

It is now well known that the White-whiskered Lemur (Lemur leucomystax, P. Z. S. 1880, p. 451; P. Z. S. 1862, p. 347, pl. xli.) is the female of the Black Lemur (Lemur macaco). For the last few years we have had pairs of this species living together in the Society's Gardens. The female of a pair of Black Lemurs purchased of Mr. A. H. Jamrach on the 1st August, 1882 (sp. no. 116 of
