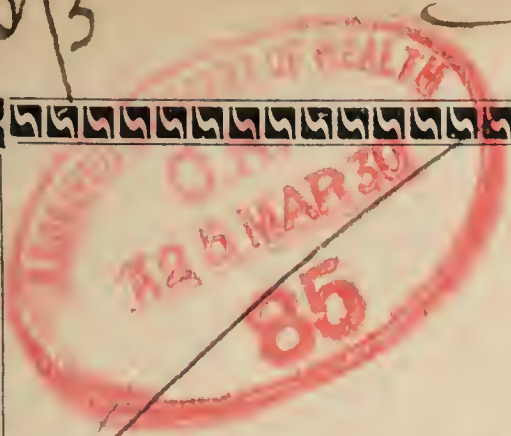



## REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1929

THE Committee of Management have the honour of presenting the Fortieth Annual Report. The following Table shows the number of In-Patients admitted from the various Parishes, and the number of days of Hospital Treatment:—

Of these, 23 were Medical Cases, 27 Surgical, 12 Accident, and 1 Maternity. 38 were discharged as cured, 17 as relieved and benefited, 2 were transferred to other Hospitals, 6 died and 3 remained in the Hospital at the end of the year. There were also 47 Out-Patients, of whom 23 attended for minor operations (15 being Dental), 22 for the dressing of slight accidental injuries, and 2 for examination, the number of Out-Patients' visits being 219. 3 major and 35 minor operations were performed.

Although the above figures show a surplus for the year of £154, it must be remembered that during the three previous years there had been successive deficiencies amounting in all to £105, and that during 1929 the funds of the Hospital have benefited by one or two large exceptional receipts, and by a Garden Fête which



was intended to relieve the Committee from financial anxiety for some time to come. Moreover, Expenditure shows an irresistible tendency to increase. A growing list of Annual Subscribers, therefore, is as much to be desired as ever.

Miss Tucker left, at her own wish, on June 26th. Nurse Prentice left on July 22nd, also at her own wish ; indeed, as far back as February 11th she had asked to be released, and the Committee were much indebted to her for remaining so long. They selected as Matron Miss G. M. E. Corbell, who took up her duties on July 15th, and she has recently been joined by Sister Gethin, a former colleague. In the interval the Committee had engaged a Probationer—Nurse Davy—and, with a view to avoiding the frequent engagement of an extra Nurse for night duty, they have decided to continue this engagement. They take this opportunity of extending a welcome, with which no doubt all supporters of the Hospital will wish to be associated, to Miss Corbell and her assistants, trusting that the arrangements made will conduce to that efficient nursing of the sick and injured for which the Hospital exists.

The Committee has to record, with deep regret, the death of Mrs. Richard Davy, of Holyrood, Falmouth, one of their Vice-Presidents. Mrs. Davy had the Operating Theatre built in memory of her husband, and had continued to be a most generous supporter of the Hospital up to the time of her death.

On August 21st, by the very kind permission of Sir Charles and Lady Hanson, a Garden Fête, in aid of the Hospital Funds, was held in the grounds of Fowey Hall. The net proceeds amounted to £108 2s. 2d. It is impossible to mention individually the many who co-operated so successfully as to produce this splendid result, but the Committee offer to them all their sincere gratitude, whether their help happened to be given, as it were, in the limelight, or in obscurity behind the scenes.

The special thanks of the Committee are also due to the collectors of subscriptions for their zealous work ; to the Organisers of the Stock Exchange Mutual Subscription Fund for their generous donation of £50 ; to the Cornwall (Fortress) R.E. and the Cornwall Territorial Army Association, who provided, as a tribute to the memory of the late Major H. S. Graham, a fund amounting to £31 13s. 6d. for the purchase of a luxurious new bed for the Private Ward, and a handsome clock ; to Miss Vatcher and her helpers in her sale of Jumbles, which raised the record sum of £25 ; to the Carnival Committee and Collectors ; to the Committee and Collectors for Alexandra Rose Day ; and to the Organisers of the Thank Offering Fund for the recovery of His Majesty the King.

As in former years, the Committee have been greatly indebted on more than one occasion to Miss Crabb for coming to the help of the Nursing Staff in emergencies.

A Wireless Receiving Set, provided by the generosity of Mrs. Jonas and other kind friends of the Hospital, has proved a most popular boon. For this, and a great number of other Gifts, a list of which appears on the last page, the Committee ask the donors to accept their grateful thanks.

They also wish to thank the Managers of the Shipping Accounts and of the Jetty-workers' contributions ; Inspector Burrough and his staff ; and all who have subscribed to the funds of the Hospital or helped in its work.
