The Illinois Arts Council (IAC), a state agency, encourages growth and development of the arts throughout Illinois. Through special programs, services and grants, the Council provides financial and technical assistance to schools and non-profit organizations interested in developing quality arts-in-education programming.

Arts-in-Education Programs and Grants

Eligibility

The following sites are eligible to submit an AIE Residency Program grant application

- non-profit K-12 Illinois schools or school districts
- community colleges
- local arts councils
- non-profit arts centers, community or neighborhood organizations

Residency Program Applicants Should...

- develop a broad-based steering committee to plan, coordinate and assess the project
- select an artist or company from the **IAC 1999-2000 AIE Artists Roster** and plan the project collaboratively with that artist
- provide a cash match of 40% of the total residency cost

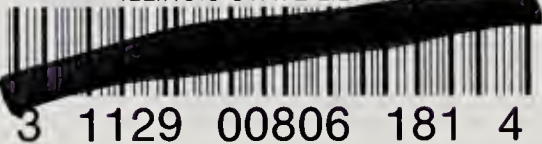
The AIE Residency Program

This program provides support for artist residencies in schools and communities statewide. Professional artists work primarily with students and may also provide workshops for teachers, parents and other community members. The artist(s) selected to conduct the residency must be listed in the **IAC 1999-2000 AIE Artists Roster** which includes individual dancers, media artists, musicians, theater artists, traditional ethnic and folk artists, visual artists, writers and performing arts companies.

Artists may work up to 20 hours per week in residencies lasting from one week to six months. This program introduces students, teachers and parents to working with a professional artist and can be used to enhance an existing arts program, to present a unique arts experience or to integrate arts into other areas of student studies.

The application deadline for the 1998-1999 Arts-In-Education Residency Program is February 15, 1998.

Eligibility

The following sites are eligible to submit an ArtsResource Program grant application:

- individual or consortia of public elementary, junior high or high schools
- individual or consortia of school districts with the approval of their superintendents
- private non-profit K-12 schools

ArtsResource Program Applicants Should...

- show previous experience utilizing artists in the classroom
- have chosen to implement the Illinois State Board of Education's recommendations for learning in the fine arts
- provide a 1:1 minimum cash match to the IAC grant

The ArtsResource Program

These grants are designed to support schools or school districts that seek to work with artists as project consultants for new teacher training initiatives in curriculum development or student assessment.

The goal of the ArtsResource Program is to assist teachers and arts specialists to meet their local school improvement plans for the fine arts by expanding their own skills and knowledge in the arts. Artists are selected by the site and engaged in a collaborative planning process with teachers to determine the project's goals and the appropriate steps to implement the project.

Schools and school districts that are making the arts an integral part of their students' education by encouraging greater teacher participation in the development of arts education strategies are encouraged to apply. Funds will be made available to the selected sites upon the IAC's approval of their submitted Intent to Apply form.

Intent-to-Apply forms for the ArtsResource Program will be available after March 1, 1998 and must be returned by May 1, 1998.

Individuals who are blind, visually impaired or learning impaired, may obtain assistance regarding Illinois Arts Council applications and written materials by contacting the 504 Access Coordinator at the IAC office.
