WOODLAND LITTER, WHEN DRY, IS HIGHLY INFLAMMABLE AND FIRES CAN QUICKLY GET OUT OF CONTROL. WE REQUEST YOUR CO-OPERATION TO CONTROL ALL FIRES SO THAT LIVES AND PROPERTY MAY NOT BE ENDANGERED OR DESTROYED, AND FORESTS BE KEPT GREEN TO FURNISH THE NATURAL BEAUTY WE ALL ENJOY AND TO GROW TIMBER WE WILL NEED.

WHAT IS "WOODLAND"?

The term "woodland" is defined by law to include, "cut-over land, slash and such other land as bears a sufficient amount of wood growth, wood, weeds, grass or other growth as to be likely to be burned over."

WHEN IN THE WOODS, YOU ARE EXPECTED TO EXERCISE CAUTION IN THE USE OF FIRE AND TO REMEMBER THAT

IT IS UNLAWFUL TO

Throw down lighted matches, cigarettes, or other burning substances from vehicles or otherwise.

Burn brush, rubbish, grass or other materials when the ground is not covered with snow, without written permission from the Forest Fire Warden.

Kindle a camp or cooking fire on land of another without permission from the owner or his agent.

Leave an open fire burning unattended.

Fail to report a forest or brush fire that is out of control.

VIOLATORS ARE SUBJECT TO THESE PENALTIES

Anyone letting a fire escape from control, whether

or not he has a permit to kindle the fire, is liable for the costs of extinguishing the fire.

Anyone found guilty of dropping inflammable material in or near woodland shall be fined not more than \$25.00.

A person failing to report an uncontrolled brush or forest fire is liable to a fine of not more than \$10.00.

For kindling a fire in woodland of another without permission of the owner, or for kindling any fire without a permit when a permit is required, a person may be find not more than \$200,00, or imprisoned 60 days.

DAMAGES

Every person who shall set fire on any land, that shall run upon the land of another, shall pay to the owner all damages done by such fire.

BE SURE — GET A PERMIT

Incinerators should be tight, with a close mesh screen, and be on clean ground.

Open fireplaces used to burn rubbish are classed as incinerators.

Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent its spread.

Never burn in dry, windy weather.

Have incinerators inspected by the Forest Fire Warden and get his written permission.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Effingham qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 2nd day of April 1957, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together

with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate not to exceed a sum of \$20,000.00 for purchase of land, and for an addition to the Center Effingham School including new construction, any necessary alterations to the present building, new equipment and such other items necessary to complete the construction, and authorize the school board to issue notes or bonds on the credit of the district for all or any part of the sum so appropriated and to make application against this appropriation any funds received from the State, Federal Government or any other source.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,400.00 for the construction of fireproof room on Effingham Falls school building and the Center Effingham school building, and to install in said fireproof rooms the furnaces now located in the classrooms; and to install power water pumps, pressure tanks and flush toilets in each building.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal Government or any department or agency thereof, or any other sources.
- 12. By Petition. To see if the school district will vote to allow the churches of this town to use the school buildings in the same manner as they were used previous to 1956.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Effingham:

During the school year 1955-56 Miss Gladys Leavitt taught grades 5-8 in the Center Effingham School, and Mrs. Linnie Giles taught grades 1-4 in the Effingham Falls School. Both returned to their respective schools in September 1956.

Good teachers are difficult to find, and Effingham is very fortunate to have such competent teachers in its schools.

There was a total enrollment of 52 pupils with two in the eighth grade. At the opening of the current year ten pupils entered the first grade. There are nine pupils in the eighth grade, and a total school enrollment of 51. According to the school census there will be six pupils to enter the first grade. Three elementary pupils attend the Ossipee Central School.

The high school enrollment in 1955-56 was as follows:-Auburn, Maine 1; Brewster Academy 1; Kennett High School 18; Porter High School 2; a total of 22. For the current year high school enrollments are:—Brewster Academy 1; Kennett High School 10; Portland High School 1: Sanford High School 1. 1955-56 high school tuition rates were:-Auburn \$200.00; Brewster Academy \$275.00; Kennett High School \$290.00; Porter High School \$231.54. Tuition rates for the current year are:-Brewster Academy \$295.00; Kennett High School \$305.00; Portland High School \$301.40; and Sanford High School \$285.00. Tuition rates for 1957-58 may be expected to show an increase. The estimated high school enrollment for next year is 20.

Mrs. Rebecca Sanborn, R. N., served as School Nurse in a School Nursing Union consisting of the districts of Brookfield, Effingham, Freedom, Madison, and Wakefield. This union of districts made possible the employment of a qualified nurse resident but a short distance from the schools. This made for a definite increase in the efficiency and amount of this vital service. Mrs. Sanborn continues this service during the current year. Her tireless devotion to the welfare of the pupils in her care has earned her many well deserved compliments. The Salk Polio Innoculation Program initiated in 1954 was continued through the cooperative efforts of the State Department of Health, Mrs. Sanborn, the teachers, and interested citizens.

During the summer of 1956 new outer doors were installed in both schools, and part of the old pupils' desks and seats were replaced in the Center School.

Several meetings were held during the spring to consider various ways of providing for a central school. The committee may have a report and recommendations.

Effingham received no state aid and will receive none this year. Under the present formula for distribution and amount appropriated by the state, Effingham is not eligible to receive state aid.

The helpful cooperation of the school board, teachers, pupils, parents, and citizens is gratefully acknowledged.

1955-56

Seven children received Salk Polio Vaccine, second shots, on November 16, 1955. Forty-five received first shots on December 12, 1955. Fifty received vaccine on January 24, 1956 (37 were second shots and 13 were firsts). These clinics were held at Center Ossipee.

Twenty-nine pupils had Tuberculosis Patch Tests. Three attended a Chest X-ray Clinic. Reports from the Patch Tests and Chest X-rays were normal.

Forty-five pupils were present for medical examination on Feb. 29, and March 7, 1956. Notices or home visits were made regarding any defects.

Four pupils attended an Orthopedic Clinic on December 7, 1955. Fourteen were reviewed and checked with their corrective exercises by the State Department of Health's Physical Therapy Consultant at a treatment center held at the Grange Hall on May 9, 1956.
