Read at the First General Court of Governors, held 31st August, 1842.

THE Committee of Management have great satisfaction in reporting to this, the first General Court of Governors, that the HOSPITAL FOR CONSUMPTION, AND DISEASES OF THE CHEST, is now in full operation, and ready for the reception of patients.

The great necessity for such an Institution was first brought under the notice of the public on the occasion of a public meeting, held at the Hanover-square Rooms, on the 25th of May, 1841; since which time, the Committee have spared no exertion in carrying the benevolent intentions of the Governors into effect.

The Out-patient Branch of the Institution at No. 20, Great Marlborough-street (selected for its Central position), was opened to the Public on the 28th day of March last, since which time 180 patients have received relief, and the number of applicants is rapidly on the increase.

After many fruitless negotiations, the Committee have succeeded in obtaining suitable accommodation for in-patients. Manor House, situate near the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, has been taken for a term of years, and, after undergoing some necessary alterations and repairs, is now ready for the reception of patients. The house is, at present, capable of containing between twenty and thirty beds, but admits of being greatly enlarged by the erection of wings, and the Committee look forward with confidence to the time, when the increasing funds of the Institution will justify them in making provision for a much larger number of inmates.

The benefits of the Institution have been recently extended to those poor persons who are not able to attend at the out-patient branch, by the appointment of a Physician, whose duty it will be to visit them, within certain limits, at their own homes.

The Committee feel that they have much reason to congratulate themselves and the public on the success which has attended their efforts to obtain suitable persons to fill the several appointments. A reference to the list of öfficers will show how completely they have succeeded in this most 'important object. Feeling the deep importance of a devoted attention to the spiritual interests of the patients, the Committee have appointed a Chaplain (who is also the incumbent of the district), by whom they feel assured that the sacred and responsible duties of the office will be zealously and faithfully performed.

Considering the short time that the New Institution has been in existence, the funds are extremely prosperous. The donations already received amount to nearly £1,500, and the annual subscriptions to nearly £500. Whilst upon this subject, the Committee eannot deny themselves the gratification of recording two occurrences which have marked the progress of their labours. The first is the patronage bestowed upon the Institution by Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, who; ever alive to the wants of her afflicted subjects, and feeling the necessity for some provision being made for this particular class, graciously condéscended, before the Hospital was in full operation (a circumstance almost unprecedented), to become the Patron of the Charity; and, through Sir Henry Wheatley, offered to the Committee the choice of a donation of Fifty Guineas, or an annual subscription of Ten Pounds, as her contribution towards its funds. The Committee, having in view the permanent welfare, of the Institution, did not hesitate to accept the latter. The other eireumstance is the receipt by the Honorary Secretary, within the last few days, of a letter from Madeira, enclosing an order for a donation of £20, and an annual subscription of one guinea towards the funds of the Charity; proving, that not in this country alone, but in places far remote, sympathy is felt for the Consumptive sufferer, and the necessity for the institution of an Hospital for Consumption acknowledged.

Although the funds are at present altogether inadequate to the wants of the Institution, the Committee of Management throw themselves on the liberality of the public, in full confidence, that the Hospital, once ealled into existence, will not be allowed to fail for want of the necessary support, but on the contrary, that the more its objects become known, the more will the Committee be enabled to extend its benefits. No effort shall be wanting on their part to ensure success to the infant charity, and it shall bet their eare so to employ the funds placed at their disposal, as to give the fullest effect to the benevolent intentions of its founders and supporters. They recommend it to the public sympathy and support, and venture, in reliance upon the Divine blessing, to entertain the most sanguine hopes of its continued and

I are the even for a There is scarcely a disease of tany severity which does not find ready admission into the words of our general Hospitals, and many, complaints of comparatively trare occurrence and triffing importance have institutions especially devoted to their treatment; but Consumption, the most frequent and destructive malady in existence; finds the doors of all our Hospitals closed against it. bu

The Statistical Reports issued by the Registrar General'show that 59,025 of the inhabitants of England and Wales were cut off by Pulmonary Consumption in the year 1838; and as the mean duration of the disease is about two years, it follows that the number of Consumptive Patients constantly living, and destined eventually to sink under the ravages of the disease, is 118,050! In other words 18.2 per cent., or about one-fifth of the total mortality of England and Wales (an estimate somewhat *below* the true proportion, for reasons which it is unnecessary here to enumerate) acknowledges Pulmonary Consumption as its cause; and by this malady alone society is constantly deprived of the services of the one hundred and thirtieth part of its members.

The plea on which this vast mass of sufferers is refused admission into other institutions is, the lingering nature and almost certain fatality of their disease. But these very peculiarities give it the strongest claim on our sympathy. When the poor man falls ill, the very sources of his subsistence are dried up; acnte diseases impoverish and embarrass him, but chronic diseases ruin him; those who are dependent upon his exertions share his destitution, and are prevented from earning their, own livelihood by the necessity of ministering to his wants.

To provide him with an asylum, to surround him with the comforts of which he stands so much in need, to ensure him relief from the sufferings entailed by his disease, to afford him spiritual consolation at a period when the mind is perhaps best adapted to receive with benefit the divine truths of religion, and to enable those who depend upon him to earn their own subsistence, are the great objects proposed to be accomplished by this new Hospital.

But though the original object contemplated in its establishment has been to afford an ASYLUM to the Consumptive Patient, it is by no means the only one. By bringing a large number of such Patients under the same roof, an opportunity will be afforded of more carefully studying the nature of this destructive malady; and assuredly there is some ground of hope, that HE who has given man much power over nature, who has provided him, in the works of his own hands, with many powerful and effective remedies, and has so often crowned his well-directed efforts towards the alleviation of the sufferings of his fellow-creatures with success, may yet vouchsafe to guide him to some means by which this, his greatest scourge, may be stripped of its terrors. At least the Committee feel that they are fully justified in pointing out to the attention of the Public, that if medical science be ever destined to achieve the great triumph of removing this fatal malady, or to effect the humbler, good of arresting its progress with certainty, the hour of such improvements must surely be hastened by the establishment of an institution which will afford ample means for deep and sustained investigation of the disease.

To all who have either felt the power of the destroyer, or who have reason to fear his attack—and what family throughout the country has not had sad experience of his presence?—an carnest appeal is now! made, in the full assurance that those who give their support to this Institution will aid in materially lessening the amount of misery endured by the suffering poor.

EXTRACT FROM THE STANDING RULES.

ESTABLISHMENT.

1. THE HOSPITAL FOR CONSUMPTION AND DISEASES OF THE CHEST is under the immediate patronage of HER MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY THE QUEEN, and of a PRESIDENT and VICE-PRESIDENTS, and is carried on under the direction of a Committee of Management.

2. The Establishment consists of a Treasurer, a Chaplain, two Consulting Physicians, two Physicians, and a Visiting Physician, a Consulting Surgeon, an Honorary Sceretary, a paid Sceretary, a Dispenser, a Matron (who is also Housekceper), and a Collector, who, during the present appointment, is also to be Assistant Secretary.

3. The Institution is divided into two branches :-- The HOSPITAL and ASYLUM, or IN-PATIENT BRANCH, with garden and pleasure grounds, situate near the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, where In-patients are received, and Out-patients treated twice a week; and the OUT-PATIENT BRANCH and OFFICE at No. 20, Great Marlborough Street, where the business of the Charity is conducted, and attendance and medicines bestowed, four days in the week, upon such Out-patients as may avail themselves of its central position.

PLAN AND OBJECTS.

4. This Institution combines in its plan and objects the threefold purpose of,

Ist, An Asylum for In-Patients afflieted with Pulmonary Consumption, and who, in consequence of that complaint, are inadmissible to other Hospitals, and an Hospital for persons labouring under other severe Diseases of the Chest.

2ndly, A Dispensary, earried on in two distinct localities, for providing advice and medicines for the less urgent cases as Outpatients.

3rdly, Providing, at their own habitations, advice, attendance, and medicines for those Patients whom the limited accommodation in the Hospital will not allow of being received as In-patients, and who are too ill to attend as Out-patients.

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

5. The Government and Management of this Institution are entrusted to a General Court or Meeting of Governors, held quarterly, whose duties are legislative; and to a Committee of Management, whose duties are executive.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

6. Every benefactor of £31 10s., or upwards, at one time, or within twelve months, becomes a Governor for life.

7. Every subscriber of ± 3 3s. per annum, or upwards, becomes a Governor, but remains so only as long as such subscription shall be continued.

8. Every person making to the Hospital a bequest of ± 50 , or upwards, may nominate a Life Governor: in the event of no such nomination being made, the executor first named in the Will shall be a Life Governor.

13. Annual Subscribers are entitled to recommend four outpatients in the year, for each guinea subscribed. Governors by donation or annual subscription, or as nominees or executors of persons giving bequests to the Hospital, are entitled to recommend one in-patient and twelve out-patients in the year. Annual Subscribers of £10, or upwards, have the privilege of two votes upon any Election or Committee.

14. Every Incumbent who shall permit collections to be made in his church for the benefit of the Hospital shall be entitled, during his incumbency, to the privilege of recommending one in-patient and four out-patients annually for every £31 10s. thus collected, provided that the patients whom he may recommend be resident within the limits of the parish from which the contributions have been derived; and that, on the avoidance of the living, this privilege shall cease.

*** Presents of old linen will be thankfully received by the Matron, for the use of the Hospital.

REGULATIONS AS TO PATIENTS.

AT THE HOSPITAL, AT CHELSEA.

Persons having letters of recommendation from Governors for admission as IN-PATIENTS, must attend at the Hospital on Tuesdays, at three o'Clock precisely, to be examined by the Physician in attendance before the meeting of the Board, at half-past three o'Clock.

Persons having letters of recommendation to *The Hospital at Chelsea* from Governors or Subscribers as OUT-PATIENTS, ean be seen by the Physicians on Tuesdays and Fridays, at two o'Clock, precisely.

AT THE OUT-PATIENT BRANCH.

The Out-patient Branch, at No. 20, Great Marlborough Street, is attended by one of the Physicians on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at one o'Clock. Patients are required to present themselves to the Sceretary, at half-past twelve o'Clock, to have their letters of recommendation registered.

Patients who are unable to attend at the Out-patient Branch, and who reside within the district, bounded by Marylebone-street on the north, Piecadilly on the south, Dean-street, Soho-square on the east, and Duke-street, Grosvenor-square on the west, must send their recommendation to the Secretary, between the hours of twelve and four o'Clock; and a note to Dr. Theophilus Thompson, the Visiting Physician, will be given to the bearer, entitling such patients to be visited at their own homes.

**** It is particularly requested that Governors and Subscribers will address their letters of recommendation for Out-patients, to that branch of the Institution nearest to the patient's residence.

*** Forms of recommendation may be obtained of the Secretary.
