

1 4. A person so declared, is no longer a member
2 in good standing of the Church of Scientology and
3 cannot again become a member in good standing
4 until the person ceases his destructive actions
5 and becomes desirous of spiritual betterment and
6 can demonstrate, by his actions, that he no
7 longer seeks to prevent the spiritual betterment
8 of himself and his fellows.

8 5. Should a person who has been declared a
9 Suppressive Person feel that this declaration is
10 false, he does have recourse. He may petition
11 for a hearing before an impartial Committee of
12 fellow Scientologists who will weigh the facts of
13 the matter and come to a decision as to whether,
14 or not the Suppressive Person declare was
15 warranted. The Committee will either absolve the
16 person, or let the Suppressive Person declare
17 stand, depending upon the evidence.

16 6. A person who has been declared a Suppressive
17 Person has the option of seeking corrective
18 measures that will assist him to reach a level of
19 spiritual awareness where he realizes that he has
20 been destructive to himself and his fellows. Once
21 the person does this, he is, again, a member of
22 the Church of Scientology in good standing.

22 7. The person is given ample opportunity to
23 pursue these corrective measures. Should it
24 become obvious that the person has no intention
25 of doing so, then he is expelled from the Church
26 of Scientology and the Church has nothing further
27 to do with the person.

27 8. One of the basic tenets of Scientology is
28 that man is basically good. This applies to even

1 those persons who have been expelled. Therefore,
2 the Church always leaves the door to spiritual
3 enlightenment open. Should the person who has
4 been expelled from the Church, at some future
5 time, recant and sincerely wish to pursue a path
6 of spiritual enlightenment, the person will be
7 given an opportunity to be restored to membership
8 in good standing in the Church.


9 9. Once a person has been declared a Suppressive
10 Person and expelled from the Church of
11 Scientology and prior to any origination from the
12 person that he, again, desires to pursue a path
13 of spiritual enlightenment and betterment, the
14 Church originates no dealings with the person.
15 What the person does with his life once expelled
16 is of absolutely no concern to the Church. While
17 on a spiritual level it is always hoped that the
18 person will at some point in the future "return
19 to the fold", as it were, the Church takes no
20 action to precipitate that decision, nor to
21 dissuade the person from the path he has chosen
22 for himself.

23 10. As in all cases with declares of Suppressive
24 Persons, there has been no action, or harassment
25 directed at Gerry Armstrong, as a result of his
26 declare.

27 I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth
28 above and am competent to personally testify
thereto.
