The Selectmen respectfully submit their report to the town with the following suggestions: that on the 11th day of June, of last year, the east abutment was carried away, and the east end of Republican bridge w s damaged by the logs; that they have rebuilt the abutment and repaired the bridge at an expense of \$2.411.05, and have commenced suit against the logowners for the damage; that they have paid bills to the amount of \$310 on account of the small-pox, and have paid bil's for repairs of Engine, and Engine houses Nos. 1 and 3, that were absolutely necessary for the protection of the Engines against frost, as it was impossible to keep them in working order without this outlay; and would refer to Balance-Sheet as showing the financial condition of the Town with the addition I suggestion that as these expenses referred to could not have been foreseen, no money was raised by the Town for these purposes; and would likewise suggest that they have examined into the condition of the persons supported by the Town at the Isane Asylum, and would not recommend their removal.

The board of Fire Engineers for the year 1872, submit the following:

REPORT.

The fire department consists of eight engineers and one hundred able-bodied firemen.

FIRE APPARATUS.

The fire apparatus consists of two hand fire-engines. Franklin No. 1. located i the west village, is a Hunneman engine, 5 inch cylinder, has 1 hose carriage, 450 ft. leather leading hose, 24 ft. suction hose, 1 copper strainer, 3 hose pipes, 12 belts, 4 nozzles, 24 spanners, 4 buckets, 2 axes, 2 lanterns, 4 pr. rubber overalls, two rubber caps, 1 rubber coat, 3 prs. rubber mittens. 1 whiffletree, 1 nipple wreuch, broom, 1 bench brush, 1 dust-pan, 2 box stoves and funnel, all in good order and condition, in engine house No. 1.

Stark No. 3, located in the east village, Hunneman engine, 5½ inch cylinder, has 1 hose carriage, 100 ft. leather leading hose and 350 ft. linen, 28 ft. suction hose, 1 copper strainer, 4 hose pipes, 6 nozzles, 4 buckets, 2 axes, 3 belts and 6 spanners for suction hose, 3 belts and 8 spanners for leading hose, 1 reducing coupling, 1 signal lantern, 1 whiffletree, 1 draw-bar, 3 draw-hooks, 2 suits rubber clothing, 3 prs. mittens, 1 2) ft. ladder, 1 nipple wrench, 1 cylinder wrench, 1 bench brush, 2 oil cans, 2 box stoves and funnel, all in good order and condition, except the linen leading hose, which is considerably worn, in engine house No. 3.

RESERVOIRS.

It has been ascertained that the wall of the reservoir near the bridge is too thin to sustain the pressure of the water, when full, and consequently will not hold water and it is the opinion of the board that the walls will have to be strengthened by building inside.

The reservoir near the depot, is in good order.

FIRES AND ALARMS.

July 7th. 1872, 2 o'clock a.m., in Winnipiseogee Paper Co. buildings, cause, supposed from lime stored in the building, loss 331.500.00. Time eight hours.

Oct. 18th, 6 o'clock a. m., in Franklin Falls Co. boarding house, kept by Mrs. Howe, cause, upsetting kerosene lamp, loss, small. Time one hour.

Oct. 24th, alarm from A. W. Sulloway's building, occupied by W. G. Hu cock as a carpenter's shop, cause, supposed friction, no loss. Time one hour.

Oct. 50th, 5 o'clock a.m., in A. W. Sulloway's building, occupied as office and finishing room to Sulloway's Hosiery Mill, cause unknown, loss \$5750.00. Time two hours.

It would appear at the first glance at the foregoing statement, that the expenses of the fire department for the year have been unusually large; but when it is considered there has been paid about \$200.00 for finishing our engine houses, which were left

unfinished when built over, \$350.00 extra for engine men working at fires, and about \$230.00 for repairs on reservoirs, it will be seen that including painting the engines, and 200 ft. leading hose, for engine No. 1, the expense is only \$587.66. Deducting the extra expense of painting and new hose, and we have only \$253.51, as the ordinary running expense.

In the matter of reservo'rs, something should be done next season on the reservoir near the bridge; also there should be some provisions for water on the hill, in the vicinity of Shadrach Wadleigh's house.

We have two good engines, all the accompanying apparatus, two engine companies which for promptness and efficiency are hard to beat, and we only need water to make our Fire Department effective.
