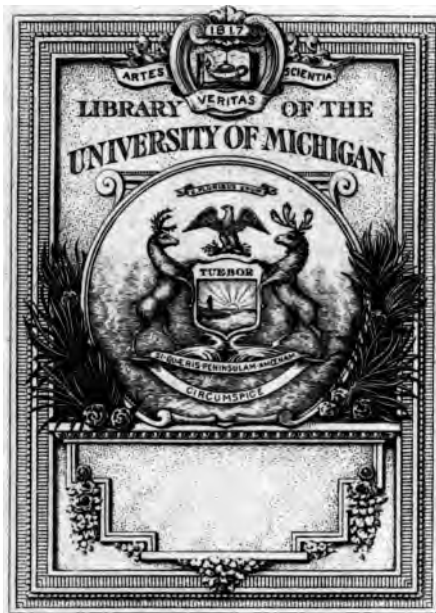

CLASSIFICATION OF MILITARY BOOKS.

The following pages represent a scheme of classification of military books on the Decimal System of Dr. Dewey. Of Part I. only so much is printed as is necessary to exhibit the plan followed. The Index in Part II. is practically complete. This scheme was completed in MS. in February, and a few copies of Part I. were printed in August, 1902. It was submitted to Dr. Dewey, State Librarian of New York, at Albany, for criticism, early in 1903. It has been revised and tested since that date at West Point and has been submitted to various officers for criticism—Major Wisser, Captains Willcox and Hero among the number. It will be adopted at West Point so soon as the scheme has been thoroughly revised. It is now printed for convenience in use and in order that it may be submitted to librarians, especially to those in charge of extensive military collections.

NOTE TO THE SECOND EDITION.

During the past twelve months the scheme has been thoroughly tested at West Point in re-classifying several thousand volumes. Minor changes have been suggested by experience, a few by correspondents, and it has been found desirable to print Part I. in somewhat greater detail for the sake of clearness. Accordingly it has been reprinted. In its present form the scheme will be adopted at West Point, and, it is hoped, at other army libraries. The book is intended as a supplement to the D. C. and must be used with it. It is found convenient to use Parker's Library Classification (N. Y. 1901) in connection with it, taking authors' names, etc., from its numbers, thus: Infantry Drill Regulations of the British Army go under the number 356.024 (3834), and so forth.
