You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Springfield on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Highways and Bridges, including winter breaking.

4. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling (1) Springfield village, (2) Stoney Brook and (3) Philbrick Hill roads.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,500.00 providing the State furnishes \$7,500.00 for State Aid Construction of George's Mills Road.

6. To see what the Town wishes to do about new road equipment and make any appropriation relating to.

7. To see what action the Town will take relative to a District Nurse, and make any appropriation relating to.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for Library purposes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 for Memorial Day observance.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for hydrant service at Twin Lake Villa.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for blister rust control.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$275.00 for street lighting.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$592.86 for Town Road Aid, the State to furnish \$2,371.44.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one hundredth of one per cent of the assessed valuation of the Town for the preceding year for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

16. To see what action the Town will take in regard to instituting a Town Forest.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute Resident Inventory blanks not earlier than April 1.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money on the notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

19. To see what the Town wishes to do about tax acquired Town property.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate some sum of money as an aid to the New London Hospital.

21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemetery work.

22. To elect a Delegate to The Constitutional Convention.

23. To see if the Town will vote to allow a $1\frac{1}{2}$ % discount for taxes paid within 30 days after tax bill mailing date.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Springfield School Board:

I herewith submit the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools.

The question of school accommodations is still the leading issue in Springfield. It was impossible to make a start on a new building last spring on account of the delay in getting permission to borrow beyond the legal debt limit of a school district. An enabling act was presented at the last session of the Legislature and granted a hearing but most of similar enabling acts were discarded by the State legislature in favor of a general act requiring school districts to appear before a special commission to secure approval of borrowing any large amounts of money. If this commission votes favorably the request goes to the Governor and Council for final decision. It is hoped that approval will be given our request for power to borrow in time to start building next spring. There seem to be many hurdles in the path of school progress.

The Architect, Mr. Archer Hudson, of Hanover, has completed plans and specifications for the proposed two-room school building so that bids can be secured just as soon as we get a green light.

The federal government has advanced us \$1260.00 to pay for plans for a new building. This amount has been paid to Mr. Hudson.

Meanwhile our pupils are housed in their cramped quarters doing the best they can under the unfavorable conditions.

We are glad to have Mrs. Marilyn Heath return to the primary room at the Center School for another year. The upper grade room is being capably managed by Mr. Josiah Kelley who has had many years experience. The Maxfield School is being taught successfully by Mrs. Yvonne Kezar, who taught in our schools in former years.

It is interesting to note that most of our pupils in high school are in attendance at New London. The new road makes the trip to New London very convenient. The High School there is well equipped and well administered and is nearer than any other high school.

There are at present 66 children in our schools. Of these nine are from Grafton. Four other elementary pupils living in Springfield are attending in Sunapee and one in New London because it is not practicable to transport them to either of our own schools. There is no room for them, anyway, in our classrooms this year. A new two-room building can accomodate all the pupils now distributed so widely.

W have a rather large number (15) of students attending high school. It is certainly encouraging to see so many continuing their education. The number will probably be as large next year, too. Since state aid is now based on average school membership. Springfield will receive about \$111.00 each for these secondary students. This aid will take care of most of the cost of tuition. The aid in respect to tuition pupils is paid to the town of residence.

Since I shall retire from my position February 1, next, I want to take this opportunity to thank all my co-workers for their hearty cooperation in carrying on the school program. I have enjoyed having a part, together with the School Board and teachers, in the education of the children of our town. I extend to those who will continue in the service of the schools my sincere wishes for further success and progress.
