Some <sup>60</sup> years ago there was planted on the bluffs of Baldwin County, Ala., a number of Pear seed by the wife of the chef of the Old Battle House, Mobile, Ala. The results of this planting were several different kinds of fruit which are in evidence today..

The fruit of the above tree is of exceptional quality, and the tree immune from blight.

This pear is of such quality that it will be used for a fruit stand pear in competition with the Bartlett pear and other edible pears.

This pear will revolutionize the pear industry in the ~~east~~ country. It has been the hope of all Horticulturists that a non-blighting and edible pear would be found and at last it has been accomplished.

This tree is approximately <sup>60</sup> years old, has a circumference of 51 inches, ten inches above the ground, 35ft. high and a spread of 35 feet.

The tree has been a continuous bearer for about 45 years and the crop of 1929 is estimated at 40 bushels.
