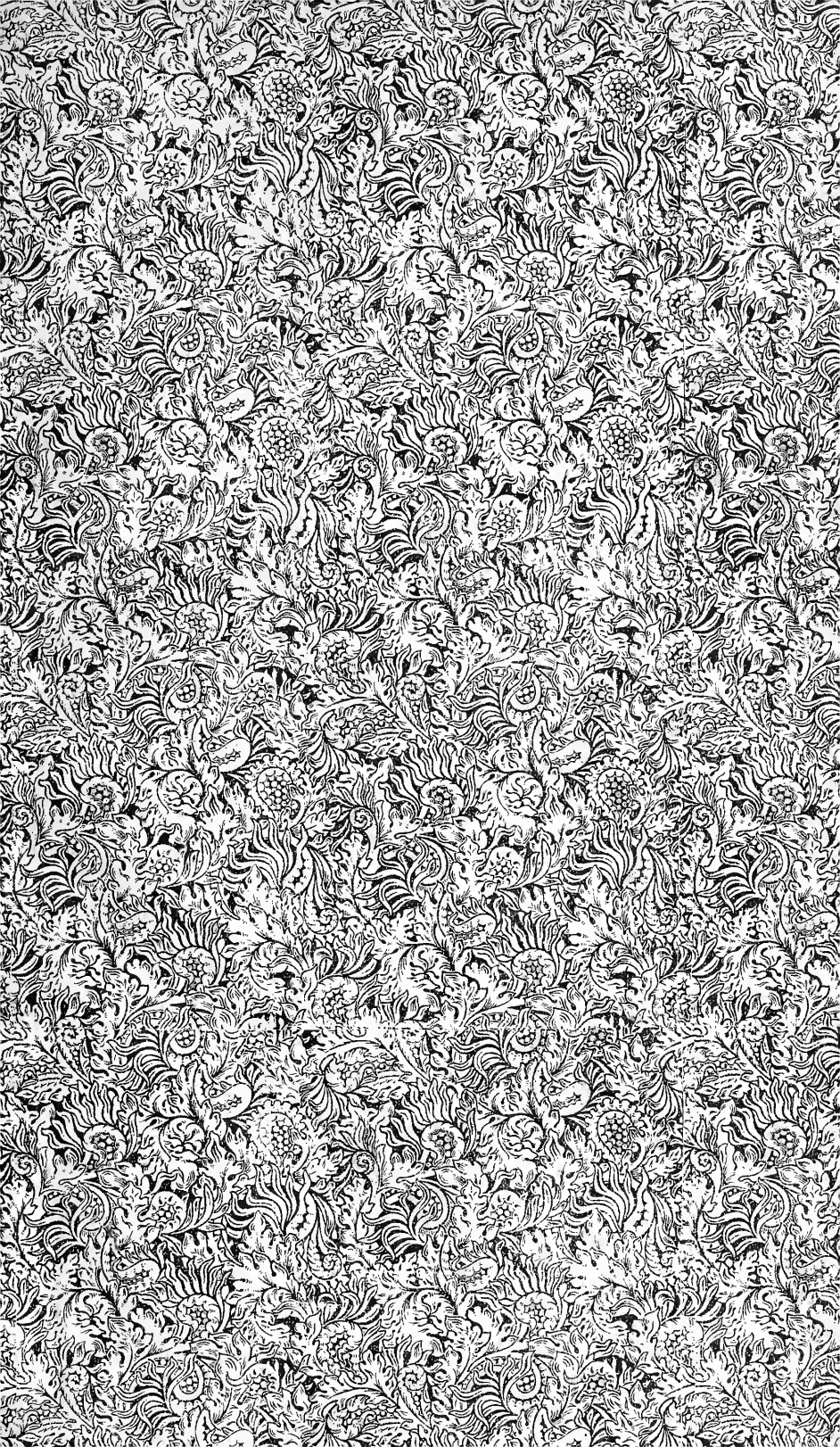

GENTLEMEN, — In compliance with the provisions of the City Ordinance the Board of Fire Commissioners herewith presents its Sixteenth Annual Report, containing a statement of the fires and their causes, the condition of the department, and expenditures for the year ending April 30, 1889.

THE FIRE RECORD.

Of the general fire-waste of the country for the year ending April 30, 1889, about \$1,078,333 must be credited to the City of Boston. This includes the total loss on buildings and contents, except a portion of that caused by the fire in the Boston & Albany hay-sheds, in regard to which the figures have been approximated. There have been nine hundred and sixty-two alarms, besides twenty-three seconds, seven thirds, and two additional, called on account of fires for which other boxes had been pulled. Though the loss is somewhat heavier than for the previous year, it is nevertheless very light as

compared with the amount of combustible property requiring protection, and cannot help but be satisfactory to those most directly and deeply interested. There has been a number of considerable fires, but they have all been prevented from assuming the serious proportions that have been the ill-fortune of some other large cities. The constant demand for improved methods of heating, lighting, transit, and applying power generally for the growing wants of the public, involves the establishment of new conditions which are likely to prove obstructive in a greater or less degree to the highest efficiency of this department, and in estimating the value of the service the public should take this fact into account and make due allowance for it.

CONDITION OF THE DEPARTMENT.

A year's quiet work has made a very appreciable and gratifying improvement in the general appearance and convenience of the houses of the department. While the amount of money spent in accomplishing the result has not been large, it is safe to assert that never before in the history of the department have the different company quarters been as creditable to the city as they are to-day. Within the year the new engine-house at Brighton has been accepted and occupied by an engine company numbered 34. It practically doubles the protection afforded the Brighton District, and is called upon to cover, in cases of considerable emergency, within the city proper. The house at Roslindale, built for Chemical Engine 4 and the new Ladder Company 16, has also been occupied, and is one of the finest buildings in finish and arrangement to be found in this or any other department. Steps have been taken toward the establishment of a new chemical engine company on Eustis street, Roxbury, and before the close of the present year the commissioners may have important recommendations to make regarding better protection to certain property in the down-town portion of the city. The question of a steady advancement of the department toward permanency is still held to be of the greatest importance. All the companies in South Boston, East Boston, Charlestown, and perhaps Roxbury, should be made permanent as soon as possible; and while the commissioners do not wish to seem importunate, they ask your assistance and encouragement to this end. They have already ventured to place Ladder Companies 4, 5, and 12, Hose Companies 5, 7, 10, and 12, and Chemical 6 on a permanent basis, and feel that the department is materially strengthened thereby.

THE FIRE-BOAT.

Engine 31, the new fire-boat to succeed the "William M. Flanders," which was promised a year ago, has been completed. The commissioners have used the utmost endeavor of which they were capable to have her furnished with the latest and best appliances to secure power, speed, and rapid manœuvring qualities. While it is yet too early to state with the utmost confidence what she can do in every emergency she may encounter, her several trials lead them to believe that their efforts have been successful, and that the boat will prove a powerful and valuable acquisition to the city's means of protection against fires. Her power to throw water is probably as great, at least, as that of any floating engine in the world.

THE DRILL-SCHOOL.

A feature of the service recently introduced is the Department Drill-School in the large yard of the repair-shop. A tower has been erected upon one of the shops and furnished with windows, making the whole equivalent to a five-story building. All recruits are drilled here for thirty days, by a very competent company commander, in all that belongs to the service outside of actual fire-fighting. They are exercised in the use of all kinds of ladders, including the Pom-pier, the coupling of hose, attachment to hydrants and engines, the jumping nets, etc. Their appointment depends upon their ability to pass through the drill in a satisfactory manner. In this way a correct estimate of their qualities and value can be much more speedily arrived at, and they can receive in thirty days instruction in the duties required of them which they would be many months acquiring in the old way. The school is likewise intended for the improvement of members of the department as well as of those who are seeking admission.

CENTRAL HEADQUARTERS.

The commissioners continue to hope that you will yet take favorable action upon the recent proposition to erect a fire-proof building in a central location for the accommodation of the Fire-Alarm Department, and for department offices and apparatus. It can hardly be necessary to enlarge here upon the constant, great, and growing menace to the fire-alarm system on account of the combustible nature of its present quarters and the rapid increase of electrical systems throughout the city. The best time to guard against trouble

is the present, instead of waiting until the mischief is done. The location originally suggested still seems to the commissioners the most economical and available, but if a better one can be found and secured they will gladly accept it. The central fact which they wish to emphasize is, that the present situation is full of peril, and speedy relief is needed.

RETIREMENTS AND PENSIONS.

An age limit for permanent men of the service has been established the past year. The commissioners have fixed it at sixty-two years, which seemed to them a conservative position to take upon a rather delicate question. This action retired two district chiefs, one captain, one lieutenant, one engineman, and three hosemen. These were all men who had performed faithful service for fifteen years or more in the department, and their names have been placed upon the pension roll. Some of them are still vigorous, and can render good service in some less exacting and hazardous calling, but experience has demonstrated that it is not for the interest of the city or the men themselves that they should take dangerous chances, and undergo the inevitable exposure and severe labor incident to this service in times of fire after the age designated. The pension list will be a slowly growing one each year on account of this action; but the department will be rendered more efficient thereby, and the results in the long run must conduce to the interests of true economy as well as to humanity and justice. By making a fixed limit of age a condition of retirement from service there remains no chance for the exercise of favoritism, even should there be any disposition of that sort on the part of the responsible officials.

APPARATUS.

But little apparatus has been purchased aside from the stock of hose and other things requiring regular annual replenishment. Several new hose wagons have been bought to continue the work of retiring the heavier and less convenient hose carriages. Two more chemical engines have been introduced into the service, and no branch of the department pays better for the expense of maintenance than this. The department repair-shop has been able to keep the apparatus in general use in good condition, and also make over some of the relief engines for new service. No new ladder trucks have been secured, yet Boston has a splendid ladder service, especially in the city proper.

THE FIRE-ALARM.

The work of the Fire-Alarm Department is shown in another portion of this report. Its greatest need now is a new and more secure location, to which reference has been made under another heading. The commissioners hope it will never be necessary to tell, in these reports or elsewhere, the story of its annihilation by reason of electrical contacts and combustible surroundings.

CONDITION OF THE FORCE.

The commissioners have only praise to express for the discipline and conduct of the department as a whole. Their instructions and commands have been carried out cheerfully, zealously, and efficiently by both the officers and men in their respective positions, and a gratifying spirit of harmony seems to everywhere prevail, without which discipline is impossible and the best results cannot be obtained. The commissioners wish to acknowledge, with grateful appreciation, the loyal manner in which the department has seconded their efforts.

THE POLICE.

On several occasions during the year the services of the police have deserved and received the special thanks of this department because of the promptness and efficiency with which that branch of the city's protective service has coöperated with this. The Lowell freight-sheds and the Boston & Albany hay-shed fires are conspicuous instances in point; but many more might be cited. The relations between the two departments have been profitable and pleasant, as they always can and should be.

THE PROTECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The Protective Department, the close and friendly ally of this, has told its own story so well and made so conspicuously good a record during the year that its praises need no trumpeting here. The commissioners, however, take this opportunity to thankfully acknowledge many acts of courtesy from that department to this, and assistance rendered, when perhaps a purely technical interpretation of duty would not have exacted it.

ORGANIZATION.

The organization of the department consists of a Board of three Fire Commissioners, a Chief of Department, a Superintendent of Fire Alarms, 13 District Chiefs and other members, including telegraph operators and employés of repair shops, to the number not exceeding one thousand men.

THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS

consists of three members. One member is appointed annually, for a term of three years, from the first Monday in May each year. The nomination is made by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the Board of Aldermen.

JOHN R. MURPHY, for three years from May, 1888. Term expires May, 1891.

FIRE DISTRICTS.

The city is divided into Ten Fire Districts, as follows :—

- DISTRICT 1. — Comprises all that part of Boston known as East Boston.
- DISTRICT 2. — All that part of Boston formerly known as Charlestown.
- DISTRICT 3. — All that part east of a line beginning at the Charles-river drawbridge, and running through the centre of Charlestown street, Haymarket square, and Washington to Summer street, and North of Summer street and the N.Y. and N.E. R.R. passenger depot to the water.
- DISTRICT 4. — All that part west of District 3, and north of a line running through the centre of Winter and Park streets, and west of Beacon, to Arlington street, west side of Commonwealth avenue, to Chester park, to water.
- DISTRICT 5. — All that part south of Districts 3 and 4 to the centre of Dover-street drawbridge, and a line running through the centre of Dover, Berkeley, Boylston, east side of Commonwealth avenue, to Arlington, to Boylston street.
- DISTRICT 6. — All that part of Boston known as South Boston.
- DISTRICT 7. — All that part of Boston south of District 5, to the centre of Albany street ; thence through the centre of Albany, and Northampton streets, Columbus avenue, and Chester park, to east side of Commonwealth avenue, to centre of Berkeley, to Dover street.
- DISTRICT 8. — All that part south and west of District 7, to the boundary line of West Roxbury, and west of Washington street to the Brookline boundary line, and including all of Ward 25 formerly Brighton.
- DISTRICT 9. — All that part south of Districts 6 and 7, to West Roxbury line, running through the centre of Blue Hill avenue, Columbia, Green, Bowdoin, Church, and Commercial streets, to Dorchester avenue, thence due east to the water.
- DISTRICT 10. — All the southerly part of Boston south of Districts 8 and 9, including West Roxbury.

HORSES.

The number of horses in the department April 30, 1888, was 180; total number April 30, 1889, 189; 19 were purchased, 9 sold or exchanged, 1 died. During the four winter months extra horses were placed in service under agreement with the owners that such service should be without cost to the city other than the care and feed, the same as is given the regular horses of the department. The horses have received inspection from the Hospital Surgeon, who has made weekly reports to the Board of their condition and treatment, both in quarters or at the hospital.

The number of horses receiving treatment during the year was 156, resulting in 225 cases, of which 56 were received at the hospital stable, and the balance were attended at the houses of their companies. Of the 225 cases treated 8 were incurable.

WATER AND HYDRANTS.

The total number of hydrants in the city, May 1, was 5,338. In addition to these hydrants there are 238 fire reservoirs in different sections of the city, that contain from 300 to 500 hogsheads of water, and can be used in an emergency. The number of hydrants added during the year is as follows:—

74 Lowry, 113 Post, 5 Boston, and 64 Boston Lowry. The amount paid by this department for water and the care and maintenance of hydrants was \$77,985.

In all cases the Water Board have cheerfully complied with the requests of this Board in the establishment of hydrants whenever necessity required.

During the past year 269 hydrants have been established and 137 abandoned, as follows: —

FIRE-ALARM DEPARTMENT.

The new construction and repair work done by this department within the year ending April 30, 1889, is as follows:—

An additional circuit has been built for the better protection of West Roxbury, the route of the same being so arranged as to secure the usual alternation in the connection of boxes and apparatus between it and the circuit heretofore in service in that district.

There are now twenty-three alarm and seven box-gong circuits in the system. A great amount of work has been done in renewing fixtures and poles, and running new wire in various parts of the city. Many new chestnut poles have been substituted for old ones of spruce, which had become unsafe from long service, being in many cases badly decayed. The large number of public and special boxes which have been put in service have necessitated the running of much new wire for connecting them into the circuits for service. More than fifty of these boxes have been placed in the public school-houses for the special protection of the same.

All the boxes in Charlestown and South Boston have been supplied with keyless doors during the year. The house of Engine Company No. 34 has been furnished with the necessary apparatus, including alarm-gong, tappers, and telephone.

A box-gong and telephone have also been placed in the chief engineer's night office.

There are sixty-seven department telephones in use exclusive of those used by Protective Companies 1 and 2 and the Fire Marshal, which are connected with the system.

A systematic arrangement of the apparatus has been made in many of the department houses by placing it upon large boards, conveniently located, and the safety and utility of the service has not only been advanced by so doing, but the several houses have been greatly adorned by the artistic setting of the various pieces of apparatus on the boards.

Seventy-one new public and special boxes have been added to the service, and one box removed during the year.

A constant watch is kept at the headquarters, City Hall, night and day, by the operators. Each operator has assigned to him certain hours of duty, during which time he is responsible for the correct working of the apparatus in giving alarms, and all testing of the circuits and other details pertaining to the service. An automatic arrangement is connected with the receiving apparatus, by which assistance may be called from the sleeping apartments, if at any time the operator should be suddenly incapacitated by illness from performing his duties. No operator is permitted to sleep during his watch, unless expressly relieved by some one else, and by consent of the Superintendent.

Each operator is accountable to the Superintendent for any mistakes that may occur at the office during his hours of duty.

An accurate account is kept of the time of giving each alarm, and of the station from which it originates, and all other necessary information.
