

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### (L. S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the town of Grantham in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer and one Overseer of Poor for the ensuing year, one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds and one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of the Poor, and Old Age Assistance.

- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid for highways and raise and appropriate money for same.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.
- Art. 8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the Public Library.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for control of the White Pine Blister Rust to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to buy a tractor and snow plow for use on town roads. To raise and appropriate money for same, to be purchased on terms which seem most advisable at this meeting.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise for the support of the District Nurse.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money if necessary.

Art. 15. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 16. To transact any other business that may come legally before said meeting.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Grantham:

It is a pleasure to present my third annual report of the work of the schools in Grantham. It is one of a series of such reports issued by superintendents of schools.

#### SURVEY

Two resignations, those of Mr. Young and Miss Kew became effective at the end of the last school year. The teachers who replaced them at the Village School are carrying forward the work without retardation. Hot lunches are being prepared and continued through the combined interests of teachers and parents. This is but a forerunner of the situation that will necessitate local agencies to care for these needed services rather than to depend upon the Federal Government. The educational work of the schools is moving forward with normal success. The pupils are increasing their skills and improving their opportunity in acquiring many of the needful tools of life.

#### ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

The enrollment and attendance table is present in the usual form. Your attention is directed to the fact that the enrollment in the North Neighborhood school is larger than that for several years past.

#### REPAIRS

The repairs made last summer were limited to the barest necessity. To carry out the idea of the citizens and the Board an investigation was made as to possible improvements at the Village School. was hoped that some aid might be received from the Federal Government for such improvements. It was found that in smaller communities it was not practicable to attempt to utilize this plan as the requirements of the Federal Government were such as to make the delays and costs almost without benefit to the District. Sketches were drawn, however, to show that the toilet facilities could be re-arranged and made more wholesome. These sketches are still available. The present condition of these facilities at the school is such that something needs to be done. These improvements involve re-building and the re-placement of the present toilets and providing the school if possible with a flush toilet system. There are available certain types of valves which make possible the use of such toilets without providing for additional heat. If these improvements can be made and water introduced into the building additional yearly receipts may be secured from the State Department due to a new ruling from that Department as to such improvements. It is recommended that a special appropriation be made by the School District to be added to any funds available from appropriation balances to complete this work. The longer these improvements are delayed the more likely there is to be a larger expense involved. An article could be inserted in the School District Warrant asking the voters to raise some specific sum for this purpose.

#### BUDGET

There was a slight increase in the amount of State Aid granted the School District last year. This item plus a somewhat larger estimated balance makes the amount required to be raised by taxation about \$200


less than last year for regular budget purposes. This fact might show the citizens a way in which the proposed changes in the Village School could be made without adding any very material amount to the tax rate.

#### CONCLUSION

The spirit of friendliness which is shown by the citizens of Grantham to the teachers and officials in connection with the schools is worthy of commendation. It is only by united effort that it is possible for public school work to be lifted to a higher plane. It is expected that much progress will be made during the next few months. Smaller communities of New Hampshire should be proud that they have been able to maintain a progressive educational program in spite of the fact that large areas in other parts of the country have either through necessity or a spirit of fear limited the expenditures for public schools. future citizenry of the country will gather its ideals from the background laid in the public schools. If these same schools show a broad outlook, develop an optimistic attitude and set up appropriate behavior patterns, the youth of the land will be able to adjust themselves to the newer situations as they arise. New Hampshire and her widely scattered communities must continue to make her contribution through a program which shall anticipate to some extent the present and future needs of the young people in the public schools.
