PREFACE

A chance remark by a cousin of the Editor, in 1959, was the beginning of the work now in hand, a matter of curiosity: "Were my ancestors REALLY like that?"

What began in a most casual way has become a fascinating quest--in which hundreds of persons whose names are listed in this genealogy have shared by sending in their life-stories, clippings, photographs, and side-lights on the lives of others. So, in a real sense, it was THEY who wrote this book, not the Editor.

Much of the material in the biographical write-ups the readers will recognize as their very own words, not enclosed in quotation marks. This is true. The information came from so many different sources, in such small bits, very often, that it is almost impossible to separate the precise quotations—it would only make the reading more difficult. As indicated in the "Introduction," however, all material was documented where possible, and the documentation is available to anyone who wants it.

It is regrettable that no photographs appear--no, not one:--in this book. Some very good ones were submitted, and members are invited to send in more, all of which will be indexed. The problem was multifold: Which pictures shall be included or excluded? What will be the effect on the cost? How many readers will know any one individual? Pictures would have enlivened the readability of the book greatly.

One of the initial problems was whether to include the Neufeld- and the Loewen lineages. If this book was to be one genealogy, not two (let alone three!), a decision had to be made. No reading of the Bargen lineage would be complete in any sense of the term without the enrichment which would come from the inclusion of the Neufeld- and at least a little of the Loewen successions. It was out of appreciation for the kind of a home the Bargen-Neufeld-Loewen home really was, originally, and its relation to the community in South Russia and pioneer America that the decision was made to include them--and to include the Neufeld line as faithfully and as fully as the Bargen. Here, too, it must be said that Bargen includes Bergen. If, in the attempt to do this faithfully the Editor has erred, has omitted, has misrepresented, he shifts the blame upon no one else; it is his own shortcoming.

Acknowledgements

One hesitates to list individually here many who helped materially in the preparation of this genealogy; yet it would be ingratitude to be silent in the face of the obvious efforts many persons made to help along with this work. Right early in the work, Justina Bargen (Mrs. Peter D.) Ewert helped with extensive listings of her particular line—it was she who discovered and submitted the name and date for Heinrich Bargen (No. 1:): Sara Bergen (Mrs. Peter F.)

Epp contributed precious items for Generations 1 and 2, also fine photographs. She is in the Bergen line; and along with her the Editor must mention the splendid help received from Anna Peters (Mrs. Irwin M.) Friesen, also Esther Mae Thieszen (Mrs. Aaron B.) CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

There is today, society being as mobile as it is, a growing desire on the part of many individuals to know more about their roots, sociologically. It is part of a general search for one's personal identity. Struggling with some of the conflicts and contradictions of modern life, they feel that if they could only know how their ancestors met their problems, it would be easier to meet the problems of the present.

In the research involved in the preparation of this book, this has come to the fore again and again. Underlying this seems to be a thought, so well expressed some years ago, "It is more important to be a good ancestor than to have had them."

In this search for one's personal identity as well as a richer understanding of one's sociological roots, a genealogy should be a working tool and effective reference book. In a way, the term "genealogy" does not quite fit this book, for it is more an adventure in biography than a lineage chart. On the other hand, it is both; and it is the hope of the writer that this book will be not only enjoyable reading, but a book of useful reference.

To be effective, a genealogy must be properly indexed and cross-indexed. The purpose of this genealogy is so to organize the biographical and statistical material for the reader so that with a minimum of effort he can locate quickly any datum desired. It seeks to answer the usual and the unusual questions speedily through the following provisions:

- l. If the name of the person is known, it locates that person in the Biographical Index by name in strict alphabetical arrangement.
- 2. If the name of the person is not known, but the name of the father is known, the Biographical Index quickly locates the father, in whose write-up the names of all children are listed.
- 3. If the approximate time-span is known, but the name of the individual is known vaguely but not precisely, the Family Index shows the span of each generation by years.
- 4. If the name of the individual is known, his present address if given in the Biographical Index.
- 5. If the name of the in-law is known, but the direct descendant is not known, the Biographical Index will direct the reader to the direct descendant.

- 6. If the number of children in a family is in question, the Biographical Index will give the names under the father's name, and the Family Index will give the Serial Number of each one.
- 7. If the nickname is known but the true name is not known, the Biographical Index directs the reader to the true name.
- 8. The relationship of any two individuals is revealed by the comparison of their serial numbers. By the use of the ancestral prefix in the serial number and the terminal digit for the individual, it can be said that:
- a. If the ancestral prefix is the same, the individuals were siblings-either two brothers or sisters, or brother and sister. Twins are given adjacent numbers (digits).
- b. If the ancestral prefix is the same except for the last two digits, the individuals were first cousins.
- c. If the ancestral prefix is the same except for the last three digits, the individuals were second cousins.
- 9. The exact spelling of given names is in question sometimes, in which case the Appendix lists given-name variations.
- 10. If it is desired to know whether or not any members of this genealogy reside in a given city, the Geographical Index will reveal this; and readers are encouraged to write the Editor for individual listings for given areas at any time for up-dated lists.

The information given in this book, while every effort was made to be accurate, cannot be guaranteed. Published sources were consulted in many cases. The reader may consult the Bibliography, given in the Appendix. But by and large, most of it came through personal letters, printed data slips returned to the Editor, in private conversations, or through clippings and photographs, published or unpublished--all of which is indexed on individual cards, a card for each person. Some persons sent in only minimal information; only one person refused to send any; although some sent in none, perhaps through indifference. (One person added to his name, in parentheses, the letters N.M.I., to which, after some thought, the Editor assigned the meaning, "Not Much Interested.") But such cases are indeed rare; most cooperated well; and some sent long letters, which the Editor condensed to the limits available for this work. To the tastes of some, he will surely have condensed too much; and for the taste of others, expanded too much. That is an editorial hazard! chance remark during a casual visit would become the basis for extended correspondence, sending the Editor upon the trail in search of further data.

Thus, this work has its definite limits of accuracy, but the Editor has documented most of the information, and this documentation is available upon request. There are, also, moral limitations: the Editor had to decide what to do with confidential material which, though shared with him, obviously

was not intended for publication. Sometimes, specific items were marked "Not for publication," and in all such cases the Editor has attempted to honor this confidential relationship in all fidelity. Hence, no record of divorces, lawsuits, suicide, common-law marriages, prison records, etc., are included; but they are on index (where known). Some did go to prison, both for good and evil reasons; but to publish what those concerned find difficult to bear should not be published for the irresponsible use of the unconcerned.

In any event, such a work is never complete in any permanent sense: new individuals are arriving, and the old are leaving; people move; and people even change their names—as a study of this genealogy will reveal. And some purposely go into oblivion, for what reason, one wonders!

But here, then, are the stories of those who do feel some sense of belonging—even some who avow they want no further relationship, still did send in their data (to them our thanks!)—and in these stories, if the reader sees the pathos of their lives, the trials and tribulations, the triumphant spirit in the way that it was the privilege of your Editor to experience first-hand, is the story of a people spanning almost two hundred years and embracing seven generations. Unsung heroes, many; villains, some; but each one unique, an individual whose life has something of value for the life of others. The individuals given in this genealogy never met for a family reunion and never will, but we can sit down for a visit with each one, at our leisure, and enter for a moment into their lives, their thinking, their problems—and this also is a way of sharing.

As was stated in the last paragraph above, it is the story of a people. A study of this people naturally raises the question, "Why did they move?" That in itself leads into a broad area of inquiry, which if followed, may be of great value to the reader who undertakes it. The world has changed tremendously in those two hundred years. It may well be that the study of the biographies in this genealogy as a group may actually be of great value to the individual in giving a sense of direction, or helping to rearrange one's whole scheme of values, for the time ahead.

CHAPTER II

THE BIOGRAPHICAL INDEX

Explanatory Note

In this chapter all the known individuals who are members of this genealogy are listed alphabetically by family name; and, under any family name, alphabetically by given names. See Appendix--for items to late to be included.

For each individual the known information about him or her is presented in somewhat the same manner, although not all the information is known about each individual. The elements in the prevailing order of presentation are:

For direct descendants. -- FAMILY NAME; Given name(s); Serial No.; date of birth; date of death; date of marriage; name of spouse; address; children; early life; education; memberships; positions held; authorships; interests and hobbies.

For in-laws.--FAMILY NAME; Given names; See-reference to spouse who is the direct-descendant; date of birth; date of death; early life; education; memberships; positions held; authorships; interests and hobbies.

It will be seen from the above pattern that the date of marriage and the names of the children and the address appear only with the parent who is the direct descendant. This is done to avoid duplication and to conserve space.

The biographical information listed for each individual could, naturally, be only such as was submitted to the Editor. If it appears that too much is given for some and too little for others, that is due primarily to the fact that different amounts of information were available for such write-ups.

This index lists not only correct given names, but also pet-names, or nicknames. Where a person in general is known by one of his given names other than his first name, the name he goes by is underscored, thus: Mary Helen. Nicknames or names of endearment are shown thus: Stanley ("Hap") Peterson. Where spelling of a name is questioned, it may appear thus: Greggory (Gregory?). Information from otherwise well-intentioned sources may have been in error, and it was not always possible to verify the spelling of names. See also the Appendix, "Oddities," etc.

Addresses shown are those last on record in the Editor's files; but are not guaranteed to be current, although many of them are. There is much moving, and sometimes when changes were made for parents, the corresponding change was not made for children. Hence, some children will, without doubt, be shown living at addresses other than their parents when in fact they live at home. This is an unfortunate error but one which it is difficult to correct.

For the early life of any individual, the reader will find it help-ful to read the life of the parents, under their respective names. To find who the parents were, the use of the Family Index is helpful (Chapter III). Through the use of the Serial No. of each individual, his family connections are swiftly established—both forward and backward. See illustration of how to scan the Family Index under the Explanatory Note of Chapter III.

The special individual interests, hobbies, and concerns are included, where available. In connection with this the reader is invited to consult the Topical Index (Chapter IV). Consulting the Topical Index, one can often see a given trait running in succeeding or alternating generations, which may throw additional light on this individual without having to read all the biographies.

On the other hand, if the reader wishes to read all about one <u>family</u>, the Family Index will quickly spot all the children in it, including the parents, whose biographies can then be studied individually in Chapter II, building a composite picture of what a given family was like and what, as a <u>family</u>, they experienced.

From this brief Explanatory Note, then, it will appear that Chapter II, The Biographical Index, presents individual biographies; while Chapter III, The Family Index, presents the pictures of the family as the unit in relation to the on-going generations.

Confidential material was received in some cases. In general no material is included in Chapter II having to do with divorces, court cases, suicides, or any other type of information which would hurt the sensibilities of anyone. The guiding principle throughout was to present the type of information which members of this genealogy would share with one another if present in person to do so. In this connection, a proverb learned in youth helped the Editor to decide what to include and what to omit: "If in doubt, leave it out." The Editor would rather err on the side of having said too little than to be guilty of being offensive through lack of good taste.

A word of caution to the reader is in place, either before he begins reading Chapter II or in the Explanatory Note of Chapter III: it has to do with the manner of numbering the in-laws: persons who married into this genealogy, so to speak. The In-law gets the same Serial Number as the person (direct descendant) whom he marries. Thus, if the Direct Descendant's number is 121, that person's spouse is 121m; thus, the suffix m indicates the one who married the direct descendant of that number.

For names not found in Chapter II, see also Appendix D.

The Biographical Index

ADRIAN Aganetha. See Henry Bergen (No. 23). Born 12 11 1859 in Fürstenwerder (Molotschna?), South Russia.

ADRIAN Katie. See Isaac D. Bargen (No. 111). Born 12 24, 1889, Parker, South Dakota. Local public schools to Grade 6. After her marriage she lived for a few months in Kasota, Minnesota. Spent the rest of her life up to the present (1960) in Mt. Lake, Minnesota, except for extended visits to her children in California. Active for a time with the sewing for the Hospital Women's Auxiliary.

ALBRECHT Helena. See David Isaac Bargen (No. 11). Born 06 23 1858; d. 10 06 1934. Born in South Russia, her parents living on a large estate near the Konsky River. They were well to do and left to their three little orphan girls a neat inheritance--each girl being placed into different homes, far apart. Helena was placed with a family in the village called Hierschau, when she was about age 10. At her home she had enjoyed much freedom with the Russian peasant children whose language had become her own, and she could not bear the atmosphere there. She ran away, very poorly clad, and was lost on the prairies. She was found and placed with a family by the name of Isaac Bargen. At the age of 17 she married her adopted brother David I. Bargen, and in 1876 the young couple emigrated to America, and started farming near Lehigh, Kansas. In 1892 they moved to Kirk, Colorado and then in 1895 they made the trip on a prairie schooner to Minnesota. During the last eighteen years she lived in widowhood, partly with her married children, but at long intervals in her own house. She was naturally an optimistic soul, always busy and never finding a thing to complain. Her decisions came on the spur of the moment and they were usually She never argued. She sang much. She prayed and worked almost conright. stantly and lovingly for her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

ALBRECHT Leland Duane. See Verda Bergen (No. 215 22). Born 02 03 1940, at Pretty Prairie, Kansas. Member of First Mennonite Church there. Local high school, 1957. Graduate, Bethel College, B.S., degree. Teaching 6th Grade, Hillsboro, Kansas. Took graduate courses at Emporia State Teachers College (Kansas).

ALBRECHT Michael Duane (No. 215 221). Born 04 22 1961. Address: 307 N. Main, Hillsboro, Kansas.

ANDERSON David Scott (No. 117 81). Born 08 02 1952. Address: 1320 4th Ave., Worthington, Minnesota.

ANDERSON Douglas Lee (No. 117 83). Born 02 08 1957. Address: 13200 4th Ave., Worthington, Minnesota.

ANDERSON, Harolds Seé Carol/Evangeline Esau (No. 1178). Born 12 26 1928.

ANDERSON, Irene. See Isaac J. Bergen (No. 211 7). Born 02 08

ANDREWS Donald George (No. 142 1). Born 06 29 1923; m. 05 30 1946 to Jackie Dent. Address: 19845 Squire Drive, Covina, California. Children: Gerald ("Jerry") Donald, Thomas ("Tommy"). He is with the Union Oil Company and has a

fine junior executive position with them. They live in the San Gabriel Valley, about thirty miles from his mother. They recently moved into their new home (in Covina?), a mile from his mother.

ANDREWS Dorothy (No. 142 2). Born 10 19 1928; m. 05 14 1955 to Ali Beheshti Beheshti (thus). Address: 1679 W. 65th Ave., Vancouver 14, British Columbia, Canada. Children: Cameron ("Cam") Ali; Evelyn Mohneer. Born at Los Angeles, California. Bachelor of Arts in Education, Los Angeles State College, 1951. She met her husband while they were both attending college. Emigrated to Canada in 1955. Married in Moosejaw, Saskatchewan, Canada. She seemed to enjoy very much her teaching, for a while, in the field of exceptional children.

ANDREWS George. See Luella Bargen (No. 142). Born 02 13 1902; d. 05 09 1959.

ANDREWS Gerald ("Jerry") (No. 142 11). Born 10 28 1948. Address: 1326 Rose-way, West Covina, California.

ANDREWS Thomas ("Tommy") Dent (No. 142 12). Born 11 22 1951. Address: 1326 Roseway, West Covina, California.

ANISOWA Lydia. See Sylvester Carl Neufeld (No. 186 2). Born 07 03 1926, in Riga, Latvia. Originally Greek Orthodox, now attending a non-denominational church on the Base. She and her husband are Protestant.

ARMSTRONG Lois. See Walter Isaac Bargen (No. 127). Born 04 30 1904, daughter of Bede Armstrong, of Waukegan, Illinois, where she spent the early years of her life. Member: Episcopal Church, Northfield, Minnesota. Assists her husband in the operation of the Ideal Cafe.

BACON Bette Mae. See Sylvester Dean Epp (No. 212 33). Born 05 08 1928. Graduate of the Grand Island, Nebraska, High School. Homemaker.

BAERGEN (Name of). See Bargen (Name of).

BAERGEN (Son) (No. 27). Born ; d. ; m. to Maria. Children: Søme, the number not known at the time of this writing. He was dragged away by the Communists during the Russian Revolution, his wife and children arriving as part of the refugee movement in Paraguay. Later his wife moved to Canada, reported as late as June, 1962, to be living there under the name, Mrs. Maria Baergen. Can any reader furnish more information as to names, dates, children, etc?

BAKER Lloyd. See Lily Amanda Toavs (No. 1C5 A). Born 02 24 1923.

BAKER Loren Eugene. (No. 1C5 A3). Born 10 14 1949. Address: Lustre, Montana.

BAKER Robert (No. 1C5 A2). Born 11 18 1947. Address: Lustre, Montana.

BAKER Shirley (No. 1C5 A4). Born 10 15 1954. Address: Lustre, Montana.

BAKER Virginia (No. 1C5 A1). Born 12 14 1944. Address: Lustre, Montana.

BALZER Anna. See Jacob Isaac Bargen (No. 13). Born 12 13 1869; d. 07 25 1954. Born at Gnadenfeld, South Russia. Local school there two years, her teacher being David Dirks. Coming to America, she attended school one year in town, one year in the country, under Dietrich Hiebert. The sixth year of her married life their house burned down. For a week they lived with her parents (Jacob Balzer and Susanna Ediger). Then they finished the pigstable, lived in it, and slept

in the barn. She came to this country in 1878, settling in the Mt. Lake community. At age 13 she became a school teacher in the front room of her parents' farm home. She is believed to have been the first public school teacher in Cottonwood County, Minnesota. She had a rather small, wiry body. She was intelligent, businesslike. Strong opinions, splendid organizer, executive ability. President of Mt. Lake Women's organization for the Mt. Lake Hospital many years. She had a very good memory, being an authority about pioneer days. She was very whimsical in her description of town characters. Often read a library book through on a Sunday; read her daily paper all her life. She took a lively interest in politics, labor troubles, the war. She was a woman of religious tolerance, knew a good preacher when she heard one. Death was due to cancer of the throat.

BARGEN (Name of). This name is listed by Benjamin H. Unruh, in his book, HINTERGRUENDE, as Bargen, also von Bargen, also Bergen, also von Bergen. Isaac I. Bargen (No. 12) used to tell the Editor of this genealogy when the latter was a child that I. I. Bargen's forebears were von Bergen or von Bargen, not indicating, since he was speaking in German, which spelling he had in mind. The notation for the Bargen family in the Prussian (Przechowka) church book 'Gerhard Bärgen wurde gebohren von seinen Eltern den Elias v. starts out: Bärgensche Eheleute im Königreich Preussen? (sic.) Dirschau im Dorfe Klein Schlanz 1802 den 21 ? mit seinen Eltern gewandert in Russland in 1804, etc.' In the Heubuden church book, there is listed an Elias von Bargen married an Anna ? on December 10, 1775, Münsterberg. The village Alt Münsterberg is about 6 miles southeast of Dirschau . . . These Van Bargens may be the Elias V. Bargen mentioned in the old Prussian (Przechowka) church book." For a very recent sidelight on this, see also Von Bärgen, Heinrich and Heinrich Bargen.

BARGEN Aganetta (No. 120). Born 01 21 1892; d. _ _ 1892, most likely at Lehigh, Kansas--a twin to George Bargen (No. 116).

BARGEN Anna (No. 1136). Born 12 18 1924; d. 12 31 1924, at Mt. Lake, Minnesota.

BARGEN Anna Eleanora (No. 139). Born 08 22 1905; d. 09 05 1905, at Mt. Lake, Minnesota--twin to Frank Ewald Bargen (No. 137).

BARGEN Anna Severa (No. 138). Born 09 02 1913; m. (1) 02 14 1944 to Harry Boylan; 04 29 1958 to George J. Spence. Children: m. (1) Sara Ann Boylan (his child by former marriage); m. (2) Carol Ann Spence (his child by former marriage). One of Anna's childhood memories, significantly, is the death of her father when she was only age 5. She received her B.S. degree, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota, as Hospital Dietician, interning at St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester, Minnesota. Member: St. Peter's Church, Rockford, Illinois; American Dietetic Association; Society of Hearing Aid Audiologists.

BARGEN Barbara (No. 136 1). Born 09 11 1930; m. 04 14 1955 to L. D. Lawson. Born at Hudson, Wisconsin. Child: David. Graduated, 1952, Stout State College, Menomonie, Wisconsin, B.S. degree in Foods and Nutrition. Member: American Dietetic Association. Chief Dietitian, San Antonio State Tuberculosis Hospital, the only dietitian in that hospital, feeding 900 people on 85 cents a day--and keeping them happy.

BARGEN Bernhard (No. 129). Born: 12 10 1901; m. 06 12 1924 to Esther Helena Kliewer. Address: 2519½ College Ave., Box 157, North Newton, Kansas. Children: Ralph Kliewer, Eldon Kliewer, Evelyn Joyce. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. At age of one year and ten months he contracted polio. Public schools at Mt. Lake, high school 1920; Mankato Commercial College, Mankato, Minnesota, 1920-21; Bethel College, 1921-23; employment: Wichita, Kansas: Kansas Gas and Electric Co., 1925-26; Hupmobile Auto Sales, 1926; Dunn-Ostertag Packing Co., 1926-27; student, Friends University, A.B., 1928; A.M., Kansas University, 1937. Teacher: Oxford, Kansas, high school, 1928-34; Buhler, Kansas, 1934-35; Bethel College, 1935-46, 53-57, 59— Manager: Mennonite Publication Office, Newton, Kansas, 1946-1950; Mennonite Press, 1950-53. Member: Bethel College, Mennonite Church; affiliated with Society of Brothers, 1957-58; Meadowlark Homestead, 1958-59. Writer, editor, published, inventor. BARGEN Bryan Lee (No. 113 43). Born 05 19 1957, at Mt. Lake, Minnesota.

BARGEN Cheryl Ann (No. 111 21). Born 12 23 1956. Address: 16 Lewis Road, Watsonville, California.

BARGEN Clarence Carl (No. 111 2). Born 07 09 1912; m. 09 30 1955 to Marlys van Dusen. Address: 16 Lewis Road, Watsonville, California. Child: Cheryl Ann Bargen. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, where he attended public schools, supplemented by special trade training at the Dunwoody Institute, of Minneapolis, Minnesota. By trade an electrician, member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. Avocationally, interested in the field of philosophy and music, being gifted and by virtue of practice a fine pianist. Even during high school days in Mt. Lake he was playing far and wide, his special favorites at the time being the classic composers.

BARGEN Cornelia (No. 134 4). Born 09 22 1925; m. 12 29 1951 to George R. Cunnington, Jr. Address: 1972 Annette Lane, Los Altos, California. Children: George Richard, Robert Bradshaw, Amy.

BARGEN Dale (No. 129 22). Born 11 30 1955. Address: 202 South St., Cassopolis, Michigan. Born at Hagerstown, Maryland. Spent his first two years at Brook Lane Farm, an active and healthy child. There's a very close resemblance between Dale's childhood tricks, thoughts, imaginations, capers and those of his father, when the latter was Dale's age. Caught his first fish, but it got away, early summer, 1962. Got it out of the water, but not into the boat. To make up for it, he learned to swim:

BARGEN Darla Joyce (No. 113 42). Born 01 31 1953, at Mt. Lake, Minnesota.

BARGEN David (No. 119). Born 03 ___ 1877; d. ___ 1878, most likely at Lehigh, Kansas.

BARGEN David D. (No. 113). Born 10 01 1884; m. ______ to Elizabeth Hepper. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Children: Leander, Menno, John, Edwin Waldou, Donald, and Anna. Born at Lehigh, Kansas. In the years following his marriage he was carpenter, builder, housepainter, and particularly (for many years) painter of grain elevators, which work took him far and wide over

the state. Originally Mennonite; later affiliated himself with other groups. Conducts religious street meetings, visits prisons, and conducts meetings for prisoners. In early summer, 1962, while helping his son, a mechanical saw made a serious cut in his left arm, from which he recovered rapidly and which, he commented, gave him something to preach about.

BARGEN David Hiebert (No. 122). Born Ol 17 1889; d. 02 04 1917. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Must have been something of a child prodigy; and later generally a social favorite, very gifted in speaking, writing. Attended local public schools; Bethel College, later student at University of Minnesota, where he died in his senior year. Assisted his father in the printshop, contributing voluminously to the weekly paper, THE MT. LAKE VIEW, much of it in verse form, under the caption, "The News in Rhyme." Something of a musician and poet. Phi Delta Kappa at the University. While at the University he was active in debate, journalism. Worked his way through school as waiter at the Men's Union. After his death from heart ailment a note of sympathy to his parents commented: "Among all my acquaintances and friends, he was surely among the first in natural endowments and elan."

BARGEN David Isaac (No. 11). Born 04 28 1849 (although this date has been questioned); d. 04 07 1917; m. 09 16 1875 to Helena Albrecht. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Children: Isaac D., Justina, David D., Susie, John A., George, Lena, Isaac (Compare Nos. 111 and 118), David (Compare Nos. 113 and 119), Aganetta. Born in South Russia, migrating to United States in 1876, settling in Lehigh, Kansas; moving to Colorado in 1892 in the fall. Thence, by covered wagon in June, 1895. His wife told one of her daughters, "I walked 400 miles." On that trip the mother baked and roasted a whole grainsack full of Zwiebach. En route they would stop, dig a hole, put an iron plate over it, gather wood, make a fire, and make coffee. Member of Mennonite Brethren Church, but also for a while joined the Baptist Church, returning later to the Mennonite Brethren, where he was deacon most of his life. A great lover of music; liked singing and playing the organ. In his later years he sold organs and wallpaper. He did carpenter work. Had some difficulty with his eyes, it is recalled; perhaps very nearsighted if not actually some disease. During their early married life, in District 32, southeast of Mt. Lake, they would board the teacher, also children who could not go back and forth to school, he serving as school janitor while his wife did the cooking for pupils and teacher.

BARGEN David Walter (No. 127 2). Born 01 02 1934; m. 08 31 1958 to Nancy Alvina Nunstedt. Address: 6802 E. Cheery Lane, Scottsdale, Arizona. Childhood at Waukegan, Illinois; thence Northfield, Minnesota. Student, Carleton College, in physics; thence University of Minnesota, graduating 1959. Master's degree, July, 1959, in Electrical Engineering. Employed with Minnesota Mining and Engineering Company, working in Minneapolis but living in St. Paul. Joined Motorola Corporation, moving to Scottsdale, Arizona.

BARGEN Dickie. See Richard Henry Bargen (No. 113 21).

BARGEN Dean Craig (No. 113 22). Born 10 08 1950, at Billings, Montana (presumably). Address: 430 Nelson Drive, Billings, Montana.

BARGEN Donald (No. 137 1). Reported to have been born with some kind of congenital spinal difficulty, which prevented learning to walk. Died when about 11 or 12. Although unable to communicate, he was a beautiful child, and was

thought to comprehend and appreciate the speech and ministrations of others for his comfort and well-being.

BARGEN Donald Peter (No. 1135). Born 12 18 1924, at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, a baby when his mother died. He was raised in the Ed. Stoesz home.

BARGEN Donald R. (No. 113 11). Born 10 08 1938, presumably at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Address: 119 North Hyland, Ames, Iowa. Childhood there, local public schools. Tabor College, Hillsboro, Kansas, freshman, 1956-57, taking a preengineering course; Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, 1957-61, B.S., in Electrical Engineering.

BARGEN Edwin Waldou (No. 113 4). Born 11 14 1919; m. 11 22 1948 to Delores Lavere Herman. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota, Children: Darryl, Darla Joyce, Bryan Lee, Bradley Jay. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Attended the Mt. Lake Bible School and Public School. Upon the death of his mother, his Grandmother Bargen helped care for him at home with his father. In 1942 he entered the U.S. Army, at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, serving in China, Burma, and India. Employed, apparently independently, in the carpentry and masonry business. Attends the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church in Mt. Lake, and is member there. Has been Sunday school superintendent. Has done much public singing, and for the past nine years has sung in the Gospel Four Quartet, which has sung over a wide territory in that area, in many churches of many denominations. Enjoys fishing as a way to relax a day or two when time permits.

BARGEN Eldon Kliewer (No. 129 2). Born 12 06 1930; m. 12 28 1951 to Helen Jeanette Bartel. Address: 202 South St., Cassopolis, Michigan. Born at Wichita, Kansas, spending his childhood years at Oxford, Buhler, and North Newton, Kansas. Graduate, Bethel College, in Industrial Arts. Employed at Children's Home, Carson City, Nevada and Brook Lane Farm, Hagerstown, Maryland, 1956-57; at Hesston Manufacturing Company, Hesston, Kansas, 1957-58; at the C. H. Schmidt Cabinet Shop, Newton, Kansas, 1958. Teacher, Wichita High School West, in Industrial Arts, 1958-61; thence, high school, Cassopolis, Michigan. Assisted at Camp Friedenswald there summer, 1961, also off-and-on later. Discharged at Cassopolis for refusal to sign the state teachers' loyalty oath. Is concerned about programs for the assistance of underprivileged. Currently employed in drafting for a manufacturer of mobile homes, but thinking of getting into some form of teaching at the parochial level. "I draw, but it is hard to put my heart into it," he writes.

BARGEN Elsie (No. 111 3). Born 10 26 1917; m. 03 01 1941 to Paul Leland Wilcox. Address: 44 Tharp, Watsonville, California. Children: John Edward, Robert Ned, Paul Leland Jr., Karen Lynn, Martin Donald. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. After local schools there, she attended Mankato (Minnesota) Teachers College and University of Minnesota (Minneapolis); later, at San Jose State College (California), she earned her B.E. degree, 1962. Positions: Teaching elementary school for the past three years.

BARGEN Emma (No. 124). Born 07 09 1892; d. 08 22 1909. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Childhood and public schools at Mt. Lake, where, as she grew up, she assisted in the local post office, where her Father was post master. Died at home after four operations (in the home) for infected appendix. One of the surviving brothers commented, looking back to those years: "Because she died after his operating upon her, we boys called him Butcher Holcomb--without a

crumb of justification for the epithet!" Attended high school one year. Although not feeling well at a picnic the day before her last illness, she went in swimming anyway. She died the morning after her third operation within five weeks. "A girl after her father's heart," someone writes about her, remembering especially how she would joke with young people her own age.

BARGEN Erdman (No. 144). Born at Plum Coulee, Manitoba, Canada, ____;
d. at about age 6 to 8 years of age.

BARGEN Esther Lorraine (No. 111 4). Born 12 06 1923; m. 04 10 1948 to Donald Dean Moore. Address: 337 Pamela Road, Monrovia, California. Children: Gregory Dean, also one adopted son, and Yvonne Coleman. (Yvonne Coleman is a foster child whom they hope to adopt.) Born in Mt. Lake, Minnesota; graduate, local high school, 1941, moving to California in January 1943. Worked for the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company at Camp Roberts, California, 1943-47. The adopted son is German-Dutch-Chinese-Javanese. She is a Methodist and sings in the church choir.

BARGEN Evelyn Joyce (No. 129 3). Born 10 03 1932; m. 08 06 1953 to Paul Henry Koehn. Address: 615 West 11th St., Newton, Kansas. Children: Daryl, Jo Lynne, Susan Leigh, Jennifer Ellen. Born at Winfield, Kansas. Childhood memories: The Barnum & Bailey Circus, getting up before sun-up to see the circus being set up, then the show itself, including the run of the side-shows. to several National Parks, to New York City, a summer's work at the Clothing Center of the Mennonite Central Committee, Ephrata, Pennsylvania; the Memorial Hall (college series) programs. Childhood at Oxford, Buhler, and North Newton,, Kansas. Memberships: Bethel College Mennonite Church, North Newton, Kansas; Alpha Psi Omega, college dramatics club. Student, Bethel College, three and a half years. Teacher of 3rd Grade, Macksville, Kansas. Extensive reader; talented in acting. While in college was editor of the BETHEL COLLEGIAN. Sunday school teacher a year or so. Authored several short stories which she is seeking to publish through regular publishers. One of the original founders of a reading-study club, 1959-60, in which she continues to have a real interest; also enjoys golfing, cooking, and music. Worked for a while in the Record Room at the Bethel Hospital. The four little girls have, collectively, been something of a medical problem-→tonsilectomies, measles, sprained wrists, broken arms, chickenpox, so that in one of the family Christmas letters one reads: "About this time we were becoming firmly convinced that we were direct descendants of Job."

BARGEN George (No. 116). Born 01 21 1892; d. 09 08 1913. Born and died at Mt. Lake, Minnesota; twin to Aganetha (No. 120).

BARGEN George. See Gerhard Lowell Bargen (No. 128).

BARGEN George (No. 113 13). Born 07 01 1943. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota; student at Tabor College, 1961-62. He was seriously injured in a car accident June 27, 1961.

BÄRGEN Gerhard. See Bargen (Name of).

BARGEN Gerhard (No. 135). Born 03 24 1897; d. 04 21 1902. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Died of measles and pneumonia.

BARGEN Gerhard Lowell ("George") (No. 128). Born 06 28 1900; d. 12 30 1955; m. 10 30 1931 to Marie Kampff. Address: Box 376, Bemidji, Minnesota. Child: William Kampff. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, where he spent his childhood, had local public school and high school; thence University of Minnesota Law School, where he graduated with honors as member of The Coif. Began the practice of law in Bemidji, first in a partnership with an older lawyer, then independently in private practice. Variously city or county attorney; refused a judgeship on grounds that he could not conscientiously send a man to prison. He had a tremendous sense of humor, was very popular, yet retained a profound sense of right and wrong and took his profession as a mission. He wrote once, when in a somewhat philosophical mood, during the early years of private practice: "If ever things went haywire it was this fall. Some of the things I wanted very badly I didn't get. And those I got proved to be less than I had contemplated. I am becoming considerable of a grouch and in my view on life and things I am becoming something of a cynic--a sort of cynicism pleasant to the cynic and no one else," yet at the same time or about that time, in a very jolly mood he joshed his older brother, "And when I get through with you, you'll not only have a high fever, but you'll have appendicitis, rupture, and appoplexy. too." He secretly loved all mankind, showing it early, when still in the University, working in the Northeast Neighborhood House; and where the kids were awfully tough, calling him "Toothless" and "Snake," etc. But he had a way with them, and never regretted his experience. Just as he had a way with those boys, so, later he had a way with men--a fact generously attested to by his colleagues at the meeting held in his memory after his death, following a protracted period of illness of the heart, which a trip to the Holy Land and continued rest from his work could not overcome.

BARGEN Hannah. See Johanna Amalia Bargen (No. 141).

BARGEN Heinrich (No. 1: See note at Family Index on method of indexing individuals in generations PRIOR to No. 1.—Editor). Born 10 1777. Thus far no additional information about him has been found, but it makes him the father of Isaac Bargen (No. 1) and Johann Bergen (No. 2). Note contrast in spelling. Information about his wife is lacking. Mennonite Genealogies, A. A. Vogt, Steinbach, Manitoba, Canada, writes that two Heinrich Bargen cards are on file, both born in 1777, both having migrated from Prussia to Russia, but that a positive identification with the genealogy in hand is impossible for lack of more conclusive information. Can any reader of this genealogy supply it? Just before going to press Clarence Carl Bargen (No. 111 2), great-grandson of Heinrich Bargen writes: "I especially recall an old Bible and a 'Biblische Geschichte Buch' which had this signature in it:—Heinrich Von Bärgen—Basel Schweiz—the date

I don't exactly recall, but it was somewhere around the 1770's . . . Often did I ask my Dad about our Forefathers, but he knew them only vaguely." Readers should note two things in this quotation: the <u>Von</u> and the <u>Basel Schweiz</u>. Certainly in this connection, also, readers interested in the name Bärgen, Bargen, Baergen, Bergen will want to read comments under Bargen (Name of) in this genealogy, particularly with reference to Elias von Bargen and Gerhard Bärgen. If we can assume (pending further research) that the parents of Heinrich (Von) Bargen (No. 1:) in this genealogy were the Elias von Bargen, and assuming further that he was married about age $2\overline{2}$, if Heinrich was the first or one the first children of that marriage, this genealogy may be said to date back to about the year 1753.

BARGEN Helena ("Lena," "Lensch") (No. 117). Born 08 09 1886; m. 07 07 1910 to Abr. C. Esau. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota, Children: Walter Hans, Emma Alice, Helen Agnes, Alsada Justina, Gilbert Donald, Ruth Hannah, Daniel Carl, Carol Evangeline. Childhood and early education in Mt. Lake, Minnesota; thence, after their marriage, to Radisson, Wisconsin, where they had 40 acres of land almost impossible to get ready for crops--rocks, large stumps, and all kinds of trees--even some ironwood trees. "We built a small house--oh, the moaning those large pine trees would make." There in the summer they would be busy picking berries, walking up to five miles one way to get the best berries -- raspberries, blueberries, finally ending with cranberries. One nice thing--the dessert was always there! They organized a Sunday school, church services, and prayer meeting. "Dad usually went alone to the prayer meeting. It was too far to walk for all of us--4 miles one way! A very happy family, doesn't matter we were poor." In Iron Mountain when the Ford Company started a car plant; then during the World War II in Superior, Wisconsin. She now lives in a small, upstairs apartment where, despite some trouble with her back and hips, she is "such a happy Christian one wonders how it can be," one of her friends writes. (Editor's note. -- See also comments about this person by her children, writing their childhood memories: Helen Agnes and Ruth Hannah.)

BARGEN Henry Ernst (No. 136). Born 03 30 1901; m. 06 08 1928 to Reba Offerdahl. Address: 1205 Third St., Hudson, Wisconsin. Children: Barbara, Nancy, Education at Mt. Lake, high school; thence Carleton College, Northfield, Minnesota, A.B. degree; post-graduate work at University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Memberships: Presbyterian Church, Elks, Masonic lodges, Teachers and Administrators Association. Positions: Brown and Bigelow, St. Paul, Minnesota; thence (or later) County Superintendent of Schools, teacher, salesman, chemist. Hobby: gardening.

BARGEN Isaac (No. 1). Born 01 19 1821; d. 12 11 1875; m. 08 21 1845 to Justina Loewen. Address: Alexanderwohl, South Russia. Children: David Isaac, Isaac, Jacob Isaac, John Isaac, Justina, Mary (Maria) Susanna. By her second marriage, but making their home in the Isaac Bargen home, were: Henry G.(Neufeld) Peter G., Gerhard G., Katherine, Anna, Marie; two other sons and one daughter had died in earlier childhood. Isaac Bargen was born into a very poor family. He worked as a hired hand during threshing seasons, flailing the wheat, and evenings he made wooden shoes. Some years later he worked as a carpenter. It is reported of him that he was a very conscientious reader of Scripture, making it a point to read the entire Bible at least once yearly. He was struck by a horse and within twenty-four hours he died. The funeral sermon, by Rev. John Toews, referred to him as one of the Stillen im Lande. He died in Russia.

BARGEN Isaac (No. 118). Born 09 __ 1875; d. __ _ 1877, at Lehigh, Kansas.

BARGEN Isaac D. (No. 111). Born 08 28 1879; d. 07 03 1960; m. 08 27 1907 to Katie Adrian. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Children: Marie, Clarence Carl, Elsie Gladys, Esther Lorraine. Born at Lehigh, Kansas, whence the family moved to Kirk, Colorado; thence to Mt. Lake, of which journey he used to say that it was one of the few best times he had ever had in his entire life. He had relished every minute of the many weeks required to complete the trail. He joined the Mennonite Brethren Church at age 15, by baptism. In Mt. Lake, where he came in 1895, he engaged in farming, later in construction work, still later in automobile-bodywork. Active community member, with a keen interest in church. Many years a Sunday school teacher or superintendent, directing church choir for 26 years. He was village clerk a number of years and while on the council was instrumental in getting a municipal power plant for the city. He suffered a stroke in August, 1957.

BARGEN Isaac I. (No. 12). Born 11 29 1857; d. 08 25 1943; m. 12 30 1886 to Sara Hiebert. Address: Mt. Lake, Minn. Children: Justina, David Hiebert, Sara, Emma, Mary, William James, Walter Isaac, Gerhard Lowell, Bernhard, Rosella Alma. Born at Alexanderwohl, South Russia. Orloff (Grammar) school, 1871, pupil of Isaac Fast. Academy at Gnadenfeld, 1873-75, pupil of Hermann Lenzman, in Bible, Henry Brown in Russian, and William Neufeld in Science. Childhood of poverty, herding sheep, tilling soil, feeding silk worms. Immigrated to United States 07 04 1878. Graduated Mankato, Minnesota, Normal School from the advanced course. University of Minnesota while teaching in St. Paul High School. Co-founder with Jacob J. Balzer of the German School at Mt. Lake. Active 1888 in the public school movement; in 1886 trip to California; in 1889-1890, teacher in St. Paul. County Superintendent Cottonwood County, Minnesota, re-elected four terms. Principal, local public schools, Mt. Lake, until 1902. In 1901 he bought the Mt. Lake VIEW; began the German weekly, UNSER BESUCHER, of which he was editor and publisher until 1914. Postmaster, Mt. Lake, 31 years. Mennonite Aid Society, 1897-1924; then secretary until his death. Great storyteller. Had desired to become a doctor (for which he had much natural talent), but he changed to teaching. Was Sunday school superintendent many years; a very generous contributor to schools and missions. Keen observer of national affairs --of which he took a rather dim view. In later life he had much difficulty with walking and hearing; he said once that he had never known a day without headache. With John Klein he promoted local gas-lights and sewer installations. As a teacher he was described as a strict disciplinarian and an excellent teacher. Was looked upon by many in the community as a sort of local scribe, writing letters for people who found correspondence difficult. Author of BROZAMMEN, memoirs of the Mt. Lake, Community (1943) not too long before his death. His letters reveal professional concerns, concerns for the underprivileged, the handicapped, and a love for his people, making extensive trips (Canada, for example) in the interests of the Mennonite Aid Society, at times when his health hardly permitted it; or giving speeches in the local park, keeping his audiences spellbound with his sparkling anecdotes and his keen sense of humor.

BARGEN Jacob Arnold ("Jay") (No. 134). Born 10 25 1894; m. 10 27 1921 to Catherine Ruth Burns. Address: 3204 W. Avenue, Temple, Texas. Children: Robert Burns, Teresa Anna, Loretta Mae, Cornelia Marie, Ruth Jacqueline. Childhood and early education, Mt. Lake, Minnesota. At age 13 he contracted pneumonia, the accumulation of pus in his lung being so severe that he was taken to the

Mayo Clinic, where drainage tubes were inserted, after a local doctor had puntured the lung to release the pus. This incident was perhaps the determinant to direct this boy into medicine as his life work. Carleton College, Northfield, Minnesota, 1915-17; University of Chicago, B.S., 1918. During World War I he served as an enlisted man in the Medical Corps of the U.S. Army. M.D. degree, Rush Medical College of the University of Chicago, 1921-1922; another year there as a John J. Borland fellow in medicine, with parttime clinical work and part-time laboratory. Member of the staff of the Mayo Clinic for 33 years and head of a section of medicine and chairman of four sections of medicine, becoming a nationally recognized authority on diseases of the stomach and the intestinal tract. First assistant in a section of medicine, Mayo Clinic, 1923. In 1925 he was made instructor in medicine, in the Mayo Foundation, Graduate School, University of Minnesota. Appointed to staff of the Mayo Clinic 1926; in 1927, degree of Master of Science in Medicine. to grade of Assistant Professor in 1931; Associate Professor, 1935; Professor, 1948. In 1937 certified as a specialist in internal medicine by the American Board of Internal Medicine, Inc., in 1942 named head of a section of Medicine in the Mayo Clinic, a position which he occupied until his retirement. President of the staff of the Mayo Clinic in 1956. Concerned himself largely with internal medicine, with a special interest in diseases of the stomach and intestines, and has published many studies in this special field, including four books (1932, two in 1935, and 1951; also 291 papers published in various medical and scientific journals). Was member of the editorial board of the journal, GAS-TROENTEROLOGY. Participated extensively in many professional activities of physicians, local, regional, national, and international. Received Distinguished Service Award of the Minnesota State Medical Association, 1959. Retired from active practice at Mayo 12 31 1959, soon joining himself to the Scott-White Clinic at Temple, Texas. Even after retirement he had an extensive speaking schedule, calling for appearances at Milwaukee, New Orleans, Washington, San Francisco, and Chicago; then at the International Congress of Gastroenterology at Leyden, Holland and also at Stockholm, Sweden, and Rome, Italy. Of his work at Temple, he said, "It is pretty much like taking on where I left off." Of his work at Mayo Clinic one of the Sisters there said, "He is still referred to around here as the 'Work Horse,' always being the last one to leave the office in the evening."

BARGEN Jacob Isaac (No. 13). Born 11 06 1864; d. 11 09 1918; m. 10 1888 to Anna Balzer. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Children: Jacob Isaac, Justina, Susanna, Jacob Arnold, Gerhard, Henry Ernst, Frank Ewald, Anna Eleanora, Anna Severa. Born in Alexanderwohl, South Russia. Farmer north of Mt. Lake, Minnesota, later living in the city. For a number of years he was a rural school teacher, first in District 15, then in the district near the Valley Church. Later he became a cattle broker in Mt. Lake. During these years he was Sunday school superintendent of the First Mennonite Church at Mt. Lake. A strong, brusque, direct-spoken individual, which traits tended to obscure the fundamentally kind and friendly heart underneath.

BARGEN Jacob Isaac (No. 131). Born 11 11 1889; d. 11 18 1889. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota.

BARGEN Jan (No. 129 21). Born 10 01 1953. Address: 202 South Street, Cassopolis, Michigan. Born at Newton, Kansas. Childhood there, going with parents to Carson City, Nevada, summer, 1954; thence, Brook Lane Farm, Hagerstown, Maryland; thence North Newton, Kansas; thence Cassopolis, Michigan. Just finished 3rd Grade—a new and a very happy experience for her. Beats her Dad in checkers; gets mumps; and reads 29 books; likes to make things with pencil, paper, paste—with a strongly religious slant.

BARGEN Jay A. See John A. Bargen (No. 115); also Jacob Arnold Bargen (No. 134).

BARGEN Johann Isaac. See John Isaac Bargen (No. 14).

BARGEN Johanna Amalia (No. 141). Born 01 28 1894; d. 10 04 1960; m. 05 18 1919 to Albert O. Siverson. Address: 14352 Devlin Ave., Norwalk, California. Born in Plum Coulee, Manitoba, Canada, her early youth in Winnipeg, Manitoba, where she spent much of her time at the family beach home on Lake Winnipeg. She was an excellent swimmer and tennis player. She had a pony and cart which carried her around town. Elementary education in Canada; also attending a finishing school there. Memberships: P.T.A., Women's Republic Club. She was a tiny woman, full of life, who charmed everyone who met her. Creating and sewing beautiful clothes for her daughter and grand-daughter was one of her favorite pastimes; and it didn't take long for her to earn the title of the "Best piemaker in town." She remained young in spirit; and lived a very full, a very exciting life.

BARGEN John ("Long John") Eldo (No. 113 3). Born _____. Address: Somewhere in San Diego, California. Childhood in Mt. Lake, Minnesota. His extreme tallness earned for him the epithet, "Long John."

BARGEN John A. ("Jay") (No. 115). Born 01 27 1890. Address: 130 North Wells, Chicago, Illinois. Childhood and early education at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, where, in his youth, he worked in the printshop of his uncle, Isaac I. Bargen (No. 12). He became an itinerant printer, in the course of his life as a Linotypist visiting and working in practically every large (and many a small) city in the country. He likes to visit interesting places, never passing up an opportunity to visit a museum. Referring to the trek his family made from Kirk, Colorado, to Mt. Lake, Minnesota, he says: "So, you see we are full-fledged members of the covered wagon family. The trip was over a thousand miles, but I was too young to enjoy it." He changed his name many years ago from John to Jay. He shows a special interest in children in the course of his visits, although he himself was never married. Has been a life-long member of a great labor union, he says.

BARGEN John Isaac (No. 14). Born 07 24 1863; d. 03 14 1934; m. 08 30 1890 to Anna Penner. Address: 7320 10th Avenue, Los Angeles 43, California. Children: Johanna Amalia, Luella, Marie, and one son (name not reported). Born in South Russia, coming to America at age 17. He had his elementary school in Russia, and coming to America, he attended business college in Minneapolis, paying for the costs of his education by working for the railroad. He went to Canada, taking a position in the store of an Erdmann Penner, where he met his future wife. He soon owned his own store, in Plum Coulee, where they made their home, on the southern prairies of Manitoba. It was a home noted for its splendid hospitality, to whose home he would not only invite guests but bring them in his own auto from nearby villages like Altona. A guest of those years has preserved a vivid description of one such (Thanksgiving) dinner at that home:

'Turkey and pumpkin pie; pudding and potatoes; chocolate cake and spice cake; coffee and buns; beets, pickles, pickled water-melon; cranberry jelly; "tsupsel"; apple and plum jelly; Pflaumenmus; red and white grapes; apples; chocolate candies . . . (and in the evening) we sang, told stories and played checkers until 12 o'clock. Uncle John beat me three games at checkers and Mrs. Bargen teased me all evening on account on it." At Plum Coulee he was member of the Mennonite Church, church school superintendent. In the community he was chairman of the School Board; and was made trustee of Grandfather Erdmann Penner's estate. He was very fond of band music. Really a gentle soul, writes one who knew him well; a bit of a dreamer. In 1915 the family moved to Winnipeg, where the family owned a lakeside home on Lake Winnipeg, where it was not at all uncommon to have a weekend house-party with friends--of which some delightful accounts are still available in the files of the Editor. The Editor remembers him as a charmingly handsome young "Uncle," whose visits, now and then, either with or without the other members of his family, were always a very special treat. He was essentially a businessman. In his retirement years he was almost totally crippled with arthritis, walking if at all, only with the help of a cane. He died at the home of his daughter, Luella, having suffered a fractured hip in a cast for six months. His heart gave out.

BARGEN Joyce. See Evelyn Joyce Bargen (No. 129 3).

BARGEN Justina (No. 112). Born 10 15 1881; m. ________ to Peter D. Ewert. Address: Box 94, Kasota, Minnesota. Children: Helena, Hulda, Peter, Isaac, LueIla, John, Gerald, Dorothy, Henry, David, Albert, Norma. Born at Lehigh, Kansas, later moving to Kirk, Colorado; thence to Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Upon her marriage they moved to Kasota, apparently; and she writes that she is enjoying life tremendously: "Do my own work, make one rug every week, besides going out for breakfast and in the morning and afternoon with the other women of the Lutheran (Church) Ladies Aid. "Have been chairman of that group for about 20 years; also now of the Mission Covenant; still am leading 'em; no one seems to fight about it, and I cannot get rid of 'em. I have many letters to write—to friends and out-of-state relatives."

BARGEN Justina (No. 121). Born 11 05 1887; d. 02 11 1905. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Born at Mt. Lake, from earliest childhood a bit sickly, often having to suffer much. Completed grade school while still quite young, then devoted herself to kitchen and diningroom in the home. The hope that her health would be restored once she got out of the classroom was never fulfilled. "At a hospital in St. Paul, Minnesota," it is reported, "she learned to know her Savior personally, and from that time she remained in intimate relation with him." In November of 1904 she weakened notably, but recovered sufficiently by January of 1905 that she even used her personal savings to purchase a bouquet of flowers to put on her grandmother's casket. Liked to play the piano. Suffered from what today might be called migraine headaches. A copy of a letter dated 11 20 1904 shows that that late she still accompanied her younger brother (No. 129) to a doctor at Fairmont, Minnesota, seeking medical aid for him. The obituary, written by her editor-father refers to her as a "happy spirit."

BARGEN Justina (No. 132). Born 01 29 1891; d. 01 05 1907. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Born on a farm, about five miles north of the town. At age 11 the family moved to the town. She was put into the 7th Grade of the public school, but she did not like it, so transferred to and completed Grade 8 at the Mt. Lake

Bible (German Preparatory) School. She caught pneumonia, quite prevalent at the time, and died of it. In fact, almost all the children in that family were taken with it. See note at her brother, Jacob Arnold Bargen (No. 134).

BARGEN Karl (No. 129 12). Born 08 28 1952. Address: 3319 East 13th St., Wichita, Kansas. Born at Garden City, Kansas, while parents were teaching at Holcomb, Kansas. Childhood there, at Moscow, Hugoton, Liberal, and Wichita, Kansas, thence Boulder, Colorado, and back to Wichita. Had a hernia operation while only six weeks old. Education in the Wichita public schools, in which he inclined toward the arts-phase of the school program, with interest in music and drawing. Enjoys working with his mother at the office. When in the 3rd Grade, he reported "having nine stars in spelling--at the head of the class." Currently much interested in music lessons and "projects in the basement"!

BARGEN Leander (No. 113 1). Born 03 28 1912; m. 04 04 1937 to Luella Klassen. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Children: Donald, Mariette, George. Born in and educated at Mt. Lake, where, after leaving school, he entered the house-moving business, acquiring the equipment and skill to undertake tremendous jobs of moving buildings. As this is being written, the Mt. Lake OBSERVER in hand carries notice that he and his wife are celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary at the Mennonite Brethren Church.

BARGEN Lena. See Helena Bargen (No. 117).

BARGEN Linda Carole (No. 127 1). Born 07 03 1929; m. 07 30 1949 to Loren Carroll Cleland. Address: 2006 7th Avenue S E, Austin, Minnesota. Daughter of Lois Armstrong, probably in Rockford, Illinois, with early life in Waukegan, Illinois. High school at Northfield, Minnesota. Continuing her education with taking courses in oil painting although, she says, "I haven't blossomed out yet and Rembrandt won't have to take any back seat. It's as our little Timmy would say, 'It's just for the jollies." Built a new house in 1959. The family hobby is coin-collecting, also collecting pretty stones, leaves, and old hornets nets; and she is started at hooking rugs.

BARGEN Loretta Mae (No. 134 3). Born 10 13 1927; m. 08 16 1949 to Lynn James Tracy. Address: 1248 Hague Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota. Children: Jay Francis, Jeffery Lynn, Julie Ruth, Jamie Catherine, Joel Leonard, and James Robert Tracy, (Daughter, name not reported).

BARGEN Luella (No. 142). Born 01 21 1902; m. (1) 07 24 1922 to George Andrews. m. (2) 12 31 1960 to David Du Ree. Address: 227 East Navilla Place, Covina, California. Childhood in Plum Coulee, Manitoba, Canada. Her grades in school there were high, and she ran for honors. After her husband's death she did some traveling but soon took a position in an office. At last writing she was in the process of building apartments for income, selling her home, and planning to live in one of the apartments.

BARGEN Marie (No. 143). Born 06 20 1907; m. _____ 1927 to W. H. Scarlott. Address: 5777 Fickett Lane, Paradise, California. Children: Ann Patricia, Johnny Allen. Born in Plum Coulee, Manitoba, Canada. After high school she came to California with her parents. About 1934, she and her husband were living at Westwood, California; in 1938 at Inglewood, California. She has designed houses, while her husband (who was a contractor) built them. Her husband died a few weeks before this genealogy went to press, about which time

she wrote: "But I am thankful for almost thirty-five years of love and being loved. I shouldn't cry."

BARGEN Marie (No. 111 1). Born 06 04 1910; d. 06 04 1910. Address: Mountain Lake, Minnesota.

BARGEN Mariette (No. 113 12). Born 12 12 1940. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Born at and local education at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Student, Tabor College, Hillsboro, Kansas, 1961-62. Plays the organ.

BARGEN Mark (No. 129 11). Born 11 30 1949. Address: 3319 East 13th St., Wichta, Kansas. Born at Newton, Kansas. Childhood at Claflin, Kansas; San Miguel, Mexico; Corpus Christi, Texas; Holcomb, Moscow, Hugoton, Liberal and Wichita, Kansas; thence to Boulder, Colorado and back to Wichita. Was near death while in San Miguel. Reads extensively and enjoys scientific experiments, with strong early leanings toward a scientific vocation. In spring of 1962 he submitted an original paper on a number-system to the Future Scientists of America, winning one of nine first awards in a six-state region. No other award was given in Mathematics. Other scientific and avocational interests include fish. In the 6th Grade he was elected "Judge" of the Kangaroo Court; later a class officer. Aside from collecting stamps, he is also working on a genealogy. Has had a straight-A record, with a citizenship record to match, wrote his school principal in the fall of 1960.

BARGEN Mary (Maria) (No. 16). Born ; d. . Born and died in Russia, "A very bright, gifted child, which died at age 3, the first daughter of Justina Loewen;" although the serial number assigned would not indicate this.

BARGEN Mary (No. 125). Born 04 18 1894. Address: Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Born at Mt. Lake, and lived there all her life. Local public school and high school, being salutatorian of her class, her brother William James, being the valedictorian the same year. When her mother had a nervous breakdown and had to be permanently hospitalized, she made up her mind to remain in the home to take care of the younger children and of her father. She thus became the second mother of the home. She made up for the interrupted education by extensive reading maintaining for many years a membership card with the St. Paul Public Library-a card much used, the books coming and going not singly but in bundles! early difficulties with her eyes, and soon lost the use of one of them completely, although some of her nearest associates were not aware of this until after she retired! She almost immediately began assisting her father in the post office, first as a part-time clerk, later a Civil Service employee in the post office from 1924 to 1959 when she retired. All these years she was a Sunday school teacher, something of local historian, poet, writer and moving spirit for many She helped organize the Oak Leaf Mission Society of the First Mennonite Church of Mt. Lake. Interested in all cultural affairs of the community-even sports, dramatics, music. Would write a poem for an occasion without difficulty, or a play if called for. Very energetic, with a robust faith in God. After her retirement she used many opportunities to make herself generally useful in the neighborhood, the church, and with friends, entertaining -- and not only people her own age but youngsters. She knows she's getting older, but jokes about it: "I have been so absent-minded--putting Sanka coffee over my cereal, turning on the fire and forgetting to turn it off, and dusting all my furniture three times on Saturday"! She engineered the general family reunion

of 1960; then sold the old family home, and purchased a smaller house (but not much smaller!) near the Bethel Hospital, saying, "Peaceful Valley is the name of home, because it seems so low and cool after living on the hill all my life."

BARGEN Menno (No. 113 2). Born 10 16 1913; m. 06 26 1946 to Nancy Kathleen Henry. Address: 430 Nelson Drive, Billings, Montana. Children: Richard Henry, Dean Craig. Born at Mountain Lake, Minnesota. Attended local Bible School, Public School and then, at Newton, Kansas, the Junior High school, where he completed the 8th Grade. Upon the death of his mother, he made his home with his uncle and aunt, the I. D. Bargens (No. 111). Entered the United States Army, 1941, serving in the South Pacific (New Zealand, Guadal Canal, New Guinea, and the Phillipines areas) until August, 1945. In 1953 the family moved to Billings, Montana, where he is employed in the construction business. Attends the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church, active in PTA and Boy Scouts. The family does considerable traveling in this area. Menno enjoys photography and has a good collection of colored slides of scenic areas in Montana, Wyoming, Idaho, and Washington. Each summer several trips are made to beautiful Yellowstone National Park, which is only a 3-hour drive away.

BARGEN Nancy (No. 136 2). Born 08 25 1934; m. 04 25 1956 to Arvid Stephens. Address: Box 392, St. Croix Falls, Wisconsin. Child: Robert Mark. Early life in Hudson, Wisconsin (most likely, although not stated). B.S. degree from Stout, Menominee, Wisconsin, in Home Economics. Taught three years in St. Croix Falls at marriage. Member Presbyterian Church. Organ. Member of professional organizations: WEA, NEA, and HEA, American Home Economics Association and State Eastern Star. Interested in music and cooking.

BARGEN Ralph Kliewer (No. 129 1). Born 10 12 1926; m. 12 23 48 to Dortha Anne Beckham. Address: 2801 South Park Way (Apt. 506), Chicago 16, Illinois. Chil-Mark, Karl. Born at Wichita, Kansas; Childhood at Oxford, Buhler, and North Newton, Kansas. While for his parents Oxford was something of an exile, he remembers it with nostalgia -- its great amount of freedom, roaming the countryside, fishing in the river, and playing with his parents--its people strongly individual. In North Newton he recalls that as a "campus-kid" he was one of a special breed of children, always aware of a certain isolation -- a half-child, half-adult world, especially during World War II, because of the Mennonite traditions. Allowed to enter Bethel College (1943) without completing Newton High School, where he had participated in a debating team which had won statewide recognition -- a championship team. At college he was put to work in the College Print Shop, and what he learned of printing (and of people) was to add off-andon later to his income. In college his interest shifted from debate more to journalism, writing for the College paper and being assistant editor. ian Public Service in California and Akron, Pennsylvania, followed by a summer at Estes Park YMCA Camp (maintenance), some months in the Veterans Hospital at Roseburg, Oregon, as psychiatric aide; after his marriage returning to Bethel College, where he graduated, B.S., Education and English. Teaching including Claflin, Holcomb, Moscow, and Liberal (all Kansas), was usually in the field of English and Mathematics, punctuated by editorial work at Hugoton, Kansas. ed a year or so at Corpus Christi, Texas, in the Linotype department of a newspaper and with the Texas Highway Department; thence to Wichita University, graduating with a Masters Degree, Mathematics, 1956. Taught on an instructorship at University of Colorado, Boulder, with the hope of working toward his Ph.D.

Memberships: National Education Association, Mathematical Association of America, National Council of Teachers of Mathematics, National Forensic Honor Society, and Pi Mu Epsilon, a national honorary mathematics society. Assistant Editor, Science Research Associates, Chicago; currently mathematics teacher, Evergreen Park Community High School, Evergreen Park, Illinois. He is a conversationalist, especially enjoying that particular kind of conversation that might be called a game, a play about an idea; also meeting people from different backgrounds; mountain climbing, sailing, tennis; painting in watercolors and oils. His favorite artists are Rembrandt, Picasso, and Klee; favorite composers are Mozart, Shostokovitch, and Duke Ellington; enjoys books—both the looks of them and to read them. Beginning to like children; likes to write; does not like mathematics, but enjoys teaching it. As to philosophical inclinations he says, MAYbe he would identify himself with contemporary existentialism—holding an image of himself which is perhaps that of the adventurer.

BARGEN Richard ("Dickie") Henry (No. 113 21). Born 07 23 1947. Address: 430 Nelson Drive, Billings, Montana.

BARGEN Robert Burns (No. 134 1). Born 03 16 1924. Address: Our Mother of Mercy Rectory, Centerville, S. D. Childhood at Rochester, Minnesota. Had scarlet fever when young enough to have an effect later. It led to rheumatic fever. As a result he was rejected by the army, and accepted by the Jesuits. Attended St. John's Grade School, Rochester, Minnesota, and Campion High School; thence Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin; Carleton College, Northfield, Minnesota; St. Louis University, Marquette U., Creighton U., with B.A. and S.Th B. degrees in 1948 and 1959, respectively. Member: Society of Jesus of the Roman Catholic Church; Nebraska and Midwest Speech Association. Priest, teacher, student. Entered Jesuits on August 8, 1943. Ordained priest, June 30, 1956; final vows, 08 15 1960. At present, acting pastor at Centerville, S. D., while studying at South Dakota U. at Vermillion. He likes people; his hobby: transportation. In 1960 he was teaching speech at the Creighton Preparatory School, Omaha, Nebraska, with special interests in directing speech activities.

BARGEN Roberta (No. 127 3). Born 05 07 1938. Address: $317\frac{1}{2}$ Division Street, Northfield, Minnesota. Graduate, Northfield High School, 1956. Three years at University of Minnesota, majoring in theatre arts and humanities. Member: Episcopal Church. Apprenticed at summer theatre in Kennebunkport, Maine. Interest in travel, dancing, reading, music. Has interests in philosophy and anthropology. Currently working for the Automobile Association Headquarters in Minneapolis, which she enjoys very much. She has rented and is subletting a large home in the University neighborhood, the income from which may put her through her last year at the University—she hopes!

BARGEN Rosella Alma (No. 120). Born 09 19 1904; m. 11 23 1955 to Lawrence ("Ole") Olson. Address: 1906 Esquire Drive, Anchorage, Alaska. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, where she had public school and high school; thence to the University of Minnesota, where she took her bachelor's degree. Teacher at Albert Lea, Hastings, Bemidji, Princeton, Minnesota; thence to Anchorage, Alaska, where she taught English in the high school and later was librarian in the Public Library. Was especially successful in the directing of high school dramatic productions. One student, writing a shy note to her as his teacher says: "I got more out of my English class yesterday afternoon than I've gotten in all the years I've taken English . . . but after your interpretations of Pope's

quotations I figured that maybe it wasn't so bad at all."

BARGEN Ruth Jacqueline (No. 1345). Born ; d. (ate age 8).

Address: 200 First Street Southwest, Rochester, Minnesota. She died from accidental drowning while a young girl, WHO'S WHO IN AMERICA, 1960, mentions the name, with the notation, "Deceased," without any dates.

BARGEN Sara (No. 123). Born 11 03 1890; d. 10 17 1958; m. 06 30 1914 to Jacob Samuel Schultz. Address: Bluffton, Ohio. Children: Harold Bargen, Karl Victor, Lora. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota. Local public school education; one year at Bethel College, Newton, Kansas; Minnesota State Agricultural College, St. Paul, Minnesota. In her parental home she was very active, of necessity, with all the usual home duties -- baking, cleaning, laundry. Later, as a mother, extremely gifted in child psychology. Active in all church work, especially as director of the Ohio Cutting Room, about 1942-1956, which she was instrumental in establishing. Her concern for a practical day-to-day expression of the Christian faith led her to visiting the sick, the mentally depressed, the aged; and to take steps to find proper housing for immigrant refugees following World War II; in the immense amount of entertaining she did in her home. She was a prodigious worker, a splendid organizer of whatever needed to be done, amazingly efficient in all she did so that everyone was always marveling at how much (and how quietly) she got so much done. Was a Sunday school teacher for a time. She had a light stroke in June, 1958, while visiting in Kentucky, from which she recovered fairly well prior to the auto accident in Indiana, in which both she and her husband died -- on the day of their daughter Lora's birthday, which they were on the way to celebrate!

BARGEN Susanna (No. 17). Born ; d. . . . Address: Alexanderwohl, Russia. She was the second daughter of Isaac Bargen (No. 1), although the serial number assigned to her does not indicate this. She died at age 3.

BARGEN Susanna (No. 133). Born 07 13 1892; m. 08 25 1914 to Aaron J. Regier. Address: Box 135, North Newton, Kansas. Children: Frances Ruth, Margaret Joy, Winifred Ethel, Donna Lois, Betty Jane. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, where she had public school education. Upon her marriage she moved to Freeman, South Dakota. Here the five girls born to them grew up, until the move to North Newton, Kansas in 1927. Upon the death of her husband, in 1947, the College asked her to take over the management of the Bethel College Book Store, a position which she has filled (as she has all others in the church and neighborhood) with a quiet behind-the-scenes thoroughness and a sense of good stewardship.

BARGEN Susie (No. 114). Born 05 03 1888; m. 09 16 1910 to Isaac J. Ott. Address: Box 85, Iron Mountain, Michigan. Children: Linda Margrete, John Paul, Mable Susan, Florence Helen, George Lawrence. Born in Lehigh, Kansas, but grew up in Mt. Lake, Minnesota, with membership there in the Mennonite Brethren Church. After moving from Mt. Lake to Wisconsin and Michigan, she devoted herself to much church work and, in the home, enjoying embroidery work and the making of rugs. They live in the iron range, there being a big, open mine about 5 miles east of their home.

BARGEN Teresa Ann (No. 134 2). Born 11 04 1925; m. 06 21 1947 to John R. Cagney. Address: 925 Oakwood Terrace, Hinsdale, Illinois. Children: Ruth Marie, Kathleen, Terese Ann, Patricia Jean, Timothy James. Born at Rochester, Minnesota. Two years of Liberal Arts at Northwestern University. Nurses Training

at the Kahler (Mayo) School of Nursing. She must have been in some kind of severe accident. A letter written by her father's uncle in 1929 says: "Little Therese clung to my neck and covered my face with her warm kisses before they left here; and then, two hours later, she was hurled into what seemed to be inevitable death. I understand the child is recovering." We see she did:

BARGEN Walter Isaac (No. 127). Born 10 17 1897; m. 12 15 1932 to Lois Armstrong. Address: $317\frac{1}{2}$ Division St., Northfield, Minnesota. Children: Linda, David Walter, Roberta. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, having his public school and high school education there; thence University of Minnesota, Agricultural College. Taught Vocational Agriculture one year at Lake City, Minnesota. For some years salesman of school equipment; later purchasing the Ideal Cafe at Northfield, which he has operated for many years. He enjoys sports, crafts, carpentry, having built a log cabin during the recent summers on the beach of Lake Pelican, Merrifield, Minnesota.

BARGEN William James (No. 126). Born 12 20 1895; d. 01 21 1962; m. 04 21 1918 to Mathilda Klein. Address: Route 1, Richmond, Illinois. Born at Mt. Lake, Minnesota, where he had grade and high school; thence to Mankato Commercial College, Mankato, Minnesota; thence to the University of Minnesota. a bank at Lavina, Montana, where he learned insurance, and became interested in patent-designing of school furniture. He moved to Waukegan, Illinois, where for many years he operated a business designing outstanding school equipment, both in fine wood and plastics, receiving a government citation for worthy contributions to school furniture design. He was reticent about telling of his 105 patents, but entertained any social gathering with his scintillating humor and his whistling, which was a special hobby. His health never was the best; very serious diphtheria when young and lead-poisoning, contracted while he helped in his father's printshop (where he was both Linotypist, business manager, advertising sales manager, and editor) during his high school years, were not good background for his strenuous years later in manufacturing and selling, when he was generally out of the house by 5 o'clock in the morning, and perhaps hundreds of miles away before he had breakfast. Thus, when meningitis set in a week before his death, he did not have physical reserves to beat it. Two days before his death one of the nurses commented: "We've known him only three days, but I'm telling you, there never was a man like him and there never will be again." He had his avocational interests, also: Indians, and children. In Waukegan he was known as "The Great White Father," and was a wonderful friend to the children on the street. He gave the feeling of authority where he was.

Originally Mennonite; and still, by membership, but often attending the Methodist church in Cassopolis, since there is no Mennonite Church in that community. Currently in charge of the Snack Shack at Camp Friedenswald, for the summer of 1962; also assisting some with counseling of girls.

He was sent by his father to help out on the farms of poorer brothers of his father, during the time of seeding or harvest, with plow and harrow, or hayrack, setting up the stacks. Such brotherly help on the farm was never evaluated in terms of money, but was taken to be a part of the family life. He was very proud of the fine arrangements he had made in the building of a new home, presumably in America.

He must have been quite a good manager, being somewhat better off financially than his brothers, but never stingy--not only sending the boys but the equipment (plow, harrow, hayrack, as the season demanded) with them. He was one of the sons of Heinrich Bergen (No. 1: See note at Family Index on method of numbering individuals prior to No. 1) but nothing is known about his mother. (See biography of Heinrich Bargen (No. 1:).

When one of the mothers (his sister) became aware of the situation, she smiled and asked the young folks, "You foolish brats, why don't you ask him for it?" As so many old Dears, this beloved uncle had a big heart and a clear understanding of the younger generation. His scruples vanished; he went to a photographer some 20 Versts away, and a little later he brought them the photo with a few simple, heartfelt words of admonition and farewell.

Children: Henry J., J.B.H., Lena and four others, not named, who did not grow to adulthood. The full lineage arrived too late to be included in this genealogy, to the regret of the Editor. The only daughter in her family to have come to America, where her husband, dying rather young, left her a widow to face many a trial, sustaining bone injuries in a fall, and contracting cancer of the lower lip, which was not only painful but interfered with eating and drinking, having to contend with the fear of death and only partially to some peace, being reported upon the occasion of her 92nd birthday as being in somewhat frail health but considering her advanced years quite cheerful. Her hearing difficulties, too, made it difficult for her to remain in communication with her surroundings—a thing which she found especially difficult to bear as she loved music.

Had a fine organizing sense; a great conversationalist, with a fine sense of humor. Her reading leaned toward the theological, which to her dismay often tended to go beyond her depth. Took an active interest in local affairs, sometimes showing her indignation in writing contributions to the Mt. Lake VIEW (her husband the editor), and which writing sometimes would cause difficulties in the "conflicts of interests" in a small town like Mt. Lake. With the death of son David she broke emotionally, spending much of the remainder of her life in a state or local hospital. Physically, very heavy, much trouble with her feet (bunions). A letter on file comments, though, that even when she had already been hospitalized, a letter she received on Mothers Day made her feel like "an entirely new person. You probably cannot remember ever having seen her as gay as she looked and acted on Mothers Day. She feels jolly even now." (This is the mother of the Editor of this genealogy; readers will perhaps pardon him for a slightly longer biographical note than for some other mothers. Surely, they all deserve more than they get in this genealogy!)

He followed his father's way of establishing a home and providing for a family-he farmed. He was moderately prosperous and happy. The Indians gave her the name, "Keez-Go Quay," meaning "Sky Woman," They gave her a pair of turquoise ear rings because she heard the cry of the Indian, a turquoise ring because she reached out her hand to help them, and a bracelet because she stretched out her arm to help them. This work with the Indians and on the Department of the Interior gave her much joy and she learned much about a subject she had never

thought about. Since her husband, William J., passed away, she is naturally lonesome and bewildered by the maze of business affairs which she must now manage in the on-going work of his business. ; d. in the spring of 1865. LOEWEN David (No. X). Born father of Justina Loewen (No. 1m), who received professional education at Danzig, studying medicine under dire privations. Something of his professional attitude may be caught from reading the biographical materials on his daughter, Justina, and how well he taught her, so that many of the still-living old timers still remember her--his protege as well as daughter. One of such old-timers who for a while, when she was a young girl, lived in Nebraska writes: "I recall a Doctor Loewen--married a Reimer . . . During a war between Russia and someone else, there was a general . . . nothing would help him, and one of his men said, 'I know one place; you take him there.' So they took this general to Doctor Loewen. There was something wrong with his bones; and Doctor Loewen cured him. When it came to paying the doctor, the latter said, 'Oh, not very much.' It was something like \$3 or so; but the general said, 'No, no, not that little: ' and gave him I don't know how much--a very large sum. Doctor Loewen was a very generous man."

LOEWEN Gerhard D. (No. X3). Born ; d. . Address: Lehigh, Kansas. He was a bachelor. He was a while the Township Assessor of Menno Township. One who knew him personally remarked that Gerhard liked to visit. He would peel potatoes and make coffee, that would be his meal. Was found dead one morning—perhaps fourteen hours after he died—no one knows just when.

LOEWEN Henry D. (No. X2). Born _____; d. _____ Presumably born in Russia, who, upon migrating to Kansas became a wealthy farmer. But, leaving no will, his estate was settled through probate, the extensive farm holdings sold at auction. He was extremely deaf; and despite every attempt on the part of friends and relatives and others genuinely concerned for him that he should make a will, he refused to do so. He died in the Goessel (Kansas) home for the aged, about the year 1940. The interesting stories afloat about this individual makes one regret that this report be so brief.

LOEWEN Jacob (No. X5). Born ____. Had a daughter, Marie Loewen. LOEWEN John (No. X4). He lived on a farm where Heinrich Schmidt lived.

LOEWEN JUSTINA. See Isaac Bargen (No. 1). See also Gerhard Neufeld, her m. (2). Born February 17, 1826, d. 01 11 1905. Born at Gnadenheim, South Russia, in a little house at the edge of the village, the first child of her father by his third marriage. Her father was a poor shoemaker in the village, too poor to buy milk for the child when the mother could not nurse it. A visitor overnight, hearing the child cry all night, gave money to purchase a cow for the

child. Her father left his wife and children to go to Danzig for medical training. By virtue of exceptional industry and will power he completed the course in a relatively short time, returning as "Doctor Loewen." Her mother died before Justina was grown up. At a very early age, one person remembers it as age 14, she began accompanying her father on his professional calls in the neighborhood. At that age she was sent by her father with medicines to strange homes, there to see to it that the doctor's order were being carried out. age 15 she was serving as midwife's assistant. Her sunny, happy disposition made her an instant favorite in every home, and her skill allowed no one to despise her youth. Poverty was the adjective which described both the home from which she came and into which she married. Her husband worked as a hired hand during threshing seasons, and in the evening made wooden shoes; while she worked at the spinning wheel, making yarn for stockings and spinning flax or sewing for others. For a long time they lived in a mudhut, with windows of oil paper. In the course of time, during which she became known as "Bagesche," (Low German for Mrs. Bargen) she had three daughters and four sons. died in the spring of 1865. From that time on, her family experienced a remarkable change in the family finances. Almost as if by magic she was lifted into the position formerly held by her doctor father; day and night her services were in demand. No darkness was too great, no storm too violent, no road so impassable, no work nor family affairs so demanding that she would not go to the bedside of some sick person to help. On November 13, 1875 she was married to Rev. Gerhard Neufeld, of Furstenau, South Russia, who brought with him three single sons and three married daughters, all of whom came to love her in time and affectionately to call her Mother. It was mainly upon her own wishes that the family migrated to America in 1878, and she never regretted it, no matter how hard the pioneer life here was--and it was hard for her! About this second marriage one person recalled that she did not want to get married a second time, but Gerhard Neufeld came again and again. Finally, she consented, but only after he had promised her that he would never send folks away who came to her for help when they were ill. Once in America, she became the "Doctor" not only for the Mt. Lake, Minnesota area, but of everwidening areas, often being called upon to make trips to Nebraska and Kansas; she may even have gone to Manitoba on such an errand of mercy. An interview 08 17 1959 with Mrs. Maria Becker provided the following memory of Grandma Bargen-Neufeld: "I remember her very She was a small woman and VERY fat. She came to York, Nebraska. see the women in those days were afraid to use a man doctor; so they had this Grandma Neufeld come from Minnesota. She always carried a little Bencksje (Low German for "little footstool"), because she could not sit on an ordinary chair. They asked her how she could come on a train so far. She replied: 'That WAS something almost impossible. They squeezed me and squeezed me until Igot in.' (into the train) She lived in Alexanderwohl . . . I recall particularly after church, how we children (in Nebraska) were all standing around; and seeing all us little children, she remarked, 'I guess most of you I helped bring into this world.' She had a friendly and good personality. I recall exactly where she sat in the church with her little bench-her legs were very short, and she had to rest her feet." But, with the passing of the years, she more and more let go of this world. Had to give up her knitting (presumably because of her eyes) and gave herself more to the study of the Bible. Her obituary reports that she had brought 11,000 babies into the world with her open arms. At the funeral the attendance was estimated at over one thousand.

Quite early in life he was made the Vorsanger (meaning the leader in congregational singing.) It was exceedingly difficult for him to accept the election, almost unanimous, to the position of minister, not being quite sure that this was the call from God. Accepting in February, 1869, a month later his wife died; and soon after that he lost all his horses and had to consent to let all his cattle be shot, resulting (so it was feared) from the bite of a mad dog. So, he was forced to walk the distance from Fürstenau to Schönsee where the church was located. His open, winsome personality won him the friendship of neighbors when he remarried, after almost seven years, to Justina Loewen, whose four sons entered upon a new family life with his six children--Justina promising him that she would treat them as her own. This marriage meant that he had to leave the village where he had spent almost half a century to move to a new home, among totally strange people; yet even this sundering was not so difficult as the pain, in the year 1878, of saying goodbye to all his friends and relatives in Russia, to migrate to America. When he arrived, a congregation was in the early stages of organization, which despite his hesitations elected him as the Elder and which he reluctantly accepted. Although he was, by and large, conservative, yet as far as the young people of the church were concerned he found great joy in working with them. As he was the master of the wildest horses, so he was master also in the affairs of the congregation. Only when his second wife, Justina, died in 1905, it seems he suffered something of a shipwreck--much of his spirit seemed to lag thereafter. He broke a hip in a fall on the porch of the house, and for two years thereafter, he found life very tiring and was, when his time came, quite ready to go on.

To work his way through college he sold Wear-Ever aluminum; later he sold yeast form samples for the Northwestern Yeast Co, or sold woolen goods house-to-house. He had a variety of college jobs-tablewaiter, Shevlin Hall, etc., also fired furnaces, washed windows, scrubbed floors, cashier at the Men's Union Cafeteria, and in his junior senior years had an assistantship in the Geography Department -- geography being his major. Graduated in ten, instead of the usual twelve, quarters! Active in the Deutsche Verein, graduating cum laude. Accepted position with Pillsbury Company, Minneapolis, 1928, sent to New York City--an unhappy country boy in the big town. His wife soon joined him there with their 8-weeks-old daughter, to Elizabeth, New Jersey. Here he was given a broadened assignment at the Newark, New Jersey

office, responsible for market surveys, sales promotion, local advertising, coupons, sampling, etc., in addition to pancake suppers. In 1930 promoted to Buffalo, N. Y., where they lived until November, 1932; thence to Minneapolis, main office, made editor of the Company's employee magazine and conducting the country-wide sales contest among the branches, including personnel work. long he was interviewing and selecting most of the new male employees. War II, with its manpower problems brought problems just the opposite of what they had been during the depression years. He was asked to create an effective personnel department, which was begun in 1945. Beginning with only his secretary, it ended January 1, 1961, with 30 persons, many of them professionals at the time he retired. His greatest satisfactions came from the personal relationships with individual employees at all levels. He became a sort of "wailing wall" of the organization, sort of a "father confessor." In connection with this he handed all salary stabilization, group insurance, corporate insurance, salary administration, training, manpower procurement, etc. Had two psychologists on the staff with Ph.D. degrees, and numerous assistants. Retired at 57--why? Pressure in such a job is terrific and he felt he could step out gracefully leaving the Company with a highly competent staff. He had been with the Pillsbury Company over 32 years. Now (1962) in the process of shifting church membership to the First Congregational Church. Interests over the years have centered around the church, neighborhood. the out-of-doors, spending vacations in the mountain areas from the Grand Canyon to Jasper National Park in Canada. (Editorial note: Perhaps an admirable modesty prevents him telling of the tremendous ovation, retirement party, the Company gave him at the time of his retirement.)

CHAPTER III

THE FAMILY INDEX

Explanatory Note

In this index individuals are listed by families.* Each individual is given a number, in the order of his birth: 1, 2, 3, etc. If there were more than 9 children in one family the digit assigned to an individual is thus: The 10th child is assigned the digit 0; the 11th, A; the 12th, B; the 13th, C; the 14th, D; the 15th, E; the 16th, F; etc. The digit assigned to an individual is always the last digit in the number. All digits preceding the last digit are the digits of the ancestors of that individual. Thus, an individual having the No. 13, is to be read thus: He is the 3d child of an ancestor who was the 1st child in his family. This indicates, also, that that individual is in the second generation, since the number has two digits. An individual having the No. 134 21 is in the 5th generation; and should be read thus: He is the first child of a parent who was the 2d child of an ancestor who was the 4th child of an ancestor who was the 3d child of the original ancestor of this genealogy. The number of digits in an individual's number indicates in what generation he appears.

The number (digit) assigned to an individual is in the order of birth if that is known; sometimes a number 1 is assigned, only to discover later that he was not the 1st child in the family. For exact order of birth, the reader will need to see the date of birth as shown in the Biographical Index (Chapter II) for the individual concerned.

Adopted children are assigned digit-numbers just like natural children, but the digit is underscored. Thus, in the No. 214 8, the reader is signalled that this individual is the 8th child in the family, and is adopted; but whether her age falls between the 7th and the 9th could be confirmed by consulting the Biographical Index.

The term, "Adopted," does not necessarily mean, in this genealogy, that legal adoption proceedings were completed. It merely means that the individual is not in true succession, that he lived with the family as a child, and that (sociologically speaking) he was a part of the family like any other natural child.

The column headings: In order to conserve space, the columns of this index are labeled: Col. A., Col. B., Col. C., meaning, respectively:

^{*} In this genealogy, a "family" is a continuous series of numbers differing only in the final digit. See side-markings, 2d and 3d Generations, below, Series X1-X5, 21-28, and 111-110, as examples.

Column A: The Individual's Number.
Column B: The Name of the Individual.

Column C: The Number of Descendants of the Individual -- that is, how many descendants that individual had. Their individual numbers are shown in Column A of the NEXT generation, having the same prefix numbers (digits) as the Individual shown in Column A of THIS generation.

Example: In the 3d Generation of the Family Index appears the name Johanna Amalia Bargen, thus:

which is to be read thus: Johanna Amalia Bargen is the 1st child (Col. C) of a parent (See Col. A) who had a number ending in 4, whose name appears in the PREVIOUS Generation as No. 14, showing that he was the 4th child of the original ancestor in this genealogy, No. 1, whose name appears in the PREVIOUS generation as No. 1, whose name was Isaac Bargen. This Johanna Amalia Bargen had only one child, whose number will appear in the NEXT generation, having the same prefix as her mother, in Column A, thus: No. 141 1, whose name (Column B) is Betty Lou Siverson. This Betty Lou had two children, whose names (with prefixes the same as their mother) will appear in Cols. A. and B. of the NEXT generation. Dates of birth and death will be found in the Biographical Index (Chapter II).

Statistical Analysis

Persons interested in genealogical work often ask the question, "How many families are included in this genealogy?" or they may wonder how many individuals of a given generation are still living. This is shown in Table 3, below.

It was convenient to show in the same table the number of families and the number of children, on the average, per family. Unless at least one child had been born to husband and wife, for purposes of this analysis such a marriage was ignored--not considered a family until at least one child is born.

It will be seen from Table 3 that the average size of family declined, from the second through the fifth generations, from 8.0 to 3.4 children per family. Generation 6, while of passing interest in this connection, must be considered only really beginning. The families in this generation are not yet complete, but it is the Editor's guess that the average number will go up. Readers may wish to plot a similar table for the Bergen Line only or the Neufeld Line only, from which interesting observations could be made.

CHAPTER IV

THE TOPICAL INDEX

Introduction

The purpose of this chapter is to index for the reader some of the interesting hobbies, interests, activities, also some of the strange coincidences, and other oddities which one finds in the reading of these biographies—most of them autobiographies.

To get a clear picture of any individual, it is well to read the biographies of other members of that person's family. The Editor was particularly struck with this fact as stories began to arrive in the mail. It was noticed that certain traits, dominant in an individual of one generation, reappeared in succeeding generations or alternating generations in remarkable ways and in new combinations. Gradually the indexes presented in this chapter developed, which are now presented for the convenience of any reader who wishes to pursue farther particular subjects.

Consider, as an example, Helena Albrecht, an orphan, lost on the prairies, born into wealth, marries into poverty. Her husband loves music-sells reed-organs and does carpentry work for a living, and plays his guitars in the evening with his children at twilight. Then read the comments of his grandchildren Helen Agnes Esau and Ruth Hannah Esau. Note how the music, the poverty, and the solid family ties appear in astonishingly new combinations-"Playing for large audiences although she never took a lesson":

The chapter is divided into Section A, Hobbies, Vocational, and Avocational; and Section B, Oddities and Coincidences. Under each section the topics are listed alphabetically.

The spacing is purposely wide and ample to permit the reader, in the process of studying the lives of other persons to write in for his own use topics which are not printed (of which there are many!), but which especially interest a particular reader, for further reference. Or, one may wish to add to the numbers listed for any given topic that is printed the numbers of persons not included. Here the mind-set of the reader is the guiding principle.

Neither of the lists, then, are intended to be inclusive--merely suggestive of what each reader can do for himself.

CHAPTER V

THE GEOGRAPHIC INDEX

Explanatory Note

One of the general purposes of a geographic index is to give the reader a picture of the over-all distribution of members of this genealogy, and it may serve to pick out spots along a trip where one may wish to stop to look up relatives whom he might otherwise overlook entirely if he were unaware of such distribution.

Finally, a geographic index such as this makes one aware of the concentration of relatives within an area where the reader may have suspected no relatives at all. Readers may be surprised to find they have relatives within the city of which they knew nothing.

In this chapter is presented a listing of the states and cities in which members of this genealogy currently reside. Admittedly, this is the least exact of all the indexes presented in this book, because of the fact that these are only the last-known addresses; and in many cases, no doubt, individuals will have moved to new addresses by the time this book is consulted.

On the other hand, even granted that an individual has moved, this is a point of beginning for further tracing of that individual. It is the hope of the Editor that users of this book, if and when they recognize that an individual has moved, will send in the change of address, thus keeping the card indexes in the Editor's files correct.

In this Geographic Index the customary order of listing is used—the arrangement being first by states, alphabetically; then within a given state the arrangement is by cities, alphabetically arranged; then, within a given city, the names are arranged alphabetically by surnames.

Cities which contain a directional adjective, such as North, West, East, or South, are NOT filed under the main word, but under strict alphabetical sequence: Thus--Mankato, Minneapolis, North Mankato; or, Covina, Watsonville, West Covina.

In listing couples, the one who is the direct descendant is listed first. For street addresses, see Biographical Index, Chapter II.

Children under age 17 are not listed, it being assumed that they are living with their parents; but individuals over age 17 are listed separately if not living with their parents, and are not listed if it appears obvious that they are.

In some cases it was not obvious by inspection whether children were or were not living with parents, with an aged mother, or an aged father; in which

cases they are listed individually.

APPENDIX A

GIVEN-NAME VARIANTS

Even a casual scanning of the names of this genealogy will reveal that given names vary greatly in spelling. The list of such variants is given here not so much to stress the novelty as to help the reader find the precise spelling he has in mind for a given person. The list includes some nicknames.

Absolute accuracy in spelling of names in this genealogy is difficult to attain. Information about the names of children came to the Editor from different people who, with the best of intentions (and often, obviously, as a result of vast effort), were not necessarily aware of such variations in spelling. A grandmother may love her grandchildren, but may have a little difficulty with modern spelling! In many cases the index was prepared as the name was spelled when first received, and variations noted. Surprisingly, in some cases the person himself did not know just what his name was!

In the accompanying list, if variants fall into two distinct sections of the alphabet, as Candy and Kandy, they are shown in both Section C and K.

The list is not intended to be literally exhaustive, rather suggestive. If a name is not found under one spelling, this list suggests others.

The card for the in-law varies a bit, since the essential information about dates of marriage, birth, children, and address already appears on the card of the direct descendant. The use of footnotes is the same as for direct descendants.

A comparison of the blanks on the Data Slip, shown on page 160. with the typed index cards will reveal a close resemblance in the form -- the one usually coming to the Editor filled in by hand (although many are typed), while the index card is entirely typewritten. Little editing is done from the data slip to the index card. The editing is done only when the genealogy is ready for publication, at which time the Editor scans all the information, including all the contradictions, corrections, changes, etc., in order to prepare a write-up which will seem to be most near to the truth. The footnotes shown in Card A (front and back) are somewhat hypothetical; usually all footnotes would follow in strict date order. The reader will notice how each item of information is documented, so that if the Editor wishes later to follow up on some item, it is on record from where and when the original information was received. It may be of interest to the reader to compare the illustration of the index card, as shown, with the actual write-up as it appears for those two persons in this genealogy.

APPENDIX D

A REQUEST OF THE READER

In the course of the work the Editor found some ways of collecting information more helpful than others. As in everything else, one learns as you go along. Surprisingly, the Editor found the personal interview the least satisfying, except in the personal sense of friendly conversation. For collecting information systematically, the written word is better.

Often the Editor felt that there were some things he wished YOU would do! Some of the things listed below will be almost no extra work for you.

- 1. Annual Christmas letters, such as so many people Mimeograph or otherwise duplicate are a fine source of information for up-dating family records. Put the Editor on your mailing list, won't you? Such letters are generally quite well thought through. You have already culled through your experiences of the year and have picked out what you consider is most important.
- 2. Whenever ANY CHANGE IN FAMILY STATUS occurs, please send in a report of the Editor. This includes ANY of the items mentioned on the Family Data Slip. Use the data slip, in fact, including only the parts that are new or additional to what appears in this printed genealogy: births, deaths, marriages, promotions, changes of address, creative productions, articles written, music composed, books published, newspaper clippings, snapshots, etc.
- 3. As you run across information which you recognize should have appeared in this genealogy but was not included, make a note of it at once; and when you have collected a number of such items, send them in.
- 4. Wherever, in your reading of this genealogy, you can fill in from the information at hand such blanks as (Month, Date, Year), or names and addresses, in such blanks as , do so at once. The space is left there for YOUR help. Then, once a year or so, send in such items to the Editor.
- 5. Feel free to ask the Editor for additional Family Data Slips. You should always have a few on hand--for your own use and to give to others who may not be aware of it.
- 6. In sending in snapshots try to select only a few--and those, particularly, that are so-called "close-up," preferably of individuals or at most couples. Do not send large, mounted photographs. Identify persons pictured.
- 7. Check your old records, correspondence, Family Bibles, newspaper clippings, etc., and send them to the Editor (abstracts), indicating what items

you wish to have returned to you, if the information is prior to that printed or which amplifies what does appear in this genealogy.

- 8. Be a good listener at family gatherings to see whether you can pick up additional information. Join the Biographical Adventure! You will find it is better than reading detective stories—you become something of an historian, and it will give you a sense of teamwork.
- 9. Feel free to write the Editor what you do not like about the genealogy, or the manner in which it is written. Submit suggestions how the next edition (Should there be one?) can be improved. You may see features in other genealogies which you think are better.
- 10. If you have any difficulty in finding the information you desire, it indicates (to the Editor) that the genealogy as here printed is not functioning as he had hoped it would; and he would like to know about it. Write him. He will be glad to help you find what you want, or give you additional information if he can. It will show him how the next edition can be improved.
