The idea of a Teen Center: a place where teens could congregate socially and work for the community was developed in Framingham in 1967. Bake sales, car washes, and fashion shows were organized to raise money for a building. In June, 1968 the Park Department gave the bleachers on A Street for a Center. After renovation work requiring over 1000 manhours from teens and adults and over $\$ 3,000$ worth of materials the Teen Center opened in March, 1969. The Teen Center is run completely by teens for teens. Chaperones are present during operating hours and a 9 -member adult board of advisors consults with the Board of Directors. The teens run the kitchen, treasury, clean-up, marshalling, maintenance, and public relations. Teen Center members have helped raise money for the Kiddie Camp, UNICEF, and the Hunger Hike; donated baskets of food and tur-

keys to underprivileged families of the town, held a Christmas Party for Head Start children from Saxonville, ushered and served refreshments for the Boys' Town Choir Performances, and helped start Teen Centers in Ashland and Holliston.

With over 300 North High members the Teen Center hopes to continue to play an active, vital role in the community.
