

State of New Hampshire TOWN OF CENTER HARBOR Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Center Harbor Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Highway Department.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital and if so how much.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$3,000.00 for Welfare and Town Poor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,900.00 for maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Fire Company.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Assistance for class V roads, the Town to raise \$256.18 the state to contribute \$1,707.89.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts, and if so, how much.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 124.57 which is 1/300 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for new equipment.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the maintenance of Dr. Morrill Memorial Park and if so, how much.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,625.00 for Street Lighting throughout the Town.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 to be used for Life Guard Duty at the Wharf Area.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt by reference the provisions of the National Board of Fire Underwriters National Building Code, abbreviated edition, and any amendments thereto as authorized by Chapter 215 Laws of New Hampshire 1959.
- 16. If Article 15 is adopted, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to defray the expenses incurred by the enforcement of said article.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for the purchase of land adjoining the Town House property and raise and appropriate funds for the same.
- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money for improvements to the Center Harbor Fire Station and if so how much.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 for improvement and tarring the High Haith Road.
- 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for the purchase of a new Town Truck at a cost of not more than \$4,500.00 and to hire money to spread cost of said truck over a period of more than one year.

- 21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,231.79 to complete payment of the cost of reappraising the Town property.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for care of shade trees.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for Town purposes in anticipation of Taxes.
- 25. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article in the Warrant and to hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Forest Fire Warden's Report

PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note. 58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners.

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fire would radically change this picture.

The rules are simple—

- 1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local fire warden the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
- 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- 4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles use your ash tray.
- 5. Don't burn at home Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

Clinic Report of Public Health Nurse

This is a report of the two evening "Walk-in Polio Clinics" conducted by the State Health Department and sponsored by the Local Women's Club of Center Harbor. These clinics were very well attended and I wish to credit the success to the sponsoring group and Mrs. Amy Brown, who worked hard to see that people took advantage of obtaining protection from this disease.

The following information may be of interest to print in your Town Report.

Civil Defense Unit

During the year we have not been too active but we hope everyone who has been assigned a job, knows it well in case the Civil Defense Unit is called for any emergency.

On January 20th, Dr. Conrad gave us a 4th First-aid Lecture. Many interested folks met at the firehouse for this lecture as the last of a series.

The radio is in the process of being installed at Dr. Hale's residence. This should give the West Center Harbor area closer contact with the village in case of fires etc.

A Civil Defense Alert Test was held April 17 and a Telephone Communication Test on December 7. This Communication Test is to check on the length of time it takes to notify each town of an enemy attack or of radioactive fall-out. During these tests, I have found we are notified by our Forestry Band Radios (located at the Firehouse and Dr Hale's) 5-7 minutes sooner than by telephone.

In the 1958 Town Report, there is a more complete report and active members are listed, therefore I will not use the space to repeat. Clarence "Jim" Hawkins has been appointed Warden to fill the vacancy caused by the death of John Jewett. We will miss the interest John had in our unit.
