#### . TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of Center Harbor qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers.
- 2. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for current expenses.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road agents or instruct the selectmen to appoint an expert highway agent.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for repairs of highways and bridges.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of trunk lines in the town.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of State Aid roads in the town.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for improvements of highways, raise money for same, and if so, how much.
- 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and pay towards balance due for re-surfacing Whittier Road.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money for town purposes in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise money to defray expenses of Memorial Day, and if so, how much.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise money to defray expenses of electric lights in Center Harbor Village, and if so, how much.
- 12. To see if the town will choose an agent to care for the fountain at Center Harbor Village.
- 13. To see if the town will choose an agent or agents to care for cemeteries throughout the town.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise money for fuel for the Fire Station, and if so, how much.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars for the purpose of having band concerts during the summer season.
- 16. To see if the town will choose a committee to take charge of wharf and make regulations for the same.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the improvement of roads from Town House to Waukewan Bridge, so called, and if so, how much.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise money for repair of sidewalks at Center Harbor Village, and if so, how much.

- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the repair of roads from the residence of G. H. Hawkins, past the residence of C. P. Jameson to New Hampton town line, and if so, how much.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital, and if so, how much.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for the extermination of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 22. To choose agents and committees in relation to any article in this warrant and hear reports of any here before chosen.

To the Taxpayers and Citizens of Center Harbor:

It is pleasing to be able to report another year of successful school administration and we invite your careful study of Supt. Small's report. (This is his first full year as superintendent). As we intimated in our report last year we expected to see our schools improve. We believe much has been accomplished under his susupervision.

Your Board has held meetings nearly every month, receiving reports from Supt. Small pertaining to school work.

Owing to a decrease in the valuation in town our school money will decrease about \$1,000.00. In view of this fact the Board feels called upon to ask you for at least \$300 for repairs.

The Town House school house needs painting both outside and in and other minor repairs to put it on par with the other houses. Both the West Center Harbor and Village houses are constantly in need of slight repairs. We are asking for this amount after carefully going over last year's repair accounts.

The Board again desires to express its thanks to the teachers, parents and citizens for their cooperation during the year past.

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Center Harbor:

The report last year dealt with attendance and tardiness, and I wish to call your special attention this year to the attendance tables.

A school's percentage of attendance may drop for a month of two because of unavoidable conditions, such as sickness, or very bad travelling, but a large number of tardy marks is an indication of slackness somewhere. It is not so much what a child misses in the few moments lost by tardiness as it is the loss of morale and the weakening of habits of punctuality and attention to duty.

How to make good citizens out of the boys and girls is a real problem and it cannot be solved entirely at school. Children are being educated for weal or woe all of their waking hours so that parents and even the community at large have a share and a responsibility in the product.

The Village School had 122 cases of tardiness last year which to be sure was a decrease of 74, but the number even then was at least nearly four times as large as it should have been.

Home duties, chores and work to a reasonable amount are good educational training, but the parent who permits his child to start his work too late, or to dally along so that he is late to school, makes his own work harder, injures the child, and hurts the whole school.

For so small a town, Center Harbor sends a good number of students to secondary schools. This is complimentary to the town and its schools, for where the interest in education is slight and the schools poor, there is little desire to continue beyond the compulsory limit.

The town is fortunate in having a committee so wholeheartedly interested in the welfare of the children and at the same time so careful that value is received for every penny expended.

#### Costs

Center Harbor spends a little above the median of the state per pupil in average membership.

Two hundred and twenty nine of the 252 districts in the state tax themselves more per \$1000 of equalized valuation for public education than does Center Harbor.
