## TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Grantham, in Sullivan County qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the eleventh of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, for the ensuing three years:
one (1) Selectman
one (1) Trustee of Trust Funds
one (1) Trustee of the Library
And for the ensuing one year:
two (2) Auditors
one (1) Police Chief
one (1) Road Agent
Also:
one (1) Member of the Planning Board for four years
one (1) Supervisor of the Checklist for six years
and to elect all other necessary Town Officers. Agents, and Committees, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 2. Shall the Town adopt the provisions of RSA 654:34-A, permitting applications for changes in party affiliation to be made with the Town Clerk by bringing in ballots on this question?

Article 3. To hear the report'of the Salary Committee and to take any action thereof.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 17.000 .00$ to defray Town Officers' Salaries and Expenses.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to apply for Town Road Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 333.18$ for the same with the State contributing \$2,221.22.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 300.00$ to support a local nursing service, or subscribe to an area nursing service and raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 1.386 .00$ which will enable Grantham to be serviced by the Newport Ambulance Service.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 600.00$ for the care and maintenance of cemeteries.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 21.150 .00$ for the use of the Volunteer Fire Department.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 25.000 .00$ to be used by the Fire Department for site work. and to authorize the withdrawal of that sum from Revenue Sharing Funds established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 13.000 .00$ for the use of the Police Department.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 1,900.00$ to defray the costs of street lighting.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover the expense of the Audit.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 4,665.00$ for the support of the Dunbar Free Library.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 5,500.00$ for Summer Maintenance of roads, and to appropriate the sum of $\$ 8,143.93$ from the Highway Subsidy Fund for the improvement of roads.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 9,000.00$ for the Winter Maintenance of roads.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 2,500.00$ for Old Age Assistance, Town Poor and Aid to Permanently Disabled Persons.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 3,500.00$ for the care, maintenance and insurance on the Town Hall and Library.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 8,500.00$ to maintain the Town Dump.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 2,500.00$ to be used for legal assistance and fees.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that section of Howe Hill Rd., the former Spiller Rd., now within the boundaries of the Robert Wilson property.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 250.00$ for Sullivan Nutrition, a subsidiary of the Newport Senior Center, for the support of its Meals on Wheels program, for the benefit of Grantham residents.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 400.00$ for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 460.00$ to remain a member of the Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council.

Article 25 . To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 500.00$ for the Planning Board to continue work on the Master Plan.

Article 26 . To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 1,000.00$ to be used for the Independence Day-Old Home Day celebration.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Conservation Commission to retain the unexpended portion of the 1979 appropriation, said fund to be placed in a special conservation fund in accordance with RSA 36-A:5.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the driveway specifications as proposed by the Planning Board.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to designate the Selectmen to act as regulators of RSA-155A, a legislative act pertaining to the taking of topsoil or fill in the town.

Article 30. To authorize the Selectmen to have a Tax Map made, and raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 10,000.00$ as partial payment.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to accept the changes in the Subdivision Regulations as listed below:

1. Add, as a continuation of Section 1: . . ."for the purpose of creating conditions favorable to the health, safety, convenience and prosperity of the Town."
2. Insert in 3.02, at end of first sentence, after "flood hazard'": . . . unless appropriate measures are taken by the subdivider to correct and overcome such dangers, perils or hazards."
3. Add a second paragraph in 3.02 , or as a new paragraph 3.14: "Layout of Lots: The lot size, width, depth, shape, orientation and the minimum building set-back lines shall be appropriate for the location of the subdivision, the natural features of the land and for the type of development and use contemplated. Where there is a question of such appropriateness, the Board may, after investigation, require modification of the layout of such lots.'"
4. Add to 3.11 . . . "The Board may require the written approval of the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission before approving any final plot.
5. Insert in 5.23, (definition of Subdivision) after the words "of sale," "rent, lease."
Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to have set office hours on a weekly basis for the Tax Collector and Town Clerk.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 50,000.00$ for the Municipal Building, i.e. facilities, equipment and site work.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 10,000.00$ for insurance and maintenance of the Municipal Building.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 97,500.00$ to pay off one-half of the note borrowed for the Municipal Building construction.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that section of the Walker Rd. beginning at the corner of the Walker Rd. and Arden Hill Rd. and continuing northerly through the Hutchins property to the land of Emil Hanslin and Tony Hanslin.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money if necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any acquired properties through sealed bids, with the Selectmen having the right to accept or reject any or all bids.

Article 39. To hear the reports of Officers, Agents and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 40. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## LICENSING OF DOGS

466:1 Procuring License; Tag. Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, on or before April thirtieth, cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar to which shall be attached a metal tag with the following information thereon, the name of the city or town, year of issue of license and its registered number.

466:1-a. Vaccination Required. Before a license is issued under the provisions of this subdivision, the owner or keeper of a dog shall furnish to the clerk a certification that said dog has been vaccinated against rabies in accordance with the provisions of RSA 442-A.

RSA 466 relative to the licensing of dogs has been amended EFFECTIVE AUGUST 30, 1977. NEW paragraphs are as follows:

466:4 Fees. The fee for every license for a year shall be $\$ 3.50$ for a neutered male or spayed female dog, $\$ 6.00$ for an unneutered male and $\$ 6.50$ for an unspayed female dog, and such proportionate sum for licenses for dogs becoming 3 months of age after May 1 , or which may be brought from out the state after May 1, as the remaining portion of
the year bears to the sum required for a license for a whole year; provided, that the owner or keeper of such spayed female dog or neutered male dog shall furnish a certificate from the person performing the operation, to the satisfaction of the clerk of the town or city wherein such dog is owned or kept.

466:6 Kennels. The owner or keeper of five or more dogs shall annually on or before April 30 procure a license authorizing him to keep such dogs upon the premises described in the license or off the premises while under his control. The fee shall be as follows except that no fee shall be required for the dogs of such owner or keeper which are under the age of three months; and for dogs becoming three months of age after May 1, or which may be brought from without the state after May 1, the fee shall be such proportionate sum for licenses as the remaining portion of the year bears to the sum required for a license for a whole year:
I. If the number of dogs does not exceed five, the fee shall be $\$ 12.00$.
II. If the number exceeds five but does not exceed 10 , the fee shall be $\$ 20.00$
III. If the number exceeds 10 and does not exceed 25 , the fee shall be $\$ 25.00$.
IV. There shall be an additional fee of one dollar for each dog in excess of 25 .
466:7 Late Fee. Additional Charge where payment of license fee is delayed. In addition to the license fees provided in RSA 466:4, there shall be a charge of one dollar for EACH MONTH or any part thereof that the fees remain unpaid if said fees are not paid before June 1 in any year.

## GRANTHAM PLANNING BOARD

The Grantham Planning Board met for 12 monthly meetings, two special meetings, seven public hearings and four work sessions during 1979.

During the meetings, the board received five applications for major and minor subdivisions, drew up specifications for a sign ordinance and a mobilehome park ordinance, which were adopted at the 1979 town meeting, and have set up standards for driveway culverts which will come before the 1980 town meeting.

The work sessions were in relation to the master plan, mandated by the town at the 1979 town meeting, and have seen a questionnaire and cover letter drafted, mailed and tabulated, and the formation of volunteer research committees for the ongoing project.

After public hearings, approval for minor subdivisions were granted to Allen Sailers for three lots, including the home lot, of his Howe Hill Rd. property; Paul Romaine for three lots, including the home lot, of his Burpee Hill Rd. property, and to William H. Swensen for two lots, including the home lot, of his Howe Hill Rd. property. Also to Controlled Environment Corp. to divide the remaining CEC land into three parcels, one along the Springfield Rd.; another at the waste treatment facility, and the third, the remaining acreage.

Approval for a major subdivision was granted to the Olde Farms subdivision, Emil Hanslin and Tony Hanslin, developers, which divided 730 acres on the east side of Grantham Mountain into 91 parcels, 89 building lots and two tracts of undeveloped land.

The board also granted approval of a boundary change between Michael Elhardt, Dunbar Hill Rd.-S, and Juniper Hills, Brown and Wein, developers.

At the end of the year, the board had under consideration a major subdivision of 18 lots on 260 acres, 16 building lots known as Juniper Hills, Brown and Wein, developers.

Legislation enacted in the recent term of the General Court known as RSA: 155 which requires that all excavation of sand, gravel, top soil, etc. be regulated by a permit is now being considered by the board, and a public hearing will take place prior to the 1980 town meeting.

As a result of a suit filed against the Planning Board by June Totty, Richard Totty, William Cartier, Mary Lou Cartier, Donna Stamper and James Stamper on the Olde Farms subdivision, the board hired Atty. Peter Decato, Lebanon, to represent it in court. A court decision found that the board had acted within the guidelines of the town-approved subdivision regulations. An appeal by the plaintiffs to a higher court is still pending.

The board notes with regret, the moving away of John and Phyllis Rockwell, former residents of Longwood Drive. Atty. Rockwell, while a member of the Planning Board, gave the board legal direction in drafting the town's subdivision regulations, and was most supportive during the Olde Farms case.

# REPORT TO TOWN OF GRANTHAM PLANNING BOARD <br> Summary of the Activities of the Five Committees of the Grantham Master Plan Group 

Following the last Town Meeting the Town of Grantham Planning Board sent out a questionnaire to all taxpayers in order to obtain information on the views of the residents regarding the future of their community. In this questionnaire residents were invited to volunteer to serve on committees to help draft a Master Plan for the future growth of Grantham. Those who volunteered were then appointed to one of the five committees to research the current and future needs of the town and develop proposals and recommendations to be submitted to the Planning Board for incorporation into a Master Plan.

## Natural Resources Committee

Fred Curtis, Chairman
This committee is well underway in the task of gathering data on the following:
A. Climate, temperature and meteorological conditions.
B. Geography. Description of land and water surfaces.

to all taxpayers and outlines of Master Plans of other New Hampshire towns. This committee is inviting knowledgeable and interested townspeople to attend at least one of their meetings to contribute their ideas and perspective. The committee is studying other master plans to discover what situations and problems Grantham has in common with other towns and which of Grantham's needs are unique to this community.

The Chairmen of all the Committees have met and will meet again. Marcia Williams of the Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council has been most helpful in supplying material from other communities and is attending Committee meetings whenever her schedule permits.

The Committee Chairmen are increasingly aware of the great responsibility involved in setting up a framework for a master plan which (should it be well received by the Planning Board and the people of Grantham) would affect the lives of the residents for generations to come.

In 1979 the Grantham police officers worked a total of 1,796 hours, or an average of 37.4 hours per week. These hours are the result of a $22 \%$ increase in activity over 1978.

This past year we increased our circulation by 1,172 books or $42 \%$. We increased the hours we were open to Monday from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m., Thursday from $9: 30$ to $11: 30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $2: 30$ to $4: 30$ p.m. and Saturday from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. In the summer we were also open Wednesday evening from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. We purchased 476 new books both hardback and paperback and received 188 usable donations.

Our big undertaking for the year was to hold a summer book sale. Thanks to the many donations of food, books, white elephant items and the help of volunteers, we had a successful day. The trustees have decided to make this a biennial affair and to use the proceeds for special projects. This year the profit was used to build up our children's book collection by buying books that are considered classics as "Huckleberry Finn," "Aesop's Fables" and "Alice in Wonderland."

During the summer we again held our story time for younger children. We also initiated a summer reading program for children in grades one through seven. In order to complete the program each participant needed to read 12 books and submit one book report. Winners of the book reports were given a prize of a paperback book, and all participants were invited to a party. We had 25 participants and 11 of those children completed the program.

This year we began registering borrowers and now have 160 registered borrowers. We initiated a fine system for overdue books of five cents a day or 25 cents a week. We bought a used typewriter to keep at the library to facilitate the librarian's job. The card catalog for both adults and children has been alphabetized and is now available for general use. This catalog does not reflect all of the library's holdings but only the newer acquisitions.

This coming year we plan on increasing the library hours so we can continue to meet state requirements as an affiliate of the statewide program. We hope our circulation will continue to increase as we expand our book selection and increase borrowers. Will you be one of our new patrons?

# GRANTHAM SCHOOL DISTRICT HEAD TEACHER'S ANNUAL REPORT 1978-79 

Life is for those who love.
This quote best, and succinctly, embodies the reality of what is to follow. The thought grew out of my researching previous years' reports. They contained ample statistical data of how we spent monies here, or what the enrollment projection for the future was, or how we accomplished the preceding year's warrant articles. Important items, indeed . . . but they "lacked" what school years really are, and really mean. How could I make the annual headteacher's report come alive, and pulsate with the rhythm of life that is here at Grantham School? As I sat at my desk, thoughtfully thumbing through last year's teacher plan book (which is more like a running commentary of a day's events that become the weeks and months of any given year), I realized once again, a very basic, simple fact: That giving and fashioning life happens, not in one grand moment, at one special time, but rather it happens in bits and pieces of seemingly unimportant trivia given consistently, constantly and carefully. A school year is much akin to a common parental experience that goes something like this . . .

One day, a parent looks up, and sees, as if for the first time, their son and/or daughter. They suddenly realize this isn't their little jelly smeared and chocolate mustached offspring standing before them. Rather, quite unexpectedly (or so it seems) here is a mature, independent individual ready to live a life of their own. Quite often it is precisely at that point, that the baffled and bemused parent reflects, rapidly, over the years passed, and says, "How did it happen? Why, it seems like only yesterday . . ." The dream they once held in their hearts is now this reality which represents thousands upon thousands of strung together, unsung, moments of patience and understanding (be it those fitful teething times, sleepness nights when sickness is about or anxious hearts when school days began).

I'm not suggesting that any one school year has quite the significance or importance of the total development of a human being, but there are some definite parallels. In both, there usually aren't huge, catastrophic events that have world shaping significance. Yet both contain the repetitive, daily, weekly, yearly events that somehow fashion "life, its attitudes, and its approaches." We've noted the parental ones, and I'm sure you can add to the list. In teaching, in a given school year, papers to check, bulletin boards to change, lunch monies to collect and tabulate, evaluations of students' progress (or lack of) . . . not much in the spectrum of recorded historic events. Still, these are the bits and pieces, that contribute to fashion the human life that stands before us, parent and teacher, at any given time.

With this as a background, I'd like to review for, and with you, the bits and pieces of Grantham's 1979 school year which actually spans two school years; that is, the last half of the 1978-79 school year, the intervening summer months, and the first half of the 1979-80 school year. I'm relying on you the reader, to fill in the spaces, and understand the giving of life as it happened . . . It won't but take a minute or two (?) to skip through the last 12 months . . .

And so on, and so on. Just brief scribbled notes along with the reading, writing and arithmetic plans that somehow pinpoint the activities of a school year, and all the people that it takes to bring "the year to life." I think the parenting experience and the teaching experience do have a lot in common. In between the lines, both experiences have their share of mistakes and "wishing to do-over."
