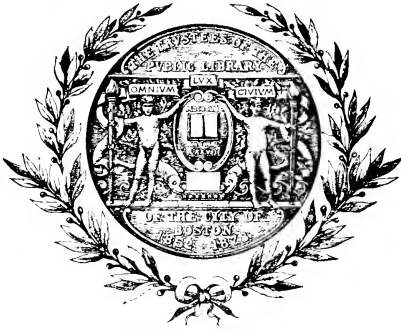

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.*

In conformity with the provisions of the tenth section of the twenty-first chapter of the General Statutes, I have the honor to submit herewith the Thirtieth Annual Registration Report relating to the BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, and DEATHS occurring in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts during the year 1871, and returned from the several cities and towns according to law.

The editorial remarks constituting the preliminary portion of the present report have been prepared by Dr. GEORGE DERBY, Secretary of the State Board of Health, and Lecturer on Hygiene in Harvard University.

The publication of the present report has been considerably delayed by the loss in the destructive fire of November last, of all that part of the work which had already passed through the press, being a large proportion of the whole document.

The tables which constitute the present report have been compiled with much care and labor, and are believed to be fully worthy of confidence.

# THIRTIETH REGISTRATION REPORT.

(1871.)

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The accompanying tables present the vital statistics of Massachusetts for the year 1871. The town clerks and registrars of the State have thus preserved for study and comparison a great accumulation of facts concerning births, marriages and deaths, which, although expressed in numbers, may suggest important inferences pertaining to population and public health.

The first table, which gives a summary statement, shows that there were recorded, in 1871, 39,791 births, 15,746 marriages, and 27,943 deaths, an aggregate of 83,480, or 3,171 more than during the year 1870.

If we make a comparison in each of these divisions of births, marriages and deaths, with the registration of the previous year, we find that

The number of births is considerably in excess of that for any previous year. The relative number of deaths is less. The marriages show a marked increase as compared with former years.

The natural increase of population, or excess of births over deaths, is 11,848, or 918 more than in 1870.

The daily natural increase is an average of 32.46.

One living child was born to every 36.63 persons, one person in every 46.28 was married, and one person in every 52.15 died.

Excess of Birth-rate over Death-rate, 8·13 in a thousand, or ·813 of one per cent.

The following table will exhibit the fact that, comparing a series of years, the general result is satisfactory. The steady gain in the excess of the birth-rate over the death-rate is noteworthy. The years of the civil war showed an unhappy approach of the two rates toward equality, which is now being yearly outgrown.

## P O P U L A T I O N .

The census returns of 1870, concerning which, in the Registration Report of 1870, quite extended observations were made, are the only available basis on which to make the calculations of the present work. The increase in population has, of course, been considerable, and this increase must be taken into consideration in making comparison with previous years in the following pages. While making this allowance, however, it should be remembered that, as the computations are uniformly made on the same basis of population, the relative conclusions for this single year are valid and reliable.

In the Report for 1869 we found that, taking a series of five years, 1865-1870, the estimated annual increase in population was 2·848 per cent. This rate may be considered as a near approach to that of the present year. This being granted, the computed population of the State in 1871 may be considered as 1,498,856. The population, according to the official census returns of 1870, was 1,457,351.

## B I R T H S .

The following table, giving the number of births in the State, annually, during the last twenty years, will show the progressive increase :—

The *Birth-rate* for 1871 is 2·73 for every one hundred persons, or 27·3 for every thousand of population. Including the stillborn, a child was born to every 35 persons.

The whole number of births, (stillborn included), is 41,181, or 1,903 more than in 1870. This number does not represent accurately the increase which occurred, for the regulations for registration, which are comparatively effective for marriages and deaths, are open to many obvious evasions in the case of births. For example, deaths are reported through undertakers, that permission for burial may be secured, but the return of births, which by the statute is made obligatory on parents and householders, is very irregularly carried out in practice. To

obtain the birth-returns, a house to house visitation, made annually, or semi-annually, is relied upon, and the discrepancies and delinquencies probable from such methods hardly need mention.

It appears from the above table that, in 1871, the births were, relatively, most numerous in Suffolk, Hampden, Worcester and Berkshire, while Dukes and Nantucket, Franklin and Barnstable were the least prolific.

The above table supposes the Birth-rate to have continued uniform the year round. The next table exhibits a similar comparison by periods of six months and carried through a series of years. A marked disparity between the early and the later months of the year will be readily noted. The difference for 1871 is considerably more than the average difference during the past ten years. The causes for this disparity have been alluded to in former reports and they are still operative,—the absence of certain classes of adult males from their homes during certain seasons,—so that the occupations of seamen, of fishermen, of laborers and the like may be pursued, will account for much of the difference.

The proportion of the sexes in the births follows an equality in relative difference from year to year which is curious to observe but difficult to explain. The males always preponderate among those born alive, not to such a degree, indeed, as to disturb the natural laws of the increase of population, but sufficient to supply a reserve to be drawn upon by the casualties to which adult males are exposed in the battle of life.

The foregoing table exhibits a significant diminution from year to year in the purely native births, and a corresponding increase in the proportion of births from mixed parentage. The births of Foreign parentage preserve a nearly constant uniformity.

The following table carries the comparison as regards parentage to a still greater extent and presents similar results.

The excess of foreign over native parentage is 3,323, or 547 more than the excess reported in 1870. Foreign births are recorded as in the majority in Suffolk, Middlesex, Worcester, Hampden, Norfolk, Bristol, Berkshire and Hampshire. The superior fecundity of the foreign element among us is a fact fully recognized, and one which is confirmed in a most suggestive way from year to year by the registration returns.

Comparing 1871 with 1870, we find that American births have increased by 234; Foreign births have increased by 781;

and the births of mixed parentage (one parent foreign) have increased by 371.

*Plural Births.* Three hundred and sixty-seven women in Massachusetts gave birth in 1871 to seven hundred and thirty-nine children. Three hundred and sixty-two had twins and five had triplets. The proportion of women in labor who give birth to more than one child is nearly constant each year—one in every hundred. The number of cases of triplets is two more than in the previous year.

*Illegitimates.*—Four hundred and thirty-two (432) are reported, one hundred and forty-seven more than in 1870. There are 196 males and 236 females. As has been the case in previous years, the females are in excess.

*Stillborn.*—The number reported is 1,390, an increase of 371 as compared with 1870. Of those stated, 790 were males and 520 were females.

## MARRIAGES.

The whole number of marriages reported in 1871 was 15,746, an increase of 1,025 as compared with 1870.

The preceding table shows that 244 females married at the age of 17, one of whom was married for the second time, and to a man of 22. Ninety-seven were married at the age of 16, one of whom was united to a bachelor of 52, and another to a youth of 17. Of the 37 females married at the age of 15, two were married to widowers at the ages of 33 and 25 respectively. The number of females married at the age of 14 was 8, a somewhat larger number than usual at that age. A man of 27 was united to one of these misses. Among the most remarkable of the marriages, in regard to disparity of age, may be mentioned the males at 75, 64, 68, 60, to females of 37, 24, 34, 21. There was but one marriage recorded where either party was married for the fifth time; in this case the age of the male was 54 and the female 24. Some of the spinsters who were married during the year were decidedly mature. For example, we find damsels at the ages of 76, 70, and 60, who for the first time have entered upon matrimony, while others who had passed into widowhood at the ages of 74, 72, 71, 68 and 60, were induced to again assume the responsibilities of wives for the second, third and fourth times. The males, too, we find were married at quite advanced ages, among the most noticeable of which may be named one in Worcester County, at the age of 81, who found his "affinity" for the fourth time, with a widow of 67; and another at the age of 80 was united for the second time to a maiden of 50. We find there were 28 males married who were 70 and upwards, one of whom at the age of 70 was married for the second time to a widow of 70, it being her fourth choice. The third marriage of a male at 75 to a widow of 35 is recorded. The ages of the oldest parties united in marriage were where the male was 79 and the female 74, it being the second marriage of both. The youngest married pair were a male of 17 and a female of 14. The greatest disparity of ages we notice is that of the male at 60 and the female at 21, and another, the male at 75 and the female at 37. A third marriage of both parties is recorded, the male being 79 and the female 73.

It will be observed that there is a slow but steady decrease in the percentage of American marriages, from year to year. This fact should be considered in connection with a similar decline in the number of purely native births.

## D E A T H S .

The total number of deaths reported throughout the State in 1871 was 27,943. As compared with those recorded in 1870, this number shows an increase of 614; and it is 2,524 greater than the average annual number for the previous ten years (1861-70), including the years of the civil war, when a largely increased mortality was reported.

The death-rate for the State for the past seven years is given in the following table. It is to be noted that the population is estimated, except for the years 1865 and 1870, which is known.

If we compare the results above exhibited with those recorded in 1870, we find that the deaths of those whose parents were both American have increased by 18; of those whose parents were both foreign, the number was larger in 1871 by 629; while the deaths of those whose parentage was mixed, one parent being American and the other foreign, have increased by 40. Of the class "not stated," 361 are reported in 1871, being 73 less than in 1870.

The following table shows a comparison of results for five years, and shows a striking and suggestive contrast in the mortality at various ages between the native and the foreign elements of our population. In calculating the percentages, those of half-foreign parentage are divided equally.

One fact brought prominently into view by this comparison is that the children born of foreign parents die in greater proportion than those purely native; and another fact is that the majority of our population past middle life continues to be of American stock.

The percentage of deaths from *zymotic* diseases in 1871 was 23·3; from *constitutional* diseases, 25·9; from *local* diseases, 29·1; from *developmental* diseases, 17; and from *violence*, 4·6. The various divisions hold very nearly the same relation to each other, from year to year, as regards percentage of mortality.

During the year 1871, one hundred and sixty-one persons were victims of railroad accidents, twenty-nine died by poison, one hundred and one died from burns and scalds, three hundred and forty-six were drowned (including those "lost at sea"), one hundred and twenty-two committed suicide, and twenty-five were murdered.

*Diphtheria*.—The number of deaths reported in 1871 was 274, an increased mortality of 32 as compared with the previous year. If comparison is made, however, with the mortality of ten years ago, a most gratifying decrease in the mortality from this much dreaded disease will be noted; the average annual mortality in the years 1861–65 was 926. Now, as then, the deaths were almost entirely limited to children under ten years of age. The distribution of the mortality was nearly equal throughout all the months, and all the counties, except Dukes and Nantucket, shared the fatality. Diphtheria has not been included in the list of the ten most fatal diseases in Massachusetts since 1865.

*Dysentery*.—There were 389 deaths from this disease, a decrease of almost a hundred as compared with the previous year. This mortality is less than that reported in any of the last ten years. We may infer that many of the cases of summer disease of the bowels, which would once have been classed as dysentery, are now more correctly designated; and, also, that under the influence of some law by which, independently of the more correct notions of diagnosis above alluded to, diseases appear to manifest their virulence and fatality in cycles, dysentery is approaching the limit of its course in one direction, and that it will sooner or later retrograde toward its former place in the order of mortality. Sixty per cent. of the deaths from dysentery in 1871 were of children under five years old. July, August and September contributed seventy-eight per cent. of the mortality. Dukes and Nantucket were the only counties exempt.

*Small-pox*.—During the five years, 1866–70, there were reported throughout the State an aggregate of 547 deaths from small-pox, an annual average of 109. This mortality was distributed as follows:—1866, 141; 1867, 196; 1868, 20; 1869, 59; 1870, 131. The percentage of this mortality, to all deaths, did not vary much in these five years from that reported during the previous twenty-five years. In other words, our State continued to be comparatively exempt from the ravages of this loathsome and pestilential disease during a whole generation. The protective power of vaccination appeared to exert its influ-



ence in the community, to the degree at least of preventing any alarming development of small-pox.

Yet the disease was never wholly absent, and seed enough remained, scattered through the people, to sooner or later propagate the contagion as a virulent epidemic. Under the influence of causes which could hardly be traced,—perhaps an unusual indifference to vaccination begotten of long-continued and apparent security, or perhaps under the influence of a natural law by which zymotic diseases tend to appear in cycles,—the small-pox showed, in 1871, a decided increase in power. Its mortality throughout the State amounted to 295, or more than double that reported in any of the previous five years, and more than half that reported in the whole of those five years. The mortality was divided between all the counties, except Barnstable, Dukes and Nantucket. The largest number of deaths in any one county (191) was in Middlesex; this county and Hampden contributed 240 of the total, 295. In other counties the deaths were quite equally divided in proportion to their population. The comparatively excessive mortality in Middlesex and Hampden counties is explained by the fact that small-pox became epidemic in Lowell and Holyoke; these two recorded a mortality of 176 and 43, respectively, or together 219, which is very nearly seventy-five per cent. of the whole number.

The following table presents statistics of the epidemic in Lowell and Holyoke, with reference to parent-nativity, age and sex of those who died:—



*Measles*.—One hundred and thirty-one (131) deaths were reported; one hundred and fourteen (114) were of children under five years of age. Dukes, Nantucket, Barnstable and Berkshire reported no fatality from this disease. The first half of the year shows a mortality considerably greater than the last half.

*Scarlatina* caused 867 deaths, an increase of 184 in comparison with the previous year. The mortality from this disease varies greatly in different years. There is no apparent periodicity in this variation; but the poison which is the special source of contagion assumes at times, and in some localities, a greater intensity, causing increased mortality. Of the deaths recorded in 1870, 590 were of children under five years old, amounting to 68 per cent.; 776, or 90 per cent., were under ten years old. The mortality was distributed throughout the year quite equally. Of the counties, Dukes and Nantucket were alone exempt; Worcester is at the head of the list, contributing 33 per cent. of the whole number, and Middlesex reports 19 per cent., or nearly one-fifth of the whole.

*Typhus*, which is a generic name for the autumnal or continued fever, and which includes the disease more correctly known as typhoid or enteric fever, and also the rather problematical disorder called infantile fever, caused 1,116 deaths, a number less by 217 than that reported in 1870. Thirty-nine per cent. of these deaths occurred among persons from 15 to 30 years old, and 40 per cent. were in the months of August, September and October. The sexes were almost equally divided, the females exceeding the males by eight; generally, the deaths of males predominate.

*Cholera Infantum*.—This disease destroyed the lives of 1,718 children in 1871. This number is less by 196 than that reported in 1870. The mortality from this cause comprised 6.1 per cent. of all the deaths reported. The average percentage, during the last thirty years, of deaths from cholera infantum, as compared with deaths from all causes, was 3.81, so that while the mortality in 1871 was somewhat less than that of 1870, the rate is still seen to be very high when we examine the records of former

years. We have in previous reports noted the preventable causes of this destruction of infant life; they are still operative, and call for energetic action in all the crowded centres to abate them, and to reduce to the lowest possible degree the toleration of nuisances and of overcrowding.

All the counties in the State felt the inroads of this annual destroyer; but the following table, giving the number of deaths from cholera infantum in each county, and the percentage of this mortality to deaths from all causes, will show that the populous places suffered the most:—

Deaths were reported in all the months; but July, August and September contributed 88 per cent. of the year's death-record.

*Dropsy* is reported to have caused the death of 527 persons. This number does not vary greatly from that reported in former

years. It is to be regretted, in the interests of accuracy, that a term like "dropsy," which designates a symptom only in the strict sense, should be continued. It would be better if deaths reported as caused by dropsy could be referred to the diseases of which dropsy is an attendant symptom, as, for example, to those of the heart, liver or kidneys.

*Consumption.*—The deaths from this disease amounted, in 1871, to 5,070. The deaths of females were 564 in excess of those of males. In 1870 there were 5,003 deaths.

The following is a tabular statement of the deaths in the four quarters of the year. It appears that the seasons exercise but little influence on the mortality of this, the most fatal disease in point of numbers in the State:—

The following table makes evident the fact that from year to year we are steadily advancing toward better things as regards mortality from consumption. Physicians treat the disease more successfully, the people take better care of themselves as they become more intelligent in matters of health, and the general result is an increased vigor, which resists more effectually the assaults of phthisis.

*Pneumonia.*—The deaths numbered 1,858 in 1871, 140 in excess of the mortality in 1870.

The greatest mortality occurred in April, and the least was in August. The first four months of the year contributed fifty-one per cent. of the whole mortality.

The sexes suffered almost equally.



Six hundred and sixty-two of the deaths (36 per cent. of the whole number) were of children under five years old, and five hundred and twenty-one (twenty-eight per cent. of the whole) were of persons above 60 years old; thus, considerably more than half of the mortality occurred at the extremes of life.

## NOTE.

Previously to the adoption, in the Registration Report of 1855, of the present NOSOLOGICAL ARRANGEMENT of Tables IX. and X., the term "Infantile" in those Tables included, under a single designation, not only all deaths returned under the several heads "Infantile," "Premature," or "Premature Births," but also all ascribed to "Debility" or "Unkown" causes, if under two years of age.

This plan was continued until the Registration Report of 1868, in which, to secure greater accuracy, the method now employed was adopted, by which Deaths returned under the head of "Premature," "Premature Births," or "Infantile," are stated *separately* in Table VIII. and *combined* in Tables IX. and X. Deaths of children under two years, from "Debility" or "Unkown" cause, are no longer classed as "Infantile."

# A P P E N D I X .

## L A W S

### CONCERNING THE REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS, MARRIAGES AND DEATHS.

[General Statutes—Chapter 21.]

#### OF THE REGISTRY AND RETURNS OF BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, AND DEATHS.

##### SECTION

1. City and Town Clerks to obtain, record, and index facts concerning Births, Marriages, and Deaths.
2. Parents and others to give notice of Births, and Deaths.
3. Physicians to give Certificate of Cause of Death, when requested. Penalty.
4. Sextons, Undertakers, &c., to make returns to Clerks of Cities and Towns. Clerks to give Certificate of Registry of Death to the Person having charge of funeral rites *preliminary* to Interment, for delivery, &c. If Interment takes place without such Certificate, notice thereof to be given, under penalty of twenty dollars.
5. Clerk annually to transmit certified Copies of Records to Secretary.

##### SECTION

6. Record or Certificate of Clerk to be *prima facie* evidence in Legal Proceedings.
7. Clerks—Fees of, payable by City or Town; Accounts of, to be certified by Secretary. Penalty for neglect of duty.
8. Superintendents of State Almshouses to record and return to Secretary, births and deaths therein.
9. Secretary to furnish Blank Books for Records and forms for Returns, with Instructions. Clerks to distribute the Blank Forms for Returns.
10. Secretary,—to cause Returns to be bound &c.; to Report annually to Legislature, &c.; to do all other acts necessary to secure the execution of the provisions of this chapter,
11. Registrars may be chosen, in certain cases, in place of Town Clerks.

SECTION 1. The clerk of each city and town shall receive or obtain, and record, and index, the following facts concerning the births, marriages, and deaths, therein, separately numbering and recording the same in the order in which he receives them, designated in separate columns:

In the record of births, the date of the birth, the place of birth, the name of the child (if it have any), the sex and color of the child, the names and the places of birth of the parents, the occupation of the father, the residence of the parents, and the date of the record;

In the record of marriages, the date of the marriage, the place of marriage, the name, residence and official station of the person by whom married, the names and places of birth of the parties, the residence of each, the age and color of each, the condition of each



(whether single or widowed), the occupation, the names of the parents and the date of the record.

In the record of deaths, the date of the death, the name of the deceased, the sex, the color, the condition (whether single, widowed, or married), the age, the residence, the occupation, the place of death, the place of birth, the names and places of birth of the parents, the disease or cause of death, the place of burial, and the date of the record.

SECTION 2. Parents shall give notice to the clerk of their city or town of the births and deaths of their children; every householder shall give like notice of every birth and death happening in his house; the eldest person next of kin shall give such notice of the death of his kindred; the keeper of a workhouse, house of correction, prison, hospital, or almshouse, except the state almshouses at Tewksbury, Bridgewater, and Monson, and the master or other commanding officer of any ship shall give like notice of every birth and death happening among the persons under his charge. Whoever neglects to give such notice for the space of six months after a birth or death, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five dollars.

SECTION 3. Any physician having attended a person during his last illness, shall—when requested within fifteen days after the decease of such person—forthwith furnish for registration a certificate of the duration of the last sickness, the disease of which the person died, and the date of his decease, as nearly as he can state the same. If any physician refuses or neglects to make such certificate, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars to the use of the town in which he resides.

SECTION 4.\* Every sexton, undertaker, or other person having charge of a burial-ground, or the superintendent of burials having charge of the obsequies or funeral rites preliminary to the interment of a human body, shall forthwith obtain and return to the clerk of the city or town in which the deceased resided or the death occurred, the facts required by this chapter to be recorded by said officer concerning the deceased, and the person making such return shall receive from his city or town the fee of ten cents therefor.

The clerk, upon recording such facts, shall forthwith give to the person making such return, a certificate that such return has been made, which certificate such person shall deliver to the person having charge of the interment, if other than himself, before the burial when practicable, otherwise within seven days thereafter. When a burial takes place and no certificate is delivered as aforesaid, the sexton, undertaker, or other person having charge of the interment, shall forthwith give notice thereof to the clerk under penalty of twenty dollars.

SECTION 5. The clerk of each city and town shall annually on or before the first day of February, transmit to the secretary of the Commonwealth, certified copies of the records of the births, marriages, and deaths, which have occurred therein during the year ending on the last day of the preceding December.

SECTION 6. The record of the town clerk relative to any birth, marriage, or death, shall be *primâ facie* evidence, in legal proceedings,

of the facts recorded. The certificate signed by the town clerk for the time being shall be admissible as evidence of any such record.

SECTION 7.\* The clerk shall receive from his city or town for obtaining, recording, indexing, and returning to the secretary of the Commonwealth, the facts in relation to a birth, twenty cents; a marriage, ten cents; a death, twenty cents for each of the first twenty entries, and ten cents for each subsequent entry, as the same shall be certified by the secretary of the Commonwealth; but a city or town containing more than ten thousand inhabitants may limit the aggregate compensation allowed to their clerk. He shall forfeit a sum not less than twenty nor more than one hundred dollars for each refusal or neglect to perform any duty required of him by this chapter.

SECTION 8. The superintendents of the state almshouses at Tewksbury, Bridgewater, and Monson, shall obtain, record, and make return of the facts in relation to the births and deaths which occur in their respective institutions, in like manner as is required of town clerks. The clerks of said towns shall, in relation to the births and deaths of persons in said almshouses, be exempt from the duties otherwise required of them by this chapter.

SECTION 9. The secretary shall, at the expense of the Commonwealth, prepare and furnish to the clerks of the several cities and towns, and to the superintendents of the state almshouses, blank books of suitable quality and size to be used as books of record under this chapter, blank books for indexes thereto, and blank forms for returns, on paper of uniform size; and shall accompany the same with such instructions and explanations as may be necessary and useful. City and town clerks shall make such distribution of blank forms of returns furnished by the secretary as he shall direct.

SECTION 10. The secretary shall cause the returns received by him for each year to be bound together in one or more volumes with indexes thereto. He shall prepare from the returns such tabular results as will render them of practical utility, make report thereof annually to the legislature, and do all other acts necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this chapter.

SECTION 11. Any city or town containing more than ten thousand inhabitants, may choose a person other than the clerk to be registrar, who shall be sworn, and to whom all the provisions of this chapter concerning clerks shall apply. The returns and notices required to be made and given to clerks shall be made and given to such registrar under like penalties.

SECTION 12. The secretary of this Commonwealth shall prosecute, by an action of tort, in the name of the Commonwealth, for the recovery of any penalty or forfeiture imposed by this chapter.

SECTION 13. Any city or town may make rules and regulations to enforce the provisions of this chapter, or to secure a more perfect registration of births, marriages, and deaths, therein.

SECTION 5. [Marriage contracted by insane persons or idiots, void.]

SECTION 6. [Marriage of persons marrying out of the state in order to evade, &c., void.]

SECTION 7. Persons intending to be joined in marriage, shall, before their marriage cause notice thereof to be entered in the office of the clerk, or registrar of the city or town in which they respectively dwell, if within the State. If there is no such clerk or registrar in the place of their residence, the entry shall be made in an adjoining city or town.

SECTION 8. The clerk or registrar shall deliver to the parties a certificate under his hand, specifying the time when notice of the intention of marriage was entered with him, together with all facts in relation to the marriage required by law to be ascertained and recorded, except those respecting the person by whom the marriage is to be solemnized. Such certificate shall be delivered to the minister or magistrate in whose presence the marriage is to be contracted, before he proceeds to solemnize the same.

SECTION 9. If a clerk or registrar issues such certificate to a male under the age of twenty-one years, or a female under the age of eighteen years, having reasonable cause to suppose the person to be under such age, except upon the application or consent in writing of the parent, master, or guardian, of such person, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars; but if there is no parent, master, or guardian, in this State, competent to act, a certificate may be issued without such application or consent.

SECTION 10. The clerk or registrar may require of any person applying for such certificate, an affidavit sworn to before a justice of the peace for the county where the application is made, setting forth the age of the parties; which affidavit shall be sufficient proof of age to authorize the issuing of the certificate.

SECTION 11. Whoever applying for such certificate wilfully makes a false statement in relation to the age or residence, parent, master,

or guardian, of either of the parties intending marriage, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars.

SECTION 12. When a marriage is solemnized in another State between parties living in this State, and they return to dwell here, they shall, within seven days after their return, file with the clerk or registrar of the city or town, where either of them lived at the time, a certificate or declaration of their marriage, including the facts concerning marriages required by law, and for every neglect they shall forfeit ten dollars.

SECTION 13. No magistrate or minister shall solemnize a marriage, having reasonable cause to suppose either of the parties to be under the age mentioned in section nine, without the consent of the parent or guardian having the custody of the minor, if there is any in the State competent to act.

SECTION 14. Marriages may be solemnized by a justice of the peace in the county for which he is appointed, when either of the parties resides in the same county; and throughout the State by any minister of the gospel ordained according to the usage of his denomination, who resides within the State and continues to perform the functions of his office; but all marriages shall be solemnized in the city or town in which the person solemnizing them resides, or in which one or both of the persons to be married reside.

SECTION 15. Marriages among the people called Friends or Quakers may be solemnized in the manner heretofore used and practised in their societies.

SECTION 16. Every justice of the peace, minister, and clerk, or keeper of the records of the meeting wherein any marriages among the Friends or Quakers are solemnized, shall make a record of each marriage solemnized before him, together with all facts relating to the marriage required by law to be recorded. He shall also between the first and tenth days of each month return a copy of the record for the month next preceding, to the clerk or registrar of the city or town in which the marriage was solemnized, and shall when neither of the parties to a marriage resides in the city or town in which the marriage is solemnized, return a copy of the record of such marriage to the clerk or registrar of the city or town in which one or both parties reside. All marriages so returned shall be recorded by the clerk or registrar.

SECTION 17. Every person neglecting to make the returns required by the preceding section, shall forfeit for each neglect not less than twenty nor more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 18. A justice of the peace or minister who joins persons in marriage contrary to the provisions of this chapter, knowing that the marriage is not duly authorized, shall forfeit not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 19. Whoever undertakes to join persons in marriages knowing that he is not authorized so to do, shall be imprisoned in the jail or confined to hard labor for a term not exceeding six months, or pay a fine of not less than fifty nor more than two hundred dollars.

SECTION 20. [Unintentional informality does not invalidate marriage in other respects lawful.]

SECTION 21. The record of a marriage, made and kept as prescribed by law by the person before whom the marriage is solemnized, or by the clerk or registrar of any city or town, or a copy of such

record duly certified, shall be received in all courts and places as presumptive evidence of such marriage.

SECTION 22. [Admission of respondent, general repute, &c., competent evidence to prove the fact of marriage.]

SECTION 23. [Marriage in foreign countries by a consul or diplomatic agent valid, and certificate of such consul or agent presumptive evidence thereof.]

[General Statutes—Chapter 29.]

OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS.

SECTION 10. County, city and town records and files may be inspected and copied.]

SECTION 13. [Penalties; . . . . . for altering or mutilating any record, paper, or written document, a sum not exceeding fifty dollars,—for wrongfully detaining records, and other documents, fifty dollars.]

[General Statutes—Section 1 of Chapter 174.]

SENTENCE WHEN NO PUNISHMENT IS PROVIDED.

SECTION 1. In cases of legal conviction, where no punishment is provided by statute, the court shall award such sentence as is conformable to the common usage and practice in this State, according to the nature of the offence, and not repugnant to the constitution.

[Chapter 138.]

AN ACT CONCERNING THE REGISTRY AND RETURN OF MARRIAGES, BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

SECTION 1. The clerk of each city and town (except in such cities and towns as choose a registrar, under the eleventh section of the twenty-first chapter of the General Statutes, in which cases the provisions of this act shall apply to the registrar), for receiving or obtaining, recording, indexing, and returning the facts relating to marriages, births and deaths occurring therein, shall be entitled to receive therefrom the sums following, viz.: for each marriage, fifteen cents; for each birth, thirty cents; for each death returned to him by the persons specified in sections two, three and four of chapter twenty-one of the General Statutes, twenty cents for each of the first twenty entries, and ten cents for each subsequent entry; for each death not so returned but by him obtained and recorded, twenty cents.

SECTION 2. Chapter ninety-six of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-five, and so much of section seven of the twenty-first chapter of the General Statutes as is inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

## [Chapter 58.]

## AN ACT RELATING TO THE MARRIAGE OF NON-RESIDENT PARTIES.

SECTION 1. Persons living without the Commonwealth and intending to be joined in marriage within the Commonwealth, shall, before their marriage, cause notice of their intention to be entered in the office of the clerk or registrar of the city or town in which they propose to have the marriage solemnized; and no marriage between such parties shall be solemnized until they have delivered to the justice of the peace, or minister in whose presence the marriage is to be contracted, a certificate from such clerk or registrar, specifying the time when notice of the intention of marriage was entered with him, together with all facts in relation to the marriage required by law to be ascertained and recorded, except those respecting the person by whom the marriage is to be solemnized.

SECTION 2. Marriages may be solemnized by a justice of the peace in the county for which he is appointed.

SECTION 3. A justice of the peace or minister who joins persons in marriage contrary to the provisions of this act shall forfeit not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars.

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## [Chapter 145.]

## AN ACT FIXING THE FEES OF CLERKS AND REGISTRARS FOR THE REGISTRY AND RETURN OF BIRTHS.

SECTION 1. The clerk or registrar of a city or town shall receive the sum of fifty cents for receiving or obtaining, recording, indexing and returning the facts relating to each birth; but a city or town containing more than ten thousand inhabitants may limit the aggregate compensation allowed to their clerk or registrar.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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## [Chapter 202.]

## AN ACT RELATING TO THE FEES OF SEXTONS AND OTHERS.

SECTION 1. Section four of chapter twenty-one is hereby amended by striking out the word "ten" after the words "fee of," and inserting instead, thereof, the words "twenty-five."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

## STATISTICAL NOSOLOGY

ADOPTED FOR REGISTRATION IN MASSACHUSETTS.

The following plan of a Nomenclature and Classification of Diseases does not essentially differ from that authorized by the Registrar-General of England, to be used in the preparation of the "Weekly Return of Births and Deaths in London," and is also, with slight modifications, identical with that embodied in a report drawn up by William Farr, Esq., M. D., of London, for the consideration of the International Statistical Congress which met at Paris in September, 1855; which report was printed in the Appendix to the Sixteenth Registration Report of the Registrar-General, England.

[NOTE.—This page and those that follow contain two lists of causes of death. The first,—that on the left side,—may be called the **TABULAR LIST**, and comprises all the heads which it is proposed to admit into the complete tables (IX. and X.) and under which ALL deaths, from whatever cause are finally distributed. It represents those diseases which, under the same terms, or terms strictly synonymous with them, are found in practice to occur most frequently.

The **SUPPLEMENTAL LIST** is *subordinate* to the first, and contains the principal *special* diseases which it may be considered desirable to note. The figures in this list indicate the corresponding numbers of the tabular list under which such diseases are ultimately arranged.

Table VIII. includes both the Tabular and Supplemental lists; Tables IX. and X. the Tabular list only.]

NOTE.—Cases of “infantile fever” are classed with those of typhoid, relapsing, and other continued fevers, under one name “typhus.” Cases of “rheumatic fever” are classed with “rheumatism;” of “hemorrhage,” and “abscess,” with the diseases of the organs affected. Cases of death from cold, heat, drinking cold water, lightning, surgical operation, and exposure, are placed under “Otherwise” [V. 7]. As “stricture of the urethra” is almost invariably the result of gonorrhœa, it is classed as I. 2.—2.
