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## PREFACE.

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At the meeting of the Alumni Association, June 12, 1891, Dr. A. B. de Frece, '67, urged the importance of preparing a biographical catalogue of the University graduates, that the Alumni might become better acquainted with the histories of their brethren, and that the public might learn of the great number of men of note who have been graduated from the University. At the annual dinner, January 28, 1892, a committee was appointed to compile the catalogue. The Committee presents this volume as the result of its two years of labor.

The work of securing the material for the catalogue proved to be vastly greater than was anticipated. Not a few of the living Alumni are too modest to present their records, even after repeated calls by letter or in person; while, of many of those belonging to the older classes, no traces could be found, although in some instances scores of letters were sent in search. But the denominational handbooks, the catalogues of professional schools, and the publications of the Greek-letter Fraternities have furnished information from which partial records have been compiled of some Alumni, respecting whom no other facts could be obtained. Not a few gaps remain, some of which will be filled in a supplement which, it is hoped, will be issued within two or three years. At the same time the Committee cannot refrain from congratulating the Alumni upon the success which has attended its efforts, in that the catalogue is issued, two years from its inception, so nearly complete—a result due to the hearty co-operation of many who are not members of the Committee.

While the labor of compilation has been shared by all members of the Committee, the greater part of the work has been done by Dr. C. S. Benedict, '80, Prof. J. J. Stevenson, '63, and Dr. A. W. Ferris, '78. In addition to a vast amount of other labor, Prof. Stevenson prepared the entire biographies of the Chancellors and Professors, and also the Bibliography. Dr. Ferris revised and edited the copy of the section of the catalogue which contains the biographies of the Graduates, and supervised the printing of the volume.

Biographies of the members of the class of 1894 have been inserted, although at the time of going to press they had not received their degrees, and, therefore, had not become members of the Alumni Association. It seemed more than unjust to omit from this catalogue, issued just after demolition has been begun, the record of the last one of the classes to complete its course in the old building.

The Bibliography has been a source of no little perplexity, and it contains much which may provoke criticism. Of the Alumni who had returned imperfect lists of publications, and who had been requested in special communications to make their lists complete in accordance with a suggested model, but few acceded to the request. In a number of instances partial bibliographies were prepared after consultation of cyclopedias and publishers' lists. It was deemed best to publish this imperfect material, with the hope that those who can will correct the errors and supply the deficiencies.

The Committee earnestly requests any one who discovers errors to communicate the corrections to Dr. C. S. Benedict, the Secretary of the Committee, who will have charge of material for a Supplement. To him also should be sent, as soon as possible, any information respecting Alumni who appear to be unknown, or whose records are incomplete.

## HISTORICAL: 1831-1894.

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It is now only sixty-five years since the meeting of nine gentlemen to consider "the establishment of a University in the city of New York on a liberal and extensive scale." It is sixty-three years (the 18th of April, 1831) since the incorporation was effected. In a little over two years after the incorporation the first class graduated, and each year since a class has gone out, so that the class of the present year will be the sixty-second in order.

The chief events in the history of the University divide themselves into two categories, the first concerning specially the Faculty of Arts and Science, and the second the professional schools of the University. The University catalogue of the present year names the following events in the first category:

1832. October, Opening of College work, closely followed by the erection (1832-35) of the University Building.

1835. Invention, in the University, of the Recording Telegraph:

"Your Philomathean Hall, the room I occupied—that room in the University was the birthplace of the Recording Telegraph."—(Extract from address of Prof. Morse, at the Alumni Meeting of 1853.)

1839. Invention, in the University, of the application of Photography to the representation of the human countenance.

1864-66. Founding of the General Endowment, in chief part by Mr. Loring Andrews.

1886. Organization of the Graduate Seminary.

1890. Academic Relation established with the Union Theological Seminary.

1892. Purchase of "University Heights."

1894. Removal to University Heights of the University College.

At the same time it mentions twelve events in connection with the Professional Schools of the University, as follows:

### IN DEPARTMENT OF MEDICINE.

1841. Opening of the College on Broadway opposite Bond Street.

1851. Removal to Fourteenth Street, near Irving Place.

1853. Procurement, by the Faculty, of the law legalizing dissection in New York State.

1869. Removal (after the burning of the old edifice, in 1866, and a temporary stay in the New York Hospital) to East Twenty-sixth Street.

1879. Erection of the present College Building.

1887. Building of the Loomis Laboratory.

1835. Plan of Hon. B. F. Butler for the School adopted by the Council, but not carried out.

1858. Opening of the Department of Law.

1863. Founding of the Law Library by John Taylor Johnston.

## IN OTHER DEPARTMENTS.

1890. Academic Relation established between the University and the Union Theological Seminary.

1890. Organization of the School of Pedagogy.

1890. Appointment of the Woman's Advisory Committee.

These categories give some hint of the history of the past.

In November of 1890, a movement was inaugurated to enlarge the work of the University by the securing of a new site for the University College, the School of Engineering, and the Graduate Seminary (in part). On August 11th, 1892, a site of about twenty acres was purchased, extending from Sedgwick Avenue to Andrews Avenue, bounded on the north by the new University Avenue (placed on the map of the city at the request of the University), which avenue lies between 180th and 185th Streets, in Trans-Harlem.

Ninety-eight gentlemen have been enrolled as founders of University Heights through their subscriptions to the purchase of the grounds. Other names may be added of those who may subscribe to the grounds or to the buildings. Forty-one of the ninety-eight names are Alumni of the University. The present movement is in accord with a report to the Council in November, 1890, which said :

“The marked advance of business into the neighborhood of the University raises the question whether our work might be advanced by any change of place.

“Our work for undergraduates might certainly be enlarged and improved, were grounds of some extent, within easy distance of the chief residence quarter of our city, placed at our command.

“Our work for the School of Law, the School of Pedagogy and the Graduate Division (except perhaps in courses requiring laboratory work) can have no better centre than Washington Square. Should, however, this ground become exceedingly valuable for business, the University could reserve for these objects the uppermost floor or floors of a great building to be erected upon this site, while the half-dozen floors below might be made to add largely to our resources.

“The University College for undergraduates, planted in some neighborhood easily accessible, could enjoy the use of land free from ordinary taxation and constantly rising in value. At first the roll of students might be diminished, yet in a short time University College in a residence quarter, with attractive grounds, would fulfill more nearly the American ideal of a college, than a college in a business locality ever can.

“The graduate work would not suffer by the carrying on of some courses in the University Building on this ground, and other courses at the University College. Already one professor gives his courses both here and at his residence, near four miles apart.”

It is certainly remarkable that it has been possible to carry forward this program so rapidly and with so little deviation from the plan proposed nearly four years ago.

The present year will witness the beginning and partial completion of an imposing building upon Washington Square, ten stories in height, of which the uppermost three will be reserved by the University. Spacious rooms are planned here for the School of Law, the School of Pedagogy, for certain Graduate Lectures, and for the Administrative

Offices. The seven stories below, with the basement, are leased for twenty-five years to the greatest school-book publishing house on this continent and perhaps in the whole world. It is hoped that the first story of this building may be enclosed by October 1st, for the temporary occupancy of the schools above named.

On the new site of the University, by October 1st, the following buildings are promised :

*Hall of Languages*, about 60 x 90 feet, standing about four rods north of the Charles Butler Hall.

*The Charles Butler Hall*, at the south-west corner of the campus, being a reconstruction of the old mansion now standing upon the site.

*The Laboratory of Chemistry*, about four rods east of the Charles Butler Hall, forming a part of the south side of the proposed quadrangle.

*The Laboratories of Physics and Engineering*, some ten or fifteen rods further east, near the south line of the property, with a basement under the former intended for a dynamo plant, and one under the latter for a steam-heating plant. The last-named basement will be about fifty feet square, with a clear height of eighteen feet.

Two rods further west, temporary *Laboratories of Geology and Biology*.

North of the last, and eight or ten rods distant, a *Y. M. C. A. Hall and Reading-room*—temporary buildings of wood.

Near these a wooden *Gymnasium*, constructed in part of the spacious barns belonging to the property, with an addition of wood, making a floor surface 65 x 100 feet.

On April 18th, 1894, being "Founders' Day," the Class of '94 took the stone that was first let down from the parapet of the old building upon Washington Square, and, carrying it to University Heights, placed it upon one of the piers builded to support the Gymnasium, being the first new structure upon the future site of the College. It is our trust that the hearty good-will and best effort of all the Alumni will follow their Alma Mater as she looks upon them from her new seat on the Harlem.

## EXCERPTS

From the Constitution of the Association of the Alumni :

“ Art. II.—All graduates of the Department of Arts and Science of the  
“ University of the City of New York who shall have received the degree of  
“ Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science or Civil Engineer shall be Members  
“ of this Association. Those who have received certificates for Partial Course  
“ from the University shall be Associate Members, but without vote or direction  
“ in the affairs of the Association. Those who have received honorary or  
“ advanced degrees from the University and members of its Council shall be  
“ Honorary Members of the Association. The Chancellor and the members of  
“ all the Faculties of the several departments of the University shall be  
“ *ex-officio* members of this Association.”

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## RESOLUTION

adopted at a special meeting of the Association held January 29th, 1891 :

“ RESOLVED, that the annual dues of this Association be and the same hereby  
“ are fixed at \$2.00, payable on the first of March in each year, and that the pay-  
“ ment of these dues shall be a condition precedent to the right to vote for the  
“ representative in the Council\* ; but failure to pay the same shall not for-  
“ feit membership in the Association.”

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\* The Council of the University had requested the Alumni Association to nominate one of its members for election into that body, to fill a vacancy then existing.
