# TOWN OF CROYDON TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF CROYDON, County of Sullivan, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Croydon Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March next, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon, (polls not to close earlier than 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon), to act upon Article One; and to meet at the said Hall on Saturday the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March next at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon remaining warrant articles.

- Article 1. To choose one Selectmen for three years, one Treasurer for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds and Cemeteries for three years, and all such offices and agents that may be necessary for the transaction of the Town business for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$294,235.00 for general town operations:

- Article 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Nineteen Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy Dollars (\$19,870) for the Croydon Police Department. (Recommended by the Selectboard)
- Article 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for the Capital Reserve Fund for Highway Department Equipment. (Recommended by the Selectboard)
- Article 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty Three Thousand Dollars (\$33,000), to apply chip seal to Pine Hill, Brighton Road, and Sugar River Lane. The funds to support this article to come from the Highway Block Grant money.

  (Recommended by the Selectboard)
- Article 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the care and maintenance of the Town's Cemeteries for the year 2005. The funds to support this article are to be removed from interest earned in the Henry J. Sawyer Memorial Fund-Cemetery. (Recommended by the Selectboard)
- Article 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Revaluation. (Recommended by the Selectboard)
- Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$9,350) for the testing of the monitoring wells at the transfer station.

  (Recommended by the Selectboard)
- Article 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000) for stone cleaning, stone repair, wall capping/repair, uncovering covered markers and stones. The funds to support this article are to be removed from interest earned in the Henry J. Sawyer Memorial Fund-Cemetery and Cemetery Care Funds.

  (Recommended by the Selectboard)

Article 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred and Three Thousand Two Hundred and Sixty Four Dollars (\$103,264) to purchase a new Freightliner M2106V Cab and Chassis with an Everest plow package and a Swenson 10' body with front and rear sander, and to authorize the withdrawal of (\$43,000) from the Capital Reserve Fund Highway Equipment. The balance of (\$60,264) is to come from interest earned from the Henry J. Sawyer Memorial Fund.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to change the organization of the Croydon Volunteer Fire Department in accordance with the form prescribed by RSA 164: 1, I(a), with a Fire Chief to be appointed by the Selectboard, and with the firefighters to be appointed by the Fire Chief.

This would change the way the Fire Chief is chosen as established at the 1995 Town Meeting (Article 16). There, the Town voted to establish the Croydon Volunteer Fire Department as the Town's official municipal fire Department, to approve the election of its officers (including the Chief) by the Fire Department membership and to authorize the appointment of its members by the duly elected Chief.

In accordance with State law (RSA 154: 1, IV), any change in the organization of the Croydon Volunteer Fire Department from one to another which is approved by the Town at its annual meeting shall not take effect until one (1) year following such vote.

# TRUSTEE'S OF TRUST FUNDS AND CEMETERIES 2004 Annual Town Report Letter

Several improvements occurred throughout the year at the cemeteries:

Post and gates were purchased and installed at the Croydon Flat, East Village, Four Corners and Putnam Cemeteries. "Please Keep Gates Closed" signs for the gates were purchased and installed.

Materials were purchased for signs designating each cemetery. Construction/painting and installation of the sign posts were installed by Albert Smith, along with volunteers; Jan & Steve Michel and their guest.

Both Croydon Flat and East Village Cemetery stones were cleaned and repaired. We'd like to thank the Croydon Volunteer Fire Department volunteering the time and effort in providing 3,000 gallons of water to reduce costs in cleaning at the Flat Cemetery.

Albert Smith was very busy this year in assisting with the gates, signs, posts, stone cleaning and a variety of organizations (DAR, Veteran's Administration), providing information and documentation requested.

Forms were provided for application by a descendant in Renton, Washington of Jonah Stow-a Revolutionary War Soldier, buried in "Under the Mountain Cemetery" in Croydon Park. A stone was provided free of charge by the Veterans Administration in Washington, DC. Stringer Funeral Homes, Inc. of Claremont, installed the stone free of charge, to show their appreciation for assistance Albert Smith provided them throughout the year.

Albert also researched records at the Sullivan County Registry of Deeds to outline Corbin Park's requirement to maintain the cemetery fence and gate located within the park itself. The Park will install a new galvanized fence and gate as the existing fence/posts and gates were in very poor condition.

Richard "Dick" Gross, who for so many years took the utmost professional care of the cemeteries, informed us he could no longer maintain the cemeteries for the Town. We'd like to thank Dick for all of his years of hard work and service. Beautification and maintenance were always done to perfection under his care and much appreciated. This left us with a new challenge and was top priority for the Trustee Members. The maintenance for 2004 was contracted out. The Trustees have voted to contract out for the maintenance services once again for the upcoming 2005 season, and will be creating a precise, legal contract outlining our highest expectations for the upcoming year.

The Rules and Regulations have also been updated to reflect an increase in the grave preparation fee and a November 1<sup>st</sup> timeline to have floral pots and/or seasonal decorations removed.

Next year we will continue with the stone cleaning. There is also a need to uncover several stones and markers that over the years have almost disappeared. Some cemetery walls need maintenance including capping.

There were seven interments in Croydon's Cemeteries during 2004:

4-Croydon Flat

2-East Village

1-Putnam

There were 4 plots sold in 2004, all at the Putnam Cemetery.

The meetings are always open to the public and the Trustees encourage anyone with interest to attend.

## (Established since 1968) Amended 2004

General Rules and Regulations of Croydon Cemeteries

Definition of terms: (Which themselves are part of the rules and regulations)

- 1. "Cemetery" shall mean Town Cemeteries, singly or jointly.
- 2. "Committee" shall mean the current elected trustees of cemeteries, and shall administer rules and regulations of the cemeteries.
- 3. The term "lot", "plot", "burial place" shall be used interchangeably, and shall apply with like effect to one or more than one adjoining graves.
- 4. The term "interment" shall mean the permanent disposition of the remains of a deceased person by cremation and interment, entombment or burial.
- 5. The terms "memorial", "grave marker", "headstone" or "monument" shall refer to same and is governed by the lot size on which it is to be placed.
- I.) In addition to the \$100 fee for a full size burial lot, a fee of \$100 for lettered comer stones will be required for any plot purchased that immediate interment will not be taking place or in any plot that is deemed necessary on a per case basis, totaling \$200 due upon purchase of lot. In the case of a single cremation, (2'X 2' lot at \$25) additional corner pins will be required at an additional fee of \$25.00 totaling \$50.00. A headstone will be allowed, but comer stones/pins will still be required. Receipts from these fees will be placed in the Croydon Cemeteries Fund to offset general cemetery expenses as permitted by the committee.
- II.) Cemetery lots will be sold to "residents" who meet the residency requirement of which the individual/family is currently residing in Croydon for not less than six consecutive months or within six months of moving out of Croydon.
- III.) Transfer/sale of lot ownership to non-relative not allowed. Transfer allowed only with approval of committee and proper deed replaced. A lot not used by an individual/family must revert back to town and cost of lot will be refunded. A lot not used within 100 years of purchase shall revert back to town at no refund. For clarification, deeds are prepared by the cemetery trustees for the governing body to sign, upon receipt of payment and conformity to rules and regulations.
- IV.) Every earth interment shall be enclosed in a suitable sized outer container of stone, brick or concrete (caskets and ums placed in), fitting the lot size purchased. The structural design, size and installation of which shall meet the specifications of the committee.
- V.) A guaranteed rate of \$400 for grave preparation of a full sized single interment, \$75.00 for a single cremation, the town to pay the balance not covered from other sources.
- VI.) Of the seven (7) town maintained cemeteries, sale of lots will only be allowed in the remaining lots in the Village Cemetery, and the Croydon Flat Cemetery.
- VII.) A "resident" family may purchase up to four (4) individual lots, for (4) interments. An individual lot size will be determined at purchase One (I) full casket interment per lot or up to four (4) cremation interments. (This would mean a family may purchase 4 lots of full casket size, or 4 of individual cremation size.) A section of the Croydon Flat Cemetery is reserved for cremations only, but are permitted in others lots as well. Any grave marker that fits within the lot size (4' X II') in the "new" section of the Croydon Flat Cemetery are allowed. Raised graves are not allowed in all cemeteries. Interment, installation of markers, and foundations are per specifications and approval of the committee.
- VIII.) Special cases may arise in which the literal enforcement of a rule may impose unnecessary hardship. The town therefore, reserves the right, without notice, to make exceptions, suspensions or modifications in any of these Rules and Regulations when, in its judgment, the same appears advisable; and such temporary exception, suspension or modification shall in no way be construed as affecting the general application of such rule.
- IX.) A deadline of November 1st, annually, all gravesites that have temporary floral pots or other seasonal decoration will require removal by owner, or cemetery maintenance personnel will remove and dispose of after this date.

These rules will not affect any lots that have already been established or markes thereon, and replaces all rules and regulations on prior record.

#### CROYDON POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2005

This year, as last, was very busy for the Croydon Police Department.

Court appearances have been consistent. I still have maintained a 100 % conviction rate.

Using grant moneys, I purchased a dash mounted camera for the cruiser. This has been used for every motor vehicle stop. I have not had to use any of the recordings, as of yet, in court. Also purchased was computer software that is to be utilized for crime scene diagrams, accident scene diagrams and for crimes of violence against persons. Anyone wishing to see how these systems work please let me know and I would be happy to demonstrate them to you. I obtained bicycle helmets and have offered them on a "must show a need basis" as required by the grant, however, only five have been requested by citizens and delivered. I would encourage anyone who needs one of these helmets for a child or grandchild residing in Croydon, to complete the paperwork in the Town Clerk's office and you can receive one of these helmets at no cost to you.

Also located in the Town Clerk's office are gun locks that are free for the taking. I have many more of these left. They are available if you want one.

The radar speed enforcement grant was not used in 2004, but had to be continued to 2005. This grant provides for 60 hours of radar patrol over a four month period at no cost to the town.

As you all know, I had a mishap with the old cruiser, resulting in the cruiser having to be replaced. 95 % of the equipment was not damaged, not including my pride, and was transferred to the new cruiser. A new color scheme was implemented and has received a very favorable response from citizens of Croydon and other communities as well as the law enforcement community at large. The drawback to this mishap was that the procedure for obtaining and equipping the cruiser took almost four months. Please feel free to contact me to view the cruiser.

My budget, again was under spent, in fairness, due to the lack of a cruiser for four months.

The calls for service rendered during 2004 were down from 2003, there being a clear reduction in motor vehicle stops, again due to the lack of a cruiser. Find below the calls for 2004 as compared to 2003.

I must say that every individual who had a complaint made about them was gracious and helpful at my inspection. All either cordially resolved the problem or no real problem was found. I am always happy to check out a resident's concerns in any case.

I did not use the money allocated by the residents for education. Nothing of sufficient quality that was affordable was available and that offered by the State of New Hampshire was extra good this year.

I have done 2 or 3 email alerts for important events for those residents that have supplied me with their email addresses. If you would like to be included on this alert list, please provide me your email address.

At present the spring on Route 10 north of the town hall is closed. Repeated testing showed consistent contamination. Cleaning and disinfecting the small spring house was not helpful. The springhouse has loose-stack rock walls and a dirt floor. An engineer, resident Chris Carucci, volunteered time to check out rebuilding the whole system (thanks Chris). Cost estimates came out high enough that the Selectmen felt the benefits did not justify the cost. Especially as I could not guarantee the contamination would be eliminated, if it came from a source uphill.

I wanted to thank the Selectmen for their help this year and also Nelson Palmer, our Transfer Station Attendant, who has kept the transfer station neat and has been fastidious about keeping hazardous materials out of our system.

We also have a Disaster Relief Fund through which we helped a number of families.

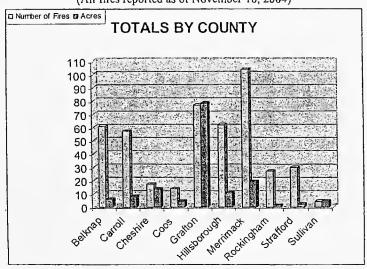

#### Report of Forest Fire Warden and State Forest Ranger

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests & Lands cooperate to reduce the risk of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. A fire permit is required for all outside burning unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Citizens are encouraged to contact the local fire department or DES at 1-800-498-6868 or <a href="https://www.des.state.nh.us">www.des.state.nh.us</a> for more information. Safe open burning requires diligence and responsibility. Help us to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. For more information contact the Division of Forests & Lands (603) 271-2217, or online at <a href="https://www.nhdfl.org">www.nhdfl.org</a>.

This last year was fairly wet throughout the spring and summer months, however we finished the season with an active fall fire season. In order to meet an increased demand for services, the Forest Protection Bureau was reorganized into three regions with smaller Forest Ranger Districts and over the last several years we have added two Forest Rangers. The fifteen state fire towers were the first to report on many fires throughout the state and they completed many other projects on the low fire danger days. The state implemented a program called Tower Quest to help citizens learn about fire towers and the need to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. The United States celebrated Smokey Bear's 60th birthday in 2004, and celebrations were held throughout the state. Please help Smokey Bear, your local fire department and the state's Forest Rangers by being fire smart and fire safe!

Over the course of this year, a great deal of activity has taken place. The following is offered so that you will have an understanding as to the amount of trash that we generate compared to our neighbors. The following is a brief example of surrounding towns comparative to Croydon and the amount of trash that has been generated in tons:

Without a doubt, Croydon's strong support of our recycling and sticker program was the primary reason for this gradual reduction in total tonnage in the past couple of years. For each ton of recycles; bottles, cans, plastic, cardboard, etc., that is kept out of our household trash saves <u>you</u>, the taxpayer, approximately \$90 a ton ...to burn, and that's not counting transport, which is an additional expenditure. You also need to be aware that your efforts in recycling in general have a very positive affect on the overall cost of trash disposal in our community and that it helps to reduce our town operating budget. Further, with the exception of highway expenses, the transfer station is the second largest expenditure for the town, dwarfing both the Town Officer's salaries and expenses combined.

Not all of Croydon's residents recycle however, and that's a shame. It not only increases taxes for that particular household, but for all residents as well - who are conscientious enough to reduce costs by recycling.

With this years installation of a compactor, it has further reduced costs for hauling. We can now compact twice the amount of household waste into each container before being hauled away, thereby reducing hauling fees further.

However, Croydon's present contract that is the NH/VT SWP expires on July 15, 2007, and will more than likely not be renewed at that time. The reason for this is that the VT communities, along with many NH communities, have indicated that they will more than likely withdraw from membership in the Project. The result of this will be that we will need to reassess how we wish to dispose of our trash with cost being the major concern between now and 2007.

What is the NH/VT Solid Waste Project (SWP)? It is comprised of the 15 towns within Sullivan County (NH) and the 14 towns within Windsor County (VT); 29 towns, who, in 1987, signed a 20 year contract with Wheelabrator of Claremont to dispose of their household trash. Therefore, not only does each town pay for disposal of their trash, but hauling fees as well.

### Lake Sunapee Region Visiting Nurse Association

As a health service organization, a primary responsibility of Lake Sunapee Region Visiting Nurse Association and affiliates is responding to changing community needs for home health and hospice care. We must continually "re-invent" ourselves in response to changes in regulations, provider reimbursement and best clinical practice standards so we can bring you value for your dollar as a member town of Lake Sunapee Region Visiting Nurse Association.

This year has been a memorable one for Lake Sunapee Region VNA in so many ways that we are referring to it as a "renaissance", a rebirth. Over the past several years we adapted to changes in Medicare reimbursement, inadequate Medicaid reimbursement, changes in clinical practice, shortages of nursing personnel, three-fold increases in insurance costs and increased technology demands. With 80% of our costs related to salaries and benefits it became essential to look for ways to reduce overhead. One way to control costs was to invest in our own building.

This spring, guided by the Board of Trustees and with a great deal of support from the greater community, we were able to purchase a building. Our new office, The Halsey Building, will meet our needs for many years and will help ensure the availability of exceptional home health and hospice services in our community. Necessary building renovations were supported by generous gifts from individuals who believe in the mission of Lake Sunapee Region VNA.

Recently, Friends of the VNA opened *The Renaissance Shoppe* in the lower level of our building at 107 Newport Road in New London. These volunteers created the shop to raise funds and to raise awareness of Lake Sunapee Region VNA. Quality furniture, estate pieces, glassware, china, jewelry and more generously donated by people in our area who may be moving or downsizing will be sold with all proceeds to benefit the VNA. Donors will, of course, receive documentation for tax purposes.

Support from the town of Croydon makes a difference in the lives of your friends and



neighbors for whom Lake Sunapee Region VNA provides care. The number of individuals and families who are uninsured or underinsured is rising. Currently, Medicaid reimburses at about 55-60% of what it costs to provide care. There has been no adjustment in Medicaid rates since 1999. Looking to the future, we expect Medicare reimbursement to decrease as the Federal Government tries to ensure solvency of the Medicare program and a continued problem with Medicaid funding due to State budget challenges.

Your town appropriation dollars help us to provide <u>medically necessary</u> care to residents of Croydon. Town support also helps cover costs of things like medications and equipment for hospice patients; care for newborns and children, bereavement support for families of hospice patients for the year following the death of a loved one and bereavement support groups for adults and for children in our local schools. We are grateful for this support because it helps bridge the gap between reimbursement and our

costs. Town support and our other fund-raising efforts allow us to continue our mission to keep people healthy and independent at home for as long as that is feasible.

Lake Sunapee Region VNA also offers many services either at no charge or with some subsidy from insurance plans to residents of the town including:

- ♦ Parent Child Program
- ♦ Well Child Clinics
- ♦ Hospice Volunteer Training
- Blood pressure and other screenings
- ♦ Home Telemonitoring to prevent unplanned hospitalizations and help patients learn self care
- Administration of the Lifeline program
- Storage space and distribution for the Kearsarge Area Food Pantry
- Speaker's Bureau for local organizations and churches
- ♦ Health Fairs
- ♦ Kearsarge Community Christmas project
- ♦ Educational programs on chronic illness and advance care planning
- File of Life and emergency information for each patient admitted to service
- ♦ Caregiver Support Groups

This year more than 61 residents of Croydon used one or more of the services offered by Lake Sunapee Region VNA. Services included 376 home care visits and 102 hospice visits for adults and children, 452 hours in long-term care services, and over 61 immunizations. In addition, 2 residents used our Lifeline program, 5 residents used our home telemonitoring program and 5 residents attended our support programs including parent child program, caregiver support and bereavement support.

The Board of Trustees, the staff and our volunteers join me in expressing our appreciation for your support and your confidence in the work of Lake Sunapee Region VNA. We welcome the opportunity to bring care and services to residents of the town of Croydon.

Sullivan County Hospice has been in existence since 1984. We are a volunteer agency, governed by a 12 member Board of Directors, all of whom reside in Sullivan County.

Our mission is to provide practical and emotional support to terminally ill patients and their families within Sullivan County. The majority of the individuals we serve are home hospice patients, who have decided to remain at home under the care of their families. It is in this setting that we provide most of our services. However, we have the flexibility to follow and serve our patients and their families in a hospital or nursing home setting, as well. Our volunteers are fully trained in areas such as death and dying, the grieving process, active listening and universal precautions. A few of the ways our volunteers provide practical support include respite for caregivers, running errands and light meal preparation. Our volunteers also provide emotional support to both the patient and their family, by being available to listen and offer reassurance and encouragement.

Our referrals come from doctors, nurses, visiting nurse associations, discharge planners, as well as from family members or patients themselves. Our only requirements for service are that the patient be terminally ill and that they reside in Sullivan County. We accept all referrals on that basis and there is never a charge for our service.

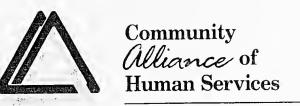

To the Board of Selectmen:

The Children and Youth Services Department of the Community Alliance of Human Services continues to promote prevention and education for the youth and families of Sullivan County.

As part of our programming, we have served Croydon youth through our Sullivan County Youth Court Diversion Program. The Diversion Program allows youth to learn from their offense through the use of a contract. Contracts consist of community service hours, letters of apology, research papers, tours of the Sullivan County Correctional Facility, participation in teen groups, and referrals to outside resources. We have served many youth and families within Sullivan County. County officials have reported an estimated savings of \$2,500 per youth when the youth participates in our diversion program in lieu of being processed through the court system.

We also are continuing to work with the local police departments, including the department in Croydon, on a diversion phase two program. That program would be geared towards more serious offenses and would require youth to have at least some of the following requirements on their contracts; an evaluation through the counseling center; counseling services; community service hours; curfews; drug screenings; and/or reports from the schools as to how the youth is doing.

Our Community Service Program continues to provide sites throughout Sullivan County where the youth is allowed to complete community service hours that are either court ordered or mandated on the youth's diversion contract. We have served youth and families within Sullivan County through this program for several years.

The Child Health Support Program is one of our newest programs. This program works with families on communication skills, parenting strategies, budgeting skills, disciplinary techniques, as well as offering assistance with child development questions they may have. Working in collaboration with other local agencies, Child Health Support Aides work with families to develop and maintain family support systems and enhances and encourages parental coping and nurturing skills. The NH Division of Children, Youth, and Families, schools, police departments, courts, and community agencies refer families to the program. This service is also available to Croydon families.

Our Tobacco Options Program allows agencies to refer youth to complete community service hours or to participate in the Tobacco Program. The Tobacco Program allows the youth to view videos and to participate within a tobacco curriculum and discussion. The youth may also receive both the community service hours and the tobacco program combined.

We continue to offer information and assistance through our Resource Center. The Center is available to the public and offers a variety of materials from parenting to tobacco education. There is a television and VCR available, allowing materials to be viewed at the Center or they may be signed out and taken home.

We welcome new initiatives and look forward to continuing to serve the youth and families from the Town of Croydon. At this time the Children and Youth Services Program respectfully requests \$1,000.00 from the Town of Croydon.

West Central Behavioral Health requests an appropriation of \$675 from the Town of Croydon that will enable us to continue offering free or low cost services to residents of the community who are uninsured or underinsured. In FY 2004, West Central Behavioral Health provided residents of Croydon with \$7,538 of free or reduced cost mental and behavioral health services for which we received no reimbursement. We are committed to making quality mental health services available regardless of ability to pay to all communities in our service area, and are asking the cities and towns we serve to help us sustain that commitment to many of our most vulnerable neighbors.

West Central Behavioral Health is the NH designated Community Mental Health Center for Croydon, as well as Sullivan and Southern Grafton Counties. Our mission is: "to promote, preserve, and strengthen the mental health and quality of life for individuals and their communities through the delivery of integrated, comprehensive services." Our consumers suffer from a range of disorders and illnesses: life threatening severe, chronic mental illness such as psychosis, schizophrenia, and bipolar disorder; all forms of addiction; as well as anxiety, depression, divorce or relationship related stress, and other impairing, but highly treatable, conditions. We work with all ages in outpatient clinics, homes, jails, nursing homes, schools, and residential supported living programs, offering a broad variety of counseling, psychiatric services, case management, and emergency consultations.

Some of the services provided to residents of Croydon this year include:

- 11 Children and their families received 130 therapy sessions at our outpatient clinics in Claremont, Newport, and Lebanon.
- 24 Adult residents received 117 sessions of outpatient counseling for depression, anxiety, addictions, family issues, and other critical issues.
- 8 Residents contacted our Emergency Services, available 24 hours, 7 days a week.
- 9 Residents received 406 sessions of other services such as case management, and vocational assistance.

We hope you will help us provide quality mental health care to all who need it.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens of Croydon:

As School Administrative Unit 43 Superintendent, I am proud to share the responsibilities of leading the Croydon School District with dedicated School Board Members. Croydon is unique – it combines education for our young people in a historic, one-room schoolhouse with modern educational techniques. Teaming with community members to enhance the school facilities and the learning of our students is common. This is unique!

Year after year, the Croydon Village School graduates students who are at or above the standards for their grade level. When students enter the fourth grade at Towle School in Newport and beyond, they frequently excel. The past year's State standardized test results were even better than usual as Croydon students exceeded all expectations.

The school principal (provided by the SAU), the classroom teachers, paraeducator and a child's parents/guardians, in consultation with the SAU director of special education, and specialized consultants create a team to evaluate a student's needs and decide on appropriate services to ensure that each student is successful. Special education services are provided to each student that needs additional support for physical, emotional, or academic special needs. Everyone works together for the good of the student.

The three-day kindergarten and Croydon's grades 1-3 teachers work consistently to stay abreast of the latest educational methods. The future looks even brighter for Croydon students! This year, Mrs. Touchette was one of several educators who participated in SAU 43's grant-funded literacy training programs. The school will also benefit from grants such as the Title I Federal grant for reading.

The Croydon Village School accomplishes this while remaining a part of the community. This is made abundantly clear on occasions such as two years ago when town residents teamed up to build the new playground, and every year when the school holds its holiday program. Occasions such as these show that the village school truly is *your* school.

### **Croydon School Board Report**

Everything stays the same, everything is different - opposites that are always present in the forward motion of our school and community. Sometimes we like to think that nothing has changed in our 200+ years and that there is little reason for it to change now. After all doesn't our beautiful red school still provide the strength and education we have always sought from it? Little changes from year to year with the financial dilemma of higher costs, diminishing access to funding, and the demands upon us of education within Croydon. In constant and sometimes barely noticeable proportions, the demographics of our community are ever changing. Often the first recognition of change becomes evident through events such as our School Meeting where visual connection is created through financial demand.

2005 will be no different. The special needs within our community are making a shift and our pre-school through K-3 population will need services and support not previously in place. Our school is aging and despite efforts earlier in the year by your school board to put in place a 5-year plan to address maintenance concerns, pieces of our school could wait no longer. Beginning in late spring the locks barely hanging in our old doors could no longer be repaired nor could the doors that supported them. In early fall, inside water leaks brought to light the urgency for repairs to both bathrooms. As winter gently settled in, so did our septic system, with the baffles collapsing and further use of our leach field no longer possible. Ushering us into the new year, frozen and split pipes in the crawl space and the discovery of an underground leak have continued to prove a challenge.

This year will also mark the retirement of Dr. Marilyn Brannigan, SAU #43 Associate Superintendent and our Principal for Croydon K through 3. Marilyn has served Croydon for six years. Marilyn has continued to identify funding sources for our school and the needs of our students and teachers. She has faced our challenges with us and continued to find solutions that allowed us to provide the kind of educational excellence that we demand for our children. Marilyn's strength of character and demand for excellence will be greatly missed.

On a very positive note, with all the challenges and change we constantly face, there is still excitement and satisfaction to be found. We are successfully answering the demands places upon us. Croydon is providing its children with a well rounded, solid and lasting education and handing them the keys to lifelong success. Our children are making a very smooth transition into our neighboring school system and continuing their academic achievements through their school years.

And in keeping with the character of our town, volunteers have continued to give of themselves in every way possible. We have a very committed network

of parents, the Croydon PTO has continued to raise monies in support of our school, we enjoyed another fantastic turnout for clean-up day, and the contributions of other groups and individuals continues to remain incredibly strong. Your continued support and gifts are greatly appreciated. Thank you.

In closing this year, we would like to share a short story with you regarding our children. Discussions had ensued on several occasions where parents and others have commented as to the commitment of our children to each other. If one child is having a bad day or is the target of some friendly joshing, the others will rally in support of their schoolmate. At birthday parties, the children will hold hands and begin cheering and shouting words of encouragement as each takes a turn at the piñata. In the classroom, work on the chalkboard provides another opportunity for words of encouragement accompanied by the clapping of hands. This type of behavior is present in story after story. As our third graders moved to Towle school this year, a teacher commented in a meeting that as a student approached the board, a word of encouragement came from a fellow classmate followed by applause which soon encompassed the whole class – she had not experienced this before. Having experienced this many times, there was no doubt in our mind where this originated.....CROYDON!

Again, a very special word of thanks to all those who extended their time, knowledge, and support to the school and board members. Thank you for your support.

### **ARTICLE 2**

To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$942,376) for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for the school district officials and agents, and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district. This article does not include appropriations voted in other warrant articles. Amended article to read: To see if the School District will raise and appropriate the sum of (\$941,376) for the Support of schools, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district. This article does not include appropriations voted in other warrant articles. Passed as amended.

### **ARTICLE 3**

To see if the school District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund B Special Education. Passed as written.

### **ARTICLE 4**

To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund B Transportation. Passed as written.

### **ARTICLE 5**

To see if the School District will raise and appropriate three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to finish the playground area behind the school. Passed as written.

### **ARTICLE 6**

To see if the school district will raise and appropriate from the undesignated fund balance, (surplus) as of June 30, 2004, if available, an amount not to exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to be placed into capital reserve funds known as School Capital Reserve Fund-Special Education and an amount not to exceed \$5,000 into the capital reserve fund known as Capital Reserve Fund-Transportation. Passed as written.

### ARTICLE 7

Shall the school district accept the provisions of RSA 198-20-b providing that any school district at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the school board to apply for accept and expend, without further action by the school district, unanticipated money from a state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the fiscal year? Passed as written.

### **ARTICLE 8**

To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
