# **Report Of Superintendent**

To the School Board and Citizens of the Dummer School District:

#### FOREWORD

As mentioned in my report last year, the legislature enacted many bills concerning education. The most important ones included the Sweepstakes, increased foundation aid, cooperative revision, authorized regional enrollment area, trade-vocational schools, and repeal of the Per Capita Tax. All of these bills will have a tendency to upgrade the quality of New Hampshire public education.

#### SCHOOL SALE

As voted at the last meeting, the voters authorized the School Board to sell the West Dummer School. This was done on a sealed bid procedure. A financial summary of the transaction is

The requested school budget for 1964-65 totals \$23,189.19, which is \$160.38 less than our present budget. Transportation expenses are expected to be higher. The sum of \$400.00 was added to this item in anticipation of this increase. Tuition charges are expected to be less and this item was reduced accordingly. One will note in our budget under Item No. 975 an amount of \$150.00 for Federal School Lunch. New budgeting procedures require the District to incorporate this as part of the budget. This sum will be offset by receipts under he Federal School Lunch Act.

At the last Annual Meeting, we discussed holding the unexpended Building Fund balance in a separate account until this Annual Meeting. Two courses of action appear to be available for action by the voters. One is to place the amount into Capital Reserve for bus purchase at a later date. If this is the desire of the District, this should be done immediately in order to receive interest on the funds as soon as possible.

The District can vote to place the balance from the sale into the General Fund. If this is done, the tax appropriation to the School District will be reduced accordingly.

To me the Capital Reserve Fund proposal appears to be the best arrangement for this money. In the not too distant future, we will have to consider bus purchase. At the present time our bus payments are spread over a five year period. I would like to see this reduced to a three year period on the next purchase.

### TUITIONING

From time to time people in the District have given some thought to closing the school and sending the pupils to Berlin. Your School Board and I have worked out a cost analysis for your information. Taking the 1963-64 budget as a base we arrive at the following amount for tuition:

Probably a few pupils would attend Parochial Schools in Berlin, if Dummer closed its school.

When one applies the savings against the tuition costs an immediate savings would total \$1,541.00. Transportation and major Capital Outlay are not included in the above computation. In all probability, over a number of years the tuitioning operation is less expensive for the District than operating our present system. Sometime in the future a more detailed study should be made of this area. Probably a few students would attend Parochial Schools at no cost to the District.
