pathological investigation from *post-mortem* examinations was done, which, it is hoped, may be embodied in a second series of articles by members of the Staff.

The nursing force and House Staff were efficient, the permanent wards were not pushed beyond their capacity, and both nursing and treatment were therefore more effective. With closer study thus made possible and the advance in bacterial and pathological investigations, each year finds us better equipped to fight against the diarrhœal diseases of infancy.

The Committee on Childhood Health Exhibit on several occasions gave demonstrations and talks to the mothers of our patients, as a part of the preventive work of the Hospital which is being gradually developed.

The Staff records its appreciation of the sympathy and cordial support of the Trustees in its efforts to attain to its ideal in the work of the Hospital.

REPORT OF THE MANAGER.

The preparations for the season of 1911 were not different from those of previous years, no radical changes being made in our machinery or fittings, and the work being done almost entirely by our own employees. The tests of the Steamboat Inspectors, although unusually severe this year, were satisfactorily met.

Despite the excessive heat of the early summer we were able to care for all patients brought to us. Great credit is due to the general employees for their faithfulness and the excellence of their work under conditions which almost prostrated many lines of work in the city.

The work of the year shows a gratifying advance in efficiency and in the co-operation of the different departments, and, while, like other hospitals, we have not reached and may not reach perfection, we believe that each year we progress as a whole.

Our strongest appeal is naturally to those who rejoice with us that we are able to save the lives and restore the health of children, at the same time giving to tired and heart-sick mothers the respite they so often need in common with their children during the strain of the unusual weather conditions which prevail in every large city in summer.

Secondarily, but of great importance to those who appreciate intelligent progress, may be noted the educational features of the work which are being each year developed and broadened by the Staff and those having in charge the organization of our nursing force, and the demonstration work of the Food Laboratory, in the care and preparation of milk as the most important article in the dietary of a hospital.

The chief of this department is to be relieved from routine work, in order to enlarge his part in the training which attracts to us the best graduate nurses of the country, thereby meeting the wishes of the Trustees that our course of training may be enlarged and strengthened.

My recommendation for the appointment of an assistant for the Superintendent of Nurses has been accepted, and opportunity will thus be afforded for a more thorough drilling of the nurses in the points of instruction peculiar to our Hospital.

It has been my pleasure, as the representative of the Trustees, to meet,

as far as possible, the requests and suggestions of the Visiting Staff, and their report indicates a reasonable degree of successful effort.

We continue to develop, as the demand grows, what is technically known as Social Service Work, but which in our institution has been modestly called, since its inception in 1909, "follow-up work." Our limitations in this field are indicated in the following extract from a letter of Dr. Henry I. Bowditch, Chairman of the Visiting Staff, June 26, 1911. He says:—

... "My belief as to this work, a most admirable one, in our sphere as an economic hospital aid to the community, is briefly stated. It is limited in the first place by our short season, therefore causing us to have very transitory supervision of our cases. It is limited to a further extent by the class of cases we treat, acute cases rapidly admitted, and, on account of the demand for beds, rapidly discharged, which usually are secondary cases, being referred from other agencies and physicians. . . .

"The brief stay under our care would make a complete social investigation almost an impossibility without great expense in salaries and records. The referred type of our case would further suggest, it seems to me, that our responsibility should be only to help an existing agency, and, when through with our work, see that such cases were returned to the original source. Rarely it may be necessary to look up a case in full detail, for the greater part of our work lies along a different plan from the other hospitals as long as we remain a summer hospital."

We have had during the season two nurses constantly at work, one spending her whole time in "follow-up work," keeping in close touch with the doctors and nurses of the Day Patients' Deck, and with the office during the day. On page 12 will be found, taken from her records, description of instances of the value of the work done by her. The other has, more successfully the second year than the first, collected breast milk, our method being that indorsed by members of the medical fraternity as the most practicable and economical.

The Hospital is supported almost entirely by the voluntary contributions of its friends. For many of these we are indebted to the kindness of the newspapers and their representatives, who have always been most generous in making known not only our successes, but our necessities.

I am extremely appreciative of the kindly counsel and advice of the Trustees in many of the problems arising during the past summer.

Peter had been brought to the boat partially prostrated, and had spent several days there, recovering from the effects of the hot weather and the questionable diet supplied by an over-indulgent mother. But, when he failed to return, the fact was taken into consideration that the neighbors had reported the case some time previously to the Health Department, and the Manager felt more or less responsibility in the matter. It was with satisfaction that he recognized the advantage of being able to send the Follow-up Nurse to the home, to see that the cure should be permanent.

And it developed that Peter's troubles had come to a crisis in the cutting of his first tooth, and that the few days of adequate care, fresh air, and good milk had tided him over a difficult period. But it had done more than that. The lessons learned on the open deck had borne good fruit. The father was buying *good* milk, and the baby was being bathed daily and kept cool and quiet.


When the mother realized that a nurse had come "way out by my house jes to see if the baby was well," one felt assured of the mental reservation that, should the child get sick again, she would know where to take him before he got "bad sick."

HAROLD.

Harold had spent two days on The Boston Floating Hospital as a convalescent pneumonia patient; but two days alone can do little for a child whose constitution, none too vigorous at the best, has suffered the severe strain of a pulmonary disease.

And yet on the third day, as the great boat pulled out, it left one small portion of its work unfinished, for Harold had not come aboard. Hospital authorities, however, are fast realizing that bedside care, especially of its children, is only one phase of nursing, and that the Follow-up Nurse is the legitimate bond between the Hospital and the home.

And so the Follow-up Nurse called upon Harold, and found his mother doing the duty of double parenthood, but failing to realize, in the stress of earning the daily bread, that her baby was not yet well enough to thrive under the makeshift care she could give him at home.

It was necessary for the nurse to enter patiently into the most minute details of child hygiene, not frightening the mother with technicalities, but gaining her confidence by sympathetic appreciation of the individual circumstances. This is only possible to those who, giving personal service to all people, learn intuitively to understand human needs. Arrangements were made, at last, to supply car-fare,—an item when the income barely covers the necessities of life,—and permission was given for the child to remain on the boat until six o'clock, that the mother might call for it on her way from the factory. Harold was one of the first little passengers to board the boat the next morning, and the Hospital Board may congratulate itself that its work is reaching out further every day,—its work of being good neighbor to the unfortunate.

THE TWINS.

Beside Bed 9 on the Day Patients' Deck of The Boston Floating Hospital sat a mother, pale and worried-looking, and only half-well herself. Her eyes wandered from Bed 9 to Bed 10 where the other twin lay, both babies in a state that left their recovery a question of care. At the end of the day, half-heartedly she took them home, for the permanent wards were filled, and she must needs spend another night doing her poor best for them.

In the morning the doctors watched uneasily for her, but she did not come. When the boat was ready to leave, they eagerly sought and instructed the Follow-up Nurse to look up the babies; if necessary, stimulate them, and in all events to bring them back to the boat, for room had been made for them.

At the home the nurse found that the mother, a convalescent herself, had attempted bringing them to the boat, but had not felt well enough. She gratefully gave them into the care of the nurse, who, after stimulating them for the trip, carried them to the Hospital.

The mother marvels a bit at the kindness of a hospital that cares what happens outside its wards, and tells the story over and over to her neighbors.

In the ward, after a few days, the sturdy cry that means "it's time for my breakfast" told its own story of the benefit that can be derived when opportunity is recognized and philanthropy becomes systematized.

REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

The season of 1911, extending from June 29 to September 15, was, in essentials, similar to previous seasons, the medical work being of the same high grade as the result of the careful selection of House Officers by the Visiting Staff; the increased efficiency of the methods of administration introduced in the season of 1910 showing in the following comparative figures:—

The above figures show an extended treatment of both classes of patients, which practically compensates for the smaller number of individuals treated. The increase in the number of deaths may be attributed to the excessive heat of early June, which brought to us in the early part of the season a larger number than usual of critical cases, the percentage of moribund cases to deaths being 20.5 per cent. in 1910 as compared with 31.47 per cent. in 1911, an increase of 11.42 per cent., the increase in total deaths being only 5.15 per cent. in spite of the generally critical character of the 438 cases treated.

A modification of the physical conditions on the boat was reflected in the general health of physicians, nurses, and employees. Co-ordination of the medical and educational departments of the Hospital kept pace with the advance in other lines of the work, and the close of the season not only justifies the ideal sought for the Hospital, but leaves these departments in a condition to make possible still more marked advances in 1912.

The Resident Physician and those working under him express their appreciation of the services of the administrative departments which have so largely made possible such good results as they are able to show.

The relations of this Hospital with other agencies for the safeguarding

of infant life are most cordial, and we are indebted to many of them for valuable courtesies.

I desire to again give expression to my gratitude for the sympathetic co-operation of the Visiting and Consulting Staffs and for the confidence and support of the Board of Trustees.







