DECLARATION OF GERALD ARMSTRONG

3 I, Gerald Armstrong, declare as follows:

4 1. I am a former staff member of the Sea Organization  
5 of Scientology. I held many executive positions within the  
6 organization and worked for Scientology's founder L. Ron Hubbard  
7 personally. In such capacities I had personal contact with Mr.  
8 Hubbard and was aware of the workings of the Church of  
9 Scientology and its sub-organizations.


10 2. On September 11, 1986 I received a phone call from  
11 A.I. Woodward, attorney for Nan McLean, in which he asked me to  
12 decode and explain the notations appearing on the "cc" (carbon  
13 copy) portion of Paula Dain's March 31st, 1982 letter to Don  
14 Randolph, Esq. The notations are "LA MAC" and "MAC 4."

15 3. The Scientology organizations were engaged in  
16 numerous lawsuits, and in connection with those, L. Ron Hubbard  
17 was frequently a party, and most often sought as a witness.  
18 Mr. Hubbard went into hiding to avoid involvement in litigation.  
19 Mr. Hubbard set up a Scientology sub-organization under his  
20 direction and control called Mission All Clear, which was coded  
21 MAC. The purpose of that "mission" was to supervise, control  
22 and dispose of all of the litigation so that it was all clear  
23 for L. Ron Hubbard to emerge from hiding. The designation "LA"  
24 refers to the Legal Affairs office of Scientology.

25 4. The appearance of the designations "MAC 4" and "LA  
26 MAC" on the letter are thus clear evidence that the litigation;  
27 i.e., the Paula Dain civil litigation, was controlled by  
28 Scientology.
