Welcome to my first column for ART SHOW. I've done this sort of thing before, but it's been awhile so bear with me. I've been collecting undergrounds (also known as "comix" or "U.G.'s") for about 10 years and have a fairly thorough collection. I won't deny that it's a spin-off from my old comic book collecting as a kid. Feel free to comment or write as communication is an exchange.

Many of us know little enough of American Indian culture and what we do get is often distorted by T.V. and movies to serve those media's situations. What we get from White Comanche by "Jaxon" (Last Gasp, P.O. Box 212, Berkeley, CA 94705, \$1.25) is far superior. It's the story of a white girl captured and raised by Comanches. His list of source material includes over 30 books and his treatment of Comanche culture appears as scholarly as any presentation I've read. Not only is it a serious piece, but interesting and well developed. By necessity, u.g.'s have produced people who do their own art, storyline, inking, and dialogue and Jaxon has always risen strongly to each challenge. I've always thought Jaxon's artwork was grossly unrecognized--it's superlative--and his story-telling capacity has always been excellent. It's one of the best comix to come out this year and Jaxon has single-handedly raised the level of u.g.'s by half a notch. Unfortunately, due to the limitations of comix distribution it will fall into too few hands. Suffice to say that if I were a U.S. History teacher, it'd be required reading.

I've been collecting u.g.'s from England as well as other countries for years now and the U.S. still produces the best u.g.'s but when some of "them foreigners" get into graphic art in general, they have a lot to say, as Heavy Metal will indicate. Streetquomix #3 - \$1.50 from the Arts Lab Press, Tower Street, Birmingham B19 3UY England, is one of the best comix from England in years...maybe ever. The whole thing is damn good, with really engaging cartooning and articles but one story, City Tales, tells of a solitary man entering the city in the near future after a holocaust. The creative layout and terrific artwork gives this story a sledgehammer impact that is devastating. I'm very impressed! Check Comic Collector's ad in TBG.


Clearly two of the funniest men in undergrounds are Gilbert Shelton and Dave Schrier whose Fabulous Furry Freak Bros. have become the Marx Bros. of hippy culture. Freak Bros. #5, also called Grass Roots, is a barrel of laughs. I saved the book for two months and finally broke down and read it, which is sorta like delaying dessert for an hour. The 3 Freak Bros. this time strike it rich and move to the country to get away from it all and that, as the saying goes, is where the fun begins. The Freak Bros. #5 is a guaranteed hour of fun for only 6 bits from Rip Off Press, Box 14158, San Francisco, CA 94114. There was talk of the Freak Bros. coming out with a full length cartoon movie called Gone With The Weed, but so far no big news.

How can I not mention

Mr. Natural #3? One of the grand—
daddies of the underground comix move—
ment, Robert Crumb, early on took pot—
shots at every sacred cow in sight and
this time is no different. This time
however, he takes a shot at comic fans,
meditation, religion and himself. Fans
are always grousing over Crumb's dis—
dain for comic collecting (especially
since he collects old 78 RPM blues
records), but we're no more sacred in
his eyes than he is. Just Great!

At the expense of an abuse of power, let me just say that anyone interested in an underground developed from the perspective of a black college student from Newark, N.J., send me \$1.50 pp (Bruce Sweeney, 82 Waltham St. Boston, MA 02118). It's a good first effort and it's fun to read and the artist has a good comic format style. Whole Wheat #1, only 150 available and an improved #2 on the way! It's funny, insightful and fresh. Whaddaya want for \$1.50? Send an age statement—big kids only.

I promised ART SHOW to "calls 'em as I sees 'em' and Hot Stuf' #4, \$1.50 from Sal Quartuccio, 770 E. 45th Street, Brooklyn, N.Y. 11203, should not be seen. Hot Stuf' #1-3 has been running O.K. to Good and I suppose in competition with Star Reach, Quack and First Kingdom for the mature comic consumer market. The covers back and front are dynamite, but after that it's a screeching halt. It's about as imaginative as an old Army recruiting poster. Gray Morrow's Orion is just another sword & sorcery tale that plods along issue after issue. It's been done to death. Mercy is about a talking spaceship computer and a spaceman going mad. Quick, class, what famous science fiction movie does that make you recall? The Vanguard is a cheap Spirit imitation. It's dull and bo-o-ring and we hope that #5 will be a good deal more competitive.









