Report of School District

Report of Superintendent

To the School Board and Citizens of Albany:

The present registration of the school is fourteen pupils. We have been fortunate in retaining an able and experienced teacher in this school and in spite of its size a number of interesting projects have been carried on that reflect credit on both teacher and pupils.

The total registration for last year was fourteen. Of these two were tuition pupils. The percentage of attendance was 93 and the number of tardiness was nineteen. Six pupils were transported.

The medical examination of last year disclosed these defects and notices were sent to the parents. Vision, 1; hearing, 1; nervous condition, 1; teeth, 12; breathing, 1. The number of corrections reported were five.

The probable amount of state-aid money for next year is \$972. The per capita tax is \$54 and the amount of the \$5 tax is \$1,004.43. The assessment required to balance the school board's budget will necessarily exceed this amount.
