TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Kingston in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Kingston on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. By petition of Bettie C. Ouellette and eleven others, to see if the Town will vote to set the term of office of Tax Collector to be three years as provided by N. H. Law 243:3 RSA 41:2A. This article to be voted by ballot.

4. On petition of Robert B. Gray and others, to see if the Town will vote to have the Town Clerk's Office open two (2) nights a week in addition to the present hours. These hours to be determined by the Selectmen and/or the Town Clerk.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,500.00 to remodel the basement of Nichols Memorial Library for a children's room.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 (Twenty-five thousand dollars) to be used by the Anniversary Committee, if necessary, to defray the expenses of observing the Town's 275th Anniversary Celebration.

7. To see if the Town will vote to require all male citizens over the age of 18 years to support a beard during the week of August 4 through 10, 1969 to aid in the Anniversary Celebration for the Town. Those males not complying with this ordinance will be subject to a fine not exceeding \$5.00 (Five dollars.)

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year and to issue in the name of the Town negotiable notes, the aforesaid notes to be paid during the current year from taxes collected during the year.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Chief of Police to place all unexpended funds from each year's appropriation into a reserve fund, a report to be included in the Chief of Police's annual financial report.

10. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to study the advisability of establishing a Town Forest in Kingston, the Committee to be appointed by the Selectmen. The proposed location is the north

side of Thorne Road extending to the Brentwood Town line. The Town now owns fifteen acres; six acres will be donated, making a twenty-one acre nucleus to start; the ultimate goal to be one hundred acres. If the article is adopted, the suggested committee is J. Edward Stevens, Lawrence B. Cheney and Theodore S. Magnusson.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$7500.00 for the completion of the second floor in the new addition of Central Fire House for use as a class room if necessary.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4500.00 for the permanent construction of roads and bridges.

13. To see if the Town will vote to set a maximum salary for the Road Agent of \$7,000.00 and a maximum salary for the Assistant Road Agent of \$6,000.00.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$573.74 and the State will contribute \$3,824.95 for Class V Highways, under the provisions of the T.R.A.

15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the building regulations as proposed by the Kingston Planning Board and as authorized under Sections 2-5 inclusive, Chapter 156, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint an Inspector of Buildings who shall hold office for a term of one (1) year, and the Selectmen shall fix and regulate his compensation as authorized by Section 1, the compensation in any event not to exceed the fees which shall be collected under the provisions of the Kingston Building Regulations.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax deeded property at Public Auction.

18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Auditors' Report and the Town Report as printed.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ARTICLE 2 – March 13, 1968. Meeting opened at 8 o'clock with prayer by Father Vickery. The Moderator read the results of the voting on the previous day. He appointed the following to serve on the Finance Committee-Roger Ouellette, Dorothy Brown, Conrad Magnusson and Donald Day.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$84,228.24 to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.

ARTICLES 3, 4, 5 – Were declared illegal as they were not put in the warrant by petition.

ARTICLE 6 – Voted unanimously that the Town authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the ensuing year and to issue in the name of the Town negotiable notes, the aforesaid notes to be paid during the current year from taxes collected during the year.

ARTICLE 7 – Voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$100.00 to carry on White Pine Blister Rust Control in Kingston. Work to be performed by the State Resources Development Division.

ARTICLE 8 – Motion was made by Mr. Bartlett and seconded by Mr. Southwick that this Article be passed as read. This Article had to have a two thirds vote therefore by a show of hands Yes 92 - No 1, it was voted that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$11,000. to purchase a truck, plow and wing to replace the 1959 Chev., the 1959 Chev. to be traded toward the new truck, such sums to be raised through the issuance of notes over a period of three years: and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Kingston.

ARTICLE 9 – By a vote of yes 77 and no 16, it was voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$4500.00 to purchase a four wheel drive 3/4 T. truck with dump body and plow, such sum to be raised through issuance of notes over a period of three years, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Kingston.

ARTICLE 10 – A motion was made and seconded that this Article be rejected. After a discussion and remarks by Mrs. Heyl, Edward Stevens and others a vote was taken, the result being Yes 46, No. 37. Therefore, it was voted to appropriate the sum of 2528.00 to buy Visiting Nursing Services for the inhabitants of Kingston from the Medicare Certified Exeter Visiting Nurse Association and send one Representative to serve on the Board of the Exeter Visiting Nurse Association.

ARTICLE 11 – Motion was made and seconded that the Town authorize the Selectmen and the Fire Wards to sell the remainder of town land westerly beyond the property recently sold to Richard Currier, the money from sale to be placed in the Fire Wards Capital Reserve Fund: a minimum sale price to be \$300.00 plus costs. An amendment to this Article to read \$300.00 per lot reserving space for widening Rock Rimmon Rd. sixty feet was made. Amendment to consumate sale within ninety days was withdrawn. The original motion as amended was carried. ARTICLE 12 – It was voted to authorize the Fire Wards to place all

unexpended funds from each year's appropriation into a Capital Reserve Fund, a report to be included in the Fire Ward's Annual Financial Report.

ARTICLE 13 – It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750. for the purpose of initiating and planning for the Town of Kingston's 275th Anniversary celebration in 1969 and to appoint a committee of five members to work with the Selectmen.

ARTICLE 14 – Motion was made and seconded that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$500.00 per year and enter into a lease for five years with option to renew for five years with C.L. & T.S. Magnusson for the use of land adjacent to present Town Dump, to be used by the Town for dumping purposes. After discussion of an amendment to raise \$2500.00 to be paid in yearly installments this amendment was withdrawn. The original motion was carried.

ARTICLE 15 - It was voted that the Town set a maximum salary for the Road Agent of \$6500.00 and a maximum salary for assistant Road agent of \$5400.00.

ARTICLE 16 - It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$577.24 and the State will contribute \$3848.24 for Class 5 Highways, under the provisions of T.R.A.

ARTICLE 17 - It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax deeded property at Public Auction.

ARTICLE 18 - It was voted to accept the Auditor's Report and the Town Report as corrected.

ARTICLE 19 – Frank Fellows announced that there would be an open house the following Sunday, from 1 to 5 P.M. to show the new Fire House and truck. Report of the Police Dept. of their assets, equipment, etc., was a total of \$1630.00. Voted to adjourn at 9:50 P.M.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN FOR 1968

The seventieth year in the history of Nichols Memorial Library was a busy one with a very substantial increase in circulation both in adult and juvenile books.

A total of 1443 books were borrowed from the Bookmobile to supplement our collection and 149 were borrowed by special request from the State Library.

For the third consecutive year a grant of \$100.00 was received from the State of New Hampshire for the purchase of basic reference books.

Library hours were increased this year making the present hours from 2 to 8 P.M. on Monday and Wednesday, 2 to 5 P.M. on Friday and 3 to 8 P.M. on Saturday.

Income from Pine Tree Grange was used to purchase: Hubbard - "An Old New England Village" and Kettel - "Pine Furniture of Early New England."

The Friends of the Library sponsored a very interesting program during National Library Week on "Primitive Antiques" with Ronald Bourgeault of Hampton as the speaker. An exhibit of colonial antiques was on display during the week. They sponsored movies for the children and two very successful "Book Fairs."

Two classes from Bakie School, accompanied by their teachers, visited the library weekly during the year, to borrow books.

We are indebted to Carl Stevens for displaying the flag and to the Kingston Garden Club for filling the urns again this year.

The assistant librarian, Mrs. Gertrude Semple, attended the Public Library Techniques course offered last spring at the University of New Hampshire. The librarian and assistant librarian attended the Book Buying Meetings which were held in different libraries of the District.

Mrs. Semple has resigned, effective January 1st, 1969 to take a full time position and Mrs. Robert L. Merrick has been appointed to take over the duties of assistant librarian.

Our library has reached that point where there is a need for expansion and much thoughtful consideration has been given to the best way to expand. As the building has a full dry cellar, a great deal of thought on the part of those concerned has centered on the possibility of having a children's room in the basement.

There are a number of advantages in having a children's room separated from the adult section which is not possible at the present. Such a room can be decorated attractively, with displays to arouse the interest of the younger group. This gives them a sense of belonging when their surroundings are keyed to their level. It also makes it easier to carry on their programs without disrupting the rest of the library.

There has been no major expansion in the library, other than a book case added here and there, in the 71 years since it was built. With a 65% population increase since the 1960 census, the present quarters are bad-

ly crowded and expansion has reached the point of necessity if the library is going to continue to serve the townspeople, in the way that they should expect.

The trustees are placing an article in the warrant this year in the hope of making this a reality.

ANNUAL REPORT

The Planning Board has discussed several proposed sub-division plans, approved some and disapproved others according to existing town ordinances. We have tried to get quick answers to the problems presented to us.

Our particular concerns for this year are two: 1. A new ordinance for the disposal of residential sewage. 2. A Building Code. This has been discussed with many local builders and contractors and, where possible, includes their suggestions. The first public hearing is scheduled for February 14th. It is hoped that the Building Code can be incorporated in the warrants for the March Town Meeting.

We believe that these two ordinances will be for the general benefit and protection of Kingston people.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE KINGSTON FIRE DEPT.

The Fire Department responded to a total of 131 calls. Twenty eight were fire calls and 103 were ambulance and rescue wagon calls. Four were to render assistance to other fire departments. One was for two lost children. One was a false alarm.

This past year has been a very busy one for the members of your volunteer fire department. We have moved into our new housing facilities. This extra room is very much appreciated. Our new hose drying facilities have proved to be exceptionally effective.

During Feb. 1968 former Chief Al Moore and myself journeyed to Elmira, N.Y. to accept delivery of our new Class A. attack pumper. This piece of apparatus has proved itself to be very effective in combating fires.

During 1968, we had an oil truck donated to the department. This vehicle has been restored mechanically and painted. This vehicle brings our water on wheels to 6000 gallons. It is housed in our South Kingston Firehouse.

During 1968, approximately 20 of our firemen attended training classes at the Lakes Regional and Meadowood Fire Training Schools.

We have received approval and insurance rate reductions for the South Kingston Facility.

The Kingston Fire Department was honored and recognized in a feature article in an International Fire Service Magazine "Firemen." A copy of this article may be seen at the Nicols Memorial Library.

Your Fire Department is running a continuous training program in fire attack procedures, truck driving and pump operations. During 1969 we are looking forward to a very advanced rescue and first aid course.

Our various fund raising committees were very busy during the year. We have established a new capital reserve fund earmarked for a new rescue vehicle to replace our present ambulance. We also have other funds to be used on the buildings and to purchase other fire tools.

Our Restoration Committee is having our first motorized truck completely restored to original condition in anticipation of our 275th celebration. Our hand drawn antiques will also be put into condition.

During 1968 we organized a muster team within our Department.

They took top honors in every muster and contest that they entered. This incidentally, is a good method to train men in efficient pumper operations and hose handling methods.
