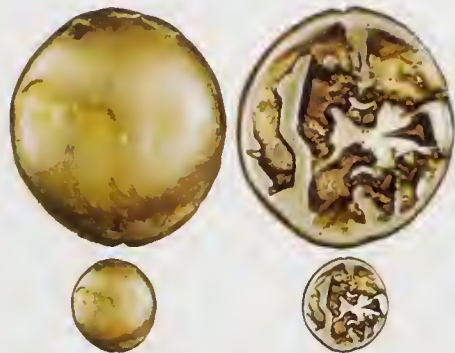

Little is known about Jotapian, although it was said that he boasted of a relationship with Severus Alexander. His unusual name is attested in its feminine form 'Jotape' in the royal houses of Commagene and Emisa. It seems that he led a short-lived revolt in Syria in the autumn of 249 while Philip I was still emperor. The extreme rarity of his coins indicates that the revolt was brief and the crude style of the extant examples indicates that the revolt was geographically confined; only 17 genuine antoniniani struck in his name are cited by Bland, but this die combination was not recorded by him
