## Warrant for Town Meeting.

---

To M. P. Doyle, a Constable of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Lincoln,

Greeting :

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Whitefield qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at the town house in said town on the sixth day of March, 1911, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1st. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2nd. To choose a clerk.

Art. 3rd. To hear and act upon the report of the several town officers.

Art. 4th. To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor.

Art. 5th. To choose a Treasurer.

Art. 6th. To choose an Auditor.

Art. 7th. To choose one or more Road Commissioners.

Art. 8th. To see what time the taxes of 1911 shall be paid in full.

Art. 9th. To choose a Collector of Taxes.

Art. 10th. To choose one or more members of the School Committee.

Art. 11th. To choose all other necessary town officers.

Art. 12th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year, and to see what action they will take in regard to the transportation of scholars.

Art. 13th. To see if the town will vote yes or no upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws

of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State aid for highways for the year 1911.

Art. 14th. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amount regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways and highways and bridges, under the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909.

Art. 15th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the Support of the Poor, for the repairs of roads and bridges and to defray all other town charges.

Art. 16th. To see what the town will vote to do with the money that was raised and unexpended last year for Free High School.

Art. 17th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Free High School, and where they will locate the same.

Art. 18th. To see if the town will appropriate \$25 to Erskine Post G. A. R. for Memorial Day.

Art. 19th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the repairs of School Buildings.

Art. 20th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the purchase of school books.

Art. 21st. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the payment or part payment of the town debt.

Art. 22nd. To see if the town will vote to repair the Town House, and what sum of money they will grant and raise for the same.

Art. 23rd. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the destruction of nests of the brown tail moth, and how the same shall be expended.

Art. 24th. To see if the town will vote to establish a school in the Fowles District so called.

Art. 25th. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to pay the Town of Randolph fifteen dollars on outlawed bill.

Art. 26th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to be expended on the Noyes road so called.



Art. 27th. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to be expended on the Miles Benner Road, so called.

Art. 28th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the town, should the same become necessary.
