






- Integration with <u>Plausible Analytics</u>

- Supersedes <u>Google Analytics</u>
 <u>integration</u> from 2014
- Maintains user data privacy








Overview graph

 Track, filter, and download access data for your preferred time interval








Top Sources

 Sources of traffic to your account, collections, and archived web pages (click "Details" for all sources)








Top Pages

 Most visited pages, entry pages, and exit pages listed by number of visitors (click "Details" for all pages)








Location

 Web browsers and operating systems listed by number of visitors







Observations





- Top sources include search engines, the Wayback Machine, live site links and redirects, catalogs, finding aids
- 229 accounts integrated
 - 214 migrated, 15 new
- 6/2023 survey respondents (n=38):
 - 74% (28) report statistics to "others in my organization"
 - 50% (19) report monthly




