Laura was born in Campton, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Ewins.

She attended the Campton Grammer School, was graduated from Plymouth High School and went on to Plymouth Normal School.

Following her graduation from P.N.S. she taught in the elementary grades in Holderness and Ashland for five years.

Her marriage to Bertram Pulsifer took place in 1935. They made their home on Pulsifer Hill in the Pulsifer homestead which was built around 1812.

Bertram Pulsifer became Campton's Selectman in 1941, an office he still serves faithfully and well.

Selectman and Mrs. Pulsifer have three children, Mrs. Wendell (Mary Louise) Noble of Milton, Vermont. Mamie and Scott who live on

Pulsifer Hill and three grandchildren, Martha Noble, 9 years, Rebecca Noble 4 years and Thomas Noble 2 years old.

Laura has served her community in many ways and for many years. She was Lady Assistant Steward in the Campton Grange #93 for several years and its secretary in the early 50's, keeping up these duties until the Grange dissolved in 1974.

Laura has been Campton's librarian since 1937 taking over the duties from her mother, Mrs. Abbie Ewins who served in this capacity from 1907 to 1937. She was assisted by Laura's sister, Louise (Shearer). Laura's brother Scott also served as librarian from 1913 to 1919.

Gardiner Little was the first librarian in the Town House in the year 1894 and served until his death in 1905.

When the Grange gave up their charter in 1974 the members voted to give the dining room and kitchen to the town to be known as the Campton Grange Town Library. At the Town Meeting it was voted to accept the gift.

That we have such a fine selection of books, figured on a small budget, is due to Laura's keen perception of the peoples' tastes and choices. She has always been willing to go to great lengths to hunt out and choose such reading, even thought it meant much traveling and hours of deliberation.

To know Laura as a person, one senses her kindness, gentleness and sweetness. And underlying these qualities there is a sense of strength and a tenacity of purpose to carry through to a final conclusion any task, however, large or small, in her path.

We all say a thank you to Laura who is a respected citizen, devoted wife and mother, kind friend, and helpful neighbor.

And a special thank you goes from everyone because we are all a bit better for knowing her.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Campton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Campton on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at two of the clock in the afternoon to act on the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To Choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- Art. 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of its highways and bridges.
- Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- Art 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Memorial Day.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the White Mountain Region Association.
- **Art. 7** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500.00 for the maintenance of Blair and other cemeteries in Town.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,640.00 to reimburse the Campton Village Precinct for hydrant rental.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,782.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.
- Art. 10 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into an ambulance agreement with the Town of Plymouth for the ensuing year and raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,894.80 for same.

- Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to continue its membership in the North Country Council.
- Art. 12 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,369.00 or any lesser sum for the North Country Council.
- Art. 13 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the N.H. Humane Society.
- Art. 14 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to help support promotion and publicity for the Campton, Thornton, Waterville Valley Chamber of Commerce. (By Petition.)
- Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for 1978 to apply toward the tax map contract.
- Art. 16 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,750.00 for the support and maintenance of its Fire Department.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,500.00 to set aside for equipment for future use of the Town.
- Art. 18 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, formally accept and expend any grants that may be awarded to the Town by State or Federal Funds.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of any land or buildings acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's Deed or Deeds. Such funds to be placed in a capital reserve fund for the sole purpose of defraying cost toward the fire department and/or Waste disposal.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,000.00 and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$25,000.00 from Revenue Sharing funds to build a main fire station on land owned by the Town of Campton on Route 49. This article anticipates that the Town of Thornton will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 toward future solid waste disposal needs of the Town of Campton either individually or in agreement with other towns.

- Art. 22 To see if the Town will vote to accept monies bequeathed by Bertha M. Chase for the establishment of a fund for the building of a public library in said town in a suitable place to be determined by the town. In the event the Town of Campton declines to accept this bequest, the bequest goes to the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to adopt rules and regulations for town cemeteries as follows: all flowers will be at the center lot monument, no bushes of any kind or trees to be planted on the lot, not over one shrub on either side of a center lot monument, markers and cornerstones to be installed at ground level, no lot monument to be over 40 inches high, all lot alterations must be approved by the Supt. of Cemeteries and the Board of Selectmen.
- Art. 24 To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the west end of the Livermore Falls Road from the railroad right-of-way to Route 3.
- Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers heretofore chosen.
- Art. 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

1977 has been a very busy year for your Selectmen. The paper work demanded by the various State and Federal departments and agencies is unbelievable and proves beyond a doubt that bureaucracy grows on paperwork.

It proves to us the wise decision in hiring a fulltime secretary, who is doing a fine job for the Town.

You will remember that we received a letter just before the 1977 Town Meeting from the State of New Hampshire Board of Taxation ordering a Public Hearing in Concord on March 22, 1977 to see is they should order a reassessment of all property in town. The Town Meeting unanimously adopted a resolution supporting the Selectmen in their taxing policies and opposing State intervention.

We were very pleased to have petitions with 237 names plus about twenty five interested voters and taxpayers take the time to go to Concord and unanimously support the Selectmen's assessing practices. We are pleased to report that to date we have never heard from the State officials.

At a recent meeting in Newport with our tax mapping company, we found that the maps and property index cards were taking form and we should have some of the completed maps for display at Town Meeting.

We completed about one half of the Pond Road with TRA Funds and plan to use TRA money to complete the balance in 1978.

The Federal Forestry Department has promised the Town that they will repair the wing wall of Campton Dam this spring to stop the long time leakage on the Pond Road.

We have purchased steel girders, from this year's Highway Funds, for the Lit and Blaisdell bridges, as well as large metal culverts for the Avery Bridge, and are obtaining an estimate from the State Highway Department for the rebuilding of the very narrow Ryan Brook Bridge.

We would like to pay our last respects to Webb Little who passed away in Manchester on February 2, 1978. Webb was a descendent of one of the early families of Campton, was Postmaster from 1915 to 1934 and Selectman from 1934 to 1948.

We have an article to see if the voters will raise funds, with Thornton, to build a fire station on Town owned land at the junction of Old Depot Road and Route 49. The present plans call for about 6000 sq. ft. block building at an estimated cost of \$100,000 with Thornton raising \$35,000 and our share of \$65,000, some of which can be taken from Revenue Sharing Funds.

The Fire Wards and firemen feel if we can build the basic building, they can and will do much of the interior construction.

A new precinct, Waterville Estates Village District, was established in the Waterville Estates area of Town for the purpose of maintaining roads owned by the said village district.

We are pleased to have the repairs completed on the Blair Bridge by Milton Graton Associates. The restoration of this bridge is certainly an accomplishment we are proud to see completed.

In October of this year, the Board moved its meetings from the Town Hall to the Town Office Building, partly to be more convenient to the Office of the Town Clerk and the Selectmen's Office, and partly to avoid the need for heating a room at the Town Hall for its monthly meeting. Unless a change of date is published, the Board continues to meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m.

The Board has met with the Selectmen, on several occasions, during the year to discuss matters of common interest regarding the needs of the Town. Working, also, with Gerald Coogan, of the North Country Council, two hearings have been slated for early 1978 relative to some amendments to the Zoning Regulations and to Subdivision Regulations. Zoning amendments would include a sign ordinance and a clarification of the regulations pertaining to the Rural Residential Area. Hopefully these amendments will be finalized in a form that will result in their being adopted at the Annual Town Meeting. Proposed changes in the Subdivision Regulations are simply a procedural matter, mainly designed to place them in conformity with laws passed by the State Legislature.

1977 REPORT FROM THE PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY

Services available to town residents through the Agency are home nursing which covers bed baths, bed change, skin care, passive exercises, dressings, enemas, douches, infant care, catherizations, blood pressures, diabetic screenings, temperatures and hypodermics, to name a few. Homemaker services cover light housekeeping, shopping, laundry, running errands and emotional support. The home health aide is a trained para-professional who assists the nurse in giving baths, both bed and tub; gives enemas and does passive exercises.

Free blood pressure and diabetic screening clinics have been instituted in Campton. Blood pressure readings are continuous monthly on every third Thursday and it is important to maintain a steady blood pressure reading from month to month. The diabetic screening will be held about twice a year. Notices of when these clinics are to be held will be in the Record Citizen.

The Agency has an automatic new-baby visit upon receipt of the birth notice to new mothers and to other mothers who are having health problems or other difficulties.

The Agency works with the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital discharge coordinator to give patients continuity of care upon discharge from the hospital.

Through all the Agency's services it enables the residents of our town to remain at home in time of illness when they might otherwise be institutionalized for lack of available home nursing care.

The Staff of the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency is doing an excellent and conscientious job in providing home health care to those of the area towns in need of it. They deserve and need our financial support.

CAMPTON—THORNTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Another year has rolled by and again the time has arrived to write a report of your fire department for the people of Campton and Thornton.

You will find a report on our income and expenses for the year in this town report.

In checking last year's report to see what we planned to do this year, we see we batted about 500.

The G.M.C. pumper has been repaired and repainted and should serve us for a few more years.

As far as the fire station location in West Thornton, we will have to say nothing done as we never heard from anyone about a piece of land to put it on. We will gladly talk to anyone who has something to offer on this problem. The Fire Commissioners are the first to say we need one there and are still waiting for some answers to questions we asked to be checked out. We still need a small station in that area.

Again, the firemen have been very active in Twin River Mutual Aid with our Chief, David Tobine, serving as President of that group this year. This is a growing mutual aid with many problems to solve but each step they take is ahead and we feel it is a good group for our department to be tied into. Your Fire Commissioners would like to see Plymouth Fire Department head up the Northern Area of this Mutual Aid and some progress is being made toward that goal as they have men on duty 24 hours a day.

We have just put into operation a new signal call system for our department. We just purchased Motorola F.M. equipment after studying a number of makes and putting bids out for our needs. All calls using the red phone, 726-4411, will be answered at the Plymouth Fire Station where they will tone our firemen to respond to the fire. We feel it will save much time and make a quicker response to all fires. At the present time we will be using the same red phone number 726-4411. This is a rather costly way and in a few years we may use a 536 number to save money but we all felt the 726-4411 number should be used until we have plenty of time to study a change.

The firemen did a lot of odd jobs to raise money toward these radios along with the appropriation from the two towns over the last three years. We feel this is a big step forward.

We need some equipment such as 4" hose and fittings which the firemen are going to work toward the purchase of, with a few projects this year.

Now our main concern is a main fire station to house our equipment. This department has around \$100,000.00 worth of rolling stock and no main station to house it and maintain it. We sure hope this year we will get the support of the voters to build a main fire station. All the firemen want is the bare necessities to house and maintain your equipment. We commissioners feel they will work and earn money for any frills they want to improve the department. All firemen and fire commissioners ask your support in this project.

The Women's Auxiliary is always ready to give a helping hand in these projects as they have in the past.

We sure hope the "town fathers" will see fit to enter an article in both warrants for this project.

Now, before we close this article, the Fire Commissioners want to state they really miss Harold Luttmann who was a faithful and knowledgeable Fire Commissioner. He really had the experience and was not afraid to give a helping hand in repairing the equipment as well and helping to pick out new equipment. He is missed by all of us and served this department well since he came to Campton.

Again, Chief David Tobine wishes to say he is always looking for men to help run the department in many jobs. If you have any spare time and want to give him a hand, do get in touch with him.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CAMPTON SCHOOL NURSE 1977

The school health program at Campton Elementary School involves many areas of the health of our community's young people.

Each April, a pre-school vision and hearing clinic is held at Plymouth Elementary School for all area 4 and 5 year olds. This is sponsored through the combined efforts of the Plymouth Lions Club, the New Hampshire Department of Public Health and the school nurses.

In May, preschool registration was held for all incoming kindergarten students. Each child is screened by a speech and hearing specialist for possible difficulties, a resource teacher for physical and emotional readiness. The kindergarten teacher interviews each parent and I obtain a health history for each incoming student.

In the area of dental health, the fourth grade students are again flossing and brushing their teeth daily through a dental program conducted by Mrs. Heberta Stark, New Hampshire State Hygienist and their teacher, Ellen Cook. A new program was also added this year. Money given to the school's dental program by the STAFF organization and the Campton-Thornton Women's Club were matched in a state matching funds program for dental care. Using these funds, Dr. James Poyak was able to provide dental care for 6 Campton students.

A series of free immunization clinics has been organized with the North Country Home Health Agency and held at the Linwood Medical Center. All immunizations required for school entry are offered. The clinic is available to all Campton residents from birth to 18.

All children in school are screened annually for hearing and vision. Height and weight checks are also completed at this time. Referrals to parents are made if necessary. Free glasses and eye examinations are also available to qualifying families through the state Sight Conservation Program.

As school nurse, I present films on various aspects of health. I am also available as a resource person and for specific health teaching to either individuals or groups of students.

Community health is a major concern of the school nurse. Last winter when there was a problem with the town water supply, a discussion was held with the town Health Officer on how best to handle the situation. It was through the cooperation of the school and the town that serious problems were avoided.

I wish to thank the teaching staff, the many physicians, parents and students for their support.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

School opened with a great deal of excitement and enthusiasm this year, and our programs are operating smoothly.

To this, I must give a great deal of credit first, to the faculty and staff for their dedication and outstanding effort to build an environment where children can work and learn effectively, and secondly, to you, the parents, and community whose support has made our efforts productive. This strong community-school relationship has been clearly demonstrated by your enthusiastic attendance to our school functions, i.e., Spring Concerts, Christmas play, eighth grade class suppers, the ski-skate program and also by your support of S.T.A.F.F. (Students, Teachers, All Families and Friends). Again this year, S.T.A.F.F. has contributed by organizing many fund raising activities (rummage sales, Ski-Skate Sale, and the Christmas Fair). Their goal is to purchase an instructional piano for the school.

This year, there are a number of items which should be brought to your attention. Opening day enrollment found 176 pupils in school and the number increased to 182 by midyear. This is the second year where such an increase has occurred but we do not anticipate any problems with housing. The second area is in regards to Special Education. The federal government passed a law entitled "The Education for All Handicapped Children Act" (P.L. 94:142) which guarantees a free appropriate education for all handicapped children. Thus, the school is required to address this issue.

The final item concerns the five acres of woodland purchased during the recent construction project. A Playground Committee, responsible to the School Board, has been formed to look into the possibility of enlarging that area into a playground for both town and school use. To date, the town of Campton has been without any publicly owned park and/or recreation area. Also, the present playfield is not large enough to accommodate school sports and activities. The committee would like to develop this area on a volunteer basis - an ambitious task at the minimum.

The climate and spirit presently existing between the school and the community will result in a productive and responsive education for all our young people.

SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE REPORT

I present to the Superintendent of Schools, School Board, and citizens of Campton, New Hampshire, my fifth Annua! Report as Assistant Superintendent for Public School Supervisory Union #48.

The "back to basics" movement has appeared in the media with increasing emphasis since the early 1920's and 30's. To define what is basic requires an analysis of the foundation of our educational institutions. One might say that all learning consists of the acquisition of skills in language, mathematics, science, the arts, and social studies. Taken as a whole, they reflect an array which facilitates mankind's understanding of the world. Leave one field out and the student is deprived of access to total self actualization. A child who does not learn the 3 R's in school is unlikely to learn them anywhere else; however, the 3 R's do not offer an adequate base for living a full life. There are other basics which are essential to survival: the skills of social interaction; the skills of emotional growth; and the skills of spiritual response. A deficiency in any one of these skills and the ability of a person to cope with life may be severely reduced.

Equally basic in the public schools is the development of character. It is oftentimes overlooked that the American public school has its origins in this objective. Character involves ethics - an adherence to honesty and a clear sense of justice.

Citizenship is another primary objective of the schools, it is action based on a feeling of allegiance to a nation. Citizenship education is a process of imparting knowledge and offering direct practice in establishing amicable relationships at every level of social activity. One facet of this experience is to ensure that students leaving high school will see their first vote as a climax of a long process of civic learning and civic action. To be a citizen is not only to know what the system is, but also to comprehend how it operates.

The schools cannot be expected to accomplish these tasks within the confines of the schoolhouse. Expecting the schools to operate in isolation can only lead to misunderstanding and frustration. The schools must continue to establish stronger lines of communication with a strengthened nuclear family, and with the cultural and recreational features of the immediate community. It is time to capitalize on these rich learning resources. It is time to develop a more dynamic linkage of the schools with these other educational units to comprehensively affect the growth of each child.

The vision of a school is a place encompassing much activity where people act with purpose and direction. The residents of Campton can be proud of the foundation being nurtured, a foundation which will contribute to a fulfilling future.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1976 - 1977

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrator, if any is in service in the union."

One half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$22,000 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of Supervisory Union #48 during 1976-1977 was made up as follows: \$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$19,500 was prorated among the school districts comprising the Supervisory Union. Allowance for \$800 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1976-1977 was made up as follows: \$2,380 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$16,620 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,700 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.
