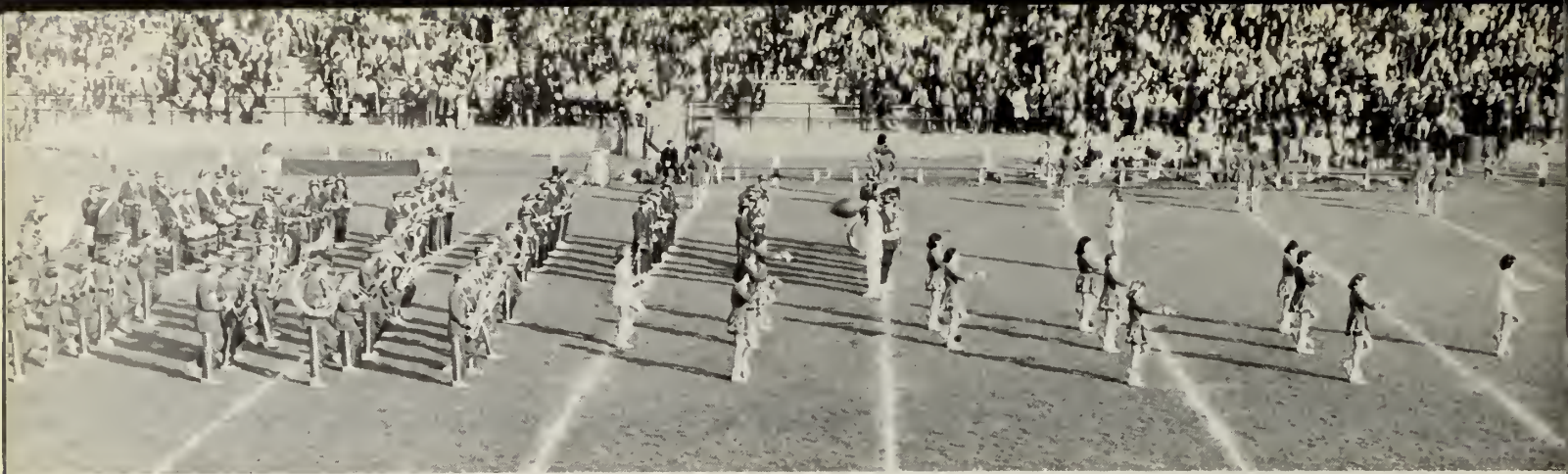
FIELD HOCKEY
