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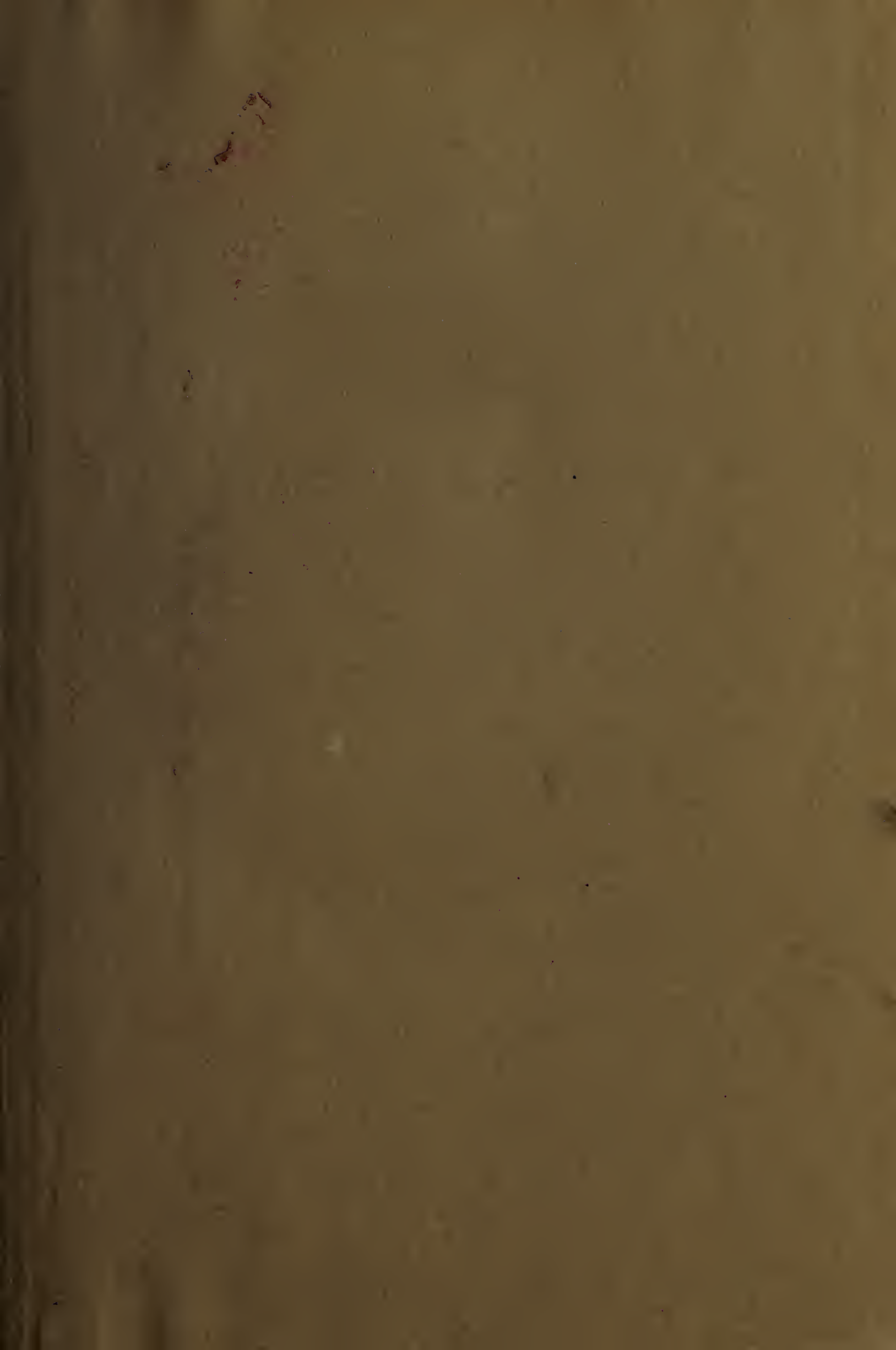

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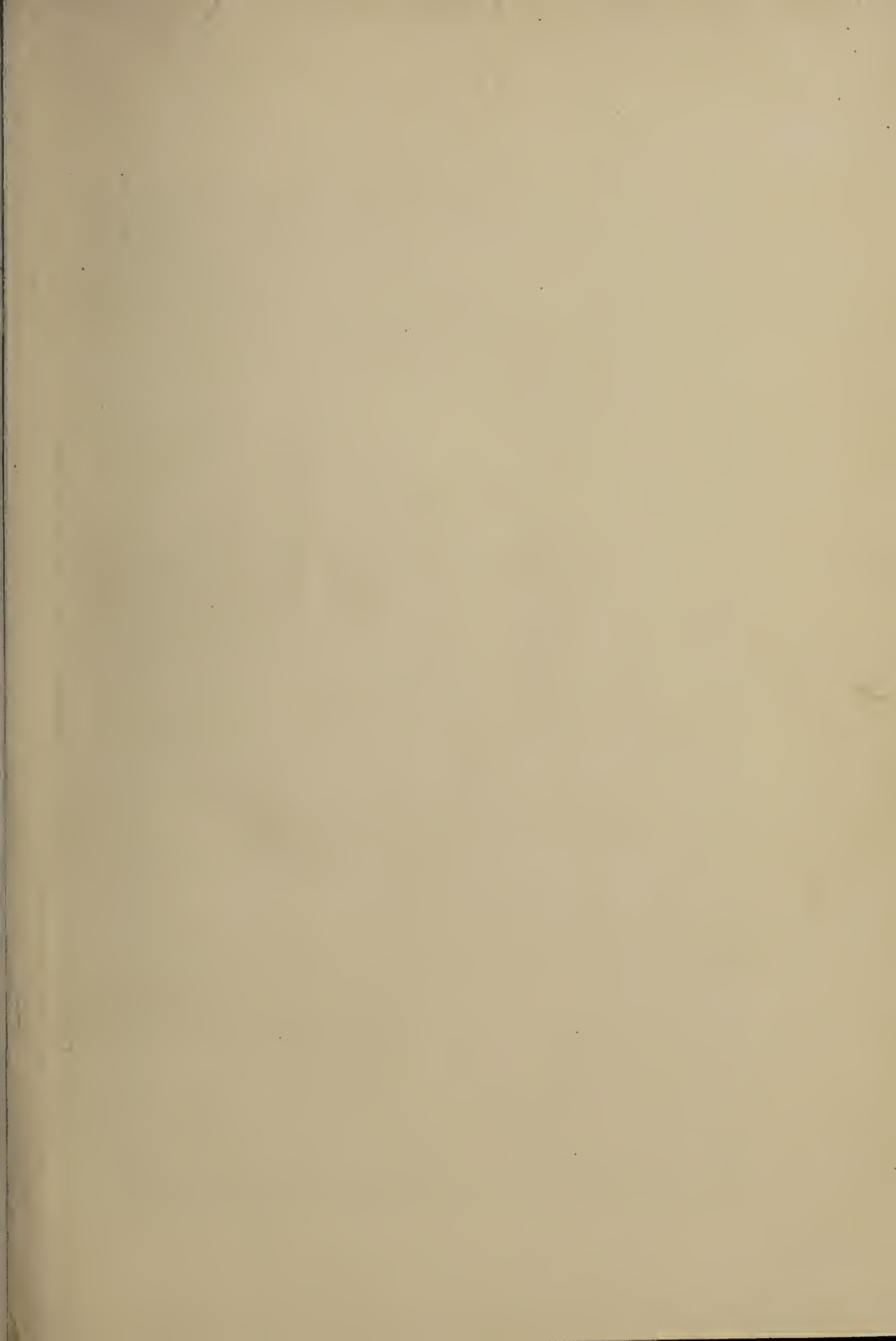

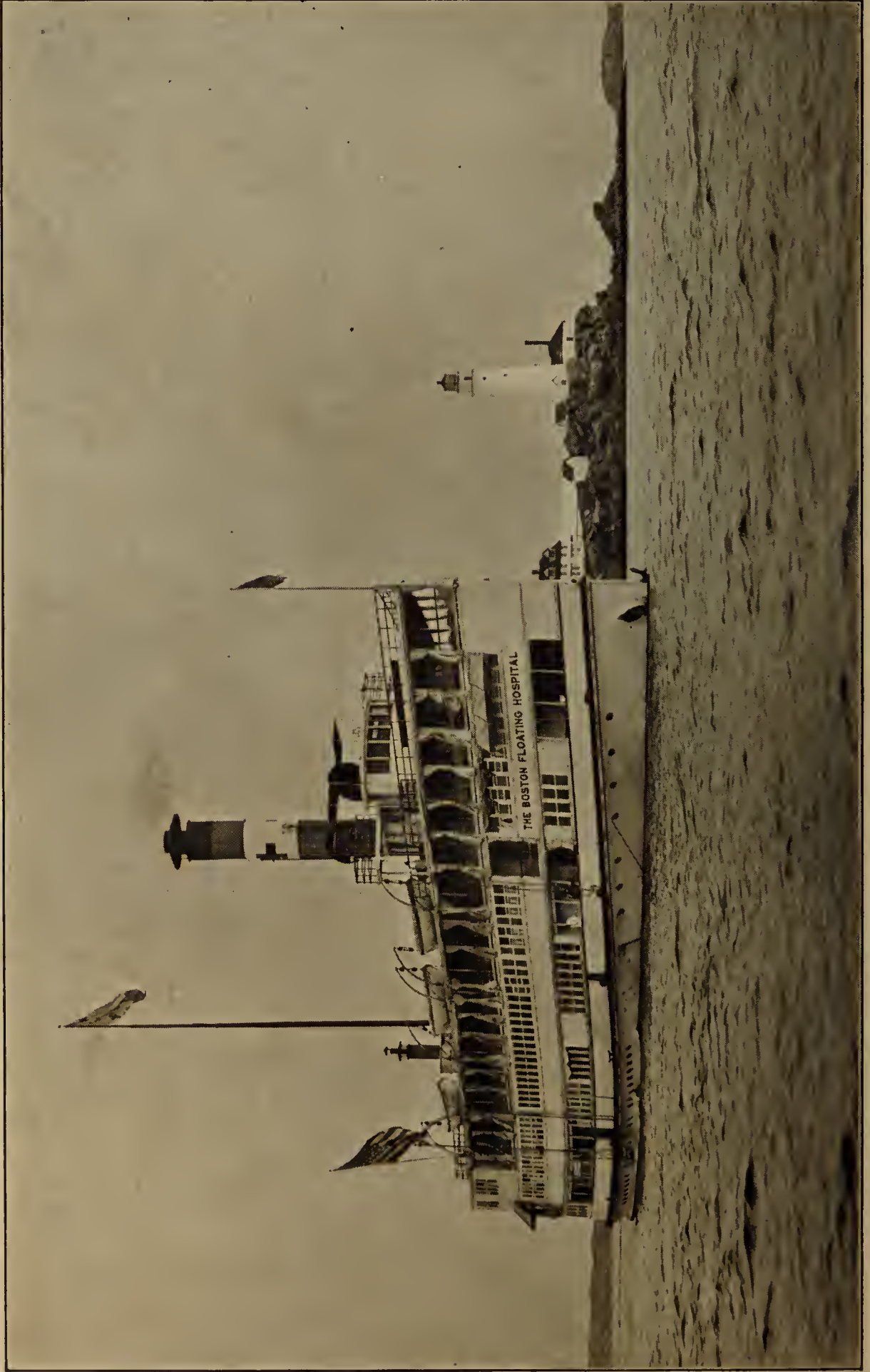

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

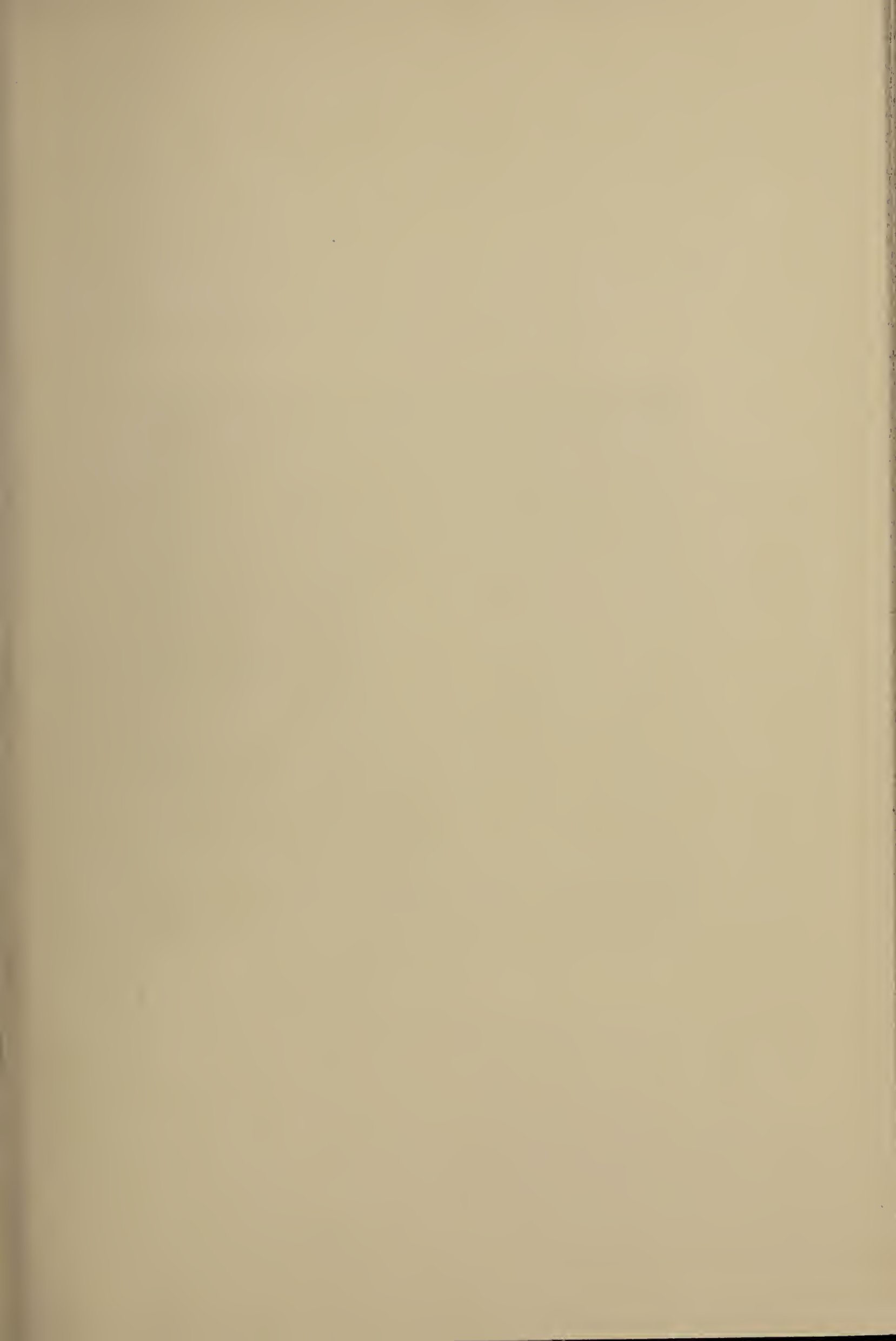
The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean linen and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL.

SEASON OF 1912.

INTRODUCTION.

For the nineteenth time we present our report of a year's work. The detailed statements given elsewhere show what we have accomplished and emphasize the spirit of co-operation which animates all departments.

The number of patients does not differ substantially from past years. Our work, however, shows steady progress. Our special field is children's diseases of the Digestive Tract, their relief and prevention. Since such diseases are more prevalent in the hot weather, the greater part of our active work is done during this season.

In 1910 we commenced the bacteriological study of these diseases with Dr. Arthur I. Kendall in charge. For the season of 1913 he is still with us with an increased staff and a larger laboratory. In co-operation with his work we have arranged for a bio-chemical study of the same material under the charge of Mr. Alfred W. Bosworth. Already the bacteriological investigations aiding the medical have given us treatments which successfully cope with some diseases which before were hopeless. From the enlarged scope of our investigations, we hope for still greater results. The records of our different departments are carefully kept and collated so that the results of the investigations and treatment as applied to similar cases can be quickly compared.

These records are accessible at any time of the year to any proper person for reference or study. Thus our investigations enable us to carry out still more effectively our original object,—the relief of the suffering of children and the giving of hope and assistance to the parents.

Our on-shore work has been continued through the year, enabling us to both close the old season and open the new one more effectively and helps to prevent patients once cured from again becoming sick. The important feature of this work, especially during our summer season, has been to see that the children were properly fed, and, as in past years, we have sup-

plied from our laboratory special modified milk for convalescents and cases of need.

There are two lines of research which we would take up if funds were sufficient. First, the study from the bacteriological and chemical standpoints of the normal digestive operations in children and their comparison with the abnormal conditions upon which we are now working. The second is the study of the pathological material which we accumulate through our work. Material furnished by us has assisted in identifying some of the germs distinctively connected with whooping-cough. We believe that much of our other material would have similar value if properly studied.

We ask your assistance in carrying out our mission in all these ways,—the relief and prevention of suffering through hospital work, special training of nurses and physicians, investigation, and the dissemination of the knowledge acquired.

An established charity like the Boston Floating Hospital should have an endowment sufficient to provide income for at least half its current expenses. With an endowment of \$500,000, instead of the present \$40,000, we should see clearer our way toward the accomplishment of our purposes and the fulfilment of the desires of the supporters of the work. To this end we welcome bequests and gifts, large and small, as well as undiminished contributions for our current expenses.

REPORT OF THE VISITING STAFF.

The Boston Floating Hospital is at the present time probably the largest hospital in the United States treating acute intestinal diseases of children during the warm weather. The Hospital is unique in that it runs for only three months during the year, and from the day of its opening can accommodate 120 babies in its wards and as many more day patients. For the past four years, besides carefully studying the treatment of our patients, the Staff has been able, with the assistance of the management, to put the treatment on a more scientific basis.

During the summer of 1910 a bacteriological laboratory was established, with Dr. Arthur I. Kendall in charge, and has been continued under his direction. The results of this department have far exceeded our first hopes. Its co-operation with the Staff in the ward work has done much to advance our knowledge of summer diseases.

Papers have been written from the laboratory and clinical wards, which have led to wide-spread interest in the Hospital in medical centres.

For the ensuing summer the Staff, with the assistance of the management, is to advance another step, and study from a chemical point of view these same cases so vital to childhood. It hopes in this way to make the hospital work as complete as possible. Our object is to be able to diagnose our cases from the combined clinical, bacteriological, and chemical point of view, to better understand the probable cause of the intestinal disturbances, and through such understanding to treat our patients more scientifically.

With our pathological examinations this gives us an opportunity, we feel, of unusually rare scientific possibility.

We wish to congratulate the Trustees of the Hospital on their work in making possible such a remarkably co-operative medical institution.

REPORT OF THE MANAGER.

The volume of work done by the Hospital is quite as large as in the previous year, and a review of it would be simply repetition. Each year shows improvement and progress, and each season we obtain new ideas and are even now planning for the year 1913 with a hopefulness that will show a result in still better work.

During the first six months of the fiscal year just ended, our engineer and several of our regular employees were busy in relocating the ventilating ducts, fans, motors, etc. With the occasional assistance of outside help this work was completed, and a successful rearrangement of the space, both in the engine-room and on the main deck, was effected. The added water capacity thus obtained was absolutely essential, as it turned out, to the nightly anchorage in the harbor, while the added bunker space for fuel made possible a great saving in labor and trouble, and the promise of less frequent coaling was of essential effect with the coal company when the usual contract was made. As the result of these changes, our engineer has been able to show a marked saving in coal.

Our "on-shore" work was extended and improved, and it must be believed that we are properly feeling our way toward certain functions for the year-round work which will be possible when our financial resources permit.

Tentative plans for the enlargement and extension of the bacteriological work have been fully discussed, and upon the visit in March, which I understand Dr. Kendall is likely to make, it is probable that more definite arrangements can be made both as to the further organization of this department as it may relate to the Harvard Medical School and the necessity of enlarging, by certain changes, the facilities for laboratory work on board the boat.

A clinical meeting held in the summer, under the auspices of the Visiting Staff, was attended by fifty or more physicians. The evening was spent in the study of cases on board, the inspection of the Food Laboratory and other departments of the boat, and the discussion of the following papers:

1. Dr. Arthur I. Kendall, "Intestinal Bacteriology."
2. Dr. James Herbert Young, "The Use of Fat-free Milk Curds."
3. Dr. Henry I. Bowditch, "The Clinical Effect of Curds from Whole Milk on Diarrhoeas with Blood and Pus in the Cells."

4. Dr. Willard S. Parker, "Methods of Determining Acidosis in Acute Infections."

5. Dr. Arthur A. Howard, "A Case of Epilepsy with Unusual Etiology."

6. Dr. Fritz B. Talbot, "A Case of Diarrhœa due to Gas Bacillus treated with Buttermilk."

7. Dr. Richard M. Smith, "Cases of Diarrhœa due to the Gas Bacillus with Fatal Outcome."

8. Dr. Stanley Cobb, "The Post-mortem Findings in Cases of Infection of Gas Bacillus."

The meeting appeared to thoroughly satisfy the Visiting Staff, and stimulated them in bespeaking the advancement of our institution as an active working agency and an educational force.

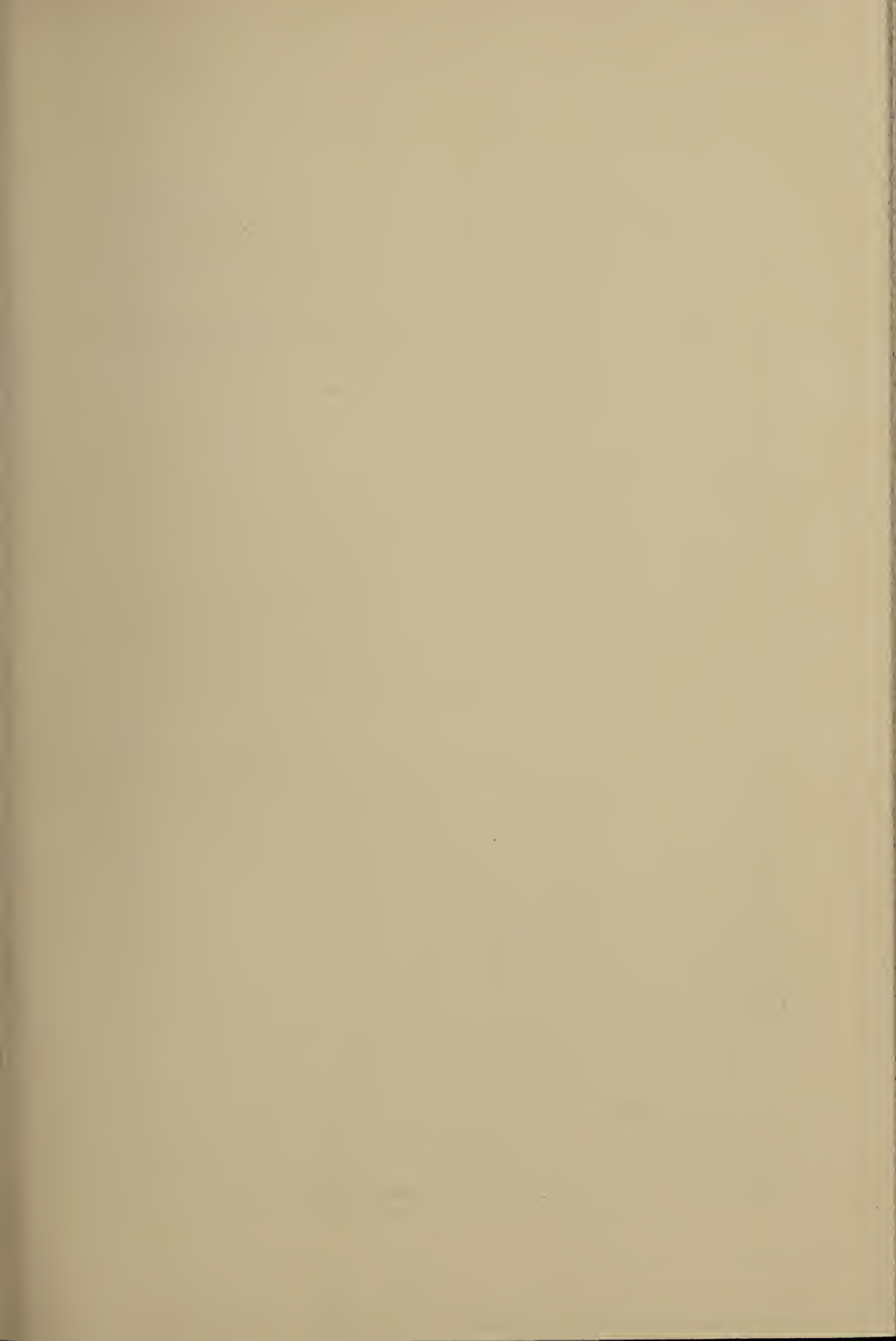
REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

The Boston Floating Hospital is a hospital devoted to the care of sick infants up to the age of five years. Often there is misunderstanding concerning the fact that patients stay on the boat permanently. There are in the institution two separate departments,—the Day Patients' Department, where the infants are taken for the day only, with their mothers, and the Permanent Wards, where the sicker cases are admitted and remain as permanent patients exactly as in other general hospitals, remaining night and day under care without their mothers. Naturally, the Day Patients' Department refers the sickest cases into the Permanent Wards, where they remain permanently. In the Day Patients' Department 120 infants, with attendants, can be cared for. In the Permanent Wards a similar number, viz., 120, can be cared for. The wards are administered as in any hospital, under the charge of the Visiting Physician, who visits them daily through the House Physicians, who remain on board night and day. Each ward has its complement of nurses with a head nurse in charge.

Reference to the statistics will show the number of cases treated in these two departments.

It has been the aim of the institution to offer the State the best and most advanced methods, not only of diagnosis, but also of treatment. With this before us, a Bacteriological Department has been evolved by the Visiting Staff, under the charge of a competent bacteriologist, and the problems confronting them attacked with every known scientific means. This year a chemist is added to the force. Through the medium of this Staff epoch-making advances have been made in the diagnosis of infant diseases, particularly concerning the gastro-intestinal diseases of infancy. With this corps of specialists we aim toward still greater achievements. During this time a Food Laboratory has been established, and the Visiting Staff have at their command a complete bacteriological and chemical force to aid in diagnosis, and a complete Food Laboratory at their call to furnish any desired formulæ to suit the needs of a sick infant.

During the winter of 1911 the results of this scientific work were published in the form of a book,—“Studies on Gastro-intestinal Diseases by the Staff of the Floating Hospital.” At the present time there is a second publication in press, giving to the scientific world the results of further studies during the past two summers. Coincident with this work the Hospital

has maintained a Post-graduate Training School for Nurses, the course of instruction in which has been enlarged, qualifying a nurse to take charge of children's wards in hospitals, to specialize in infant nursing, or direct the work of public milk stations. The outline of this work will be found elsewhere in this report.

The publications of the Hospital are open to other hospitals, medical schools, and physicians and nurses, and, when desired, may be obtained at the office of the institution.

During the present season, in co-operation with the Harvard Medical School, a course of instruction will be offered to qualified graduates in medicine to study the problems of gastro-intestinal diseases of infants, clinically under Dr. Richard M. Smith in the wards and scientifically under Dr. Arthur I. Kendall in the Laboratory. At the same time a course of instruction in the Harvard Medical Summer Schools will be given by Dr. Henry I. Bowditch on diagnosis and treatment of children's diseases and by Dr. James Herbert Young on gastro-intestinal infections. The enthusiasm in the work on board, manifested not only by the administration and the physicians in charge, but also by the House Physicians and nurses, cannot help but have borne good results. The season of 1912, although not unlike similar seasons, was remarkable for the smoothness in which the work progressed, and at the same time was satisfactory in the completion of our "on-shore" work, whereby the discharged cases could be placed in the channels from which they came. The Floating Hospital accepts sick children referred to it by institutions, physicians, milk stations, societies, and Board of Health nurses. It aims, when its period of usefulness to these infants is completed, to direct them to the care of the institution or individual originally directing them to the care of the Hospital.

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean linen and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

SEASON OF 1913.

INTRODUCTION.

TO OUR SUPPORTERS AND THE INTERESTED PUBLIC:—

The Trustees present with this the report of another year's stewardship of the work and funds which you have entrusted to them.

The care of sick children has been carried on for a season of the usual length. We have regarded our work as the relief of suffering, and have striven to make it as broad and as thorough as our opportunities permitted. That the sufferings of our little patients might not be in vain, we have from the first tried to gain from their cases knowledge and experience, so that other children might be saved from such suffering.

During our first years our scientific and educational work was clinical and was carried on by our medical staff and their assistants. The Food Laboratory and the policy of a systematic course of training for graduate nurses in the treatment of the diseases of children, especially diseases of the digestive tract, grew out of their experience and study.

The bedside and Food Laboratory records have been kept and collated until they form one of the largest masses of data in existence on infant feeding and the medical results. In connection with this should be noted our success in the collection and use of breast milk.

Doctors and nurses who have received our training have spread the results literally to "the ends of the earth," and the visit last summer of Dr. Fritz B. Talbot to the European centres of medical study of the diseases of children has brought us in closer touch with these centres.

A great variety of pathological material is found in connection with our work. This is systematically preserved and studied, and arrangements are in progress which we hope will make possible its larger use. Material from our collection has proved of essential assistance in the study of the organisms which are present in whooping-cough.

Four years ago we employed Dr. Arthur I. Kendall as bacteriologist, and one year ago a biological chemist. The results so far attained are

summed up in the report of the Visiting Staff. This report indicates that we have succeeded in outlining the problems which confront us, and shows that in a number of points we have made marked advance in the treatment of diseases of the digestive tract in children, and it merits careful study on the part of those interested in such subjects.

In the further relief of suffering in the form of anxiety on the part of the parents of sick children, we have carried on our "on-shore" work throughout the year. During the season we get in touch with the families and the home conditions; when the patients are returned, we follow them up and see that they have proper care and feeding, keeping track of them throughout the winter, and so preventing, as far as we may, the recurrence of sickness.

Our funds fall into three general divisions:—

1. Endowment, of which only the income can be used. This has increased during the past year \$17,000, the increased income from this source amounting approximately to only 1.6 per cent. of our annual budget.

2. Unrestricted bequests and gifts. Our boat and equipment have largely come from this source, and the Trustees feel that gifts of this character should be reserved for replacement and emergencies.

3. Current contributions. In several of the years past these have been sufficient to meet our current needs. During the past year they fell off so that we were obliged to draw on our unrestricted fund in order to close the year out of debt. At the end of the fiscal year we had used up practically all of our unrestricted fund. We hope that this year contributions for current expenses may be sufficient, so that our unrestricted bequests may be saved for replacement and emergency work and conditions.

To those who have aided in extending the knowledge of the work we are doing, and to those who by word and gift have encouraged and helped us do it, the Trustees extend their grateful thanks.

REPORT OF THE VISITING STAFF.

TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL,
54 Devonshire Street,
Boston, Massachusetts.

Dear Sirs,—After our summer work for 1913, it was with great satisfaction that two of the Visiting Staff accepted an invitation from the New York Academy of Medicine to tell of our scientific experiences for the seasons 1910–13 inclusive. It may be of interest to you, also, to see what has been accomplished. The following simple statement of our studies, made possible by the appointment of Dr. Kendall as bacteriologist (1910), and Mr. Bosworth as chemist in 1913, is therefore submitted:—

SCIENTIFIC RESULTS OF FOUR YEARS' WORK.

1910.

1. We shortened the bacteriological diagnosis of dysentery by twenty-four hours.
2. We established the Gas Bacillus as predominating organism in certain dysenteries.
3. We demonstrated an easy clinical test for the Gas Bacillus infection.
4. We established a theory for treatment of such cases, in the form of buttermilk, and demonstrated its use in such cases.
5. We shortened our starvation period in all dysenteries.
6. We established the use of Dextrose Saline Solution in the form of infusions for stimulation in such, showing collapse or depletion.

1911.

1. We isolated the Shiga Bacillus from the blood (first known case on record).
2. We established the clinical position of irrigations in cases of dysentery.
3. We tested the use of "constant seepage."
4. We demonstrated the prevalence of Pyelitis in Streptococcus infection of the intestinal tract.

1912.

1. We demonstrated the use of high proteins in Gas Bacillus infections.
2. We demonstrated the dangerous treatment of administration of lactose or sugars in such cases.

1913.

1. We further demonstrated the use of high proteins in dysenteries not Flexner, Shiga, nor Streptococcus Etiology.
2. We demonstrated the use of maltose as a food to be easily absorbed, digested, and assimilated.

This work seems to us to warrant all expenses sustained in salaries of our bacteriologist and chemist. It further spurs us on in advancing such work each succeeding year. The general work of the boat during the season was of the usual good standard.

Dr. Fritz B. Talbot, unfortunately, was unable to be on service during the summer, being abroad. His position was filled by Dr. Louis Gilbert, of Brookline. We wish in this way to express our appreciation and thank him for his time, advice, and clinical work in the wards, all so generously given.

REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

The Boston Floating Hospital is unlike any other institution for the care of children in the country, inasmuch as it is in operation but two and one-half months in the year. Between 55 and 60 nurses from all parts of the country, each having her own ideas and methods; nearly 20 doctors, each with a wide and varied training in medical school and hospital; scores of people engaged in other departments of the boat,—all are congregated into a comparatively small space for a short period of time. During this period nearly 1,500 patients receive treatment.

By our inventory system each department is fully equipped at the beginning of the season, so that from the first to the last day the work progresses smoothly, harmoniously, and without interruption. In no other institution will you find individuals and departments co-operating so earnestly with one another, all with one aim in view,—the care and treatment of our little patients. It is indeed gratifying to see so many of our former patients who owe their lives to the Hospital brought back to the ship year after year, so that those on board may see the wonderful results accomplished by the cool sea air, the proper food, good care, and careful treatment. The appreciation and words of praise from the parents of these children are a source of constant inspiration to every one.

The reputation which the Hospital holds within and without the State speaks volumes for the system and efficiency of all the departments. Improvements are made each year to meet the needs of the departments, and this season proved no exception to the rule. Owing to the increasing amount of bacteriological work, it was necessary to enlarge and re-equip the laboratory. The splendid work of this department, under Dr. A. I. Kendall, has aided us wonderfully in the diagnosis and treatment of many of the intestinal disorders which are so common to children. Our death-rate this year was abnormally low, due probably to the cool temperature throughout the season and to the early diagnosis which we were able to make. The bacteriology of the intestinal tract of all our patients, both on the upper deck and in the permanent wards, was a part of our routine examinations. Many cases of intestinal infection, giving no signs or symptoms, but which undoubtedly would have led to serious illness if not discovered, were greatly benefited by early diagnosis and treatment.

The condition of the patients on discharge from the Out-patient has been better than ever before. In previous years the treatment of patients ceased when they left the boat at night, and, as a result, the good work accomplished during the day was spoiled, because of the improper feeding while the child was at home. This difficulty has been remedied by distributing milk from the Food Laboratory to mothers or attendants as they leave the boat, so that the child receives the same food throughout the twenty-four hours. This year 1320 quarts of milk were sent home for night feedings.

Like all other departments, our "on shore" work shows steps in advance. The home conditions of all our babies were investigated, so that, on discharge from the hospital, our knowledge of the environment into which the child was going aided us in directing the "follow up" work where it was most needed.

We are greatly indebted to Messrs. H. P. Hood & Sons, who have removed an obstacle from our path by supplying our discharged patients with the proper modifications of milk needed, receiving as remuneration only the amount which the family was able to pay. The amount stated by the family was checked up by the investigation of the home conditions.

We also wish to thank the several automobile concerns who have willingly and gratuitously given the use of several automobiles every morning to transport the mothers and their babies from the car lines to the boat.

We look forward each year to improvements in treatment and care of our patients and in the efficiency of all departments, and the season of 1913 has added its full quota to those of former years.

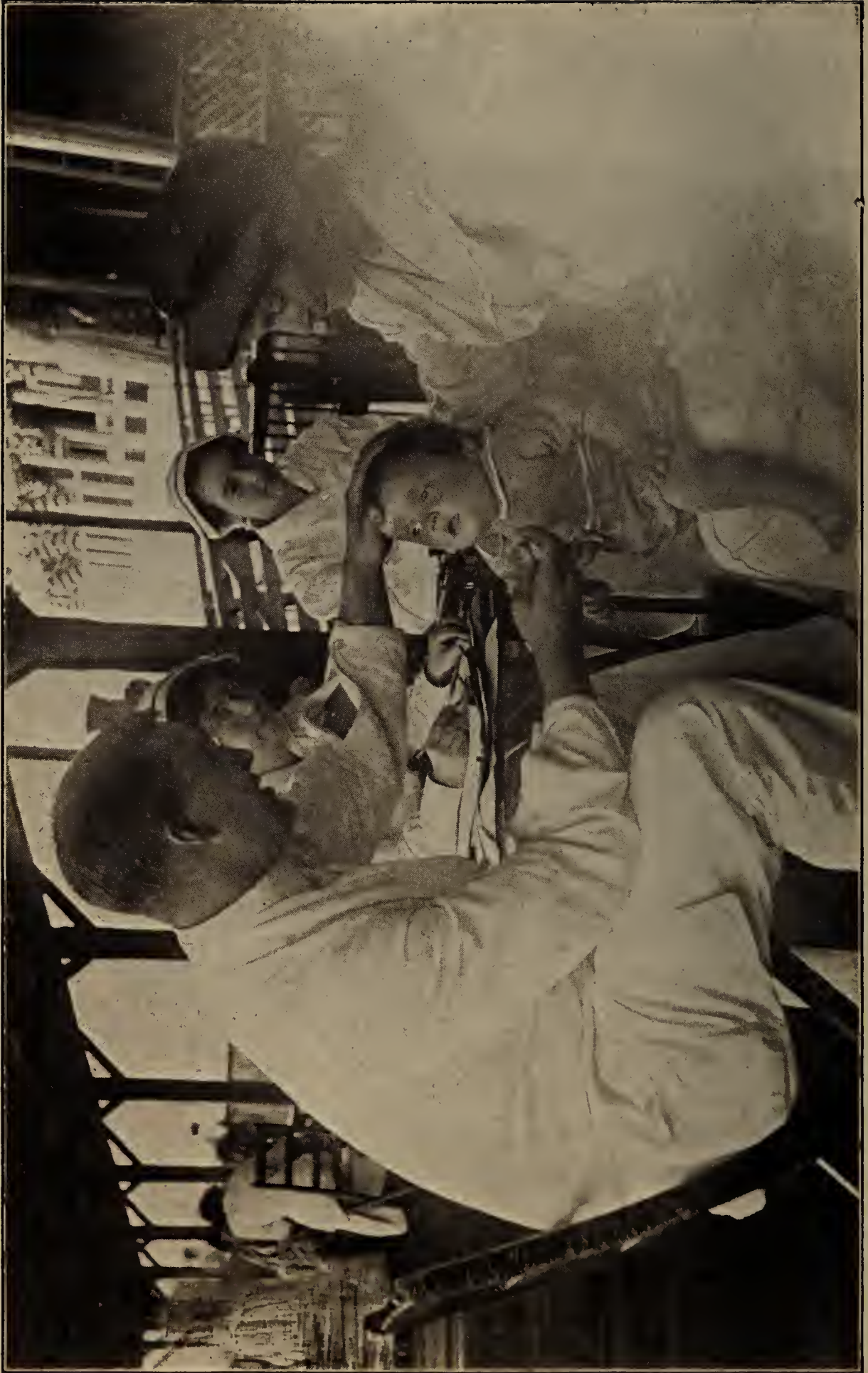

THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL.

SEASON OF 1914.

INTRODUCTION.

TO OUR SUPPORTERS AND THE INTERESTED PUBLIC:—

The Trustees of The Boston Floating Hospital present to its supporters and the public generally their report of the operations covering the season of 1914, its twenty-first year of work for the relief of sick babies during the summer months. Since its establishment, and more especially in recent years, the importance of the prevention of infant mortality has grown upon the public mind, and various agencies in our city give special attention to this phase of the conservation of the public health. The Floating Hospital remains, however, unique in its purpose and methods, and descriptions of its organization and achievements are sought from every section of the country, with a view to their adoption where possible.

The work of the Hospital is carried country wide through the nurses graduated from our Post-Graduate Training School, and in one of the largest of our Western States the requirements for registration as a nurse are determined in part at least by the standards represented by the secretary of the Board of Examiners, who gratefully acknowledges the value of her participation in and graduation from our work.

Important as is this extension of the work of our contributors, it is secondary to the primary work of the Hospital,—*the care of sick babies*. This Hospital continues to be the large and important factor in the saving of child life that it has increasingly been in past years, and a study of the statistical figures published herewith must bring to each contributor, as it does to each worker, a feeling of gratification at the results accomplished.

It is for the continuance of this primary work that contributions are asked. The Trustees have given much thought and consideration to the conditions with which their year opens, and have weighed carefully their obligations to the supporters of the work as well as to its beneficiaries. Reviewing the history of the Hospital, and remembering with gratitude the generous support of the past, they have felt that they may safely place

in the hands of old supporters the lives of the children who are to be cared for, and that they may confidently ask the support of new friends. They have therefore decided to conduct the work of the Floating Hospital during the coming season without curtailment, but at the same time with closer attention, if that be possible, to all details of expenditure and administration.

It is hoped that the report of the Resident Physician will have the careful notice of the philanthropic workers through whom so many of our patients come to us. We believe the suggestion therein made, as to the information in regard to the patients which it is desirable to have, will readily commend itself to those working in co-operation with us, and so enable us better to serve the object of our common interest,—the sick baby.

As will be noticed by the Treasurer's Report, careful study of which is asked, it was decided to close the accounts of the fiscal year 1914 without deficit, using for this purpose unrestricted funds which we had hoped to maintain against necessary renewals which must be effected within a few years. Our friends are asked to contribute this year the sum needed for our current expenses in order that the small unrestricted fund may be preserved intact. Our appeal is made at a time when the hearts of all people are softened by the needs of the suffering, and we feel confident it needs only to be made to meet that ready response which has come to us in the past years of the work.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICIAN IN CHARGE.

TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL:—

Dear Sirs,—The following report of the Medical Staff for the summer of 1914 is respectfully submitted.

The hospital stands to the community primarily as a summer hospital. It deals largely with acute summer upsets in infants and children in all their aspects (ward and out-patient care and supervision) and tries to reach out in a preventive way along the usual lines of education of parents or guardians.

The summer of 1914 gave about the same results as previous years. A cooler summer, with the occurrence of a milder epidemic, gave us a less severe type to care for; the attendance was approximately the same, with our results correspondingly better.

The Bacteriological and Medical Departments were busy studying the epidemic of the season on the one hand, and the nutritional disturbances in connection with feeding on the other hand. Each year adds a little more to our knowledge of the child's digestion during the trying summer months, and we hope to see such additions kept up.

A study of the humidity was attempted in preliminary form to help solve our summer problem. This we trust to see furthered next season. With the equipment always improving in little ways season by season your staff sees more and more efficient work done in the future, with better satisfaction to you through increasing public confidence.

REPORT OF THE HOUSE PHYSICIAN.

The work of the Hospital, with its 70 nurses and 20 doctors, was inaugurated and carried on this year, as usual, without friction, and with gratifying medical results, as will be seen by reference to the statistical tables submitted herewith.

Our most serious problem was in connection with the admission of patients. In many cases these are sent to us without previous notice, and we have not been able to admit them immediately to the permanent wards, though all such cases are treated on our Day Patient Deck. It would be to the benefit of the patient if in cases of severe illness we could be advised by note or telephone from those having the care of the child, so that proper provision might be made for it. It should be borne in mind that the Floating Hospital willingly, when necessary, waives formality in admitting a sick child. The credential is the sick child itself, though, of course, the information referred to is helpful and valuable, but the lack of it will not act as a delay in the immediate attention given to an applicant for admission.

We are often handicapped, too, by the insufficient history sent with the case, consisting, as a rule, of only a few introductory lines, with no reference to the symptoms, diet, dejections, etc. It is hoped that some means may be adopted by which this information may reach us with the patient.

On discharge the mothers have been given formulæ for suitable modifications, and, where necessary, a nurse from our On-shore Department has visited the home the next day to assist the mother by a demonstration in the preparation of the food. In every case the home conditions were ascertained before the discharge of the patient, and, where it seemed likely that the instructions given would not be properly carried out, the proper modification was furnished as long as necessary at a minimum cost.

Wherever it has been possible, patients have been returned to their source. In many cases this has not been possible because the card of admission has not borne the address of the individual or institution sending the child to us.

The relief this year from the clerical work heretofore imposed upon the Resident Physician, which work has been performed by an assistant, has made it possible for me to devote my entire time to the oversight of the patients, permanent and out-patients.

I express my appreciation of the service of all those who have contributed to such degree of success as my work may show, with especial acknowledgment of the highly efficient co-operation of Miss Egan, Superintendent of Nurses, in important metabolism work and in maintaining the general spirit of a common purpose which has marked the season.

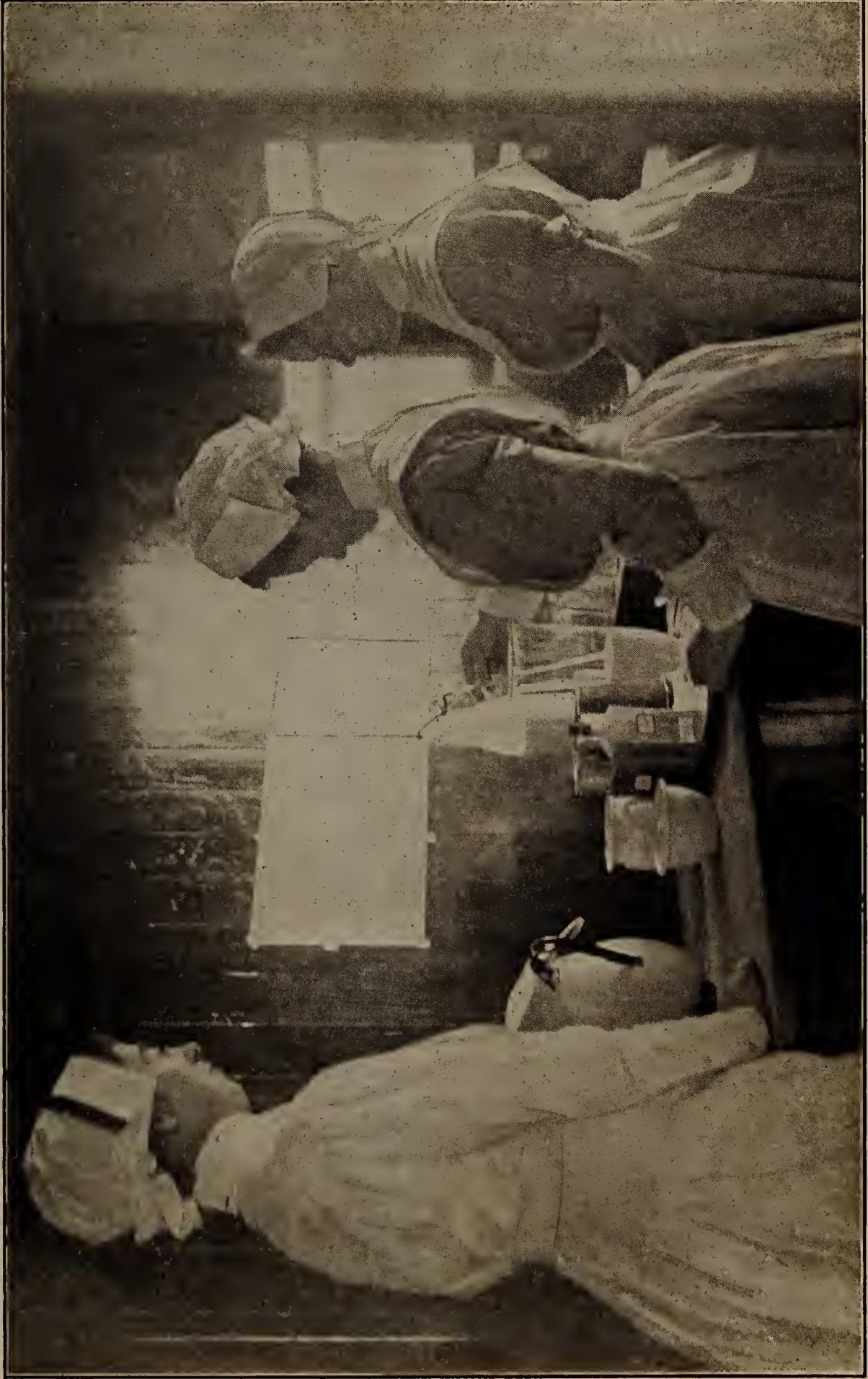

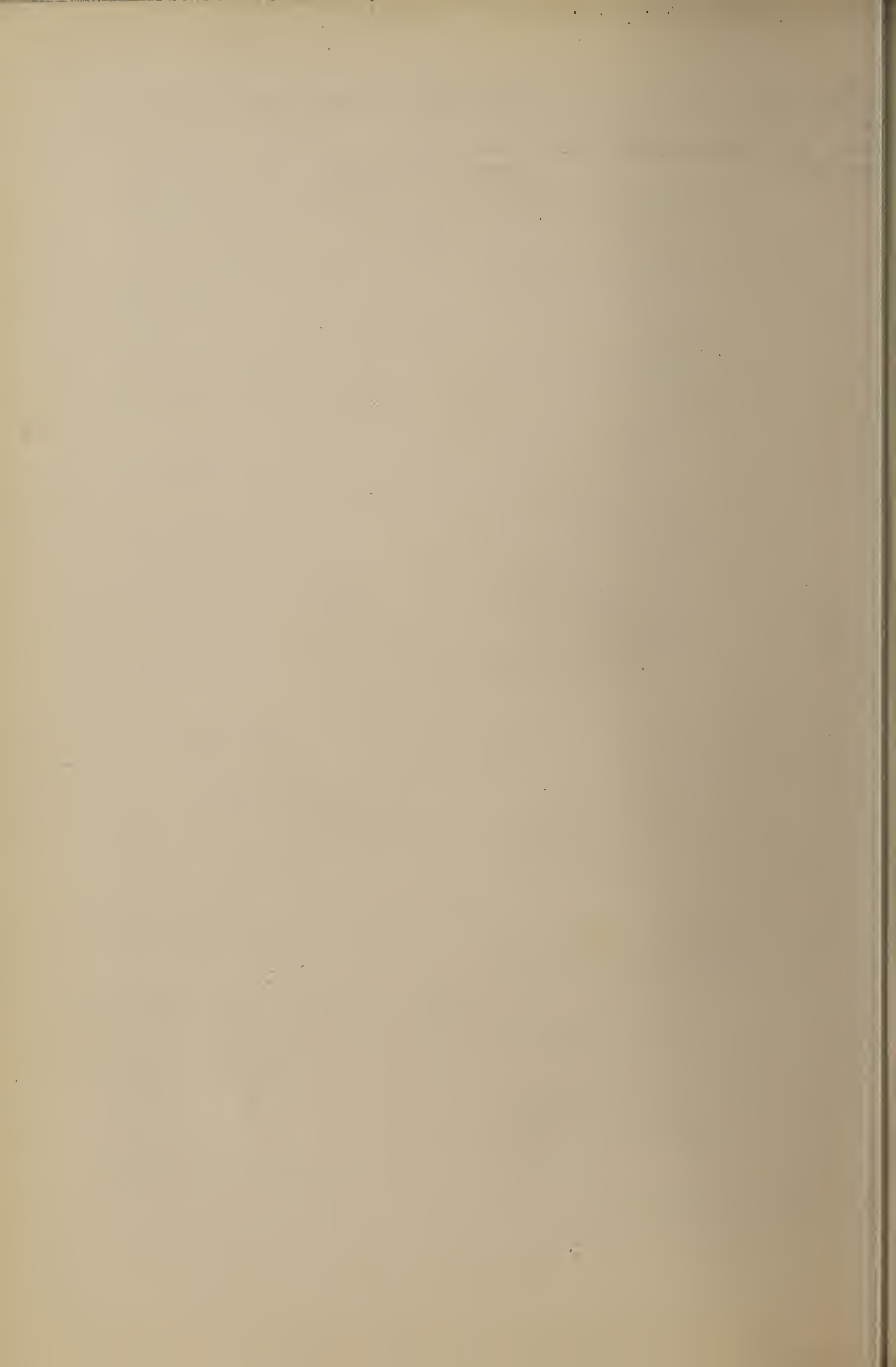

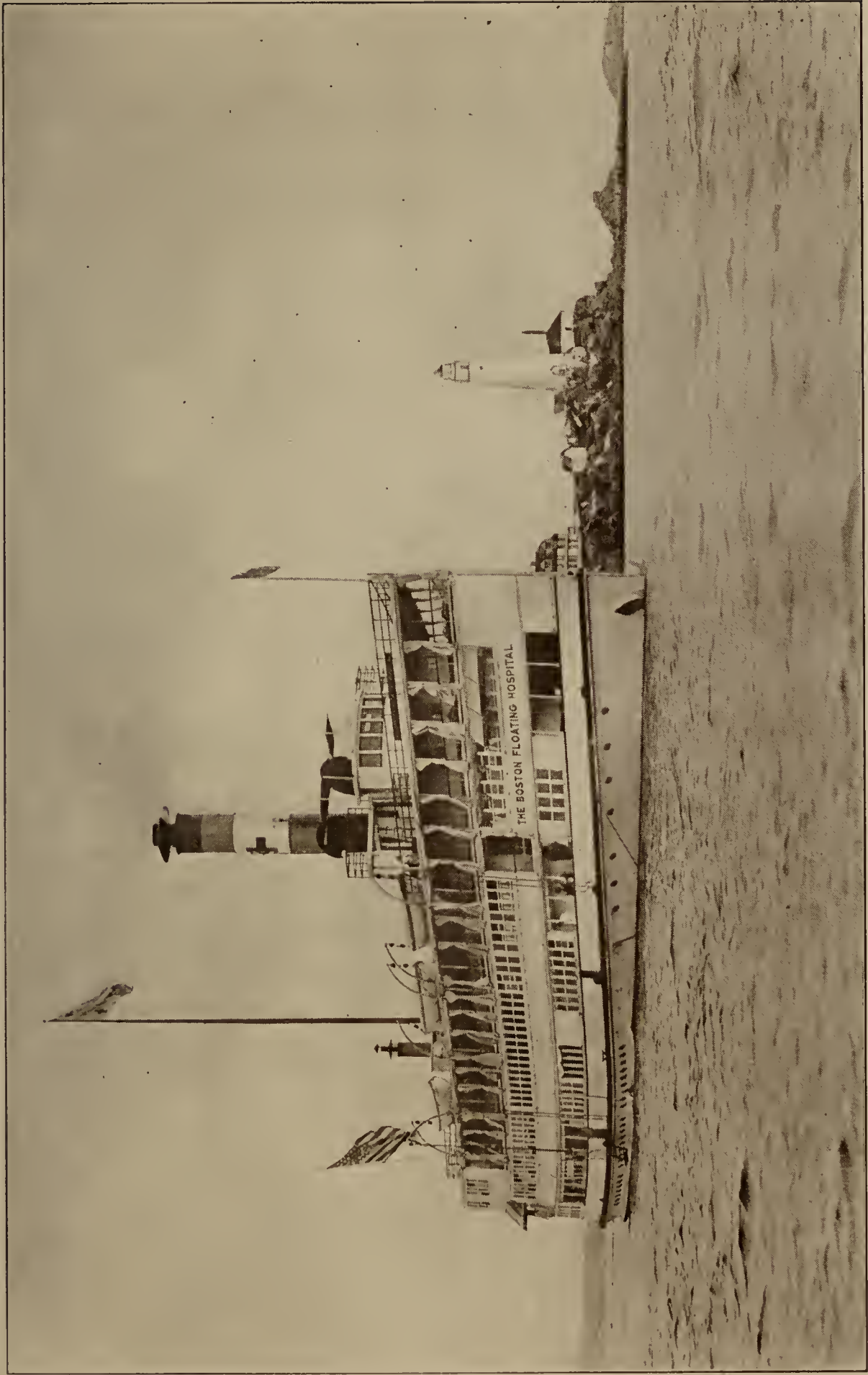

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean linen and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

SEASON OF 1915.

INTRODUCTION.

TO OUR SUPPORTERS AND THE INTERESTED PUBLIC:—

It is with profound gratitude that the Trustees of The Boston Floating Hospital present this report of the contributions that have been given us and the results obtained during our twenty-second year ending October 15, 1915.

The financial statements included in this report show a condition of which it is difficult to speak with too much thankfulness. They disclose to an extent we had not anticipated the place our institution has in the confidence and friendship of its supporters.

The World War, beginning in August, 1914, affected our income, although a considerable proportion of it was assured before that time. At the close of that fiscal year we faced a deficit in our current expense receipts and were obliged to meet the demands of extraordinary expense by a draft general.

During the year just closed the demand upon our people for the relief of suffering in other lands has been unprecedented, and the feeling has been general that local interests might reasonably expect a diminished support. The Trustees feared this, but the trust in our supporters embodied in our plans for the season was justified by the fact that we are enabled to show a small surplus instead of a deficit in current expense receipts.

Additions to our Endowment and General (replacement) Funds will be noted. The increase in the former places at the disposal of the Trustees about \$800 of yearly income for ordinary expenses, a sum not sufficient to make good the loss of our usual annual or occasional contributions from the donors, which loss must therefore be made good by the addition of new friends. Additional contributions must also be sought to meet the normal increase in the expenses of a growing work and the increase in cost of necessary medicines and hospital supplies caused by the present world-wide conditions.

The "On Shore" work has developed to a point where it is possible not only to visit former patients in their homes, as heretofore, but to establish during the winter a between-seasons clinic with our Resident Physician and nurses in attendance, to which these and other children may be brought for observation or treatment and the results of our summer work made more permanent. In other words, with the beginning of the new year The Boston Floating Hospital will begin an all-the-year service, with results, we anticipate, far outweighing the slight increase in annual expense.

The bacteriological work shows significant progress along lines not sufficiently developed as yet for positive assertion, but indicating a contribution to the knowledge of the causes and treatment of infantile gastroenteric diseases which will have far-reaching beneficent results. A substantial gift, which is noted in the Treasurer's report, provided special facilities for this work outside of the expense included in the annual budget.

A room on the boat has been set aside for instruction by talks and demonstration in the care of babies. This work is under the direction of the Superintendent of Nurses. Separate classes of mothers and young girls have been formed, and the value of the work has been shown in the eagerness of the pupils.

The valuable course of lectures to the nurses given by members of the various staffs has this year been stenographically reported and copies given to the graduates, thus making them of permanent value. The examinations have been extended to cover more thoroughly the Food Laboratory work of the nurses. The character and scope of this examination may be judged by the sample questions covering two formulæ which are printed in addition to the usual Nurses' Examination paper.

The work of our biological chemist has assumed such importance that the engagement of Mr. Alfred W. Bosworth to give his entire time to it seems imperative. The prosecution of this work promises results which are likely to mark a most significant step in the advance of our knowledge of the effect of certain food elements on infants.

In conclusion, special attention is directed to the following items in the Treasurer's report for the past year:—

(1) *Interest on Endowment.* It will be noted that our income from this source is about 6.6 per cent. of our total receipts, and this fact, it is hoped, will present our strongest appeal, annually repeated, for additions to our Endowment Fund.

(2) *Hospital and Boat Expense.* Our moneys are expended under a carefully prepared segregated budget showing the estimated expense for each month of the year. In previous reports the statement of expenses has

shown the commodity or service costs; the present report shows in these two departments the departmental costs instead, *i.e.*, the kitchen and dining-room, laundry and fuel costs have been apportioned to the different departments into which the work is divided. We believe that the figures thus given show more clearly the cost of operation, both as a Boat and as a Hospital, than those submitted in previous years.

It may be of interest also to note the growth of the bacteriological work as indicated by the item for special apparatus and supplies, additional to the budget appropriation. The cost of these was met by a special contribution; the major portion of the apparatus and supplies included in this item are of unusual character and furnish a substantial addition to the equipment of the Hospital.

Encouraged by the successful work of the past year, so generously supported by our friends, and with the promise of scientific as well as practical advance in the year to come, the Trustees confidently ask for support from old friends and new with the purpose of still further accomplishment to the extent of their ability.

We are most grateful for the cordial co-operation of the press in the presentation of our work to the public and to many merchants and business men for courtesies extended during the year.

The detailed reports submitted we hope may prove of interest and value, and to merit your careful study.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICIAN IN CHARGE.

TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL:—

Dear Sirs,—At the beginning of the present year, more properly after the close of the season of 1914, it was deemed advisable to reorganize the work of the Visiting Staff. By action of the Trustees the title of the Chairman was changed to Physician in Charge, and there was placed upon him the responsibility of selecting the members of the Staff to be associated with him in the season of 1915. It had been for some time known that the demands upon the time of Dr. Richard M. Smith and Dr. Fritz B. Talbot would prevent them from giving to our Hospital more of that valuable service which they had rendered during the years of their connection with the work, and while their resignations were accepted with regret both by the Chairman and the Trustees, we were pleased to have both these gentlemen accept appointments on the Consulting Staff.

The vacancies thus created were filled by the appointments of Dr. Arthur A. Howard and Dr. Edwin T. Wyman (Assistant Visiting Physicians in 1914) and the addition of Dr. John W. Hammond and Dr. Elmer W. Barron.

The work during the season of 1915 under the changed conditions was fully as efficient as in previous years, and its conduct perhaps more uniform, the continuous service during the summer proving more advantageous to the patients. I fully realize the extra demand upon the time and strength of the members of the Visiting Staff and desire to thank them most heartily for the enthusiasm and co-operation in their prolonged service which made the plan so successful.

The enthusiasm and general *esprit de corps* of the House Staff was unusual and deserves a cordial recognition, which I here record.

The scientific work under Alfred W. Bosworth, biological chemist, and Frank Garm Norbury, bacteriologist, marked definite advance, which it is hoped may be permanently recorded in forthcoming papers on this work and its results. The ward services were made smaller and the work thus concentrated, bringing into effect closer co-operation of the clinical and laboratory sides of the work. This process will be still further developed during the coming season, with, I believe, increased benefit to the patients.

The members of the Staff generally unite with me in hearty recognition of the co-operation of the Trustees in the successful endeavor to increase the efficiency and value of the work of the Hospital. With the encouragement thus given, we look forward with confidence to a still further advance along the lines of our work in the summer of 1916.

WATCHING THE DOCTOR

REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

The work of the Hospital for the past season has been eminently satisfying, the records showing an increased number of individual patients cared for in both departments, ward and day patient, with a decreased length of service. This shortened stay in the Hospital, with a corresponding decrease in the percentage of deaths to total admissions, indicates more clearly than can be told in words the increased efficiency of our work.

With an increase of 24 permanent patients, the deaths were 20 less than in 1914, showing a death rate of 4.6 per cent. as against 5.8 per cent., a gain of 1.2 per cent. This seems a slight gain, but it means that this year nearly 50 more babies with the probabilities against them were saved as against the previous year, and this only in the permanent wards. The comparison carries in the day patient department.

An improvement is to be noted in the organization of the House Staff under Dr. Bowditch and the nursing force under Miss Egan, Superintendent of Nurses.

Of especial value to our young men has been the weekly clinics for consultation and exchange of opinions. The lectures of Dr. Councilman, Dr. Ten Broeck, and Prof. Bosworth were especially noteworthy.

The general management of the boat under the supervision of Mr. Briggs, the Manager, was, if possible, a larger contributing factor in the success of the work under my charge than ever before, and the absence of friction in so peculiar an institution as ours is a remarkable achievement.

I desire to again emphasize the recommendation made last year that agencies desiring to send patients to the Hospital shall, where possible, first communicate with us in order that arrangements may be made for the reception of the patient without delay and with the least inconvenience to the friends of the patient, or that we may provide for the child when our beds are all filled, as frequently happens during the season. Such co-operation would enable us to be helpful to a larger number of patients and so of greater benefit to the community.

A study of the subjoined statistical tables will prove of interest as indicating the scope of the medical work intrusted to me, beneath which are, of course, the vastly larger benefits which the Hospital has conferred.

The opportunity to serve in this work under the Board of Trustees is gratefully appreciated, and my thanks are due for many courtesies from the working force of the Hospital generally.

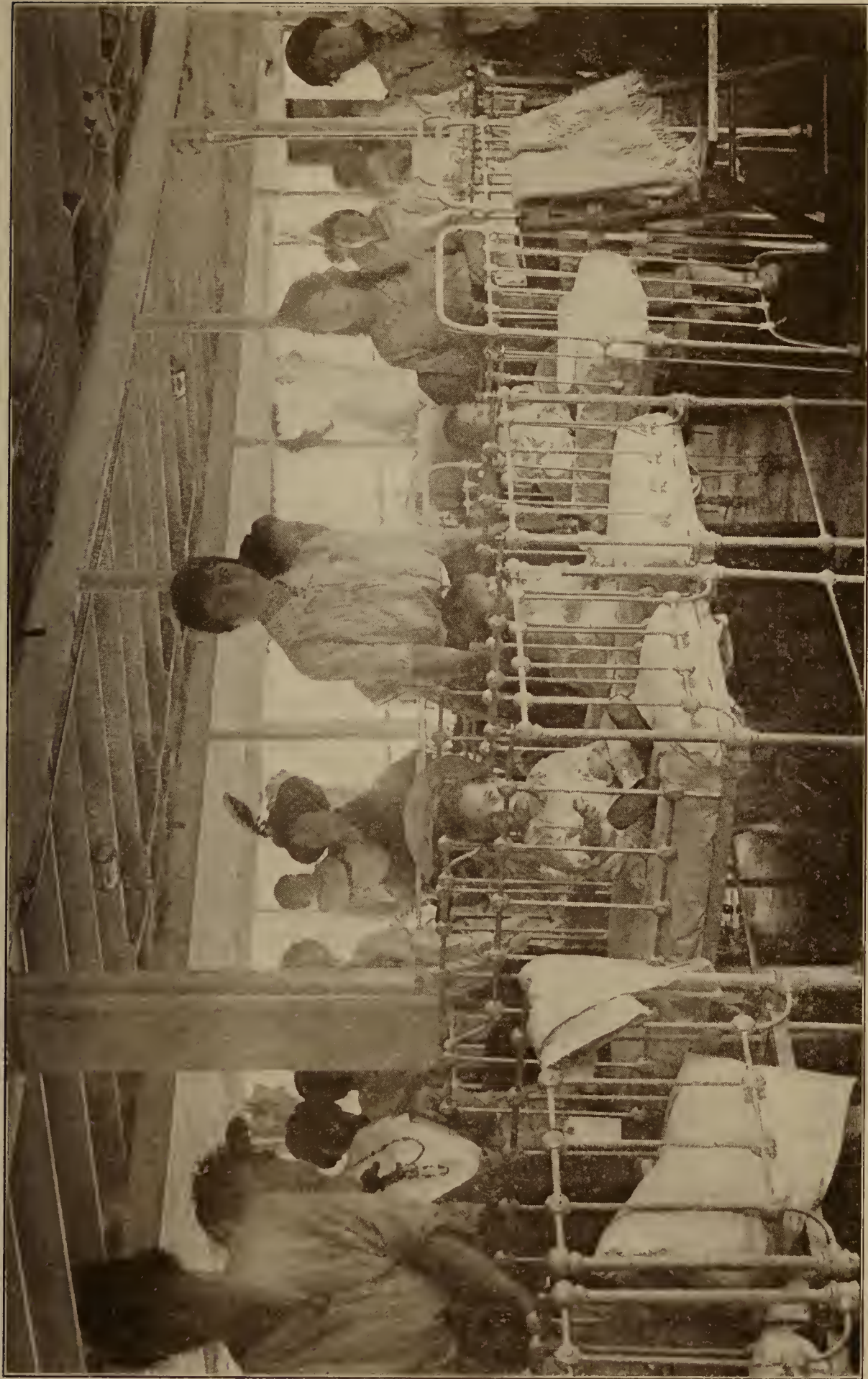

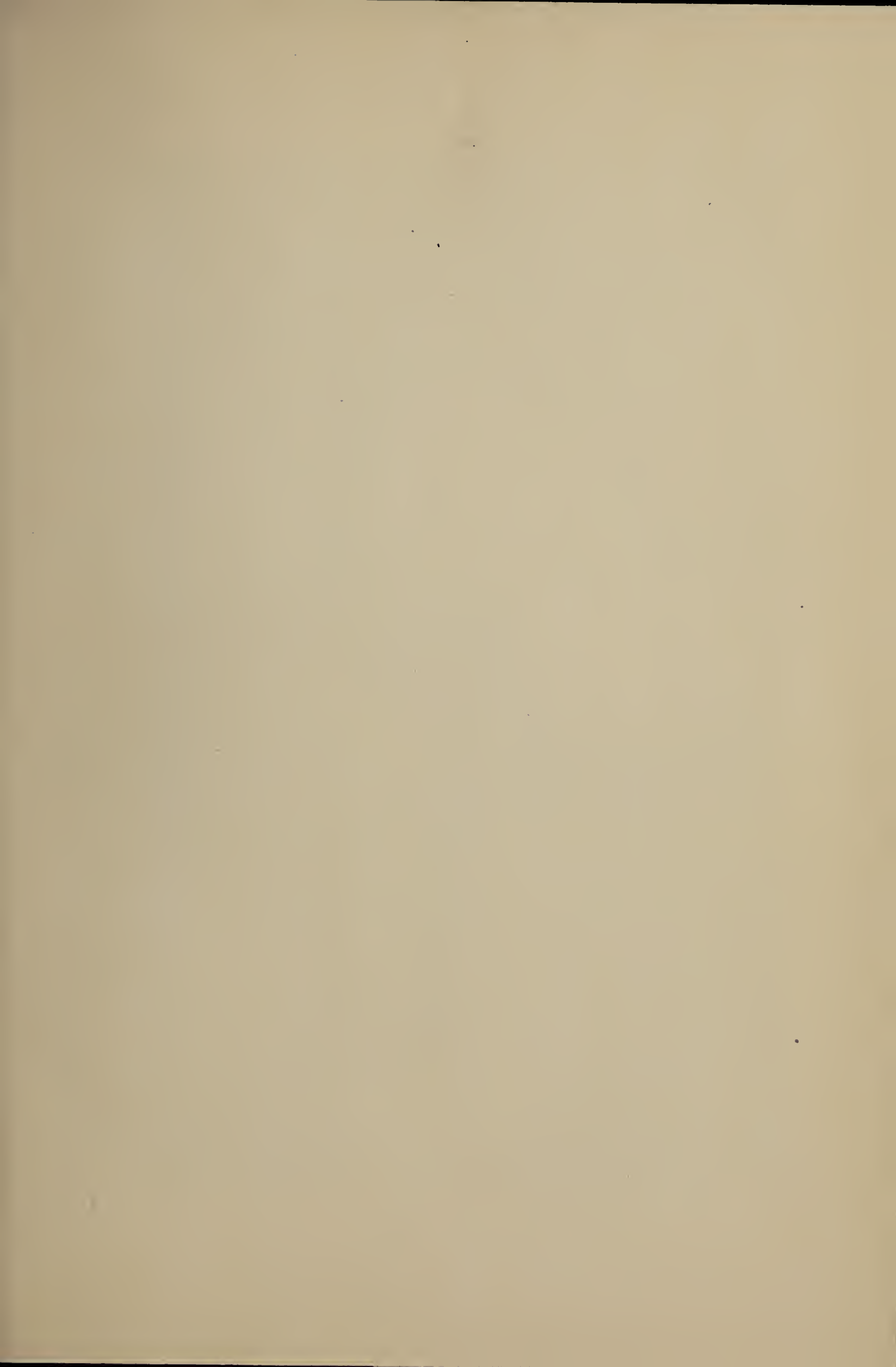

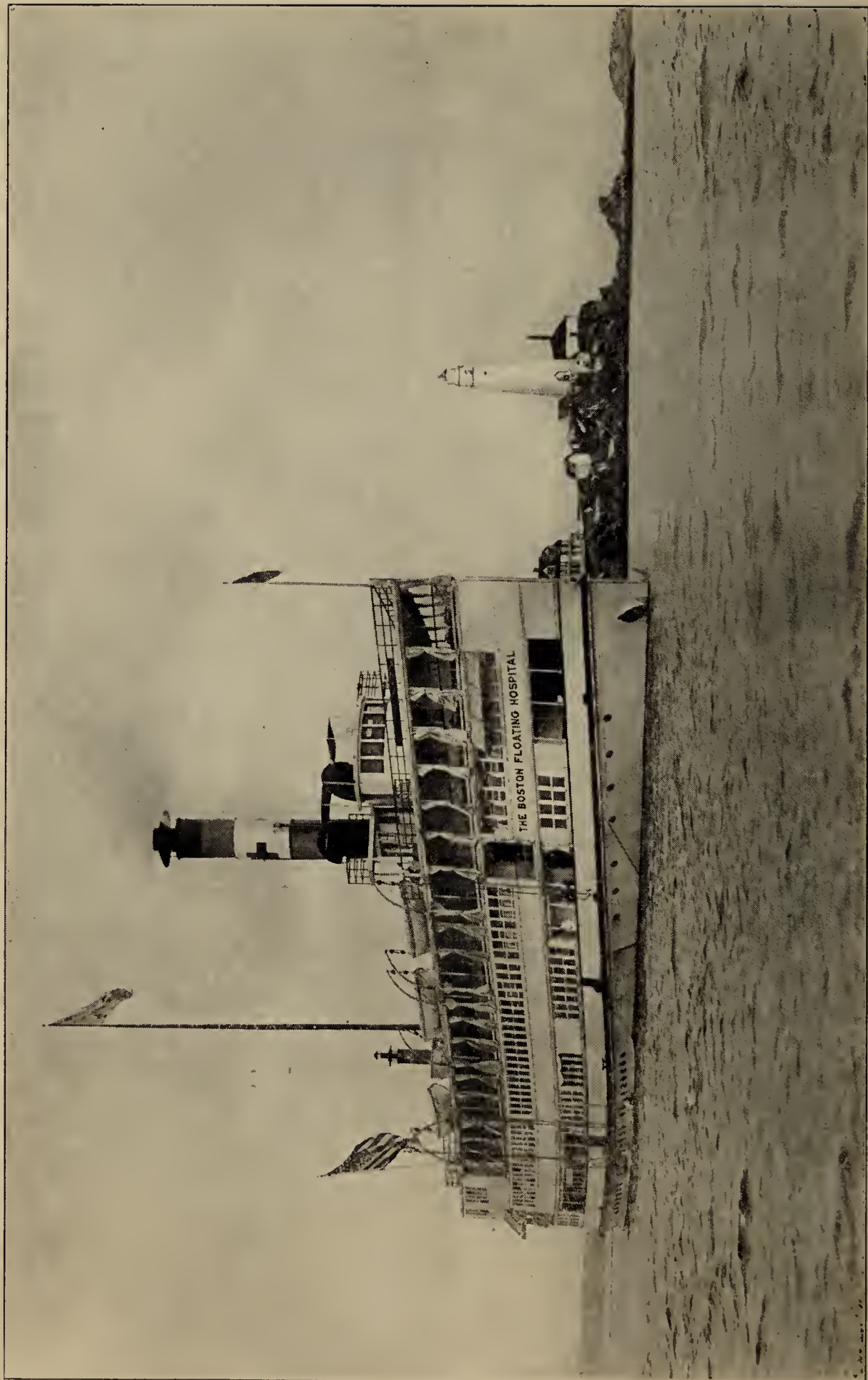

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean linen and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL.

SEASON OF 1916.

INTRODUCTION.

The Trustees of The Boston Floating Hospital present herewith their report for the twenty-third year of operation, ended October 31, 1916. The hope and confidence expressed in our report for the previous year have been fully justified, and we believe that the reports and exhibits submitted will be a source of gratification to our contributors, whose generous and sympathetic interest has been made manifest in so marked a degree.

The work of the year shows an increase of some 25 per cent. in the amount of service rendered, with an expenditure of only \$1,300 in excess of the expenditures of the previous fiscal year. In a time of high prices for medicines, food supplies, and labor such a result could only be obtained by the preparation of a carefully planned budget at the beginning of the year and a close scrutiny of every item of expense, following the established policy of the Trustees in the handling of the gifts of our contributors.

The contributions to meet current expenses have been unusually generous, and the year closes with a balance which, though small, is sufficient to tide us over the winter months, during which few gifts are received, and thus will obviate the necessity of drawing upon our replacement fund, as in some previous years.

The additions to our Endowment Fund and General Fund have been most gratifying, and the income from these will be a great help in lessening the burden of raising the necessary amount to meet current expenses. We are still, however, far from the desired figure for our Endowment Fund, which should be at least \$500,000. The income from such an endowment, with the gifts from annual contributors, would practically meet the expenses of operation and leave to its natural growth the General (replacement) Fund, which must within a few years be called upon to meet the costs of new construction and equipment.

The Bio-chemical work (the cost of which does not form a part of the annual budget, but is met from independent sources) has made marked progress during the year, and some of the results have been recorded in monographs, copies of which we shall be pleased to send on request to any persons interested. This work has grown to a point where the employment of an assistant biological chemist is imperative in order to hasten the solution of urgent problems in infant feeding and metabolism which have presented themselves.

During the summer the "On Shore" work was prosecuted with increased success with temporary headquarters in the North End, but in order

that we might not lose the oversight of our patients, so essential to their continued well-being after leaving the Hospital, we deemed it wise to establish a clinic in a more central location. We secured quarters in the Norfolk House Centre, John Eliot Square (easily accessible from the Dudley Street Station), a building in which many different charities have headquarters. Here our nurses and our resident physician have had regular hours during which they could be consulted and from which during the winter months the direction of our regular home visitation work could be better systematized and prosecuted. The work accomplished during the past winter is indicated in the following figures:—

No report of ours is complete without our grateful acknowledgment of the generous support of the press of our community, and to these papers and their representatives we return hearty thanks for their sympathetic interest.

As in other years we have been favored with a considerable number of contributions from merchants of Boston, to whom we also tender our thanks.

The demand of the coming year will certainly be not less than that of the past year. The necessity for the ministry of the Floating Hospital will continue as long as there are sick babies, weak babies, ill conditions of life in the communities we serve. It is probable that we shall, by reason of efficiency attained and the growth of the population, have to meet a larger demand. It is probable that some of the things needed in our work will be advanced in cost. It seems clear to the Trustees that it is their duty to prepare to meet these needs and these demands with the assurance born of former experience, that those who in the past have helped the work will not fail in their support, and that the wider knowledge of our accomplishments will bring to us new friends and gifts sufficient to enable us to carry through the work with no less success than in the past years.

Since this report was prepared our country has entered into the World War. Sharp advances in prices are occurring, even beyond the high costs of last year. Already our expenses in the preparatory season have increased beyond the additions to our income derived from our last year's gain in endowment. In the active season they must still further increase. The need for our services in conserving the man power of the nation is greater than ever. Will you not support us in meeting this need?

REPORT OF THE PHYSICIAN IN CHARGE.

TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL:—

I have pleasure in reporting cause for great encouragement in the progress of the work of the Hospital during the past summer. In addition to the gratifying statistics submitted by the Resident Physician, the following items of interest may be noted:—

The Bacteriological Department in charge of Mr. Frank Garm Norbury was of great assistance to Dr. Smillie (Department of Preventive Medicine, Harvard Medical School) of our Auxiliary Staff in his study on the epidemiology of bacillary dysentery. The results of this work are comprised in a paper read before the Massachusetts Medical Society and since published. The work demands further investigation at the hands of Dr. Smillie, and we trust our wards during the next season may offer him the needed opportunity. The regular work of the Bacteriological Department was characteristically efficient in aiding our ward treatment. A valuable piece of investigation on protein anaphylaxis was conducted by this department in connection with Dr. Cleaveland Floyd of the Bacteriological Department of the Harvard Medical School, and one of our House Staff. This was pioneer work and should be continued.

A new line of study instituted this season was the examination and care of our patients' primary teeth, a work which Dr. Walter C. Miner, our stomatologist, hopes to advance along preventive lines. In this work Dr. Miner was assisted materially by Drs. Cushman and Curtis. As opportunity offers, cases will be grouped for further research.

The Consulting and Auxiliary Staffs, as in other years, took an active part in the instruction of our nurses. The lectures afforded a great stimulus and were much appreciated. The usual courses for Post-Graduate teaching in connection with the Department of Pediatrics, Harvard Medical School, were given by our visiting physicians.

The work of the season was brought together in the midsummer clinical meeting, which was an occasion of much interesting and valuable discussion.

Dr. James Herbert Young resigned from the Visiting Staff to accept the directorship of the Milk and Baby Hygiene Association. Dr. John W. Hammond of our staff was also absent in Europe with one of the Harvard units. Dr. Young, has, however, been able to accept a position on the Consulting Staff and so will be able to keep in touch with our work. I take this opportunity to thank these gentlemen for their unselfish assistance during the previous summers, while pleased to be assured of their interest and cooperation in the future work of the Hospital as far as may be possible.

I desire to extend thanks to all the gentlemen named in this report for their enthusiastic work, the results of which make for the usefulness of the Hospital both in its work on board the ship and to the medical profession generally through the publication of the results attained.

As in all the years of my service with the Hospital, I am pleased to acknowledge with hearty appreciation the sympathy and encouragement given me by the Trustees in all that we have together tried to do for the children who have been intrusted to our care.

The results of the work of 1916 warrant full confidence in preparations for next season.

REPORT OF THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN.

TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL:—

The work of the Day Patient Department of the Floating Hospital shows no marked changes from the year 1915, the morale being well sustained and the work showing the usual co-operation of the different departments on the boat.

The number of permanent patients, 355, was 11 less than in the previous year, but we were able to extend the treatment from seventeen to nineteen days, and this division of the work shows a total service of 7,026 patient days.

The Day Patient Department showed an increase both in the number of patients and the number of days' service rendered, the figures for this year being 603 with 4,124 patient days.

The total service of the boat showed a large increase, the figures for this year being 15,766 as compared with 12,323.

The "On Shore" work was conducted during the fall, winter, and spring months with gratifying results, the clinics at Parmenter Street being well attended. It is a source of gratification to know that this experimental work has so justified itself that steps will be taken to establish permanent headquarters in some central location to which mothers may bring their children and which will furnish the nucleus for the work of the summer of 1917.

The co-operation of the Trustees and Mr. Briggs, the Manager, in furthering the work of the Resident Physician is deeply appreciated.

I regret that conditions are such that it will not be possible for me to take up the work during the summer of 1917 but find a great satisfaction in continued contact with the work as a member of the Visiting Staff. I bespeak for my successor the same ideal and considerate treatment which I have always had from all connected with the work.

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean linen and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

Copies of the Annual Report, descriptive and printed matter, will be sent upon request.

SEASON OF 1917.

INTRODUCTION.

In sympathy with the desire to conserve material and having in view the most careful use of its funds, the Trustees present their Twenty-fourth Annual Report, much condensed in form, but with no essential information omitted. We believe our contributors and friends will commend this action and be ready to assist us in meeting the increased cost of operation due to the large advance in the cost of material and labor.

The summer of 1917 presented an unusual number of difficult problems in securing professional and lay help, but these were overcome with no loss of efficiency, and but slightly increased expense, the increase over 1916 being largely accounted for by the more than double advance in the cost of steam coal.

The statistics accompanying this report indicate the scope of our general work. The "On Shore" work and its associated clinic have been established on a twelve-month basis, and the Trustees have assumed responsibility for the important biological work, which for several years has been supported by private gifts. The far-reaching results of this work will place the Floating Hospital still further in the forefront of the existing agencies for the conservation of child life.

In grateful acknowledgment of substantial courtesies extended to them by the Commandant of the United States Navy Yard, and Mr. Henry B. Endicott, Executive Manager of the Public Safety Committee, the Trustees were glad to place the Hospital Boat at the disposition of the Government as a dormitory for sailors during the winter, without charge, except for its upkeep in proper condition.

The work of the season of 1918 will undoubtedly entail an increased expense, not all of which can be met by the anticipated income from our still inadequate Endowment Fund. The Trustees therefore appeal to all former contributors for at least undiminished gifts and for new friends and supporters.

Grateful appreciation is again expressed for the generous support of the press and its representatives, and for many gifts and concessions from the merchants of Boston.

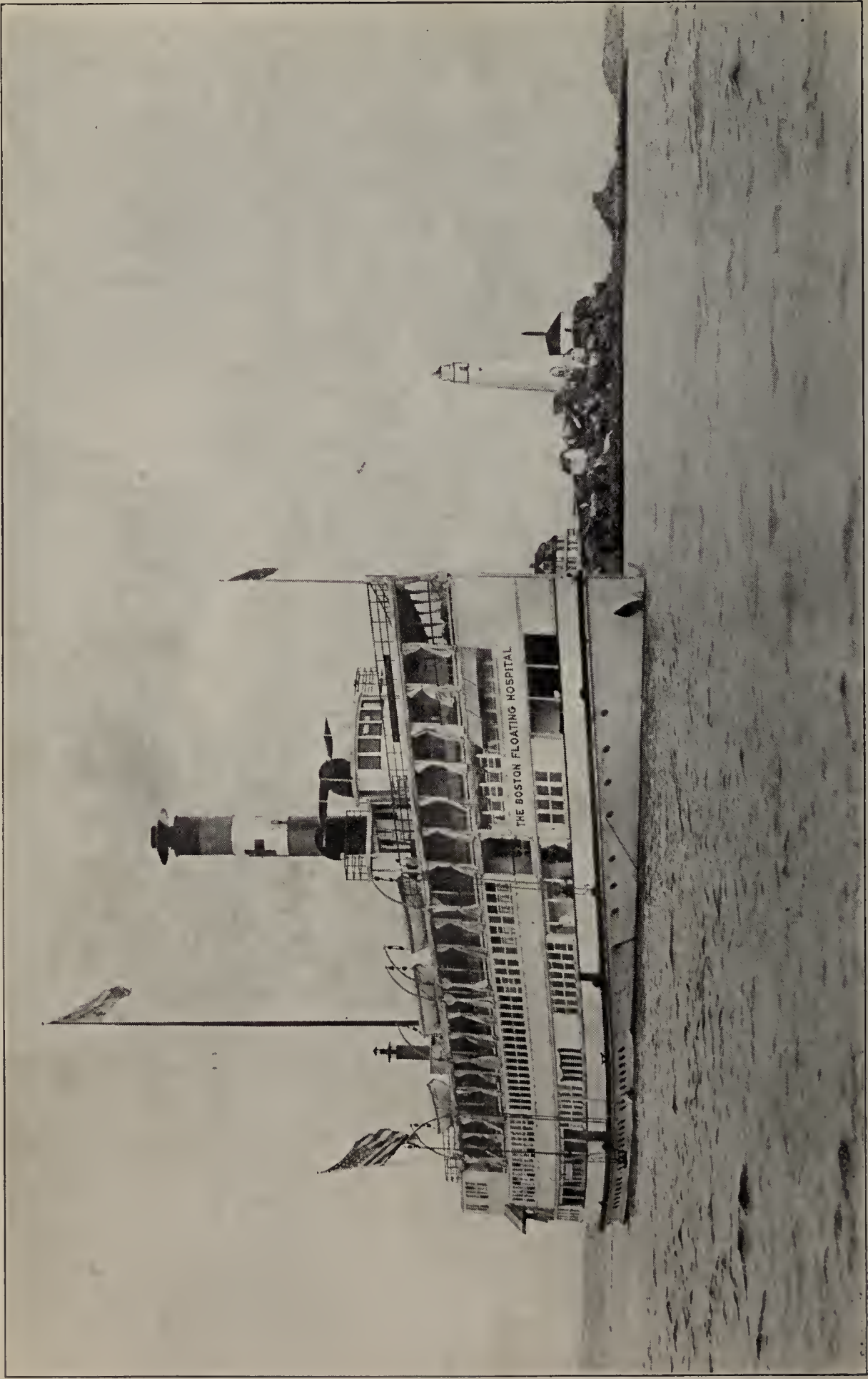

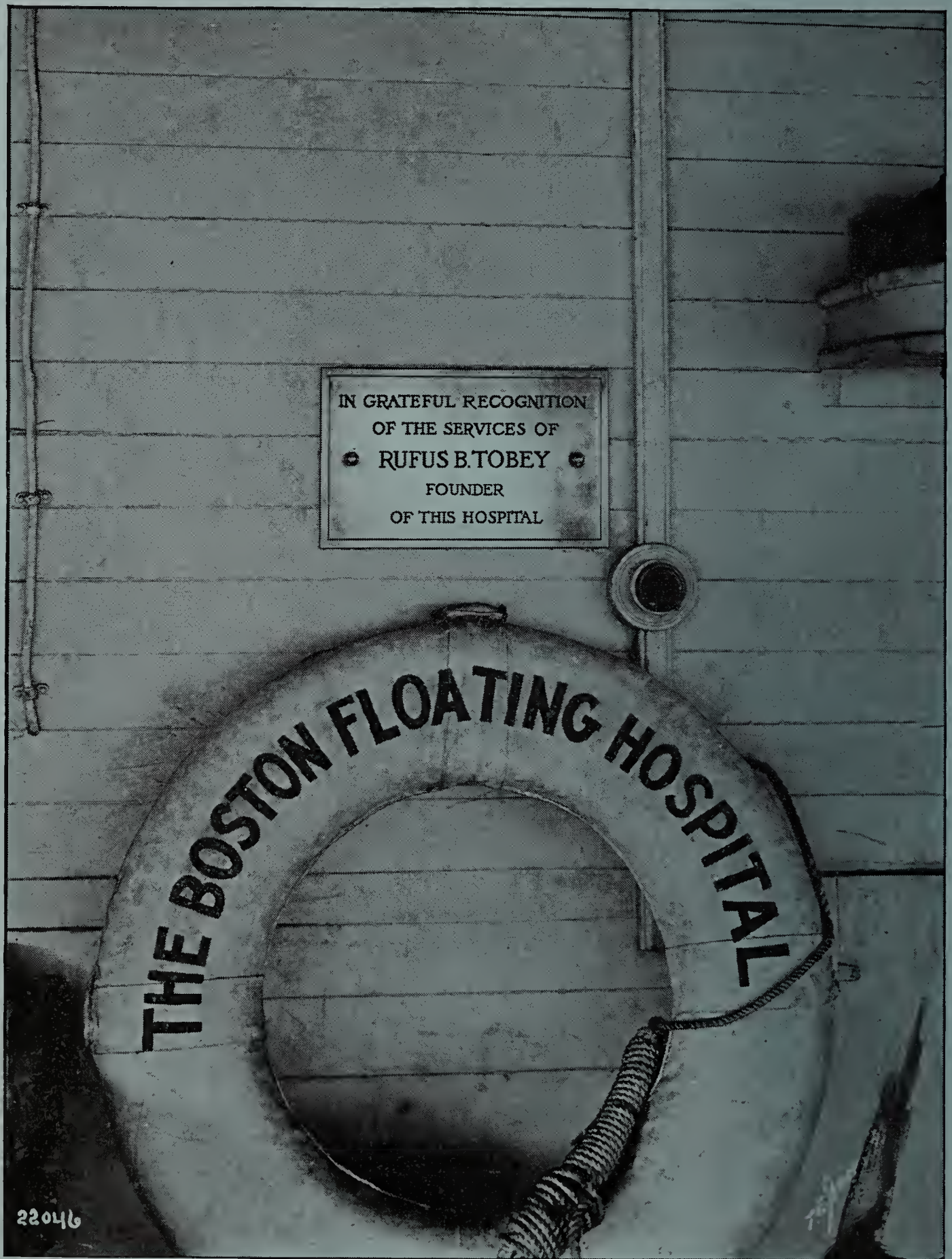

NAMED DAYS AND NIGHTS.

It has long been the custom of this Hospital to allow to individuals or organizations the privilege of giving a name to a day or night, either as a memorial or to specialize the donor's interest in the work. The price for such privilege is \$150 for a day, \$100 for a night, and, where desired and possible, the same date may be reserved by the donor each year.

MEMORIAL BEDS.

Persons or organizations desiring a more permanent form of memorial may avail themselves of the privilege of giving a name to a bed for a period of five years on payment of \$250; and this privilege is continued for a like term on payment of an additional \$250. A bronze tablet indicates the name of the bed and the donor, and forms a perpetual remembrance of the gift.

DAILY MILK FUND.

The cost of cream, milk, fat free milk, buttermilk, and other foods for the sick infants, together with the attendant expenses of handling in the Food Laboratory, approximates \$20 a day.

A special form of help by Sunday-schools, children's clubs, and organizations or groups of children, combining their contributions, or by individual children, is made possible by a subscription of \$20 for each working day of the hospital ship, and will be designated as the "Floating Hospital Daily Milk Fund." The donor's name will be recorded and recognized in the same manner, as far as possible, as are donors of Named Days and Named Nights. This list will also be published in the Annual Report as a matter of record.

VISITORS.

While the Hospital is in commission during the summer, the boat returns to the pier at North End Park every afternoon at 4.30 (Sundays included), when visitors are always welcome to inspect the Hospital and see how the work is conducted.

LINEN.—PRINTED MATTER.

The Hospital is in great need of large supplies of old clean linen and cotton rags, such as worn-out table-cloths, napkins, white underclothing, towels, sheets, pillow-cases, etc. In the care of the very sick children intrusted to us we use quantities of this material.

Tags to be used in expressing bundles, boxes, or barrels, will be furnished.

THE BOSTON FLOATING HOSPITAL.

SEASON OF 1918.

INTRODUCTION.

The season of 1918 opened with the return of our boat from the Government, who had had its use as an adjunct of the United States Navy during the previous winter and spring. As far as possible the Government had attempted to restore the boat to the condition in which it had been turned over to them. Our preparations for the work of the summer disclosed, however, many repairs and renewals necessary for the efficient conduct of the work. Much of this could not be attempted in the short time between May 1 and the opening of the boat for the reception of patients. The cost of this work will therefore largely be reflected in the expense accounts for next year, 1919.

The season opened June 27, and in spite of the handicaps mentioned, the shortage of nurses and a diminished medical staff, the work was maintained through the summer with gratifying success.

- The demand upon the nursing force of the country by the overseas service made it necessary to supplement the work of our small force of graduate nurses with undergraduates and assistants, whose work and enthusiasm were most praiseworthy. The return of large numbers of graduate nurses since the armistice permits the feeling of assurance we have that this force next summer will be fully up to the standard of our hospital both in number and efficiency.

We were obliged, too, to share the services of our Resident Physician, Dr. Eli Friedman, with another hospital. Dr. Friedman well met this additional draft upon his time and ability, and the Trustees are pleased to acknowledge their appreciation of his service in this position as well as in that of physician to our clinic, a duty assumed by him during the previous winter and spring.

The operation of the boat presented in aggravated form the same problems as the summer of 1917, and these were as successfully met and solved by our Manager, Mr. Briggs.

The support of the work was loyally maintained by our contributors as a whole, but the increased cost of labor and commodities and the absence in government service of a large number of our supporters is reflected in a deficit of \$7,336.56 as compared with a surplus in 1917 of \$1,079.29. Of this amount, \$4,605.19 was due to decreased contributions.

In the interest of conservation our report for 1917 appeared in abbreviated and condensed form. It will be noticed that the present report marks a return to our standard form. A feature not heretofore included, and one which will be of especial interest, we hope, to members of the nursing profession, is the schedule of the lectures given in our Post-Graduate Course, with the names of the lecturers. The Trustees take this occasion to publicly acknowledge their great debt to these gentlemen, whose service in this field has been at the disposal of the Hospital in most cases almost since the establishment of the Course. Their names are a measure of our debt as well as an indication of the value of their gift to our students.

The "On Shore" work has been conducted with signal success. So important has this branch of our work become that generous friends have given us funds for the equipment of an On Shore Department. The close of the next season will see our present work located in more permanent quarters as part of this new department of our Hospital for all-the-year-round treatment of cases, and in which our laboratory and scientific work may be closely associated with the clinical, instead of in separate quarters as at present.

This growth of our work with the universally high cost of commodities emphasizes the appeal of the Trustees for contributions much larger than last year. Generous as our contributors have been in the past, the importance of the work, filling a need not met by any other agency, and supplementing the work of practically all other child-welfare organizations, justifies the appeal. The Trustees also ask the inquiring interest of that large public which has not heretofore participated in the work, satisfied that knowledge of our methods, administrative, financial, and scientific, and the results attained, will transmute that interest into substantial aid to the sick children of Greater Boston for whom we work and speak.

It is our annual duty, gladly performed, to express our hearty thanks to the newspapers and to a substantial number of friends who have made gifts of goods, linen, garments, etc., during the year.

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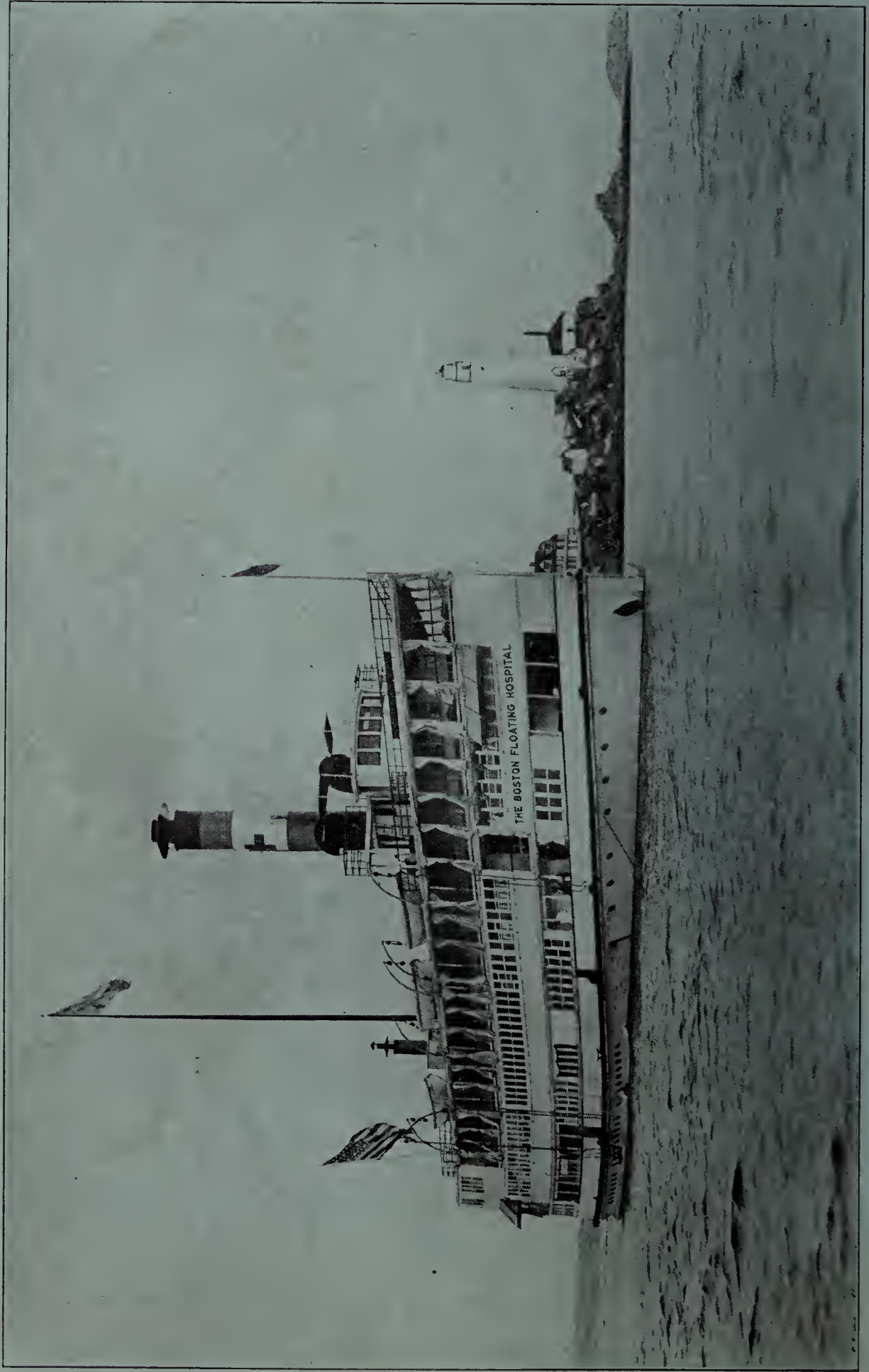
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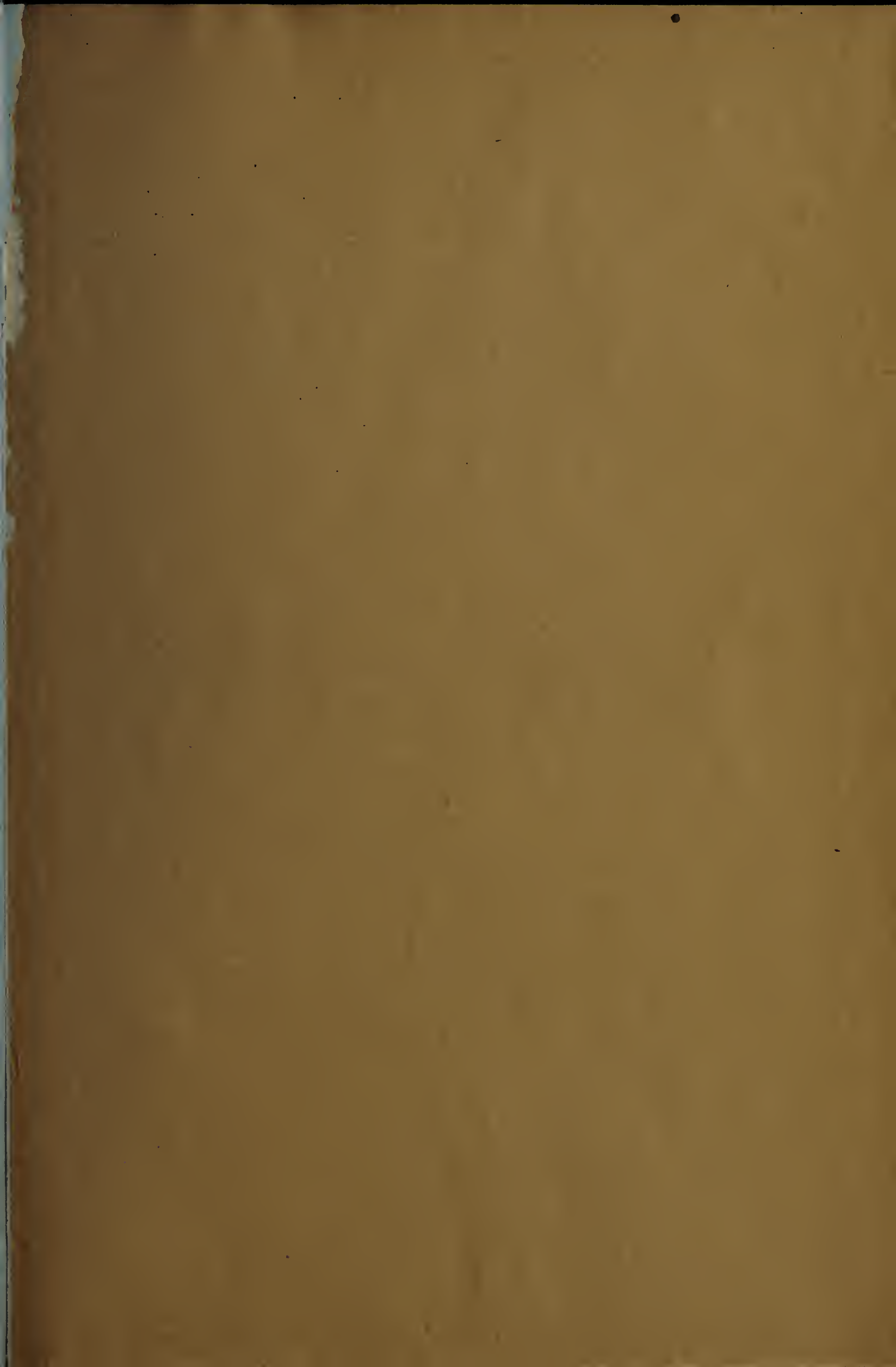
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
