


VI.A Elsculus Hippocástanum The common Horsechestnut.






Æsculus Hippocástanum.




Gymnócladus canadénsis. The Canadi an Gymnocladus, or Kentucky Coffee tree.

Sophòra japónica péndula. The drooping-branched Japanese Sophora.


