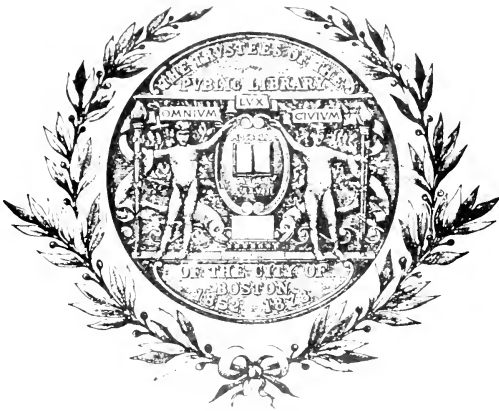

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.*

In conformity with the requirements of the laws of the Commonwealth, I have the honor to submit herewith the Annual Report concerning the BIRTHS, MARRIAGES and DEATHS occurring in Massachusetts, and returned according to law from the several cities and towns, during the year 1869, being the Twenty-Eighth Registration year.

The work has been as heretofore under the editorial care of Dr. GEORGE DERBY, Secretary of the State Board of Health. His editorial remarks and observations, constituting the first portion of the present Report, evince labor and research, and will doubtless be found valuable.

The compilation of the National Census of 1870 not being completed, the discussion of certain subjects related thereto, which would otherwise have received attention in these pages, has been necessarily deferred to another year.

Commendable accuracy and punctuality have been manifested by the town and city clerks in the preparation and transmission of the registration returns of the year, and correction of any defects which have been discovered has been readily secured by correspondence with the proper parties.

The preparation of the tables in the present Report has been entrusted to competent and practised hands, and may be confidently relied upon for its fidelity and accuracy.

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# TWENTY-EIGHTH REGISTRATION REPORT.

(1869.)

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The results of registration expressed in figures, and representing the grand total of births, marriages and deaths which have occurred in all the cities and towns of Massachusetts during the year, are given in the first table of this Report.

They show that the town clerks and registrars of the State have made records of seventy-seven thousand and twenty-one births, marriages and deaths, and transmitted them for safe keeping to the secretary of State.

Comparing the numbers in each of these divisions with the previous year, we find that

The births have decreased by . . . . .	52
The marriages have increased by . . . . .	970
The deaths have increased by . . . . .	451

The natural increase of population, or excess of births over deaths, amounts to 10,087, which is 503 less than last year.

The natural increase each day is 27.6 persons.

On the basis of the State Census of 1865, one living child was born to every 35.06 persons, one person in every 42.73 was married, and one person in every 48.63 died.

The *birth, marriage and death rates* for 1869 may be represented in two ways. 1st, by the State Census of 1865 as a basis of calculation; and this mode has necessarily been used in each previous

year since 1865. 2d, by a close approximation to the actual population of 1869, which we are enabled to reach through the United States Census of 1870, not yet published in official form, but which has been made known by the government authorities.

*Special Note to the preceding Table.*—The rates of both births and deaths for each year since 1865 have been corrected in accordance with the general results of the Census of 1870 which are already made known, and therefore do not correspond with the rates given in previous reports, which were necessarily based on the State Census of 1865.

## P O P U L A T I O N .

The present year, preceding that in which the decennial United States Census is taken, finds the editor of the Registration Report somewhat awkwardly placed between two bases of population. The Census of 1865, complete in all its details and published in official form, is the basis upon which all the tables prepared at the office of the secretary of the Commonwealth are founded.

On the other hand, the more general results of the United States Census of 1870 are already known, and we have been furnished with some details by the officer under whose charge it has been taken, which cannot properly be ignored in our pursuit of useful inferences from the figures of registration.

The United States marshal reports to us (November, 1870) that the Census of June, 1870, furnishes the following numbers as the population of the several counties. The final adding up at Washington may give slightly different results when published by the general government, but these may be taken as close approximations to the fact.

Our present purpose is to ascertain the population of Massachusetts in 1869, and this may be made out with a near approach to

accuracy, since we know the actual increase between 1865 and 1870, by computing the yearly increase after the manner of reckoning compound interest.

The yearly increase is thus found to be 2·848 per cent., and the population for each year is as follows:—

This mode of estimating the population for 1869 will be found useful in all inquiries concerning rates of births, marriages and deaths for the whole State, and the increase of population has been so considerable that we should not be justified in declining to avail ourselves of it.

The annual increase of population since 1865 being at the rate of 2·848 per cent., or 28·48 per thousand, and the natural increase, or excess of births over deaths, being in these four years ·80, ·92, ·77 and ·71, or an annual average of ·80 of one per cent., we have remaining an annual increase of 2 per cent., which may be taken to represent the growth by immigration, or the net gain between emigration and immigration.

This is the only way we have of estimating this difference, and indeed it is a very satisfactory way.

It is utterly vain to endeavour to reach, by actual count of the arrivals from foreign countries, the number of foreigners who every year settle among us. They come by sea, and many thus arriving make their way to the far West. They come by land from the British Possessions, and there is no one to count them. The attempt to estimate the numbers of our people who go to settle in other States or countries is still more impossible. We know that our farming towns are thus constantly drained of their most active and enterprising young people, but their numbers no one can tell. Whatever the loss may be, it is made up *numerically* by arrivals from other countries, and from other parts of our own country since 1865, and with a net gain of two per cent. in each year in favor of immigration.

The *Birth-rate* for 1869 (*assuming the population to be 1,417,654*) is 2·55 for each hundred persons, or 25·5 for each thousand. Including stillborn, a child was born to every thirty-eight persons.

The whole number of births (including stillborn) is almost exactly the same as in the previous year, the difference being only eight.

The sudden falling off in the Birth-rate which occurred in 1862, the beginning of the war, has never been recovered from, nor can it reasonably be expected for many years to come. But for the loss of male adults in 1862, and the three succeeding years, the births in Massachusetts would now be more than forty thousand

annually, judging from the rate of increase which prevailed between 1850 and 1860.

The Census of 1870 will show a disparity between the sexes at marriageable ages, which will make this apparent.

The preponderance of births in the last half of the year is very marked. As explained in the report of 1868, it is due not to any physiological cause of general operation, but rather to the enforced



separation of husbands and wives at certain seasons, when men leave their homes to pursue their occupations, as seamen, fishermen, laborers, &c.

The Foreign births exceed the American births in 1869 by 2,129, which is an increase of 504 since 1868. Foreign births are in the majority in Suffolk, Middlesex, Worcester, Hampden and Norfolk counties. American births preponderate in all the other counties, but their population is so much less (with the exception of Essex), that they cannot turn the scale against the great centres of manufacturing industry, where, for the most part, our foreign citizens are congregated.

Comparing 1869 with 1868, we find that the American births have diminished by 270; the foreign births have increased by 234; and the mixed births (one parent foreign) have increased by 223.

From the above, it appears that since 1864 the proportion of Foreign births remains but slightly changed; the American births have declined, and the mixed births have in the same, or very nearly the same proportion, increased.

The interpretation of the preceding table is to be found in the fact that the young people of our agricultural districts go to other States in great numbers, while the manufacturing towns are recruited by immigrants from Ireland, Germany, Canada and England. Our population is in this way undergoing a great change of character, the effects of which must be in many ways perceptible in the future.

The original stock which peopled Massachusetts in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, and which remained undisturbed till about 1820–1830, has been to a very considerable extent displaced by immigrants of the most needy class, who have poured in upon us from the old world, and from the British Provinces. They have found employment in our factories, which are always needing fresh supplies of laborers. They have prospered, and have brought prosperity to their employers.

The English stock of the Massachusetts of 1800–1820 is as strong as ever, and spreading itself over the whole western country, but in this State it is, in spite of the very considerable English immigration of the past ten years, likely to be at no very distant day outnumbered by the Irish, the Germans and the French Canadians.

It is not to be supposed that the number of children born to this class represents their effective strength. This is very far from being the case. The mortality among their children is greatly in excess of the mortality among American families, and there is also much reason to believe that the length of life among the parents is far less than among the natives of Massachusetts. This, however, belongs to another division of this Report.

*Plural Births.*—Three hundred and forty-five women in Massachusetts gave birth in 1869 to 696 children. Three hundred and thirty-nine had twins and six had triplets. The proportion of women in labor who give birth to more than one child is each year very nearly the same—one in every hundred. The number of triplets is precisely the same as in the previous year.

*Illegitimates.*—The number reported (undoubtedly somewhat less than the fact) was 286; 130 males and 156 females. As

usual, the latter predominate, although for what reason we are quite unable to imagine. Of the whole number 58 occurred in the State Almshouses, and 71 in the City of Boston.

*Stillborn.*—The number reported was 1,094, or 44 more than in 1868.



## MARRIAGES.

The whole number reported for 1869 was 14,826, an increase of 970 over the previous year.

The next table gives some remarkable facts with regard to certain marriages.





It is a matter of no little interest to notice the disparity of ages between the parties uniting in marriage. The preceding table gives but a small portion of such, and those who have the curiosity to look into such matters, will be amply repaid by referring to the proper tables. The following may be mentioned as among the most remarkable marriages for the last year. One man of 32 was married, for the sixth time, to a maiden of 30; also, another man, for the sixth time, to a widow of 62; it being her second marriage. The ages of the oldest parties married for the first time were, the male and female 60 each. The greatest disparity in the first marriage, was the male 67 and the female 20. The youngest male was 16 to a female of the same age. There were married during the year seven maidens at the age of 14, and forty-one at the age of 15. Forty-five males were married during the year who were over 70, and one widower of 80 was united for the second time to a widow of 54, it being also her second marriage, while but five females over 70 are reported as having married during the year, the oldest being 78, who was married for the first time. A widower of 30 was married for the second time to a young widow of 20, it being her *fourth* marriage! But one marriage is reported where both parties were married for the fourth time each, their ages being 73 and 62. There was also one marriage, the male being 73, his fourth marriage, to a widow of 57, her third marriage. One male of 29 was united to a widow of 30, it being his first marriage and her fourth. A widower of 56 was united to a widow of 52, it being her fifth marriage. The sixth marriage of a male is reported at the age of 32 to a spinster of 30. A second marriage of a man of 56 is reported to a female of 52, it being her fifth venture.

The uniformity of these percentages during ten years, in spite of immigration and emigration, is a fact worthy of notice. It seems to us a better index of the relative force of the (so-called) American and Foreign elements in our population than can be obtained through either the birth or death reports. It represents the age of early maturity, after all the losses which have occurred by death in the period of infancy have been subtracted—which losses are known to be exceedingly great in the families of those of foreign birth. It also certainly includes among Americans a great number of the American-born children of foreigners. The attempt to separate this class from the English stock of the last century is yearly becoming more difficult, and will soon be impossible.

## D E A T H S .

The whole number reported as occurring in Massachusetts in 1869 was 26,054. This is 451 more than in 1868.

The death-rate for the past five years is given in the following table; the population being computed from the numbers returned by the State Census of 1865, and the U. S. Census of 1870, as explained in our remarks under "Population."

It would be likely to mislead. Next year, with the Census of 1870, it can be made with accuracy.

A comparison of the preceding table, with the record of 1868, shows that the deaths among those whose parents were American have increased by 462 ; of those whose parents were both foreign, the increase has been 126 ; of those with whom one parent was American and the other foreign, the increase has been 76 ; and the class of "not stated" has diminished by 213.

The next table, including the record of three years, shows what striking differences are found in the mortality of these two classes of our population at different ages. The children of half-foreign parents are equally divided in calculating percentages.

It is very apparent that the deaths among children of foreign parentage are more numerous than among those of American parentage. It is also evident that the great bulk of our population past middle life is still of American parentage.

The ages of the two classes are so different that their mortality is hardly comparable.

\* *It is greatly to be desired that all cities and towns in the Commonwealth should observe the suggestion of chapter 21, section 13, General Statutes of Massachusetts, and hold undertakers to a strict accountability by requiring a license for the exercise of their calling. In our large cities a license is forfeited by failure on the part of the undertaker to make return of the death before burial. If every town would insist on the same compliance with the law, as might readily be done by a system of license, it would add very much to the value of registration.—*

[EDITOR OF REPORT.

The average temperature for the year was about three degrees lower than the mean of the past half-century. The temperature of March was singularly low; lower than in either January or February, both at Cambridge and Amherst.

The percentage of deaths from zymotic diseases in 1869 was 26·8; from constitutional diseases, 25·5; from local diseases, 27·9; from developmental diseases, 15·7; and from violent deaths, 4·1.

The following table shows the comparative number of deaths from the most destructive zymotic diseases in the past six years.

During the year 1869, ninety-three persons were killed by railroad accidents, twenty-six died by poison, eighty-three by burning and scalding, one hundred and ninety-one were drowned, ninety-two are reported as having committed suicide in various ways, six were murdered, ninety-two were lost at sea, one was killed by lightning, but one is reported as killed by heat (in the previous year eighty-five), and three by cold. One man was executed during the year.

*Diphtheria*.—This disease, during the past three years, seems to have been stationary. From 1860 to 1863 and 1864, there was a progressive and alarming increase; then, during the three following years, a corresponding decline. It is very liable to be confounded with croup, and also in a less degree with scarlet fever, but the substantial reality of the increase and decrease referred to is attested by the fact that the numbers reported as dying from croup in those years exhibit no such fluctuations.

*Dysentery* is another disease occasionally prevailing as an epidemic, and committing great ravages for several successive years and then subsiding. The causes of this periodic rise and fall are quite unknown. Thus, we find from 1860 to 1862 an annual mortality of less than 500. In 1863, 1864 and 1865, an annual mortality nearly three times as great, and in the four succeeding years, a subsidence to the standard of 1860 to 1862 again. During 1869 the deaths from this cause were only 481. Of this number 279 were under five years of age, and 287 occurred in August and September. The numbers in the various counties show that the cases were for the most part sporadic, and not epidemic.

*Typhus* shows an increase of 309 deaths over the preceding year. The cases were nearly equally divided between the sexes. Infantile fever, a designation so vague as to be of little or no value in any classification of the causes of death, has, for some reason unknown, always been classed in these reports with typhus, and we find 123 deaths under five years of age incorporated with those from typhus and typhoid. Some of these, doubtless, were true typhoid fever cases, but the great majority were probably something quite different. The whole number of deaths under the head of typhus and infantile fever in 1869 was 1,205. The whole number during the past ten years was 11,698, making an annual average of 1,170. Throwing out the extremes of youth and age, and making due allowance for cases of "infantile fever," it is safe to say that one person in a thousand of the adult population dies yearly from typhoid fever, which is the "continued fever" of Massachusetts. Reckoning one death in ten of those attacked with typhoid fever, we may reasonably suppose that one per cent. of the able-bodied people, and a still larger proportion of those of both sexes in early maturity, are annually disabled by this disease for periods varying

from one month to three or four. The causes of this most destructive malady are always among us in the autumnal months, and seem to be connected with the decomposition of organized substances, both of vegetable and animal origin. Often the disease seems to spring from decaying vegetables in cellars, often from foul drains and privies, often from the exposure of the bottom of ponds in dry seasons. There remains, however, a large class of cases in which such origin cannot be traced, and we are disposed to believe that decay of a kind resembling that to which reference has been made, occurring in the earth, and without man's agency, may give rise to the disease at certain seasons. In the months of autumn it is prudent to avoid sleeping on the ground floor, and to sleep at such a height from the earth that its emanations may be greatly diluted before entering the lungs.

*Measles* caused the death of 222 persons, of whom 170 were children under 5 years of age. They are distributed through all the months and in all the counties, except Dukes and Nantucket, where the number of young children is very small.

*Scarlatina* was rather more destructive than usual in 1869. There were 1,405 deaths from this cause; 907 were under 5, and 1,265 under 10 years of age. There was also a slight preponderance of deaths among females. The cases occurred in all the months and in all the counties.

Very few physicians are now found to deny that scarlet fever is propagated by contagion. In the most populous counties and cities it often makes great havoc, and this apparently from the facility with which the special poison which communicates the disease is carried among large numbers of persons. During the year 1869 this disposition to extend itself in crowded quarters is generally evident, as will be seen by the following table. The factory towns of Hampden County, however, seem to have escaped.

*Croup* was less fatal than usual in 1869. Deaths occurred in all the months, but of the whole number (473) only 80 took place in May, June, July and August.

*Cholera Infantum* killed 1,424 young children in 1869. Large as the number is, it was still greater (by 137) in the previous year. 2,985 infants dead in two years from cholera infantum shows the influence of crowded towns, of impure air, of unventilated and putrid streets and alleys, of all those causes which make our cities smell so foully in midsummer to those who enter them from the country. The same unwholesome atmosphere reduces the vital power of the whole population, but its effect is most marked and most fatal upon the organization of those who have least power of resistance. The destruction of infant life from this cause is increasing from year to year, and should be taken as a warning to purify our large towns, and to remove all decomposing material

from among the inhabitants as speedily as possible. It is feared that the systematic removal of such dangerous matter is greatly neglected in many of our compactly built and rapidly increasing cities. The same system will not do for a rural village and a thriving factory town, and in many cases the one has been gradually transformed into the other without any enlargement of the plan for securing public health.

The percentage of deaths from cholera infantum, to deaths from all causes, is seen on page xcix to have been in the past twenty-eight years 3·52 per cent., while in the past five years it has grown to be 4·95 per cent. This is an increase of more than 40 per cent. in one of our most destructive maladies. No other disease shows a like increase. To this disease, more than to any other, must we ascribe the frightful total mortality of very nearly one-quarter of the whole number of nursing children each year in the city of Boston. And this proportion will surely increase in the future, as it has in the past, unless the system of overcrowding, with its attendant filth and foul air, is in some way checked. Meanwhile, it is the imperative duty of the health authorities to remove all removable filth from streets, alleys, privies and yards with much greater frequency than is now practised in our largest cities and towns.

The percentage of deaths from cholera infantum to deaths from all causes in the whole State in 1869 was 5·5. The ratio varies from 7· in Essex, 6·3 in Suffolk, 6·5 in Middlesex, 5·6 in Hampden, and 5·5 in Worcester, to 1·7 in Barnstable and 1·1 in Berkshire.

*Consumption.*—The deaths in 1869 numbered 4,659, with an excess of 513 females. All the months and seasons furnish their proportion, and with what singular equality is shown in the following statement.

It is evident that whatever influence season may have on the production of the disease, it has little or none on the final event.

It is apparent from the above that consumption is specially a disease of that period of life when bodily vigor should be greatest. Twenty-six per cent. of all who died from consumption in 1869 were between the ages of 20 and 30.

The preceding table makes two quite distinct comparisons: one being the relation which deaths from consumption bear to deaths from all other specified causes, the other the relative liability to death from consumption in the living population. These will never be found to correspond, for the single reason that consumption is a disease of more general distribution than any other of those most fatal from year to year. The diseases of infancy, particularly cholera infantum, greatly increase the total mortality in the crowded cities, and by their extreme fatality render deaths from consumption less prominent. In the cities, consumption is really not *less* prevalent; but the diseases of infancy are far *more* prevalent than in the country.

The next table will show the order in which the counties stand in both respects. It is to be said that in using the census of four years ago, which is the only one now available, we cannot hope to attain perfect accuracy, as the population of some of the counties has materially changed.

The diminished mortality from consumption in Massachusetts in the past generation has been the subject of remark in the last two registration reports. The table by which this is shown to be the case is here reproduced with the addition of 1869, and with a correction of the population since 1865, which is made possible by the aggregate numbers existing in the State in 1870 being already made known, as explained in the chapter on population.

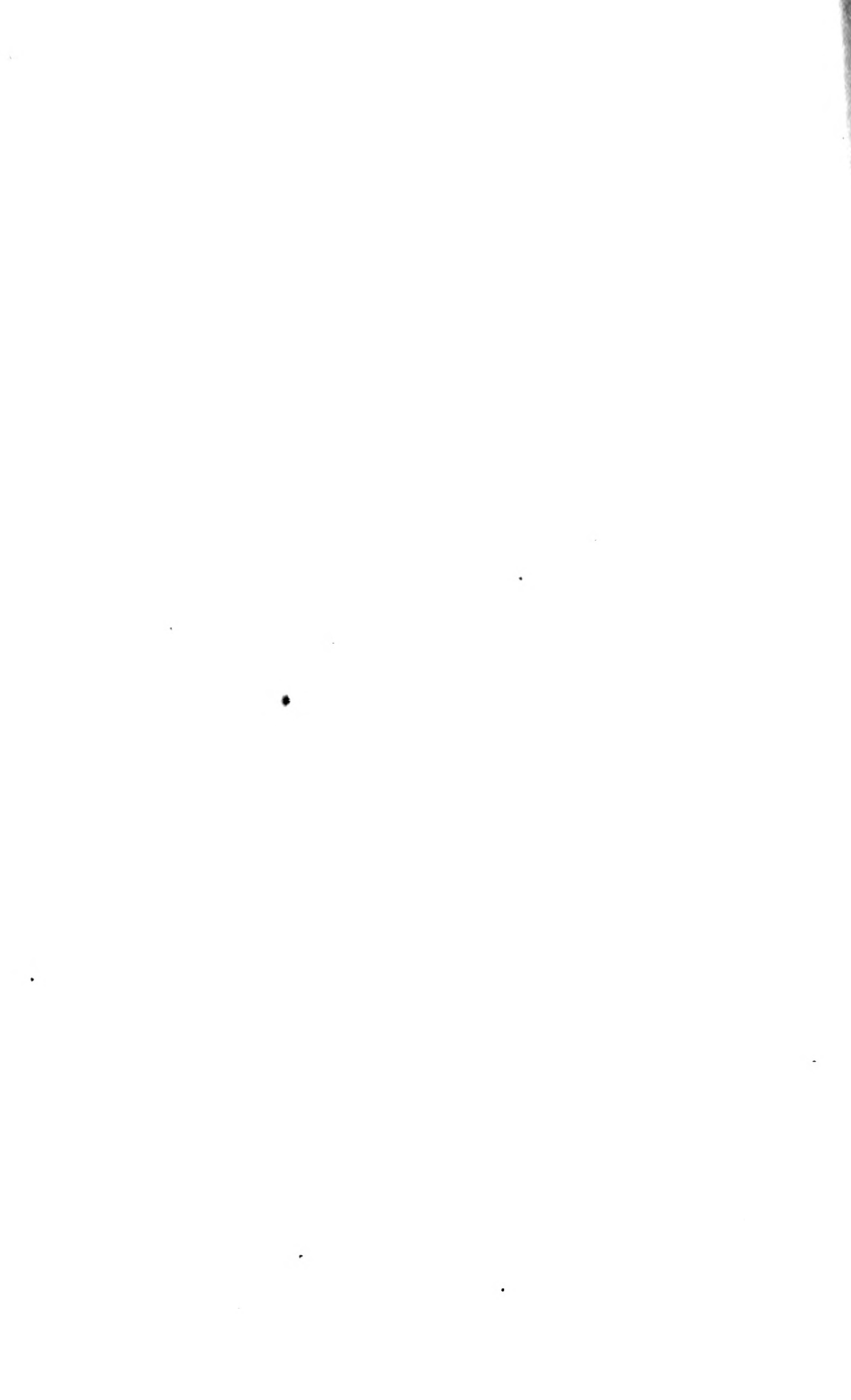
*Pneumonia.*—The number of deaths in 1869 from this cause was 1,736, with a slight preponderance of males. The whole number is 85 greater than in 1868.

Deaths occurred in all the months, but by far the greatest number in the season of cold. July and August report 59 and 54 respectively. January, February and March 178, 218 and 252. March, it will be observed, by referring to the table of temperature, was a month of unusual and almost unprecedented cold.

Six hundred and nineteen, or 35 per cent. of the whole number of deaths from pneumonia, occurred in children under 5 years of age, and 512, or 29 per cent., in persons above 60 years of age. It is thus seen to be a disease especially fatal at the extremes of youth and age.

## NOTE.

Previous to the adoption of the present NOSOLOGICAL ARRANGEMENT of Tables IX. and X., in the Registration Report for the year 1855, the term "Infantile" in those Tables had included not only Deaths returned as "Infantile," "Premature," or "Premature Births," but also all under two years of age returned under the head of "Debility," or "Unknown" cause.

Although not accurately corresponding to the new Nosological arrangement, the plan was continued until the Registration of 1868, when in consequence of the inconveniences arising from it the following method was substituted.

The deaths returned as "Premature," and those returned as "Infantile," are now stated *separately* in Table VIII., and *combined* in Tables IX. and X. Deaths of children under two years returned as from "Debility" or "Unknown" cause, are no longer classed as "Infantile," but under "Debility" or "Unknown."

# APPENDIX.

## L A W S

### CONCERNING THE REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS, MARRIAGES AND DEATHS.

#### [General Statutes—Chapter 21.]

#### OF THE REGISTRY AND RETURNS OF BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, AND DEATHS

##### SECTION

1. City and Town Clerks to obtain, record, and index facts concerning Births, Marriages, and Deaths.
2. Parents and others to give notice of Births, and Deaths.
3. Physicians to give Certificate of Cause of Death, when requested. Penalty.
4. Sextons, Undertakers, &c., to make returns to Clerks of Cities and Towns. Clerks to give Certificate of Registry of Death to the Person having charge of funeral rites *preliminary* to Interment, for delivery, &c. If Interment takes place without such Certificate, notice thereof to be given, under penalty of twenty dollars.
5. Clerk annually to transmit certified Copies of Records to Secretary.

##### SECTION

6. Record or Certificate of Clerk to be *prima facie* evidence in Legal Proceedings.
7. Clerks—Fees of, payable by City or Town; Accounts of, to be certified by Secretary. Penalty for neglect of duty.
8. Superintendents of State Almshouses to record and return to Secretary, births and deaths therein.
9. Secretary to furnish Blank Books for Records and Forms for returns, with Instructions. Clerks to distribute the Blank Forms for Returns.
10. Secretary,—to cause Returns to be bound, &c.; to Report annually to Legislature, &c.; to do all other acts necessary to secure the execution of the provisions of this chapter.
11. Registrars may be chosen, in certain cases, in place of Town Clerks.

SECTION 1. The clerk of each city and town shall receive or obtain, and record, and index, the following facts concerning the births, marriages, and deaths, therein, separately numbering and recording the same in the order in which he receives them, designated in separate columns :

In the record of births, the date of the birth, the place of birth, the name of the child, (if it have any,) the sex and color of the child, the names and the places of birth of the parents, the occupation of the father, the residence of the parents, and the date of the record;

In the record of marriages, the date of the marriage, the place of marriage, the name, residence and official station of the person by whom married, the names and places of birth of the parties, the residence of each, the age and color of each, the condition of each, (whether single or widowed,) the occupation, the names of the parents, and the date of the record;

In the record of deaths, the date of the death, the name of the deceased, the sex, the color, the condition, (whether single, widowed, or married,) the age, the residence, the occupation, the place of death, the place of birth, the names and places of birth of the parents, the disease or cause of death, the place of burial, and the date of the record.

SECTION 2. Parents shall give notice to the clerk of their city or town of the births and deaths of their children; every householder shall give like notice of every birth and death happening in his house; the eldest person next of kin shall give such notice of the death of his kindred; the

keeper of a workhouse, house of correction, prison, hospital, or almshouse, except the State almshouses at Tewksbury, Bridgewater, and Monson, and the master or other commanding officer of any ship shall give like notice of every birth and death happening among the persons under his charge. Whoever neglects to give such notice for the space of six months after a birth or death, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five dollars.

SECTION 3. Any physician having attended a person during his last illness, shall—when requested within fifteen days after the decease of such person—forthwith furnish for registration a certificate of the duration of the last sickness, the disease of which the person died, and the date of his decease, as nearly as he can state the same. If any physician refuses or neglects to make such certificate, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars to the use of the town in which he resides.

SECTION 4. Every sexton, undertaker, or other person having charge of a burial-ground, or the superintendent of burials having charge of the obsequies or funeral rites preliminary to the interment of a human body, shall forthwith obtain and return to the clerk of the city or town in which the deceased resided or the death occurred, the facts required by this chapter to be recorded by said officer concerning the deceased, and the person making such return shall receive from his city or town the fee of ten cents therefor.

The clerk, upon recording such facts, shall forthwith give to the person making such return, a certificate that such return has been made, which certificate such person shall deliver to the person having charge of the interment, if other than himself, before the burial when practicable, otherwise within seven days thereafter. When a burial takes place and no certificate is delivered as aforesaid, the sexton, undertaker, or other person having charge of the interment, shall forthwith give notice thereof to the clerk under penalty of twenty dollars.

SECTION 5. The clerk of each city and town shall annually on or before the first day of February, transmit to the secretary of the Commonwealth, certified copies of the records of the births, marriages, and deaths, which have occurred therein during the year ending on the last day of the preceding December.

SECTION 6. The record of the town clerk relative to any birth, marriage, or death, shall be *primâ facie* evidence, in legal proceedings, of the facts recorded. The certificate signed by the town clerk for the time being shall be admissible as evidence of any such record.

SECTION 7.\* The clerk shall receive from his city or town for obtaining, recording, indexing, and returning to the secretary of the Commonwealth, the facts in relation to a birth, twenty cents; a marriage, ten cents; a death, twenty cents for each of the first twenty entries, and ten cents for each subsequent entry, as the same shall be certified by the secretary of the Commonwealth; but a city or town containing more than ten thousand inhabitants may limit the aggregate compensation allowed to their clerk. He shall forfeit a sum not less than twenty nor more than one hundred dollars for each refusal or neglect to perform any duty required of him by this chapter.

SECTION 8. The superintendents of the State almshouses at Tewksbury, Bridgewater, and Monson, shall obtain, record, and make return of

the facts in relation to the births and deaths which occur in their respective institutions, in like manner as is required of town clerks. The clerks of said towns shall, in relation to the births and deaths of persons in said almshouses, be exempt from the duties otherwise required of them by this chapter.

SECTION 9. The secretary shall, at the expense of the Commonwealth, prepare and furnish to the clerks of the several cities and towns, and to the superintendents of the State almshouses, blank books of suitable quality and size to be used as books of record under this chapter, blank books for indexes thereto, and blank forms for returns, on paper of uniform size: and shall accompany the same with such instructions and explanations as may be necessary and useful. City and town clerks shall make such distribution of blank forms of returns furnished by the secretary as he shall direct.

SECTION 10. The secretary shall cause the returns received by him for each year to be bound together in one or more volumes with indexes thereto. He shall prepare from the returns such tabular results as will render them of practical utility, make report thereof annually to the legislature, and do all other acts necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this chapter.

SECTION 11. Any city or town containing more than ten thousand inhabitants, may choose a person other than the clerk to be registrar, who shall be sworn, and to whom all the provisions of this chapter concerning clerks shall apply. The returns and notices required to be made and given to clerks shall be made and given to such registrar under like penalties.

SECTION 12. The secretary of this Commonwealth shall prosecute, by an action of tort, in the name of the Commonwealth, for the recovery of any penalty or forfeiture imposed by this chapter.

SECTION 13. Any city or town may make rules and regulations to enforce the provisions of this chapter, or to secure a more perfect registration of births, marriages, and deaths, therein.

[General Statutes—Chapter 106.]

OF MARRIAGE.

SECTION

- 7. Notice of Intention of Marriage to be entered with Town Clerk.
- 8. Certificate of Record of Intention to be given to Parties by Clerk. Such certificate to be delivered to Person before whom Marriage is to be solemnized.
- 9. Certificate not to issue to certain Minors, except on application of Parent, &c. Penalty.
- 10. Clerk may require Affidavit of Age.
- 11. Penalty for making False Statement.
- 12. Parties living in State and Married out of it, to file certificate on return. Penalty.
- 13. No Person to solemnize Marriage of a Minor, without consent of Parents, if any in the State competent to act.

SECTION

- 14. Marriages, by Whom to be solemnized, and in what Place.
- 15. Marriages among Quakers.
- 16. Persons solemnizing Marriage to keep Record and to make Returns to certain Town Clerks. Clerk to record all Marriages so returned.
- 17. Penalty for not making Returns.
- 18. Penalty for solemnizing a Marriage unlawfully.
- 19. Penalty, on Person not authorized to Marry.
- 21. Record of Marriage, or certified copy thereof, presumptive evidence of Marriage.

SECTIONS 1, 2 and 3. [Marriage between certain relatives prohibited.]

SECTION 4. [Polygamy forbidden.]

SECTION 5. [Marriage contracted by insane persons or idiots, void.]

SECTION 6. [Marriages of persons marrying out of the State in order to evade, &c., void.]

SECTION 7. Persons intending to be joined in marriage, shall, before their marriage cause notice thereof to be entered in the office of the clerk, or registrar of the city or town in which they respectively dwell, if within the State. If there is no such clerk or registrar in the place of their residence, the entry shall be made in an adjoining city or town.

SECTION 8. The clerk or registrar shall deliver to the parties a certificate under his hand, specifying the time when notice of the intention of marriage was entered with him, together with all facts in relation to the marriage required by law to be ascertained and recorded, except those respecting the person by whom the marriage is to be solemnized. Such certificate shall be delivered to the minister or magistrate in whose presence the marriage is to be contracted, before he proceeds to solemnize the same.

SECTION 9. If a clerk or registrar issues such certificate to a male under the age of twenty-one years, or a female under the age of eighteen years, having reasonable cause to suppose the person to be under such age, except upon the application or consent in writing of the parent, master, or guardian, of such person, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars; but if there is no parent, master, or guardian, in this State, competent to act, a certificate may be issued without such application or consent.

SECTION 10. The clerk or registrar may require of any person applying for such certificate, an affidavit sworn to before a justice of the peace for the county where the application is made, setting forth the age of the parties; which affidavit shall be sufficient proof of age to authorize the issuing of the certificate.

SECTION 11. Whoever applying for such certificate wilfully makes a false statement in relation to the age or residence, parent, master, or guardian, of either of the parties intending marriage, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars.

SECTION 12. When a marriage is solemnized in another State between parties living in this State, and they return to dwell here, they shall, within seven days after their return, file with the clerk or registrar of the city or town, where either of them lived at the time, a certificate or declaration of their marriage, including the facts concerning marriages required by law, and for every neglect they shall forfeit ten dollars.

SECTION 13. No magistrate or minister shall solemnize a marriage, having reasonable cause to suppose either of the parties to be under the age mentioned in section nine, without the consent of the parent or guardian having the custody of the minor, if there is any in the State competent to act.

SECTION 14. Marriages may be solemnized by a justice of the peace in the county for which he is appointed, when either of the parties resides in the same county; and throughout the State by any minister of the gospel ordained according to the usage of his denomination, who resides within the State and continues to perform the functions of his office; but all marriages shall be solemnized in the city or town in which the person solemnizing them resides, or in which one or both of the persons to be married reside.

SECTION 15. Marriages among the people called Friends or Quakers may be solemnized in the manner heretofore used and practised in their societies.

SECTION 16. Every justice of the peace, minister, and clerk, or keeper of the records of the meeting wherein any marriages among the Friends or Quakers are solemnized, shall make a record of each marriage solemnized before him, together with all facts relating to the marriage required by law

to be recorded. He shall also between the first and tenth days of each month return a copy of the record for the month next preceding, to the clerk or registrar of the city or town in which the marriage was solemnized, and shall when neither of the parties to a marriage resides in the city or town in which the marriage is solemnized, return a copy of the record of such marriage to the clerk or registrar of the city or town in which one or both of said parties reside. All marriages so returned shall be recorded by the clerk or registrar.

SECTION 17. Every person neglecting to make the returns required by the preceding section, shall forfeit for each neglect not less than twenty nor more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 18. A justice of the peace or minister who joins persons in marriage contrary to the provisions of this chapter, knowing that the marriage is not duly authorized, shall forfeit not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 19. Whoever undertakes to join persons in marriage knowing that he is not authorized so to do, shall be imprisoned in the jail or confined to hard labor for a term not exceeding six months, or pay a fine of not less than fifty nor more than two hundred dollars.

SECTION 20. [Unintentional informality does not invalidate marriage in other respects lawful.]

SECTION 21. The record of a marriage, made and kept as prescribed by law by the person before whom the marriage is solemnized, or by the clerk or registrar of any city or town, or a copy of such record duly certified, shall be received in all courts and places as presumptive evidence of such marriage.

SECTION 22. [Admission of respondent, general repute, &c., competent evidence to prove the fact of marriage.]

SECTION 23. [Marriage in foreign countries by a consul or diplomatic agent valid, and certificate of such consul or agent presumptive evidence thereof.]

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[General Statutes—Chapter 29.]

OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS.

SECTION 10. [County, city and town records and files may be inspected and copied.]

SECTION 13. [Penalties; . . . . . for altering or mutilating any record, paper, or written document, a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, —for wrongfully detaining records, and other documents, fifty dollars.]

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[General Statutes—Section 1 of Chapter 174.]

Sentence when no punishment is provided.

SECTION 1. In cases of legal conviction, where no punishment is provided by statute, the court shall award such sentence as is conformable to the common usage and practice in this State, according to the nature of the offence, and not repugnant to the constitution.

## [Chapter 133.]

## AN ACT CONCERNING THE REGISTRY AND RETURN OF MARRIAGES, BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

SECTION 1. The clerk of each city and town, (except in such cities and towns as choose a registrar, under the eleventh section of the twenty-first chapter of the General Statutes, in which cases the provisions of this act shall apply to the registrar.) for receiving or obtaining, recording, indexing and returning the facts relating to marriages, births and deaths occurring therein, shall be entitled to receive therefrom the sums following, viz.: for each marriage, fifteen cents; for each birth, thirty cents; for each death returned to him by the persons specified in sections two, three and four of chapter twenty-one of the General Statutes, twenty cents for each of the first twenty entries, and ten cents for each subsequent entry; for each death not so returned, but by him obtained and recorded, twenty cents.

SECTION 2. Chapter ninety-six of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-five, and so much of section seven of the twenty-first chapter of the General Statutes as is inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

## [Chapter 58.]

## AN ACT RELATING TO THE MARRIAGE OF NON-RESIDENT PARTIES.

SECTION 1. Persons living without the Commonwealth and intending to be joined in marriage within the Commonwealth, shall, before their marriage, cause notice of their intention to be entered in the office of the clerk or registrar of the city or town in which they propose to have the marriage solemnized; and no marriage between such parties shall be solemnized until they have delivered to the justice of the peace, or minister in whose presence the marriage is to be contracted, a certificate from such clerk or registrar, specifying the time when notice of the intention of marriage was entered with him, together with all the facts in relation to the marriage required by law to be ascertained and recorded, except those respecting the person by whom the marriage is to be solemnized.

SECTION 2. Marriages may be solemnized by a justice of the peace in the county for which he is appointed.

SECTION 3. A justice of the peace or minister who joins persons in marriage contrary to the provisions of this act shall forfeit not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars.

STATISTICAL NOSOLOGY

ADOPTED FOR REGISTRATION IN MASSACHUSETTS.

The following plan of a Nomenclature and Classification of Diseases does not essentially differ from that authorized by the Registrar-General of England, to be used in the preparation of the "Weekly Return of Births and Deaths in London," and is also, with slight modifications, identical with that embodied in a report drawn up by William Farr, Esq., M. D., of London, for the consideration of the International Statistical Congress which met at Paris in September, 1855; which report was printed in the Appendix to the Sixteenth Registration Report of the Registrar-General, England.

[NOTE.—This page and those that follow contain two lists of causes of death. The first,—that on the left side,—may be called the TABULAR LIST, and comprises all the heads which it is proposed to admit into the complete tables (IX. and X.) and under which ALL deaths, from whatever cause are finally distributed. It represents those diseases which, under the same terms, or terms strictly synonymous with them, are found in practice to occur most frequently.

The SUPPLEMENTAL LIST is *subordinate* to the first, and contains the principal *special* diseases which it may be considered desirable to note. The figures in this list indicate the corresponding heads of the tabular list under which such diseases are ultimately arranged.

Table VIII. includes both the Tabular and Supplementary lists; Tables IX. and X. the Tabular list only.]

NOTE.—Cases of “infantile fever” are classed with those of typhoid, relapsing, and other continued fevers, under one name “typhus.” Cases of “rheumatic fever” are classed with “rheumatism;” of “hemorrhage,” and “abscess,” with the diseases of the organs affected. Cases of “neglect” and “cold,” except when the result of privation, (Class I. 3.—1,) are placed (with notes) under deaths by “accident or negligence,” (V. 1.—7.) As “stricture of the urethra” is almost invariably the result of gonorrhœa, it is classed as I. 2.—2.







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
