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IS ir Hans Sloane of Chelfea, in the county of Middlefex, Baronet, do make this codicil to be annexed to my last will and testament as follows. Whereas I have in and by my faid Will given fome directions about the fale and disposition of my museum, or collection of rarities herein more particularly mentioned : Now I do hereby revoke my faid Will as far as relates thereto, and I do direct and appoint concerning the fame in the following Manner. Having had from my youth a strong inclination to the ftudy of plants, and all other productions of nature; and having through the courfe of many years with great labour and expence, gathered together whatever could be procured either in B OUL

our own or foreign countries that was rare and curious; and being fully convinced that nothing tends more to raife our ideas of the power, wifdom, goodnefs, providence, and other perfections of the Deity, or more to the comfort and well being of his creatures than the enlargement of our knowledge in the works of nature, I do Will and defire that for the promoting of these noble ends, the glory of God, and the Good of man, my collection in all its branches may be, if poffible, kept and preferved together whole and intire in my manor house, in the parish of Chelsea, situate near the physic garden, given by me to the company of apothecaries for the fame purpofes; and having great reliance and confidence that the Right Hon. Hon. and other perfons hereafter named will be influenced by the fome principles, and faithfully and confcientioufly discharge the truft hereby repofed in them, I do give, devife and bequeath unto the Right Hon. Charles Sloane Cadogan, Efq;

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Efq; Hans Stanley, Efq; William Sloane, Efq; the Rev. Sloane Elfemere, Doctor in Divinity and the rector of Chelfea for the time being; Martin Folkes, Efq; and the prefident of the Royal Society for the time being; Sir Paul Methuen, James Weft, Efq; and the Treasurer of the Royal Society for the time being; the two fecretaries of the Royal Society for the time being; Samuel Clarke, Efq; the Hon. Richard Arundell, Efq; Joseph Andrews, Esq; Mr. Joseph Ames, Mr. Henry Baker, the Rev. James Bradley, Doctor in Divinity, Aftron. Reg. Sir Thomas Burnet, Knt. Mr. Peter Collinfon, Sir John Evelyn, Bart. John Fuller of Suffex, Efq; the Rev. Stephen Hales, Doctor in Divinity; Theodore Jacobson, Esq; Smart Lethieullier, Esq; Sir James Lowther, Bart. John Milner, Efq; Mr. James Empfon and Mr. William Watfon; all that my collection or mulæum, at, in, or about my manor house at Chelsea aforefaid, which confifts of too great a variety to be particularly defcribed. But I mean all my library of books, drawings, manuferipts, prints, medals and coins, antient and modern, antiquities, feals, &c. cameas and intaglio's, &c. pre-

[7] precious stones, agates, jaspers, &c. vessels, &c. of agate, jasper, &c. chrystals, mathematical instruments, drawings and pictures, and all other things in my faid collection or mufæum, which are more particularly defcribed, mentioned and numbered, with fhort histories or accounts of them, with proper references in certain catalogues by me made, containing thirty-eight volumes in folio, and eight volumes in quarto, except fuch framed pictures as are not marked with the word (collection) to have and to hold to them and their fucceffors or affigns for ever; to the intent only that the fame and every part and parcel of my faid collection or mufæum may be vefted in the faid Right Honourable and Honourable, and other perfons upon the trufts, and for the uses and purposes, and subject to the feveral limitations and directions hereafter particularly specified concerning the fame: and for the rendering this my intention more effectual, that the faid Col-

lection may be preferved and continued intire in its utmost perfection and regularity; and being affured that nothing will conduce more to this purpose, than placing the same under the direction and care of learned, experienced and judicious perfons who are above all low and mean views, I do earneftly defire that the king, his royal highness the prince of Wales, his royal highness William duke of Cumberland, the archbishop of Canterbury for the time being, the right honourable Philip lord Hardwick, and the lord high chancellor for the time being, the lord prefident of the council for the time being, the lord privy feal for the time being, the lord fleward of his majefty's houshold for the time being, the lord chamberlain of his majefty's houshold for the time being, his grace Charles duke of Richmond, his grace John duke of Montague, his grace Holles duke of Newcastle, his grace John duke of Bedford, and the two principal secretaries of ftate

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state for the time being; the right honourable John earl of Sandwich, and the lord high admiral, or the first lord commissioner of the admiralty for the time being; the right honourable Henry Pelham, Efq; and the lord high treasurer, or the first lord commissioner of the treafury for the time being, and the chancellor of the exchequer for the time being, the lord chief juftice of the king's bench for the time being, the lord chief justice of the common pleas for the time being, the lord chief baron of the exchequer for the time being, the lord bishop of London for the time being, the lord bishop of Winchester for the time being, the right honourable Archibald duke of Argyle, the right honourable Henry earl of Pembroke, the right honourable Philip earl of Chefterfield, the right honourable Richard earl of Burlington, the right honourable Henry lord Montford, the right honourable Arthur Onflow, Efq; and the fpeaker of the House of Commons for the time being, the

the honourable lord Charles Cavendifh, the right honourable Charles lord Cadogan, the right honourable John earl of Verney, and the right honourable George lord Anfon, will condefcend fo far as to act and be vifitors of my faid mufæum and collection. And I do hereby, with their leave, nominate and appoint them vifitors thereof, with full power and authority for any five or more of them to enter my faid collection or mufæum at any time or times, to peruse, supervise and examine the fame and the management thereof; and to visit, correct and reform from time to time as there may be occafion, either jointly with the faid truftees, or separately, upon application to them for that purpole, or otherwife, all abuses, defects, neglects, or mismanagements that may happen to arife therein, or touching or concerning the perfon or perfons, officer or officers that are or shall be appointed to attend the fame. And my will is, and I do hereby request and defire, that

that the faid truftees, or any feven or more of them do make their humble application to his majefty or to parliament, at the next feffions after my decease, as shall be thought most proper, in order to pay the full and clear fum of twenty thousand pounds of lawful money of Great-Britain, unto my executors or the furvivors of them, within twelve months after my decease, in confideration of the faid collection or mufæum : It not being, as I apprehend or believe, a fourth of their real and intrinsic value; and also to obtain fuch fufficient and effectual powers and authorities, for vefting in the faid trustees all and every part of my faid collection or mufæum before mentioned in all its branches; and alfo my faid capital manor houfe, with fuch gardens and out-houfes as shall thereunto belong, and be used by meat the time of my decease, in which it is my defire the fame shall be kept and preferved ; and alfo the water of, or belonging to, my manor of Chelfea comcoming from Kenfington, fubject to furnishing or fupplying the Lord Bishop of Winchefter's houfe as is now ufed; and alfo all that the advowfon prefentation or right of patronage of the church of Chelsea: To the end, the fame premiffes may be abfolutely vefted in the faid truftees, for the preferving and continuing my faid collection or mufæum in fuch manner as they shall think most likely to answer the public benefit by me intended; and also obtain as aforefaid, a fufficient fund or provifion, for maintaining and taking care of my faid collection and premiffes, and for repairing and fupporting my faid manor houfe, water-work and premises, to be vested in the faid trustees for ever : And I do hereby further direct and appoint, that my executors do and shall, upon payment of the faid fum of twenty thoufand pounds, deliver or cause to be delivered unto the faid truftees, or any feven or more of them, for, and in the name of all of them, in the prefence of the faid vifitors,

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or any five or more of them, as well the possession of my faid manor house and gardens at Chelfea aforefaid, as alfo all my collection or mufæum before mentioned and defcribed, and every part thereof in all its branches, whole and intire, as the fame shall be found in my faid manor houfe, according to the faid catalogues, and together with the feveral volumes of catalogues thereunto belonging. And further, my will is, and I do hereby alfo direct and appoint, that in cafe his majesty or the parliament do accept the faid offer, and do pay the faid fum of twenty thousand pounds unto my executors or the furvivor of them, that then my faid executors do, within fix months after fuch payment as aforementioned, and obtaining proper powers for effectually vefting in the faid truftees all my faid Collection, and my faid capital house and gardens, with their appurtenances, water and advowson, presentation or right of patronage of the church of Chelfea as aforefaid ; C 2

aforefaid; together with my heir or heirs at law, and all other proper parties, do and fhall join in and execute fuch acts, deeds, or conveyances, as fhall be thought requifite and neceffary for the more perfect and abfolute vefting, conveying, and affuring the faid premiffes in, and to the faid truftees and their affigns or fucceffors for ever, for the ufes, intents and purpofes herein mentioned and intended.

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And my Will is, and I do hereby impower and direct, that- the faid truftees, or any feven or more of them, do and fhall, in convenient time after payment of the faid fum of twenty thoufand pounds unto my faid executors, or the furvivors of them as aforefaid, meet together from time to time, as often as fhall be thought fit, and there make, conflitute and eftablifh (to be afterwards ratifyed and approved by the vifitors hereby appointed, or any five or more of them) fuch ftatutes, rules, and ordinances, and to make and and appoint fuch officers and fervants for the attending, managing, preferving, and continuing of my faid mufæum, or collection and premiffes, for ever, with fuch falaries, payments, or allowances to them refpectively, as fhall feem meet and neceffary.

And further, my Will is, and I do hereby order and direct, that in cafe any difference or difpute fhall happen to arife by or between the faid truftees touching the faid premiffes, which cannot be adjufted or fettled among themfelves, then and in fuch cafe, and as often as the fame fhall happen, the vifitors hereby appointed, or any five or more of them, fhall and are hereby authorized and impowered, to hear and determine in the moft fummary way, fuch difference or difpute, whole order or determination fhall be final.

And it is alfo my Will and defire, that all fuch other powers and authorities may be added or vefted, as well in the faid intended truftees, as in the vifitors hereby appointed, as fhall by the the legiflature be thought most proper and convenient, for the better management, order, and care of my faid collection and premiss.

And further, it is my Will, and I do hereby declare and direct, that the

faid advowfon, prefentation, and right of patronage of the church of Chelfea, fhall be filled up from time to time, as often as the fame fhall become vacant, by fuch perfon or perfons as the truftees hereby appointed, or the major part of them, fhall elect, prefent, nominate, or appoint.

And I do hereby further requeft and defire, that the truffees hereby appointed, or the major part of them, with the confent of the vifitors, or major part of them, and alfo my heirs and executors, and every of them, will concur, as far as in them refpectively lies, in promoting this my intention, and of perpetuating my faid collection as afore mentioned, with their beft endeavours, and for obtaining payment of the faid fum of twenty thousand pounds as aforefaid, and and for fettling and affuring the faid mufæum or collection and premiffes, manor-house and garden, with their appurtenances, water, and advowfon, upon the truftees hereby appointed, and for making a provision or fund for maintaining and fupporting the fame for ever, as before mentioned : And in order that there may be always a fufficient number of truftees subfifting as far as may be, my Will is, and I do hereby direct and defire, that within convenient time after the decease of any feven of the faid truftees herein before particularly named, or any other feven of the truftees for the time being, or any lefs number, if they fo pleafe, then and in fuch cafe, and fo often as the fame shall happen, the furvivors of fuch trustees, or any feven or more of them, shall and may at their meetings proceed to the election or choice of fuch other perfon or perfons as they shall think fit to be trustees, in the room of fuch of them as shall happen fo to die; and the perfon or perfons fo

fo elected and chosen, shall be invested with the same powers and authorities in and over the premisses, as the truftees hereby named, so as that the number of trustees never exceed fifty at any one time.

And my Will alfo is, and I do direct, that (for continuing a fufficient number of vifitors) upon or after the. decease of any five of the visitors herein before particularly named, or any five of the vifitors for the time being, or of any lefs number if they fo pleafe, then and in fuch cafe, and fo often as the fame shall happen, the furvivors of fuch vifitors, or any five or more of them, shall and may elect and chuse fuch other perfon or perfons as they shall think fit, provided they be not truffees in the room of fuch of them as shall happen to die; and the perfon or perfons fo elected and chofen, shall be invested with the same powers and authorities in and over the premisses, as the vifitors hereby named, fo as the number of vifitors never exceed

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exceed more than thirty at any one time.

And I do hereby declare, that it is my defire and intention, that my faid mufæum or collection be preferved and kept in my faid manor-house at Chelfea aforefaid, by the faid truftees and vifitors, and that the fame may be, from time to time, vifited and feen by all perfons defirous of feeing and viewing the fame, under fuch ftatutes, directions, rules, and orders, as fhall be made, from time to time, by the faid truftees, or any feven or more of them, to be afterwards ratified by the faid vifitors (or any five or more of them, as aforefaid) that the fame may be rendered as useful as possible, as well towards fatisfying the defires of the curious, as for the improvement, knowledge and information of all perfons; and it is for this purpose I have hereby reposed a fincere trust and confidence in my right honourable, honourable,

nourable, and other trustees and visitors hereby appointed.

But in cafe payment of the faid fum of twenty thousand pounds shall not be had and obtained, and made unto my executors, or the furvivors of them, within twelve months next after my decease, and no such act of parliament shall be obtained for settling, preferving, establishing, maintaining, and continuing my faid collection and premiffes in manner aforefaid; then, and not otherwife, my Will is, and I do in fuch cafe hereby direct, that my faid executors or the furvivors of them, do and fhall fell and dispose, or cause to be fold and difpofed of all and every part of my faid collection ,or mufæum as before defcribed, together with the catalogues thereto belonging unto, or for the use of the royal academy of fciences at Peterfburgh, provided that the faid royal academy of fciences at Petersburgh, or the managers and directors

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rectors thereof, or others on their behalf impowered, do and fhall, within twelve months next after notice thereof, fignified or given to the embaffador, refident or envoy of or from the Czarina or Empress of Russia, or of the Emperor of Ruffia for the time being, by my faid executors or furvivors of them, pay or cause to be paid unto my executors, or the furvivor or furvivors of them, and to be deemed as part of my perfonal estate, the full and clear fum of twenty thousand pounds of lawful money of Great-Britain; and in cafe payment of the faid fum of twenty thousand pounds shall not be made at or within the time mentioned above for that purpose, by the managers or directors of the faid Royal Academy of Sciences at Petersburgh, or any other on that behalf impowered, then my Will is, and I do hereby direct and appoint, that my executors or the furvivors of them, do and shall fell and dispose, or cause to be fold and disposed of, all and every part of D_2 my

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my faid collection or mufæum as before defcribed, with the catalogues thereunto belonging, unto or for the use of the royal academy of sciences at Paris, provided that the faid Royal Academy of Sciences at Paris, or the managers, directors or others impowered on their behalf, do and shall within twelve months next after notice thereof fignified or given, to the embassador, refident, or envoy of or from the court of France, by my faid executors or furvivors of them, pay or cause to be paid unto my executors or the furvivor or furvivors of them, and to be deemed in like manner as part of my perfonal eftate, the full and clear fum of twenty thousand pounds of lawful money of Great-Britain; and in cafe payment of the faid fum of twenty thousand pounds last mentioned shall not be made at or within the time above-mentioned in that behalf, then my Will is, and I do hereby direct, that my executors or furvivors

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vivors of them, do and shall fell and dispose or cause to be fold and disposed of, all and every part of my faid collection or museum as before described, with the catalogues thereunto belonging, unto or for the use of the royal Academy of Sciences at Berlin, provided that the faid royal Academy of Sciences at Berlin, or the managers or directors thereof, or others impowered on their behalf, do and shall, within twelve months next after notice thereof fignified or given to the ambaffador, or refident, or envoy of or from the king of Pruffia, by my executors, or furvivors of them, pay or cause to be paid unto my executors, or the furvivor or furvivors of them, and to, be deemed in like manner as part of my perfonal eftate, the full and clear, fum of twenty thousand pounds of, lawful money of Great-Britain; and in cafe payment of the faid fum of twenty thousand pounds last mentioned shall not be made at or within the time 1

time before mentioned for that purpofe, then my Will is, and I do hereby direct my faid executors, or furvivors of them, do and shall fell and difpose of, or cause to be fold and difposed of, all and every part of my faid collection or mufæum, as before defcribed, with the catalogues thereto belonging unto or for the use of the Royal Academy of Sciences at Madrid; provided that the faid Royal Academy of Sciences at Madrid, or the managers or directors thereof, or others impowered on their behalf, do and shall, within twelve months next after notice thereof fignified or given to the ambaffador, or refident, or envoy of or from the court of Spain, by my executors or furvivors of them, pay or caufe to be paid unto my executors, or to the furvivors or furvivor of them, and to be deemed in like manner as part of my perfonal eftate, the full and clear fum of twenty thousand pounds of lawful money of Great-Britain. And

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And my Will is, and I do hereby further direct, that fuch notice and notices shall be given and fignified to the respective ambaffador, or resident, or envoy of or from the court of Ruffia, France, Berlin and Madrid, within three months next after failure or default of payment of the fum of twenty thousand pounds afore mentioned from the parliament as afore mentioned. And in cafe the faid respective offers shall not be accepted by parliament, nor by any of the faid foreign academies, nor any fuch payments well and truly made by any others on their respective behalfs, within the respective times before mentioned, unto my executors or the furvivors of them as aforefaid :

Then my Will is, and I do hereby further direct and appoint, that my executors or the furvivors or furvivor of them, do and fhall be at liberty, with all convenient fpeed, to fell and difpofe

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difpofe of, or caufe or procure to be fold and difpofed of, all and every part of my faid collection or mufæum, in the moft fpeedy and advantageous manner; and the monies arifing by fuch fale or difpofition, I do hereby direct, will, and appoint, fhall be paid to my executors or to the furvivors or furvivor of them, and fhall be confidered as part of my perfonal eftate;

Provided always, and my Will is, that the truftees or executors, hereby intended and appointed for any of the purpofes herein mentioned, fhall not be anfwerable for or chargeable with the acts or deeds of each other, but with or for his own wilful acts and deeds only.

And further my Will is, and I do hereby direct, that in cafe my faid collection fhall be fold or difpofed of to either of the faid foreign academies before-mentioned, or in cafe of their refufal or non-acceptance by my executors, ecutors, or the furvivors of them; that then my faid manor houfe and garden, with their appurtenances, and the water, and advowfon, fhall go to and belong to fuch perfon or perfons, and in fuch manner as I have given and devifed the reft of my faid manors, lands, and tenements at Chelfea or elfewhere.

In witnefs whereof I the faid Sir Hans Sloane have to this codicil, contained in two fkins or pieces of parchment, fet my hand and feal this tenth day of July in the year of our lord one thousand feven hundred and fortynine.

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V Hereas I have by a codicil ap-pointed and named his grace Charles duke of Richmond, John duke of Montague, and Henry earl of Pembroke, all lately deceafed, among others, visitors of my museum, or collection of curiofities, upon certain trufts therein mentioned ; now I Sir Hans Sloane do hereby name and appoint, in their flead, the right honourable the earl of Macclesfield, the earl of Shelburn, and the right honourable Sir John Strange mafter of the Rolls, and the mafter of the Rolls for the time being ; and I do defire that they will accept of the faid truft : and I do also defire, that Sir John Bernard, Sir William Calvert, and Slingfby Bethel, Efq; may be added to the other truftees, by me formerly made

made in my faid codicil, or in the lift hereunto annexed.

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And whereas I have in and by the faid former codicil, or by fome other, given and devifed my advowfon of the rectory and parish church of Chelsea to my faid vifitors and truftees, or to fome of them, upon truft to prefent a proper perfon thereto, when the fame fhall become vacant : now I do by this my codicil revoke that part of my faid former codicil concerning the faid advowfon, and do hereby give and devife the faid advowfon to fuch perfon or perfons as shall from time to time have and enjoy my manor of Chelfea, and that he, fhe, or they, from time to time, shall prefent thereunto, whenever the fame shall become vacant. . .
