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TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, 1983, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To cast your ballots for all necessary Town Officers.
- Article 2. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised laws relative to playing games of beano shall be adopted at this time.
- Article 3. Are you in favor of the adoption of the amendment to the existing town zoning ordinance as proposed by the planning board, such amendment being a revision in its entirety of that ordinance?

Polls open on the above articles at 10:00 A.M. and shall not be closed earlier than 7:00 P.M.

The following part of the Town Meeting will be adjourned until Monday, March 14, 1983, at 7:30 P.M.

- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$31,928.72 (Thirty one thousand nine hundred twenty eight dollars and seventy two cents) as its share of the operating budget of RESCUE, INC. for the period extending January 1, 1983 through December 31, 1983, this appropriation being two thirds the \$47,893.08 appropriation requested by RESCUE, INC. for the eighteen month period extending from January 1, 1983, through June 30, 1984. An appropriation of this amount will eliminate the need for RESCUE, INC. to assess service charges to Hinsdale residents requiring services, or act in any manner thereon. Inserted by Selectmen Without recommendation of Budget Committee
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,350.11 (Twenty two thousand three hundred fifty dollars and eleven cents) as

- Article 5. cont. its share of the operating budget of RESCUE, INC. for the period extending January 1, 1983 through December 31, 1983, this appropriation being two thirds the \$33,525.16 appropriation requested by RESCUE, INC. for the eighteen month period extending from January 1, 1983 through June 30, 1984. An appropriation of this amount will necessitate RESCUE, INC. assessing service charges to Hinsdale residents requiring RESCUE, INC.'s services, or act in any manner thereon.

Jones, Inc. who will do a thorough analysis of Hinsdale's insurance requirements and work on behalf of the Town toward obtaining the most comprehensive and cost-effective insurances for the Town.

- Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,816.00 (One thousand eight hundred sixteen dollars) for the support of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Services. (This is a .50 per capita assessment based on 1980 census data), or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 (One thousand dollars) to fund the delivery of meals to elderly and handicapped shut-in citizens of Hinsdale, sponsored by the Hinsdale Friendly Meals through Home Health Care and Community Services, Inc.

- Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$687.90 (Six hundred eighty seven dollars and ninety cents) in addition to which the State will contribute \$4,586.00 (Four thousand five hundred eighty six dollars) to be expended on Class IV and V road construction, or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 (Five hundred dollars) for the support of the Women's Crisis Center to help provide assistance to women and children who are victims of domestic violence or sexual abuse, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance relating to the licensing and regulation of coin operated amusement devices in the Town of Hinsdale.

ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AMUSEMENT DEVICES

I. Statement of Purpose: It is the intent of this ordinance, pursuant to RSA 31:41-d, to regulate and to license amusement devices as defined herein and to provide for the management of amusement devices in the public interest.

II. Definitions:

A. Amusement devices: The term "amusement device" shall mean any machine which, upon the insertion of a coin, slug, token, plate or disc, may be operated by the public generally for use as a game, entertainment, or amusement, whether or not registering a score, and whether or not skill is used in its operation. It shall include but not be limited to such devices as electronic games, pinball machines, skill ball, mechanical grab machines, and all games, operations, or transactions, similar thereto under whatever name they may be indicated. The term does not include vending machines in which are not incorporated gaming or amusement features, nor does the term include any coin-operated rides or devices which solely produce music.

B. Person, Firm, Corporation or Association: The terms person, firm, corporation, or association shall include any of those entities or combinations thereof owning an amusement device, or maintaining an establishment where one or more amusement devices are available for general use by the public, or having control over such an establishment.

III. Gambling Devices NOT Permitted: Nothing in this ordinance shall in any way be construed to authorize, license or permit any gambling devices whatsoever prohibited or regulated by New Hampshire law.

IV. Prohibited Practices:

A. No prizes of material value may be given away or sold at nominal fee for any reason whatsoever pertaining to a high score, matching number, or any other outcome of any amusement device game.



Article 27. V. License Required:  
Cont.

- A. No person, firm, corporation, or association may operate an amusement device without first obtaining a license from the Hinsdale Board of Selectmen.
- B. The Selectmen may establish from time to time reasonable licensing requirements, but in no event shall those requirements contain less than the following:
  1. That the applicant or applicants are eighteen years of age:
  2. That a full description of the premises is submitted, with a statement that such premises will be operated in accordance with all applicable local ordinances:
  3. That the total of amusement devices licensed within an establishment not exceed three:
  4. That the applicant will report the number of proposed amusement devices, and that should such number exceed the original number, an additional fee shall be paid for each such device.
- C. License Fee: The applicant shall pay twenty-five dollars (\$25.) per year or any part thereof per device, provided that the applicant may at his discretion remove and replace any device at will without further payment of a fee. In other words, the license fee shall be determined by the maximum number of devices present on any day of the year, and not by the total number of different machines present during the entire year.
- D. Duration: Licenses shall be effective from the date granted until December 31 of the year granted. Owners of establishments with amusement devices now in operation must pay all fees and apply for a license within 30 days of the effective date of this ordinance.
- E. Renewal: License will be reviewed annually by the Selectmen and renewed upon payment of fees if the person, firm, corporation, or

association applying for renewal has been found to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.

F. Revocation or Suspension: Such license may be revoked or suspended upon a determination that a violation of this ordinance has been committed by the license holder, his agent, or employee. Such revocation or suspension shall be carried out by the Selectmen only after due notice and hearing.

G. Additional Requirements: The Selectmen may from time to time amend this ordinance to modify, add, or delete any provisions thereof. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to abrogate, limit, or contradict any State or Federal law or regulation.

VI. Penalty: Any person, firm, corporation, or association found to have violated this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation.

VII. Separability: Each separate provision of this ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further ordained that if any provisions of this ordinance are found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

VIII. Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption by voters of the Town of Hinsdale.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to require that, henceforth, the final permission and consent, to operate a dump for dumping or a temporary storage center for rubbish or industrial or hazardous waste in the Town of Hinsdale, by any person, business, corporation, or Government Agency, local, State, or Federal, be determined by the Town voters at a Special or Annual Town Meeting, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to make the position of Hinsdale Road Agent an appointed position by removing the position from the official ballot and authorizing the Selectmen to hire a qualified person as Road Agent, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to go on record in support of immediate actions by the Federal Government to control and reduce acid rain which is harmful to the environment and economy of Hinsdale and to the health and welfare of the people of Hinsdale, NH., or act in any manner thereon.

These actions shall include:

1. Reduce by at least half the major cause of acid rain, sulfur dioxide emissions, by the year 1990.
2. Conclude negotiations and adopt a treaty with the government of Canada that will commit both nations to this same goal.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 3% discount for the first 30 days after tax bills are mailed on the payment of taxes in full, or act in any manner thereon. Inserted by Selectmen

Article 32. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to contract for and accept aid relative to disasters, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 33. To allow the Town to accept prepayments on all taxes, with a warrant from the Selectmen, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 34. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums, in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes, therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year and from taxes collected within the current municipal year.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or another governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:95-b.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to confirm and authorize the authority of the Selectmen to sell any

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Board of Selectmen  
Town Office  
Hinsdale, New Hampshire 03451

Members of the Board:

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds and account groups of the Town of Hinsdale for the year ended December 31, 1981 and have issued our report thereon, dated April 30, 1982. As part of our examination, we reviewed and tested the Town's system of internal accounting control to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. Under these standards, the purpose of this evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance when determining the nature, timing and extent of other such auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements. Our study and evaluation disclosed the following weaknesses and conditions that we consider to be material.

Sewer and Water Departments

Both vendor and payroll checks for the two departments are signed by one Selectman and one Board Member. Since the two utilities are now departments of the Town, the checks should be signed by the Town Treasurer, who in turn should assume control of bank statements, cancelled checks and related bank reconciliations.

The following recommendations, although not material weaknesses in internal accounting control, merit your attention. They were developed from observation of the Town's financial and administrative operations and are not the result of a special study.

Fixed Assets Accounting

The Town does not maintain accounting records for its general fixed assets, as is the case with many New Hampshire municipalities, fixed asset records are essential for control of the assets, insurance programs and long-range planning. While we recognize that the costs of any control system should not outweigh the benefits and that the establishment of fixed asset accounting records is a major undertaking, we believe that the Town should give development of these records a high priority. We offer the following program for your consideration.

- . Adoption of a formal capitalization policy by the Board of Selectmen.
- . Take an inventory of existing fixed assets and maintain records of identified items at a central location under control of the Selectmen.
- . Establish fixed asset accounting records for all new acquisitions and a certain percentage of existing items annually.
- . Establish a program for periodically verifying existence of items in the fixed asset accounting records.
- . Adopt formal procedures to delete items from the records.

#### Purchase Order System

At present, the Town does not have any formal purchasing procedures which would control obligations before purchases are made and to obtain the best possible prices. We offer the following guidelines as an aid in initiating purchasing procedures. These recommendations should be adhered to by all Town departments, including the Water and Sewer Departments.

1. If possible, authorize one person to make or approve purchases for the Town.
2. Ensure that all purchases are authorized by that person before the order is placed and that adequate funds are available in the budget.
3. The Town should consider the use of a pre-numbered purchase order form to help control expenditures before purchases are made.
4. Require competitive bids on purchases exceeding a certain dollar amount.
5. Require grouping of similar purchases from various departments into one consolidated bulk purchase.
6. Establish procedures for purchases without prior approval of small items or emergency items.

#### Municipal Court

Internal controls over virtually all accounting areas are weak. The majority of these weaknesses are caused by the lack of separation of incompatible accounting duties due to the small number of individuals involved in the accounting function. Without the expansion of the court personnel, which would not be practicable, such separation of duties is not possible.

#### Enterprise Fund - Sewer Department

As disclosed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Sewer Department, prior to January 1, 1980, has not capitalized additions to its plant and equipment or accounted for its debt service obligations.

The Department's fixed assets records are comprised of only the expenditures incurred in connection with the Waste Water Treatment Plant, but are inadequate in the following respects:

1. Additions to equipment and motor vehicles are recorded in the respective accounts in total, without reference to specific items involved.
2. Some capitilized items were for relatively small amounts with an estimated life of ten years.

We offer the following recommendations in the area of the Department's fixed assets accounting records.

- a. All additions to fixed assets should be isolated and recorded on separate ledger cards, and when fully depreciated, the asset should be deleted from the records.
- b. Establish a more realistic policy of capitilization, and set a dollar limit as to which items should be capitilized or treated as an expense in the year the expenditure was incurred.

As disclosed in the prior audit report, the Town officials are urged to perform a comprehensive review of the methods currently used in determining sewer rates. Under guidelines issued by the National Council of Governmental Accounting for Enterprise Funds, user charges are expected to fund all operating expenditures including depreciation and interest on debt.

In the past the Office of Revenue Sharing has not accepted audit reports which had opinions qualified for inability to audit fixed assets in an Enterprise Fund due to lack of documentation. We strongly urge the Town to initiate action in this area. In order to comply with generally accepted accounting principles.

#### Investment of Idle Funds

It was noted during our examination, that large amounts of cash were maintained in the Town's non-interest bearing checking account. We recommend that the Selectmen develop a cash management program that would maximize interest income.

#### Other

The objective of internal accounting control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed the benefits derived and also recognizes that the evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgment by management.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstandings of instructions, mistakes of judgment, carelessness or other personal factors. Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon segregation of duties can be circumvented by collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally by management with respect either to the execution and recording of transactions or with respect to the estimates and judgments required in the preparation of financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation of the Town's system of internal accounting control for the year ended December 31, 1981 which was set forth in the first paragraph, would not necessarily disclose all weaknesses in the system.

It should be noted that a letter of this type is critical in nature and that we do not intend to imply that our review failed to disclose commendable features in the present accounting and operating procedures of the Town.

#### Publication Requirement

The provisions of R.S.A. 71-A:21 require that only this letter be published in the next annual Town Report.

However, we suggest that you consider the publication of the entire report which includes auditor's opinion, financial statements and notes to financial statements. No portion of either the auditor's opinion, financial statements or notes to financial statements may be published separately.

We extend our thanks to the officials and employees of the Town of Hinsdale for their assistance during the course of our audit.

1982 was different from recent years in this respect.

In December 1981, I undertook a survey to determine the number of patrons, who come to the Library on Tuesday evenings and continued the survey until the final week of January 1982.

The results showed that an insufficient number of people came to the Library to warrant operation on Tuesday night and the Trustees decided to close it. From January 19 the Library operated for five days per week until July 6 when the Summer Reading Program for children went into effect until August 24 on Thursday afternoons from 1 to 5 p.m.

During the year a number of exhibits were on display and we are grateful to the exhibitors such as Mrs. Beverly Fecto, Regent of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas, Mrs. Virginia O'Neal for her collection of old Easter cards, the library collection of Sabastian Figurines of Library and Historical characters, Mrs. Betty Glover for her collection of minerals and rocks and Mrs. Mildred Chamberlain who donated her collection of sea shells to the Library. Mrs. Chamberlain's interest goes back for a number of years. Her niece, the late Sylvia Fletcher, was a long time Librarian here in Hinsdale and certainly in the memory of Hinsdale residents one of the best in the long history of our organization.

In 1982 a number of hardback and paperback books were donated to the library by local citizens and the Trustees and the Librarian are thankful for this important addition to our collection.

From March to May I took a course in Children's Library activities under the auspices of the New Hampshire State Library, and I have completed five courses in Library Techniques since 1980.

From July 6 to August 24, on Tuesday afternoons from 1 to 5 p.m. Mrs. Betty Glover conducted the Summer Reading Program for children in the first to sixth grades and there were three pre-schoolers as well.

A few less children participated than in the summer of 1981, but
