# TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, on School Street, in East Jaffrey Village, in said Town, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, District Delegates and Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican Parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

Polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forencon and to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon.

- 2. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years and all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To hear all reports, except that of the Budget Committee, and act thereon.
- 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee, and to raise such sums of money as may be required for the support of the poor, building and repairing highways and bridges, fire department, Memorial Day, street lights, and all other Town charges.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$381.00 (1/100th of 1 per cent of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in co-operation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,145.00, the same to be set aside for future State Aid Construction of Class II roads when State moneys become available.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$421.99 for construction of Class V roads upon condition that the State will allot the sum of \$1,687.94, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Treasurer of the Trustees of Trust Funds, an annual salary not exceeding \$100.00 and vote to raise and appropriate money to pay for same.
- 10. To see if the Town desires to take any action in relation to the pay of the Sextons.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Mrs. Hattie H. Bacon, a quit claim deed of the Red School House in old District Number 11, situated about one half mile beyond Shattuck Inn, with conditions that it shall be kept in repair.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light near the driveway entrance to the residence of Arland B. Hunt, raise and appropriate sixteen dollars for same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Arland B. Hunt and others.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light near the residence of August Duval and appropriate sixteen dollars for same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Alcide Pelletier and others.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on Parent . Street, on the North side of said street near the residence of Rosanna LaPlante, raise and appropriate sixteen dollars for same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Alice Pelletier and others.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the construction of a sewer from a point near Red Mill Inn on Stratton Road down to and including as many homes as possible on the fork of Stratton and Old Squantum Roads, to be constructed as soon as conditions will warrant, as petitioned for by George W. Schoerner and others.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town a lease of the land owned by the Town on the summit of Mt. Monadnock to W. K. N. E. Corporation or its nominee, such nominee to be a corporation whose name shall include the word Monadnock, such lease to be for a term of ten years with a renewal privilege of ten additional years at an annual rental of \$500.00 for the first five years, with the privilege of renegotiating the amount of the rental for each five year period thereafter. The use to be made of said land is for a Frequency Modulation Broadcasting Station with the necessary tower and buildings and access thereto but in no other way to interfere with the use of the land by the public, as petitioned for by Delcie D. Bean and others.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept a road two rods wide, leading Easterly from Stratton Road, a distance of approximately 500 feet, known as Forcier's Driveway, as petitioned for by Alphonse Belanger and others.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on the Henchman Road, so-called, near the residence of Isabel J. MacLeod, raise and appropriate sixteen dollars for same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Isabel J. MacLeod and others.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$6,000.00 to purchase a tractor or truck for highway purposes, or take any action thereto.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,000.00 to retire Grade School and Auditorium bonds.

- Art. 4. Borrowing. Voted to authorize Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxation.
- Art. 5. Town Road Survey. Voted to raise and appropriate \$500.00 to continue Town Road Survey.
- Art. 6. Monadnock Region Association. Voted to raise and appropriate \$375.00 for Monadnock Region Association.
- Art. 7. Voting in Town Elections. Voted to rescind the vote taken at the biennial meeting held on November 2, 1920, to adopt the Australian ballot system for town elections and to adopt the non-partisan ballot system for town elections.
- Art. 8. Transcribing Vital Statistics. Voted to raise and appropriate \$600.00 to pay the Town Clerk for transcribing records of births, marriages and deaths, including filing cabinet, supplies and rebinding old books.
- Art. 9. Pool Fund Committee. Voted to request the Committee to expend the income of the Alice W. Poole Fund to have its accounts audited annually by the Town Auditors; and to render a report annually to the Town in such manner as to give information of the several purposes and amounts of expenditures but not to disclose the names of individual recipients.
- Art. 10. Town Officers' Salaries. Voted that the salary of the Municipal Court Justice be raised to \$300.00 per year; of the Town Clerk to \$100.00; of the Town Treasurer to \$150.00; and of the Health Officer to \$100.00.
- Art. 11. Sale of Kinsman Land. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Kinsman land, so-called.
- Art. 12. Municipal Budget Act. Voted to rescind the vote taken at the annual Town Meeting of March 12, 1935, whereby the Town adopted the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act; and voted to authorize the creation of a Budget Committee composed of one member appointed from and by the Board of Selectmen; one from and by the School Board; and three citizens to be appointed by the Moderator, to serve for a term of three years and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The duty of the Committee shall be to meet on or before the 10th day of February in each year to carefully consider the finances of the Town; to hold hearings for various departments and for other persons desiring to be heard; and to draw up a list of the amounts necessary, in their opinion, to be raised for all Town and School purposes, the same to be printed in the Town Report and submitted to the voters for final action at the annual meetings.
- Art. 13. Bicycle Regulations. A comprehensive code of By-Laws for regulating the use of bicycles and licensing the same was presented, and after discussion, voted to refer the matter to a committee consisting of

the Chief-of-Police, the Selectmen and four other members, to be appointed by the Moderator, two of whom shall be members of the Jaffrey Civic Club and report to an adjourned meeting to be held on the second Tuesday of May, 1943.

- Art. 14. Retiring Bonds. Voted to appropriate \$1500 from money in the treasury not otherwise expended for retiring bonds.
- Art. 15. Class V Roads. Voted to raise and appropriate \$840.12 for construction of Class V Roads upon condition that the State allots \$3.360.46.

# ABSTRACT OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED AT THE ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING, MAY 11, 1943

- Art. 13. Bicycle Regulations. The Committee, composed of Hubert F. O'Neil, Chief of Police; Jason C. Sawyer, Ralph E. Boynton and Homer J. Belletete, Selectmen; and Levering Reynolds, Jr., George P. Duncan, Homer J. Forcier and John T. Conrad, appointed by the Moderater, reported the following regulations and recommended their adoption:
  - 1. These By-Laws shall be known as the Jaffrey Bicycle Regulations.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for any resident of Jaffrey to operate or cause to be operated on any public way within the town any bicycle unless the same shall have been registered as provided herein, cr while the registration of said bicycle is suspended.
- 3. The Chief of Police is hereby designated as the registering officer, any expenses incurred by him under authority of this by-law shall constitute a just charge against the Town, all fees collected by him under authority of this by-law shall belong to the Town, and he shall render a separate account annually in the same manner as is required of other Town Officers. He is authorized to purchase and issue registration plates, printed registration certificates and printed copies of these regulations.
- 4. The registration fee for each registration period shall be twenty-five cents and shall be paid in advance. The fee for transfer shall be ten cents.
- 5. All registrations shall expire at midnight upon March 31 after their date of issue.
- 6. It shall be unlawful to operate a bicycle on any sidewalk in the town of Jaffrey.
- 7. It shall be unlawful for more than one person to ride on a bicycle unless it is a tandem.
- 8. It shall be unlawful to operate a bicycle during the period between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise unless the same is equipped with a light visible from the front and a reflector visible from the rear.

- 9. It shall be unlawful to operate a bicycle unless the same is equipped with an adequate audible warning signal.
- 10. It shall be unlawful to operate a bicycle unless the same is equipped with an adequate brake.
- 11. It shall be unlawful to operate a bicycle in such a manner as to endanger the safety of any person.
- 12. The Chief of Police shall revoke or suspend any registration for just cause. An appeal to the Municipal Court may be had by any person whose registration has been revoked or suspended.
- 13. Any person violating any provision of these by-laws may be fined not more than \$5.00.
- 14. If any provision of these by-laws or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of these by-laws which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of these by-laws are declared to be separable.
  - 15. These by-laws shall take effect June 1, 1943.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

I submit this, my twenty-sixth annual report as Superintendent of Schools, it being the thirty-fifth in the series under union supervision. With it is included the report of Headmaster Ernest W. Pratt and the report of Mrs. Helen L. Towne, School Nurse.

Since our last report Mr. Ernest B. Dana was given a leave of absence as headmaster to enter the service of the U. S. Army as an instructor in the air forces, and the position of headmaster since that time has been held by Mr. Ernest W. Pratt of Barre, Mass., a graduate of Colby College with several years experience as teacher of science in Massachusetts and Connecticut schools, and seven years as supervising principal of the Junior and Senior High School in Millbury, Mass.

Miss Swann, teacher of English was married near the close of the school year and asked to be released from her contract during the summer vacation.

Mrs. Ellen H. Floyd who was elected to the English department received her degree of B. Ed. at Southern Illinois Normal University in 1942, and the degree of M. A. from the University of Illinois in June, 1943.

Mr. Durkee gave up his position as teacher of Social Science the latter part of August, and Miss Elena F. Baglione, who received her degree from Framingham Teachers' College in 1943 was elected.

Mrs. Vera H. Rice declined re-election in the Junior High department, and Mrs. Abbie S. Brown, who had taught part time during last year was given a full time position in this department.

Miss Edythe Coutts, teacher of one section of the first grade was married at the close of the school year, and Mrs. Dorothea Hammond, a former teacher in the primary grades was elected to succeed her.

The transfer of Mrs. Abbie Brown as part time teacher in the grade school to the junior high occasioned a vacancy that was filled by the election of Mrs. Louise Belletete, a former sixth grade teacher.

The enrollment for the first twelve weeks of the present school year has been 550. For the same period last year it was 555, and for the entire school year 1942-43 it was 575.

During the past ten years the total enrollment of the schools has varied from 551 for the school year 1937-38 to 590 for the school year 1940-41

The smallest enrollment for the high school was 115 in 1937-38, and during two years, 1940-41 and 1942-43 reached the total of 152.

For the second successive year the meeting of the State Teachers' Association was omitted, but a Regional Association meeting in connection with the Cheshire County Institute was held at Keene on

November 12th. This meeting was attended by the teachers of the supervisory union.

The classes in adult education for several years conducted by Mrs. Aline Brown were discontinued last spring as Mrs. Brown was obliged to give up the work at that time, but these classes were resumed in October and are now in charge of Mrs. Barbara Doucoumes of Keene.

The shortage of teachers and the higher salaries paid out of the state necessitates a call for a substantial increase in the school budget.

The schools are meeting the war situation with a determination to do their part. Thus far only one call has been made for a rationing program, and this was very successfully conducted during the fall term with little loss of school time.

In these trying days the schools need the cooperation of the homes, the pupils and the teachers. Parents should realize more keenly their responsibility to the schools. They should make their children realize the importance of making the most of their opportunity to secure an education. Pupils should more keenly appreciate that for them school is their most important business, and teachers by skill and tact must see to it that the work assigned is done.

When all co-cperate, difficulties disappear. Our task is not different from that of other communities throughout the country. Let us all carry on with increased vigor and determination.

# REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF CONANT JUNIOR-SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Mr. Lewis S. Record, Superintendent of Schools, East Jaffrey, N. H.

The following is the annual report for Conant Junior-Senior High School for the year 1943.

## Teaching Staff

Three changes were made in the teaching staff during the year, all of which became effective in September. The vacancies caused by the resignation of Mr. Benjamin G. B. Durkee, Social Science Department, Mrs. E. Elizabeth Jones, English Department, and Mrs. Vera Rice, Junior High Science Department, were filled by Miss Elena Baglionne, Mrs. Ellen H. Floyd, and Mrs. Abbie S. Brown respectively. Of the eleven full time teachers, six teach full time in the senior high school, two teach in both the junior and senior high school, and three teach full time in the junior high school.

#### Enrollment and Attendance

Conant Senior High School opened this past fall with an enrollment of one hundred and twenty-six pupils. At present there are one hundred and twenty-one students in high school. Three have moved from town and two have entered the Armed Services. In contrast to the enrollment of other high schools which opened last September with greatly decreased student bodies, due to war conditions, this school has maintained a far better than average stability of pupil registration. The enrollment of the junior high school for September was ninety-eight, a decrease of ten from that of last year.

The attendance in the senior high school for the year of 1942-43 was 92.2% as compared with an average of 93.5% for the entire state, and the number of tardinesses per pupil was 2.1 as compared to 1.4 for the state as a whole. The number of half days in which schools were in session was 338, while the average for the state was 346.7. In the junior high school for the first twenty weeks of this school year the per cent of attendance was 93.03 and the number of tardinesses per pupil was .86.

The only change in the course of study from that of last year is the introduction of a physical education program for all boys.

The purpose of this program is to make high school pupils physically fit to undertake the unusually heavy tasks that they will be called upon to assume in the near future. For some it will be for induction into the armed forces.

The program has for its objective the development of: (a) Strength, endurance, stamina and bodily coordination; (b) Physical skills that will be of direct value and use in the armed forces and war work.

Owing to the great demand placed upon the time of pupils outside of school hours, both in work and civilian defense activities, it has been somewhat difficult to maintain all extra curricula activities at the same standard that would normally occur during peace times. However all school and class events have functioned as usual up to the present, but it is doubtful if this can be carried out if the present emergency continues, as the demands of pupils' time and efforts become greater each passing month.

The school has continued its membership in the Monadnock League and has its full representation of athletic teams, although baseball was played informally last spring as in all other schools situated as Conant, is due to the extreme difficulty of transportation.

The annual senior class trip to Washington has been changed to a trip to New York for four days and the present senior class is planning to make the same tour.

One phase of war effort is to be greatly commended. The school sells, every Friday morning, War Savings Stamps which is being accomplished by the office practice class of the Commercial Department. Each month over 90% of the pupils have purchased stamps entitling them to fly their "Minute Man Flag." Those who buy regularly are forming a habit of saving. From September, 1943, to February, 1944, \$2,294.15 worth of stamps and bonds were sold. One senior who left school to enter the Armed Service invested his school savings in bonds.

In conclusion I wish to call the attention of both school officials and parents to the urgent need of regular attendance and punctuality, You will note from a previous paragraph that Conant High and Junior High School fall below the average for the state in attendance and tardinesses. Pupils who are absent a great deal from class miss the class room work and can not possibly accomplish as much in trying to make it up in spare periods or at the close of school. There are several pupils who fall in this category, both from trying to do too much work outside of school, and allowing outside interests to take up their minds and time to the detriment of their school subjects. Those who make a practice of being absent a great deal gradually fall below in their grades and ultimately reach a point where they fail promotion.
