# TOWN WARRANT

## WARRANT FOR THE 1965 TOWN MEETING STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Milton in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, with polls not closing before eight of the clock in the afternoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for Town Officers.

### ARTICLES OF BUSINESS TUESDAY EVENING, MARCH 9, at 7:00 P.M.

2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate six hundred twenty two dollars and seventy seven cents (\$622.77) in order to receive Town Road Aid. (The State of N.H. to contribute \$4,151.81.)
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) for oiling.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for Camp Roads.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate thirteen thousand five hundred (\$13,500.00) for gravel and repairs of highways and bridges.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00) for winter maintenance.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for repair of sidewalks.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for maintenance of highway equipment.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to hard surface the Branch Hill Road. (By petition)

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate thirty six hundred dollars (\$3,600.00) for street lights.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000.00) to pay Town charges and expenses and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

12. To determine the salaries, wages and other compensation and allowances for all persons serving the Town, and to pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the Milton Fire Department, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for maintenance of the Milton Mills Fire District.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) to purchase new fire hose, one third for Milton Mills department and two thirds for the Milton Department.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to pay the first and second Engineers and Firemen in addition to the amount allowed by law, to see how much per hour the Town will vote to pay Engineers and Firemen while fighting fires, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for Memorial Day.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate eight hundred and Fifty dollars (\$850.00) for the Milton Free Public Library at Milton Mills.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate five hundred dollars (500.00) for the maintenance of hydrants in the Milton Water District.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate three hundred five dollars and eight cents. (\$305.08) 1/100 of 1% of valuation, for the Lakes Region Association.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for Civil Defense.

22. To see what action the town will take in regard to tax discounts and take any vote or votes relative thereto.

23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the Town a sum of money necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1965 and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to file an application with the United States Government for an interest free advance of Federal Funds in the amount of \$26,000.00 (as provided under Public Law 560, 83rd Congress, as amended) to finance the costs of engineering to work out construction drawings and specifications for the sewerage system and sewage treatment facilities; to accept the advance if and when granted; such advance to be repaid when and as construction is undertaken; to furnish the United States Government such information, data and documents pertaining to application for an advance as may be required and otherwise to act as the authorized representatives of the Town in connection with the application or take any action relative thereto.



25. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

If article 6 is adopted the entire Water District will have water service. But we must keep in mind the source of supply. In 1936 it was not expected these extentions we have added in all directions over the years would be taken care of by the same wells and pumps. We seem to be alright now, but some time in the future a modern well and pumping equipment will have to be installed. We believe there is almost an unlimited supply of water in our well field.

As a whole the system is in good condition and is working alright.

# FIRE WARDEN REPORT

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy—both industrial and recreational—is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area—4,350,000 acres—is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Milton for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds and Library.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets:

December 31, 1962 - December 31, 1963 (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1962 and December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased by \$2,120,13, in 1963.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein, These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$4,143.30, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$424.29, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,567.59.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1963, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks



were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

### GENERAL COMMENTS

#### Town Clerk:

It is noted that as of December 31, 1963, there was a total amount of \$4,815.68 due the Town from the Town Clerk on account of motor vehicle permit fees. This represented the excess in the amount collected by the Town Clerk for permits issued over the amount remitted to the Treasurer in the following years as follows:

1959 - \$	256.74
1960 -	413.39
1961 -	911.25
1962 -	532.34
1963 -	<u>2,701.96</u>
	\$4,815.68

A subsequent examination of the Town Clerk's accounts for the period from January 1, 1964, to September 29, 1964, disclosed that an additional amount of \$2,707.82 was due the Town for that period. Therefore, as of the date of audit-September 29, 1964, there was a total accumulated shortage in the Town Clerk's accounts amounting to \$7,523.50. A separate report of the Town Clerk's accounts covering the fiscal years ended December 21, 1959, 1960, 1961, 1962, 1963 and the period from January 1, 1964 to September 29, 1964, has been submitted to you.

In this connection it is emphasized that the Town auditors, when making their examination of the Town Clerk's motor vehicle permit account, should always list and add each permit issued. The page totals, or adding machine totals submitted by the Clerk should never be accepted until verified by the auditors.

#### Tax Collector:

##### Remittances to the Treasurer:

It is noted that as of December 31, 1963, the Tax Collector had unremitted funds in the amount of \$542.56

on account of the collection of 1962 property taxes. A remittance was made to the Treasurer on October 10, 1964, to settle this account.

Attention is called to Chapter 41, Section 35, of the Revised Statutes Annotated, pertaining to the duties of tax collectors, which provides in part as follows:

"41:35-\*\*\*The collector shall, on the last Monday of every month, pay to the town treasurer all money collected by him up to that time. He shall also make a final payment to the town Treasurer of all moneys collected by him prior to December thirty-first as soon as possible after said close of the fiscal year.

#### Standard Form of Cash Book:

The Collector should adopt the use of the prescribed form of loose leaf columnar cash book which provides for the segregation of tax collections and redemptions from tax sales by year of levy and type of tax (i.e.- property, poll, yield, head).

This will provide the necessary information for making out the report which should accompany each remittance which the Collector makes to the Treasurer. All tax collections and redemptions from tax sales up to the time of the remittance, as indicated by the cash book, should be turned over to the Treasurer on each occasion that a remittance is made.

#### Abatements:

The Collector should receive written authorization from the Board of Selectmen for all abatements. No abatement should be recorded in the Warrant Book until such authorization has been received.

#### Tax Sales:

All properties on which there are delinquent real estate taxes should be advertised and sold at the Collector's tax sale without any exceptions.

It is noted that it has been customary in Milton for the Collector to hold the tax sale on the last day of September which is the latest date on which the sale may be held before the expiration of the tax lien on October 1st. It is recommended that the sale be held at least two weeks earlier for the following reasons:

- (1) To provide time for the postponement of the tax sale if it became necessary to do so.
- (2) To allow time in which the Collector could re-advertise property in case a taxpayer's check was received immediately before the sale and later returned by the bank on account of insufficient funds.

#### Personal Checks:

The Collector should refrain from the practise of cashing personal or any other checks out of tax funds.

#### Identification of Tax Payments:

When tax payments are recorded in the Warrant Book and Tax Sale Record Book such payments should be identified by the year of payment as well as the month and day.

#### Conclusion:

In conclusion we would like to comment upon the fact that although the Board of Selectmen are not required or supposed to perform the functions of auditors, nevertheless they are expected to exercise general supervision over town financial affairs and in this capacity it is important that they assure themselves from time to time that the town fiscal officers are properly performing their duties in accordance with the laws which prescribe such duties.

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. This letter of transmittal should be published in its entirety but the publication of Exhibits is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Milton for their assistance during the course of the audit.

The task ahead of the public schools in scope, program, quality, and sheer added numbers calls for a financial effort as magnificent as is our ideal. Immediate steps are demanded for holding excellence where it now exists and for hurriedly closing the gap where it is lacking.

Although certain values, certain knowledge, certain skills are constant, education like our society must change. The educational program of today should be different from that of yesterday, and today's will prove inadequate tomorrow. Public schooling in the United States has had the essential quality of flexibility in the past. This characteristic is imperative for the future. Where the schools are headed is more important than where they have been.

In conclusion, we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation given us during the year by the citizens, school board, teachers and pupils of Milton.

# REPORT OF PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The enrollment in the Milton Public School continues to climb slowly. On the opening day of school, September 9, 1964, there were 470 students enrolled in the three schools. If this trend continues in the next few years, some changes will have to be made.

At Milton Mills the usual summer maintenance was done and a few minor repairs were made. The building seems to be in good repair. The major problem at this time is the fence around the school. Some of the posts holding the fence up have rotted off and the fence is in danger of collapsing. This will be repaired this summer. The size of grades 4, 5, and 6 made it possible to move them downstairs, thus avoiding the necessity of pushing the heat to the upstairs room. This change seems to be working well.

In the Grammar School, in addition to the summer maintenance the following work was done: The cafeteria was partitioned to provide space to handle the overflow from grades 1 and 2. Doors were placed on the cupboards in the cafeteria to protect the dishes and cooking utensils from dust and dirt. A circular drive and parking area and a play area were paved in front of the school. This paving has resulted in better winter plowing and has helped in school maintenance by cutting down the amount of sand tracked into the school. Grass seed and fertilizer have been spread in front of the school and it is hoped this will help prevent the erosion of the soil on the banks in front.

In the high school, the cafeteria kitchen was refurbished. A new tile floor was laid, the walls were painted and a new ceiling was installed. The boys' basement was painted; a ceiling was put up in the girls' locker room; and the parking area in back of the school

was paved and the roadway to the shop was also hot-topped.

There were several personnel changes in the Milton Public School System last year. In Milton Mills Mrs. Mary Jane Moulton replaced Mrs. Rosamond Pike in Grades 1, 2 and 3. Mrs. Ella McKenna replaced Mr. Clifford Germain in Grades 4, 5 and 6. In the Grammar School Mrs. Jacquelin Locke replaced Mrs. Elsie Julin who moved to the second grade to replace Mrs. Frances Scott. Mrs. Elizabeth Sanders replaced Mrs. Gwendolyn Cram in the Third Grade. Mr. Bradford York replaced Mr. Harold Sanborn in the Sixth Grade and also as Principal of the Grammar School. Mrs. Gertrude Elliot was added to the staff at the Grammar School to take some of the overflow of Grade 1 and 2; she is also working with children who have reading difficulties. Mr. Samuel Warren replaced Mr. William Gile in teaching General Science and General Math. An influx of students into the 7th Grade necessitated the splitting of that grade into two sections. This was accomplished by adding Mr. Albert Columbus to the staff to supervise study halls and release classroom teachers from this duty. The teachers thus released took an additional section of the 7th Grade.

The curriculum of the schools has remained relatively unchanged. In the high school General Science II was upgraded to give students who are planning to attend Technical or Vocational Institutes a strong background in the sciences. Algebra I was divided into two sections. This was also done to give students who needed more advanced math but not necessarily college math an opportunity to take such a course. A course in Humanities was offered to seniors. While this program has a heavy emphasis on literature, Music and art are also covered.

I would again like to thank all those who have contributed to the successful operation of the schools.
