GENERAL SUMMARY.

The Weather.—The mean barometric pressure for January was 30.09; mean temperature, 38; total precipitation, 4.89 inches, and prevailing direction of wind, *Northwest*. The temperature was 1.01 higher than the normal for the month, and the excess in precipitation was 1 69 inches. The number of clear and fair days was 23.


Mortailty.—The total deaths were 780, as against 930 for the corresponding month of 1590. Of these, 601 were white and 179 olored, a death rate of 18.72 per thousand for the former and 30.25 for the latter. 86 died from zymotic diseases, 104 from consumption ad 112 from pneumonic. 218, or 32 per cent. of the total deaths, were in children under five years of age.

Infectious Diseases Reported.—During the month 186 cases of infectious diseases were reported, a decrease of 44 from December 1850. The greatest decrease occurred in diphtheria, eroup and scarlet fever, and there was a decided increase in measles. Diphtheria, eroup and searlet fever fell from 104, 22 and 73 cases, respectively, in December to 59, 14 and 55 in January. Measles increased from 4 cases in December to 33 in January, and whooping cough from 23 to 24.

Deaths in Hospitals .- Sixty two deaths occurred in public institutions, of which eleven were reported as non-residents.







Ward Map of Baltim

GENERAL SUMMARY.

The Weather.—The mean barometric pressure during February was 30.12 inches; mean temperature, 41°; total precipitation, 5.52 inches, and prevailing direction of wind, Northwest. The temperature was 1.27° higher than the normal for the month, and the excess in precipitation was 1.98 inches. The total number of clear and fair days was 18.

Mortality.-The total deaths were 702, as against 787 for the corresponding month of 1890. Of these, 533 were white and 169 colored, a death rate of 16.81 per thousand for the former and 28.56 per thousand for the latter. The death rate for the whole population was 18,49 per thousand. 77 persons died from infectious diseases, 102 from consumption and 78 from pneumonia. 250, or 35.6 per cent. of the total deaths, were in children under five years of age.

Infectious Diseases Reported.-During the month 207 cases of infectious diseases were reported, an increase of 21 over January. In diphtheria and scarlet fever, there was a slight decrease, measles remained nearly stationary in prevalence, while whooping cough and croup showed a decided increase. Croup, measles and whooping cough increased from 14, 33 and 24 respectively, in January, to 20, 34 and 50 in February. Diphtheria decreased from 59 to 57, and scarlet fever from 55 to 45.

Deaths in Hospitals.—*Fifty-two* deaths occurred in public institutions, of which *eighteen* were reported as non-residents.

GENERAL SUMMARY.

The Weather.—The mean barometric pressure during March was 30.12 inches; mean temperature, 39°; total precipitation, 7.94 inches, and prevailing direction of wind, *Northeast*. The temperature was 1.07° lower than the normal for the month, and the excess in precipitation was 3.85 inches. The total number of clear and fair days was 16.

Mortality.—The total deaths were 729, as against 1,032 for the corresponding month of 1890. Of these, 555 were white and 174 colored, a death rate of 17.34 per thousand for the former and 29.70 per thousand for the latter. The death rate for the whole population was 19.23 per thousand. 55 persons died from infectious diseases, 94 from consumption and 83 from pneumonia. 241, or 33 per cent. of the total deaths, were in children under five years of age.

Infectious Diseases Reported.—During the month 162 cases of infectious diseases were reported, a decrease of 45 from February. In diphtheria, scarlet fever and croup, there was a slight decrease, while in measles and whooping cough the decrease was decided. Diphtheria decreased from 57 to 53, croup from 20 to 18, scarlet fever from 45 to 44, measles from 34 to 13, and whooping cough from 50 to 31.

Deaths in Hospitals. - Forty nine deaths occurred in public institutions, of which nineteen were reported as non-residents.

Ward Map of Baltimo





GENERAL SUMMARY.

The Weather.—The mean barometric pressure during April was 30.04 inches; mean temperature, 56°; total precipitation, 2.48 inches, and prevailing direction of wind, *Northwest*. The temperature was .89° higher than the normal for the month, and the deficiency in precipitation was .79 inches. The total number of clear and fair days was 24.

Mortality.—The total deaths were 850, as against 724 for the corresponding month of 1890. Of these, 648 were white and 202 colored, a death rate of 20.85 per thousand for the former and 34.42 per thousand for the latter. The death rate for the whole population was 22.41 per thousand. 42 persons died from infectious diseases, 106 from consumption and 135 from pneumonia. 243, or 28 6 per cent. of the total deaths, were in children under five years of age.

Infectious Diseases Reported.—During the month 147 cases of infectious diseases were reported, a decrease of 15 from March. In diphtheria, croup and whooping cough, there was a decrease, and an increase in scarlet fever and measles.

Deaths in Hospitals. - Fifty-one deaths occurred in public institutions, of which twenty-one were reported as non-residents.



GENERAL SUMMARY.

The Weather.—The mean barometric pressure during May was 30.07 inches; mean temperature, 62°; total precipitation, 3.11 nehes, and prevailing direction of wind, North and Northeast. The temperature was .53° lower than the normal for the month, and the leficiency in precipitation was .44 inches. The total number of clear and fair days was 18.

Mortality.—The total deaths were 892, as against 1,012 for the corresponding month of 1890. Of these, 699 were white and 193 colored, a death rate of 21.84 per thousand for the former and 32.62 per thousand for the latter. The death rate for the whole population vas 23.52 per thousand. 60 persons died from infectious diseases, 94 from consumption and 123 from pneumonia. 296, or 33 2 per cent. of the total deaths, were in children under five years of age.

Infectious Diseases Reported.—During the month 173 cases of infectious diseases were reported, an increase of 26 over April. In liphtheria, croup, scarlet fever and whooping cough, there was an increase, and in measles a slight decrease.



Infectious Diseases Reported.—During the month 167 cases of infectious diseases were reported, a decrease of 6. over the precedng month.


