#### Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
  - (e) Town hall, office and other buildings.
  - (f) Damage and Legal Expenses.
  - (g) Health Department.
  - (h) Town Dump.
  - (i) Vital Statistics.
  - (i) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (k) Civil Defense.
  - (1) Interest on Temporary Loans.
  - (m) County Tax.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
- To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise one thousand seven hundred dollars (\$1,700.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department.

- 8. To see what sum of money, if any the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town road maintenance.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the following roads which are not used:
  - (a) The two sections of road on High Street that were replaced by the new road in West Stewartstown Village.
  - (b) The road known as School House Hill, leading from the Daniel Webster Highway on Washington Street to the intersection of the present Highway on High Street in West Stewartstown Village.
- 12. To see what action the town will take in regard to the Tractor Snow Plow:
  - (a) To see if the town wants to keep paying so much for repairs on the old plow.
  - (b) To see if the town will vote to hire the snow banks pushed back for one year to see if it is cheaper than having its own equipment.
  - (c) To see if the town will vote to replace the old plow with a new one.
- To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell the V Type truck plow and wing.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of at a public auction any and all real estate now owned and acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to change the road agents districts to two districts instead of three districts.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-partisan Ballot.

- 18. To choose by Non-partisan Ballot the following Town Officers:
  - (a) Town Clerk.
  - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
  - (c) Town Treasurer.
  - (d) Three Road Agents.
  - (e) One or more Auditors.
  - (f) Overseer of Poor.
  - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
  - (h) One or more Sextons.
  - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
  - (j) One Library trustee for the three years ensuing.
- 19. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

### Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Stewartstown qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the 5th day of March, 1960, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officers, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with such other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will authorize the school board to sell the Cedar Brook and Hollow School properties.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State and/or United States.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

### Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

#### Foreword

In all probability, the past year has witnessed more being attempted by our schools than has ever been done before during a like period, to more nearly measure up to what has been so voluminously said and written about what they should be doing. Yesterday's concern about the overlooked upper quarter, who and how many are doing what in what way in Mathematics, Science and Foreign Languages, and where and how do we get there in Guidance, is today being rapidly converted from the expressed to the action stage. This transition is taking place at all levels, national, state, and local with the last one presenting the initial performance in many instances. Here in our own state, ways of challenging marked ability, the use of the more effective conversational approach in the teaching of Foreign Languagse enhanced by the use of electronic devices, daily broadcasts of educational television programs in a number of subject areas, for both elementary and high school, and much stepped-up guidance programs are already being capitalized upon in a rapidly increasing number of schools. Matching funds made available through the National Defense Act for the purchase of materials and equipment in certain subject areas at all grade levels have contributed not a little in stimulaiting the action which has taken and is taking place.

It is significant that with the adoption and putting into practice of these new ways of presenting subject matter, and the utilization of the additional assistance that only a greater understanding of the scientific potential about us provides, our basic philosophy still remains the same. Although quality is receiving more attention, quantity has not been neglected. The recognition of the need to educate everyone up to the level of his ability is still compatible with the demand for the best at all levels in education. For, in so far as has yet been determined, ability is not the sole ingredient in superior performance. The indications are that motivation and character must also be present in this product if anything of lasting value is to result.

#### Teachers

With little or no abatement in the teacher shortage in the foreseeable future, the district is extremely fortunate to have experienced teachers in all positions. Mrs. Claire G. Owen,

who received her training at Farmington Teachers College in Maine, and who has taught several years previously in this state, teachers Grades 5-8 at the new Hollow Elementary, School. Mrs. JoAnn M. Davis teaches Grades 1-4 at the same school. The three veteran teachers at the West Stewartstownt School include Mrs. Velma H. Gray, Principal, who teaches Grade 6-7-8; Mrs. Henrietta W. Jackson who teaches Grades 3-4-5, and Mrs. Cleora M. Richardson who teaches Grades 1-2.

#### School Nurse-Health

As has been pointed out many times previously, the health services rendered year after year by Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, school nurse, to help pupils more effectively maintain that state of good health essential to a happy and successful overall school life, bespeaks the magnitude and importance of the work done. Clinics, immunizations, physical examinations, frequent check-ups on height, weight, hearing, and eyesight, and continuous supervision of the general health are included in the comprehensive program conducted.

As much as these services contribute to what is accomplished healthwise in our schools, however, one of vital importance—dental care—urgently needs to be included. A dental clinic would provide an extremely valuable addition.

#### Repairs-Equipment

Although the construction of the new Hollow Elementary School Building was in progress during the past summer, the policy of keeping all buildings in use in a good state of repair and maintenance has been followed. Since the Hollow and Cedar Brook buildings would no longer be used for school purposes the windows were covered. At West Stewartstown, outside of repairing the ceilings in the stairway leading to the boys' basement and the one over the first landing in the stairway leading to the second floor on the North side of the building, most maintenance work was confined to painting. Included in the painting done were the walls of both classrooms on the first floor and the floors in the lunchroom, basement room, and both boys 'and girls' toilets.

Outside of miscellaneous items a liquid duplicator for the West Stewartstown Building was the only piece of equipment purchased during this past year.

#### New Hollow Elementary School Building

With the construction of the New Hollow Elementary School Building practically completed and located as it is on a beautiful site supplied by fresh spring water, the school district has a facility of which it can justly be proud. This attractive one story gable-roofed structure, with a brick veneer over cinder block classroom section and a painted cinder block service section, has been brought from the initial stage when the footings were poured in April to the present one which, with the exception of the movable partition between the two classrooms, is finished and has been in use since the opening of school in early September. Much credit is due the general contractor, Lawrence V. Moran; plumbing and heating contractor, William A. Chamberlain; and electrical contractor, William J. Cochenet, for what was accomplished in a relatively short period of time.

The two large, well lighted, and uniformly heated class-rooms, with their acoustical tile ceilings, asbestos tile floors, and beautifully decorated walls of light pastel colors, contribute very materially to the effectiveness of the classroom activities as the pupils and teachers engage in their daily school work together. The service section of the building, also, with its provision of a teachers' room, kitchen and storeroom, in addition to the corridor, boys' and girls' toilets and the boiler room, all likewise attractively decorated, provides those facilities essential to the successful overall operation of a school. And the large playground area, equipped with combination see-saw and swing units at each end of the building, is of great aid in conducting those play activities so necessary to the health and happiness of the pupils.

#### School Lunch

The outstanding work done year after year in the school lunch program at the West Stewartstown School for a relatively large number of pupils in the building of morale, in the maintaining of good health, and in contributing to overall physical development, indicates the popularity of this vitally important activity. As has been stated previously, much credit is due the operator, Mrs. Eva M. Day, for the success of this program.

#### Notes on the Budget

The School Board's budget for 1960-61 of \$60,875.00 is \$300.00 more than the \$60,575.00 budget of the Municipal Budget Committee. As will be found in the budget breakdown, which immediately follows the detailed expenditures listed on subsequent pages in this report, the difference is in the amounts allocated for teachers' salaries. (Since the estimated income of \$13,000.00 is the same for both the Board and the Committee, the requested appropriation to be raised by taxes by the town becomes \$47,875.00 and \$47,575.00 respectively.

In comparison to the above amounts, a budget of \$55,985.00, which was the same for both of the above groups, was raised and appropriated for the current year. The estimated income of \$12,500.00 general state aid was increased by anticipated building aid to make a total of \$13,400.00, which left \$42,585.00 to be raised by taxes by the town. It should be noted here, however, that as a result of the district receiving less combined state aid than was estimated, that the actual amount to be paid over by the selectmen to the school district for the support of schools for this year is \$42,593.77.

For the most part the increase in the budget for next year is explained by provision for increases in salaries and tuition rates.

#### Enrollment and Attendance

The enrollment of pupils in our schools is the largest this year that it has been for some time as there are 124 at the present time as compared to 113, 112, 113, 117, 113, and 110 for the respective preceding six years. A breakdown of the present enrollment shows that there are 78 at the West Stewartstown School, and 46 at the new Hollow Elementary School. The average percentage of attendance of the schools in session during the past year was 95.56 at West Stewartstown and 93.21 and 94.02 at the Hollow and Cedar Brook rural schools respectively, while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the period taken in the same order was .68, .14, and .51.

#### Tuition Pupils

Although there was an appreciable increase in the number of pupils enrolled in schools outside the district last year which was 45, the number this year of 39 is more in keeping with the five years preceding last year during which there were 37, 35, 38, 31 and 38 respectively. Of the number of pupils for which the district is paying tuition for the current year, 12 are at Colebrook Academy, 25 at Canaan High School, Canaan, Vermont, and 2 at Colebrook Elementary School.

#### Miscellaneous

As was noted under the caption, "Notes on the Budget," the Municipal Budget Committee's budget decreases the School Board's allocation for teachers' salaries by \$300.00. It is believed that it should be mentioned here, also, that as a result of the action taken by the Committee along the same lines of economy, that it has not been possible to include several articles in the warrant which the Board had planned to submit to the voters for consideration at the annual district meeting. The aricles had to do with employment of an additional teach-

er at the West Stewartstown School, painting the building purchase of new burner for the boiler, and purchase of the rest of the lot from which the site of the New Hollow Elementary School was obtained.

#### Conclusion

May I again express my thanks to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens, for all the help and cooperation received as we have worked together in an effort to provide good schools. It is only with the assistance of you all that high standards can be achieved and maintained.
