WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

[L. S.]

To the inhabitants of the town of Haverhill qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ART. 1. To choose a town clerk.

ART. 2. To choose three selectmen.

ART. 3. To choose a town treasurer.

ART. 4. To choose one or more highway agents.

ART. 5. To choose one or more auditors.

ART. 6. To choose one library trustee.

ART. 7. To choose all other necessary town officers.

ART. 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, and for school supplies.

ART. 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor.

ART. 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to retire \$3,000 of town bonds, and to pay interest on bonds outstanding.

ART. 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for laying out, building, and repairing highways, and for building and repairing bridges, and to act upon the question of applying for state aid.

ART. 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other town charges.

ART. 13. To determine what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Decoration day.

ART. 14. To hear the reports of the selectmen, treasurer, and other town officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ART. 15. To determine what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the town libraries.

ART. 16. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to unite

with the town of Newbury, in the state of Vermont, in the purchase of the Haverhill Bridge, so-called.

ART. 17. To hear the report of the Board of Cemetery commissioners and pass any vote relating thereto.

ART. 18. To choose one member of the Board of Cemetery commissioners.

ART. 19. To see if the town will authorize the placing of headstones on unmarked graves in the different cemeteries of the town, and if so, what sum will they raise and appropriate for this purpose.

ART. 20. To determine what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the improvement and maintenance of the cemeteries in the town.

ART. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$300 for a free hospital bed at Cottage Hospital, in Haverhill, for the period of one year.

Report of the Selectmen.

To the Taxpayers of the town of Haverhill :

Your Selectmen submit herewith their annual report for the year ending February 15, 1906.

It is their desire to render to the tax payers of the town such a report as will place before them a full, fair and complete statement of their doings, and the finances of the town for the past year.

During this period there have been a number of things that should prove of interest to the tax payers.

In the first place the valuation of the town has increased upwards of \$43,000, which is, perhaps, not an unfair indication of prosperity and progress.

In the matter of highways the expenses have been kept within the appropriation and there is on hand a fund approximately of \$2500 to be used for permanent improvements during the coming year in accordance with the vote of the town and the State Highway law of 1905. A new wooden bridge has been built across the Oliverian stream to replace the old Butterfield Bridge. It was the intention of the Selectmen to paint all the iron bridges last fall. Paint was ordered and paid for but on account of delay in delivery it did not arrive before cold weather set in. Paint is now on hand for going over all the bridges the coming spring,

The police department, heretofore an expense to the town has, for the first time in the town's history, produced an income. Two years ago this department cost the town

about \$900 ; last year about \$500 ; while this year instead of costing the town anything for police protection, there has been an actual income.

The same gratifying condition exists in the departments of County poor, Town Poor and quarantine, in all of which departments the expenditures have been the lowest for many years.

The largest amount yet received from dog licenses was received this year, the proceeds of which go to increase the amount of our school funds.

Three thousand dollars (\$3,000) of town bonds have been paid as well as all interest due.

Some inquiry has been made as to how the town disposes of bonds that have been paid and retired. For the information of the tax payers we would say that each year all bonds paid are destroyed by burning in the presence of the selectmen, auditors and town treasurer. The town has voted each year for the past seven years to appropriate \$3000 toward payment of bonds, which means the sum total of \$21,000.

Never has the town made any provision for the payment of interest on bonds outstanding. During this seven years there has been paid in interest charges the sum of \$13,440 ; so that while the town has provided for the payment only of \$21,000 your selectmen have managed to actually pay out \$34,440. The original bond issue was \$57,000, while today there are outstanding \$36,000.

In the case brought by the town of Bath against the town of Haverhill, which has been pending some time, a decision was recently rendered by the Supreme Court in favor of the town of Haverhill, thus settling the question of maintainance of the bridge at Woodsville over the Ammonoosuc river and

sustaining the claim of your Selectmen.

There are no orders for the year outstanding and no bills unpaid that have been allowed to date.

The net debt of the town has been reduced during the past year \$5,946.07.

The newly elected Cemetery Commission makes its first report, and its doings will be of interest to all persons interested in the management of our cemeteries.

In not a department have expenditures exceeded appropriations; the town debt materially decreased, all bills paid that have been presented and allowed to date, and a cash balance in the treasury of \$3,561.68.

In the warrant you will find articles deserving of your careful consideration.

LAW RELATING TO DOG LICENSES.

There is and has been a great deal of misunderstanding in regard to the law relating to the licensing of dogs, and the duty and liabilities of the owners. We therefore beg leave to submit a few extracts from the Public Statutes, hoping that they will be of service to the owners of dogs, and that they will govern themselves in accordance with the same

(Extracts from Chap. 60, Laws of New Hampshire, 1891.)

SECTION 1. Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over, shall annually, on or before the thirtieth day of April cause it to be registered, numbered, described, and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name and its registered number.

SEC. 2. An owner of a dog may at any time have it licensed until the first day of the ensuing May; and a person becoming the owner or keeper of a dog after the first day of May, not duly licensed, shall cause it to be registered, numbered, described, and licensed as provided in the preceding section.

SEC. 3. The fee for every license for a year shall be two dollars for a male dog and five dollars for a female dog, and such proportionate sum for licenses for dogs becoming three months of age after the first day of May, or which may be brought from out the state after the first day of May, as the remaining portion of the year bears to the sum required for a license for a whole year.

SEC. 8. Whoever keeps a dog contrary to the provisions of this chapter shall forfeit fifteen dollars, five dollars of which shall be paid to the complainant and ten dollars to the treasurer of the city or town in which the dog is kept.

SEC. 10. The assessors shall annually make a list of all dogs owned or kept in their respective cities or towns on the first day of April, with the owners' or keepers' names, and return the same to the city or town clerk on or before the first day of May. An owner or keeper of a dog who refuses to answer or answers falsely to the assessors, relative to the ownership thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, to be paid into the town treasury.

SEC. 11. The mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually, within ten days from the first day of May, issue a warrant to one or more police officers or constable, directing them to proceed forthwith, either to kill or cause to be killed, all dogs within such city or town not licensed and collared, according to the provisions of this chapter, and to enter complaint against the owners or keepers thereof; and any person may, and every police officer and constable shall, kill or cause to be killed, all such dogs, whenever and wherever found.
