Bill Nye (1850-1896)

Humorist Bill Nye was the first editor of the daily paper in Laramie, Wyoming, and named it the Laramie Boomerang in honor of his mule. The book, according to Nye, includes "some little epics and ethereal flights of fancy..." and he said "it affords me great pleasure... to know what a feeling of blessed rest and childlike confidence and assurance - and some more things of that nature - will follow the publication of this work."
