### A BILL

For the enlargement of the Capitol grounds and for the erection of a monument or monumental memorial to Abraham Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1  $\mathbf{2}$ tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 That for the enlargement of the Capitol grounds, and to pro-4 vide a site for a monument or monumental memorial to Abraham Lincoln and a dignified and adequate approach to 56 the Capitol, the Vice-President, the Speaker of the House of 7 **Representatives, and the Superintendent of the Capitol Build**ing and Grounds be, and they are hereby, authorized and 8 9 directed to acquire, by purchase, condemnation, or other-10 wise, all of squares numbered six hundred and twenty-six, 11 six hundred and twenty-eight, six hundred and thirty, six 12 hundred and thirty-two, six hundred and thirty-four, six

hundred and eighty, six hundred and eighty-one, six hundred 1 2and eighty-two, six hundred and eighty-three, six hundred and eighty-four, six hundred and eighty-five, seven-hundred 3 4 and twenty-one, seven-hundred-and twenty-two, and seven 5hundred and twenty-three, in the city of Washington, Dis-6 trict of Columbia. And to pay for said squares, and for their 7 grading, laving out, and improvement when acquired, the 8 sum of four-million three million two hundred and fifty thou-9 sand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 10 hereby authorized to be expended.

SEC. 2. That should the Vice-President, the Speaker, 11 12and the Superintendent of the Capitol Building and Grounds decide to institute condemnation proceedings in order to 1314 secure any or all of the land herein authorized to be ac-15 quired, such proceedings shall be in accordance with the 16 provisions of the Act of Congress approved August thirtieth, 17 eighteen hundred and ninety, providing a site for the enlarge-18 ment of the Government Printing Office (United States 19Statutes at Large, volume twenty-six, chapter eight hundred 20and thirty-seven).

SEC. 3. That the expenditure of the further sum of one million dollars is hereby authorized for the purpose of erecting a monument or monumental memorial to Abraham Lincoln upon some portion of the land acquired under section one of this Act. The said sum of one million dollars

shall be expended by a commission to be composed of the 1 Vice-President, the Speaker of the House, the chairman of 2 the Committee on the Library on the part of the Senate, and 3 the chairman of the Committee on the Library on the part 4 Said commission shall also determine the 5 of the House. 6 exact location of the said monument or monumental memorial. 7 The said commission may also expend for the purpose 8 of securing a suitable design any unexpended balance of the 9 money hereafter appropriated for such purpose and such unexpended balance shall be immediately available. 10
