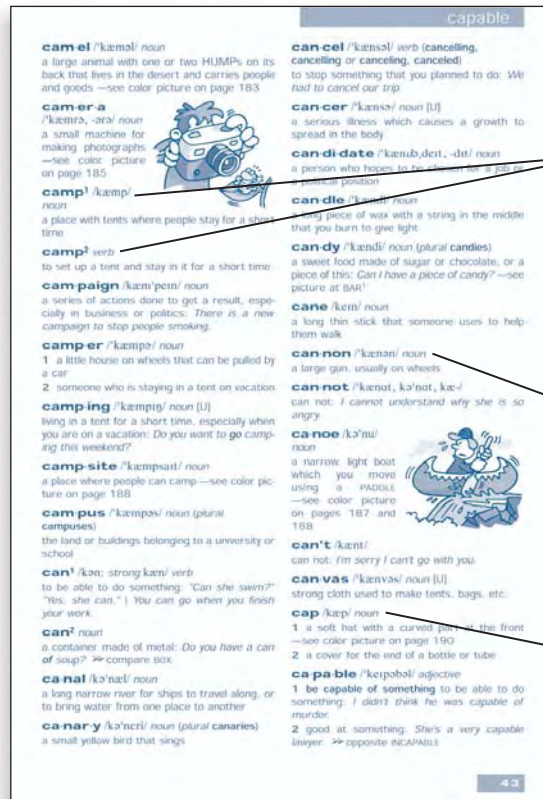

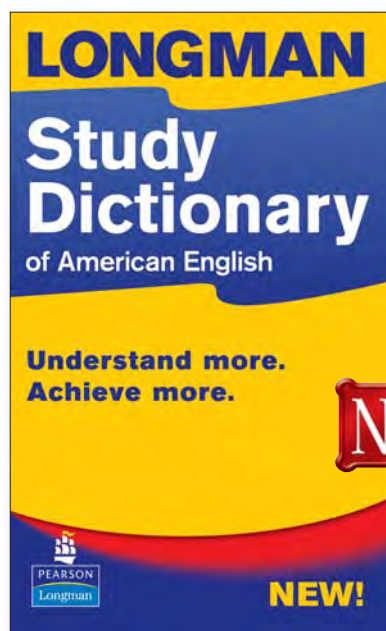

differ /dɪfər/ verb, formal

dig-fer /dɪfər/ verb, formal
to be different: How does the film differ from the book?

D **difference** /dɪfərəns/ noun

1 a way in which one thing is not the same as another: There are several differences between baseball and softball – one is that the ball in softball is bigger and softer. | What's the difference in price between the two cars? | I can't tell the difference between the two dogs (=I can't see how they are different from each other). **ANTONYM** similarity

2 make a difference = to have a good effect on a situation: Exercise can make a big difference in how you feel (=change the way you feel in an important way).

3 make no difference = to be unimportant or to have no effect: It makes no difference to me whether your hair is long or short – I like it both ways.

different /dɪfərənt/ adjective
not the same: My sister and I like different kinds of music. | Ben feels different from most kids at his school, because he doesn't like sports. **ANTONYM** the same
—differently adverb

diff-er-en-ti-ate /dɪfərəntʃɪ'eɪt/ **[Ac]**
verb, formal
to know that two things are different from each other: I can't differentiate between the colors red and green; the two colors look the same to me.

diff-ic-ult /dɪfɪkəlt/ adjective
not easy to do, understand, or deal with: The first question on the test was difficult, and I got it wrong. | It's difficult for us to guess what will happen. **SYNONYM** hard; **ANTONYM** easy

diff-ic-ulty /dɪfɪkəlti/ noun

1 a problem or something that causes trouble: I have difficulty (=have problems) getting to sleep. | She walks with difficulty, because she hurt her knees.

2 the quality of being difficult: The worksheets have different levels of difficulty.

dig /dɪg/ verb, dug /dʌg/ digging
to make a hole in the ground by moving earth: The kids had fun digging in the sand. | I dug a hole and put the plant in it.
PHRASAL VERBS
dig something into something
to push something hard into something else: She dug her fingernails into my arm.
dig something up
to take something out of the ground: The dog dug up a bone in the backyard.

di-gest /daɪ'dʒest/ verb
when you digest food, it changes in your stomach into a form your body can use: Some babies can't drink cow's milk because they can't digest it easily.
—digestible adjective easy to digest

di-ges-tion /daɪ'dʒestʃən/ noun
the process of digesting food
—digestive adjective relating to digestion

dig-it /dɪdʒɪt/ noun, formal
any of the numbers from 0 to 9: a four-digit number such as 9723

dig-ital /dɪdʒɪtəl/ adjective

1 using a system in which information is represented in the form of ones and zeros: It's a digital camera, so it doesn't have film.

2 giving information in the form of numbers: It is easy for children to read digital clocks.

dig-ni-fied /dɪɡnəfaɪd/ adjective
calm, serious, and making people feel respect: The professor was a tall, dignified old man.

dig-ni-ty /dɪɡnəti/ noun
calm, serious behavior that makes people respect you: Everyone respected her because she always behaved with great dignity.

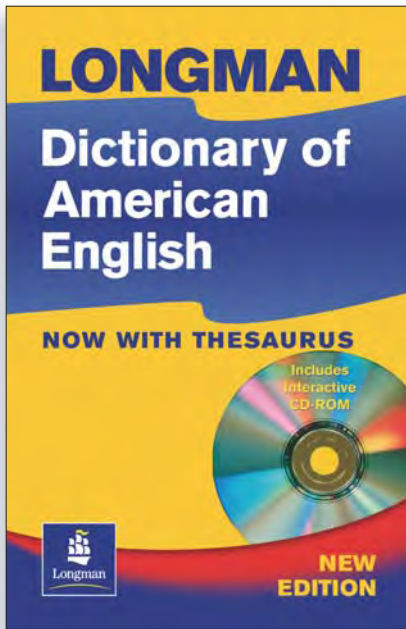
dike // noun
a wall or bank built to keep back water and prevent flooding.

di-lem-ma /daɪ'lema/ noun
a situation in which you have to make a difficult choice between two actions: This is my dilemma: should I ask him to the party, or should I wait and hope he asks me?

dil-i-gent /dɪlədʒənt/ adjective, formal
someone who is diligent works hard and carefully: Connie is a diligent student and always does extra work.
—diligently adverb —diligence noun the quality of being diligent

check up on sb/sth *phr. v.* to try to find out if someone is doing what s/he is supposed to be doing: *She was calling every ten minutes to check up on me.*

signing a check

check ^{n.}

1 MONEY [C] one of a set of printed pieces of paper that you can sign and use to pay for things: *a check for \$50* | *Can I pay by check?* | *I wrote her a check for \$300.* | *Did you cash the check (=get cash in exchange for the check)?*

2 EXAMINATION [C] a careful look at or test of something, to see if it is safe, correct, in good condition, etc.: *a security check* | *The building inspector must first do a safety check.* | *I want a check on the quality of all goods leaving the factory.* | *I want you to do/run a check on (=find out information about) this blood sample.*

3 CONTROL [C usually singular] something that controls something else and stops it from increasing: *The policy should act as a check on inflation.* | *We've kept/held the disease in check (=kept it under control) for over a year now.*

4 BILL [C] a list you are given in a restaurant showing what you have eaten and how much you must pay [= bill]: *Can I have the check, please?*

COLLOCATIONS

If you have eaten in a restaurant and are ready to pay, you **ask for the check**.

If someone who eats with other people pays for the whole meal, they **pick up the check**.

If people share the cost of the meal between them, they **split the check**.

5 MARK [C] a mark (✓) that you put next to an answer to show that it is incorrect or next to something on a list to show that you have dealt with it

6 SQUARES [C] a pattern of squares on something: *a tablecloth with red and white checks*

check-book /ˈtʃekbʊk/ *n.* [C] a book of checks

checked /tʃekd/ *adj.* having a regular pattern of different colored squares: *a checked skirt*

check-ered /ˈtʃekəd/ *adj.* **1** marked with squares of two different colors: *a checkered flag*

2 checkered past/history etc. periods of failure as well as success in someone's or something's past: *a cop with a checkered past*

check-ers /ˈtʃekəz/ *n.* [U] a game for two players, using 12 flat round pieces each and a special board with 64 squares

check-in *n.* **1** [U] the process of reporting your arrival at a hotel, airport, hospital, etc.: *Passengers should arrive early for check-in.*

2 [singular] a place where you report your arrival at an airport, hotel, etc.: *Be at the check-in counter at least two hours before your flight.* → **check in** at CHECK!

checking account *n.* [C] a bank account that you can take money out of at any time

check-list /ˈtʃeklɪst/ *n.* [C] a list of things you have to do for a particular job or activity

list, grocery list, shopping list, mailing list, price list, waiting list, guest list

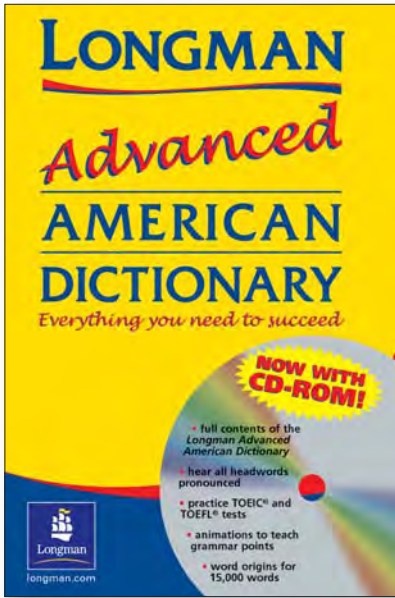
check-mate /ˈtʃekmeɪt/ *n.* [U] the position in a game of CHESS when the KING cannot escape and the game has ended

check-out counter /ˈtʃek-aʊt ˈkaʊntə/ *n.* [C] the place in a SUPERMARKET where you pay for things

check-point /ˈtʃekpɔɪnt/ *n.* [C] a place, especially at a border between countries, where an official person stops people and vehicles to examine them

check-up, check-up /ˈtʃek-ʌp/ *n.* [C] an occasion when a doctor or DENTIST examines you to see if you are healthy: *Dentists recommend regular check-ups.*

ched-dar /ˈtʃedz/ *n.* [U] a firm smooth yellow or orange cheese

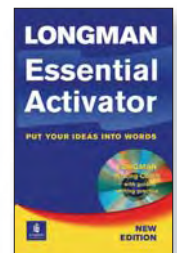

2 listen to sb/sth [T not usually in progressive] to listen to what someone is saying, the music they are playing etc.: *I heard a great new song on the radio. | Jeff, did you hear what I said?* | [hear sb do sth] *We went to hear Todd's band play at Mr. B's.*

3 be told sth [I, T not usually in progressive] to be told or find out a piece of information: *I heard a rumor that Katya was coming back. | I heard (that) I heard they did a lousy job on the roof. | [+ about] How did you hear about it? | [hear sth about sb] It's nice to meet you, I've heard a lot about you. | [hear what/how/who etc.] Did you hear what Sammy's latest idea is? | I'm glad to hear (that) your mother's feeling better. | "Nina quit her job." "Yeah, so I heard." (=I was told this information before) *Hammell said he heard through/on the grapevine* (=found out about something in conversation) that Payne had had a heart attack. | *I've heard it said* (=heard people say) that animals love you unconditionally.*

4 in court **hear a case** to listen to what is said in a court of law, and make a decision: *The case will be heard on July 16.*

SPOKEN PHRASES

5 (do) you hear (me)? said when you are giving someone an order and want to be certain that they will obey you: *Be home by ten, you hear?*

6 I hear you a) used to say that you understand what someone has told you to do and you will obey them: *"The bottom line is we have to finish on time." "Okay, I hear you." b) used to say that you agree strongly with what someone just said: *"There's just too much junk on TV these days." "Yeah, I hear you."**

7 sb won't hear of it used to say that someone will not do something, even though you think it would be safer or better for them: *I think Clarence should stop driving, but he won't hear of it.*

8 have not heard the last of sb used to say that someone or something will cause more problems for you: *I'm going to sue him. He hasn't heard the last of me.*

9 sb will never hear the end of it used to say that someone will criticize or make jokes about something you have done: *Marya cried at the wedding, and her brothers will never let her hear the end of it.*

10 be hearing things to imagine you can hear a sound when really there is no sound: *Oh, you are there. Good, for a second I thought I was hearing things.*

11 I can't hear myself think said when the place where you are is too noisy: *The boys were being so loud I could hardly hear myself think.*

12 you could hear a pin drop used to say that a place was extremely quiet: *You could hear a pin drop in the auditorium during Norway's speech.*

13 have you heard the one/joke/story about... used when asking someone if they know a joke: *Have you heard the one about the Norwegian and the Swede at the doctor's office?*

14 I heard that **SPOKEN** used to say that you strongly agree with what someone has just said: *"Sneakers have sure gotten expensive." "I heard that!"*

15 now hear this! **OLD USE** used to introduce an important official announcement

16 Hear! Hear! said after a speech or in a meeting when you agree with the person who is speaking

671 **heart**

hear from sb phr. v. [T not in progressive] **1** to get news or information from someone: *Have you heard from Francis at all?* **2** to listen to someone giving their opinion: *We'll be hearing from the new Vice President for finance at the meeting.*

hear of sb/sth phr. v. [T] **have heard of sb/sth** to know that someone or something exists because you have been told about them: *I've heard of Louis de Bernieres, but I've never read anything by him. | Have you ever heard of a band called Big Star?*—see also **UNHEARD OF**

hear sb out phr. v. [T not in passive] to listen to all of what someone wants to tell you, without interrupting them: *Look, I know you're mad, but at least hear me out.*

USAGE NOTE: HEAR

WORD CHOICE: hear, listen

Use **hear** when you mean that a sound comes to your ears: *I heard loud music coming from the room next door.* Use **listen** when you mean you want to hear something and pay attention to it: *I was listening to music when the phone rang.*

hear-er /'hɪə/ n. [C] someone who hears something

hear-ing /'hɪərɪŋ/ n. **1** [U] the sense which you use to hear sounds: *My hearing isn't as good as it used to be.*—see also **HARD OF HEARING** **2** [C] a meeting of a court or special committee to find out the facts about a case: *a public hearing* **3** **give sb a (fair) hearing** to give someone an opportunity to explain their actions, ideas, or opinions: *Korb was given a fair hearing by the committee.* **4** **in sb's hearing** **NORMAL** if you say something in someone's hearing, you say it where they can hear you: *Don't scold your child in his friends' hearing.*

hearing aid /'hɪərɪŋ aɪd/ n. [C] a small piece of equipment that you put in or behind your ear to make sounds louder if you cannot hear well

hearing-im-paired /'hɪərɪŋ ɪm'paɪəd/ adj. **1** unable to hear well **2** the hearing-impaired people who are unable to hear well

hear-ken, harken /'hɑːkən/ v. [I + to] **LITERARY** to listen

hear-say /'hɪəseɪ/ n. [U] something that you have heard about from other people, but do not know to be true: *Hearsay is not allowed as evidence in court.*

hearse /hɜːs/ n. [C] a large car used to carry a dead body in a CASKET at a funeral

Hearst /hɜːst/, **Wil-liam Ran-dolph** /'wɪljəm 'rændəlf/ (1863–1951) a U.S. businessman who owned many popular newspapers

heart /hɑːt/ n.

1 **body** [C] the part of your body in your chest that pumps blood through your body: *Eating too many fatty foods is bad for the heart. | My heart was beating so fast I thought it would burst. | He's had heart trouble for years.*—see picture at **RESPIRATORY**

2 **(emotional) love** [C] the part of you that is able to feel strong emotions, such as love: *I knew in my heart that I wouldn't see him again. | I was hoping with all my heart that you would win. | It would break his heart (=make him very sad) to move out of his own home. | It broke her heart when Doug left her. | The novel takes a dark look at affairs of the heart (=matters relating to love). | I believe with my heart and soul that we will overcome this (=I believe it completely).*

3 **your chest** [C] usually singular] the part of your chest near your heart: *Put your hand on your heart and repeat after me.*

4 **shape** [C] a shape used to represent love—see picture at **SHARP**

5 **the heart of sth a)** the main or most important part of something: *The issue is at the heart of Reddin's campaign. | Eckert wants to get to the heart of the problem, so it can be presented in the*

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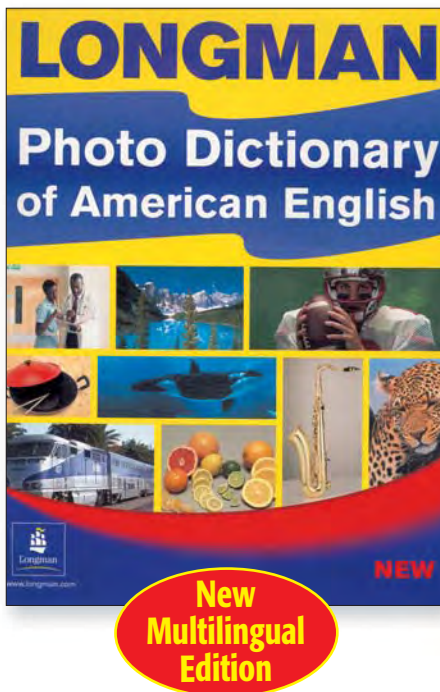

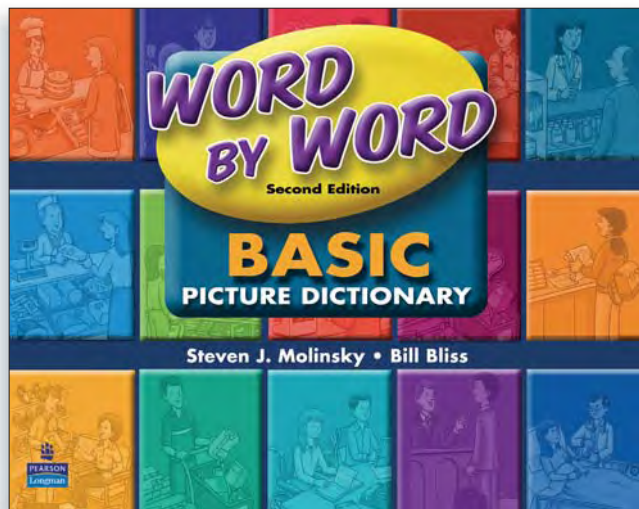

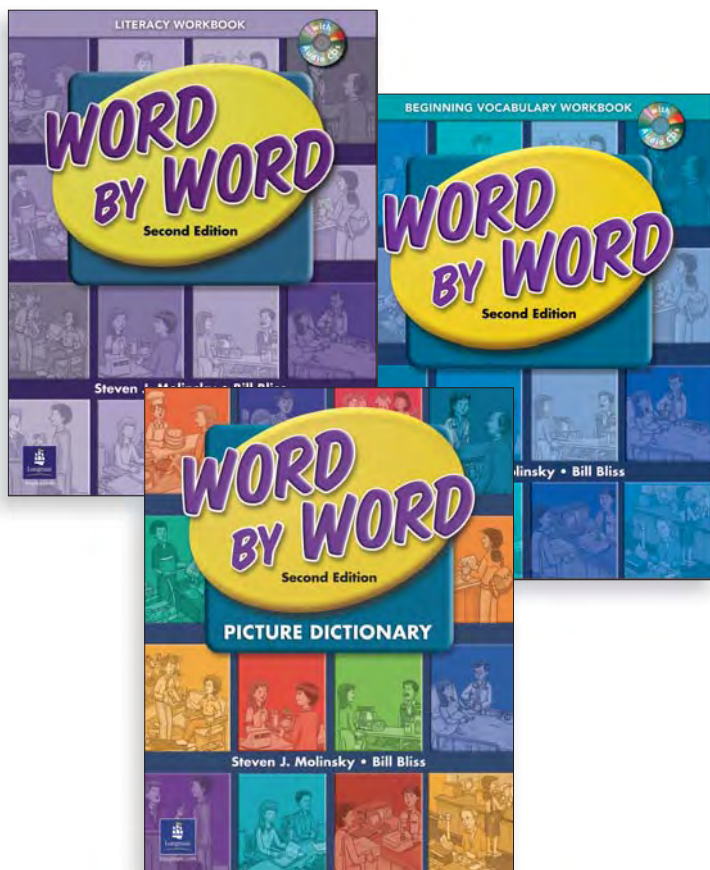
