

TOWN WARRANT.

State of New Hampshire.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- I. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- II. To choose three selectmen for the ensuing year.
- III. To choose all other town officers.
- IV. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for current expenses.
- V. To see if the town will vote to raise money for high-ways and bridges.
- VI. To see if the town will vote to raise money to defray expenses of Memorial Day, and if so, how much.
- VII. To see if the town will vote to raise money to defray expenses of electric lights in Center Harbor Village, and if so, how much.
 - VIII. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for

improvement of highways and raise money for same, and if so, how much.

- IX. To see if the town will choose an agent to care for the fountain at Center Harbor Village.
- X. To see if the town will choose an agent to care for the cemetery on Center Harbor Hill.
- XI. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen or Road Agents to either buy or hire a team to be used on the road machine for spring work.
- XII. To see if the town will vote to hire money for town purposes.
- XIII. To see if the town will vote to hire one or more patrolmen for town roads during summer season.
- XIV. To see if the town will vote to raise money to lease and repair wharf at Center Harbor Village and if so, how much.
- XV. To see what action the town will take in relation to claim of A. L. Davis for damage received on highway.
- XVI. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$500 for repairs on highway leading from Town House to Measley Pond Bridge.
- XVII. To see if the town will vote to raise money to place in Nichols Memorial Library, suitable tablets, bearing the names of residents who were in the service of the Civil, Spanish and Wo ld War.
- XVIII To choose committees and agents in relation to any article in this warrant and hear reports of any here before chosen.

Report of School Board

At the opening of the school year the schools were in charge of the same teachers as the year before, with the exception of the Hawkins. Miss Sheldrick and Miss Glidden at the village, Mrs. Mary E. Lovett at the Town House and Mrs. Pearl Willoughby at the Hawkins. In the spring the Board united the village schools, and Mrs. Laura J. Clark of Hollis was placed in charge.

At the annual meeting Miss M. Grace Woodward was elected a member of the School Board, but declined to qualify and Wilbur L. White was appointed to fill the vacancy. Later, Mrs. E. B. C. Smith resigned and has since had charge of the Hawkins school. The school year was broken up by schools being closed during the prevailing influenza epidemic by order of the Board of Health. The attendance afterwards was not up to the standard.

We would recommend the selectmen raise by taxation \$700 for tuition, \$75 for supplies and \$25 for flags. New flags are needed at the Hawkins and Town House schools.

Village school-Maurice Bickford, third term.

Town House, first and second terms—Oren Blake; for entire year, Alberta Blake, Earle Mack and Thane Preston.

Hawkins, first term—Ariel Marston, Evelyn Marston and Beatrice York; second term, Roger S. Haines, Ariel Marston, Evelyn Marston and Beatrice York.
